## Media Notes

### About Tonight's Game

The Hokies enter tonight's game 9-5 overall and 1-0 in ACC action ... Virginia is 12-1 on the season and 1-0 in league play ... The Cavaliers were ranked fifth in both polls last week.

### Last Time Out: VT 73, NCSU 68 OT

The Hokies opened ACC play with a big come-from-behind victory over NC State, 73-68, in Cassell Coliseum on Saturday afternoon. Tech trailed by as many as 16 points in the game and trailed by 10 points with 10:31 remaining in regulation, but rallied to send the game into overtime on a three-pointer by **Seth Allen** in the final seconds of regulation ... Tech then got big baskets from **Kerry Blackshear Jr.**, and **Jalen Hudson** in overtime for the 73-68 victory ... Allen and Hudson scored 23 points each and **Zach LeDay** had nine points and 12 rebounds in the win.

### Series Against The Cavaliers

This is the 142nd meeting all-time between the two in-state rivals, in a series that dates back to 1915 ... This is the most-played rivalry for the Hokies ... UVa leads the all-time series, 88-53 ... UVa has won the last seven meetings, most recently a 69-57 win in Charlottesville last season ... Tech is 27-21 in home games in the series and 14-7 in games played in Cassell Coliseum ... This series has been played not only in Blacksburg and Charlottesville, but also in Richmond, Lynchburg, Roanoke, Salem, Hampton, Norfolk and Greensboro, North Carolina in the 2006 ACC Tournament.

It is also a potential half point in the Virginia529 Commonwealth Clash, the point rivalry series between University of Virginia and Virginia Tech ... Currently the score for the Clash is University of Virginia 3.5 and Virginia Tech 1.5 ... Learn more about Virginia529 and this new competition at [thecommonwealthclash.com](http://thecommonwealthclash.com).

## Commonwealth Notes

Virginia Tech is 427-313 (.577) all-time against schools from Virginia ... Tech is 2-0 this season against Virginia schools ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state all-time ... The only state Division I school that Tech has not played is Hampton ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech has played VMI and Radford from the Commonwealth this year.

## We Like 23, and 4

**Jalen Hudson** scored 23 points in the win over NC State ... That is a season high for Hudson and third time in his Virginia Tech career he has scored 20-or-more points in a game ... All three have come against ACC competition ... **Seth Allen** scored 23 points for the Hokies ... This is his third, 20-plus point game of the season.

## All the Way Back

In the win over NC State, the Hokies rallied from a 16-point deficit ... That is the largest comeback of the season and the first time the Hokies have rallied from a double-digit deficit since coming back from a 10-point deficit to Georgia Tech last season ... The last time the Hokies overcame more than a 16-point deficit was a 17-point comeback over West Virginia on Nov. 12, 2013.

## Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

Tech is 30-166 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... The Hokies are 13-58 against nationally-ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season ... Tech is 0-2 against ranked teams this season ... The last time the Hokies defeated a nationally-ranked team was Dec. 1, 2012, when Tech defeated No. 15 Oklahoma State, 81-71, in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech is 2-12 against teams ranked No. 5 nationally ... These numbers are for teams ranked in the AP poll.

## Keeping It to Ourselves

In the win over NC State, the Hokies committed just four turnovers ... The four turnovers is the fewest-ever for the Hokies in a regular season ACC game ... It is the fewest turnovers for the Hokies since turned the ball over three times against Miami in the first round of the 2014 ACC Tournament.

## Wrapping Up the NC State Win

The Hokies won their ACC opener for the first time since defeating Miami, 61-60, in overtime in the 2013-14 season in Miami ... The win snapped a five-game winning streak in the series by the Wolfpack ... It was Tech's first win over NC State since Feb. 2, 2011 and the first win over the Pack in Blacksburg since March 3, 2010 ... The Hokies are now 2-1 in overtime games this season.

## Consistent Transfers

Fourteen games into the season and **Seth Allen** and **Zach LeDay** have shown great consistency scoring points for the Hokies ... Both players sat out last season after transferring from Maryland and South Florida, respectively ... Allen has scored in double-figures in 12 of the 14 games and LeDay has been in double-figures in 11 of the 14 games ... On top of that, LeDay has been in double-figures in rebounding in eight of the 14 games.

## Shane Steps Up

Entering the West Virginia game, senior **Shane Henry** had scored a combined 11 points on the season ... Entering the game with 2:58 remaining in the first half, Henry would play a season-high 16 minutes and record a career-high 12 points, to go along with four rebounds ... He was four-of-four from the field in the game ... Henry earned the start against NC State and had a big blocked shot for Tech on the Wolfpack's final possession to send the game into overtime.

## Bibbs Just Off the Mark

**Justin Bibbs** is shooting 56.9 percent from three-point range ... He is just under the NCAA minimum of 2.5 makes per game ... His percentage would be second nationally if he had met the criteria ... He has made 33 of his 58 attempts this season and now shoots 46.7 percent from three for his career.

## Clarke Out

Freshman forward **Chris Clarke** suffered a fracture to the fifth metatarsal in his right foot and had successful surgery on Dec. 29 ... The injury occurred working out during the Christmas break ... Clarke had started 10 of the first 12 games of the season and is averaging 10.5 points and 7.4 rebounds per game.

## Doubling Our Pleasure

With his 10 point, 11 rebound performance against St. Joseph's, **Zach LeDay** recorded his seventh double-double of the season, in just 13 games ... The last Hokies to record seven double-doubles in a single season was Jeff Allen, with 15 double-doubles in the 2010-11 season.

## Tough, Busy Week

While most of America looks at this time of year for some rest and time off, the Hokies take a totally 180 degree look at this week ... Beginning on this past Wednesday, the Hokies play three games in the six days, two against nationally-ranked teams and all three at Cassell Coliseum ... Then, after a few days off, the Hokies play their first ACC road game of the season at defending national champion and nationally-ranked, Duke.

## Really Young Again This Season

The Hokies once again this season field one of the youngest teams in the nation ... According to [kenpom.com](http://kenpom.com), Tech is 315 out of 351 NCAA Division I teams in experience, at just 1.20 years per player ... Tech is 14th out of 15 ACC teams in experience ... Players new to the Virginia Tech program this season account for 60.3 percent of minutes played for the Hokies, second-highest among ACC teams ... Only Boston College at 65.5 percent is higher.

## A Lot of Doubles

With **Zach LeDay's** double-double against St. Joseph's, the Hokies now have 12 double-doubles for the season, tied for the lead among ACC teams ... This is the most double-doubles for the Hokies in a single season since the 2010-11 season, when the Hokies recorded 18 double-doubles.

## Swat!

In the loss to St. Joseph's, **Zach LeDay** recorded a career-high four blocked shots ... That is the most by a Hokie this season and the most by a Hokie since Joey van Zegeren blocked six shots against Morgan State on Nov. 30, 2014 ... He had three blocked shots in the win over NC State.



**Freshmen Doubles**

**Kerry Blackshear Jr.** and **Chris Clarke** have each recorded double-doubles far this season ... This is the first time since the 2007-08 season that two Hokies have recorded double-doubles in their freshman seasons ... Jeff Allen and JT Thompson accomplished the feat that season.

**Big at the Break**

The Hokies scored 51 points in the first half of the win over Lamar ... Tech topped that in the win over Grambling State, as they scored 52 second half points in the victory ... That is the most points the Hokies have scored in a half since scoring 52 points in the second half at Wake Forest on March 10, 2013.

**It Is Better to Give, A Lot**

In the loss to Northwestern, **Devin Wilson** recorded five assists and just one turnover, cracking the 300 career assists total ... Following the West Virginia game, he has 321 career assists, good for 4.3 assists per game ... Now in his junior season, Wilson entered the top 10 in assists in school history at 10th place in the win over Grambling State, when he dished out four assists ... His 321 career assists is sixth among active ACC players.

**Ending the Road Blues**

When the Hokies defeated Radford, 74-65, at the Dedmon Center on Dec. 9, it marked the first win for Tech on an opponent's home court in more than two calendar years ... The last true road win for Tech was on Dec. 8, 2013, when the Hokies defeated Miami, 61-60, in the BankUnited Center to open ACC play in the 2013-14 season.

**A Freshman Double Feat**

**Chris Clarke** recorded his second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 13 rebounds in the Northwestern game ... It's the first time a Virginia Tech freshman recorded consecutive double-doubles since Jeff Allen in the 2007-08 season ... Allen had 11 points and 12 rebounds in the regular season finale at Clemson and 10 points and 10 rebounds in the first round of the ACC Tournament against Miami ... **Kerry Blackshear Jr.**, also equaled that mark with double-doubles against Lamar and Grambling State.

**Bibbs' Summer**

USA Basketball named the 2015 USA Basketball Men's and Women's U19 World Championship Teams as co-recipients of the 2015 USA Basketball Team of the Year Award ... Virginia Tech's **Justin Bibbs** was a member of the men's gold medal winning team.

**Gimme That!**

In the Hokies' win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff, **Jalen Hudson** earned the start and then posted a career-high five steals in the contest ... That is the most steals in a game by a Hokie since Erick Green had five steals in a win over Mount St. Mary's in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 2, 2011 ... Hudson also led the Hokies in scoring with 15 points against the Golden Lions.

**20-Plus for Allen**

**Seth Allen** scored 25 points in the Northwestern game ... That marks the first time a Hokie has scored 20-or-more points in consecutive games since Adam Smith had 26 points against Miami of Ohio and 22 points against Morgan State last season ... Allen had 23 points in the win over UAB on Nov. 28.

**Buzz Williams** begins his second season as the head coach of the Hokies ... Now in his ninth season as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 173-113 ... A complete bio is available on page 5 of these notes.

Individually, **Zach LeDay** is eighth in offensive rebounds per game and 15th in double-doubles ... LeDay is 23rd in total rebounds and 31st in rebounds per game.

**New Name, Same Place**

The Hokies are playing this season in the same arena, Cassell Coliseum, but the playing surface has a new name ... The floor is now known as Virginia Tech Carilion Court at Cassell Coliseum ... This is in recognition of a generous sponsorship of Virginia Tech athletics by Carilion that will be used to fund scholarships and strategic initiatives, as well as to support public-health awareness ... Carilion was awarded naming privileges to the court for 10 years in recognition of a sponsorship that will provide \$500,000 a year over that time ... With the naming, Carilion will support student-athletes who are pursuing health careers, promote health awareness and the Carilion Clinic Children's Hospital, and honor the importance of the Virginia Tech Carilion partnership.

### 554 in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 554-186 overall record in Cassell Coliseum, good for a .749 winning percentage ... The win over Florida State in 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and two losing seasons in Cassell Coliseum.

### Outlaw Out

Junior wing **Tyrone Outlaw** will miss the 2015-16 season due to a medical issue ... Outlaw transferred to Virginia Tech this spring after one season at Lee College, a junior college in Texas ... He played as a freshman at UNC Greensboro.

### 411 and Counting

Tech has now hit a three-point field goal in 411 consecutive games, the most in school history ... The Hokies have hit a three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Since the three-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time Tech did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

### A Golden Opportunity

Virginia Tech sophomore wing **Justin Bibbs** won a gold medal as a member of the championship USA team at the FIBA U19 World Championship, held in late June and early July in Heraklion, Crete, Greece ... Bibbs becomes the first Hokie to win a gold medal in a sanctioned USA Basketball FIBA world championship.

### Three So Far

With **Kerry Blackshear Jr.'s**, double-doubles in the wins over Lamar and Grambling, the Hokies now have three players to record double-doubles this season ... It marks the first time since the 2013-14 season that three different Hokies had double-doubles in a single season.



## Head Coach Buzz Williams



Buzz Williams begins his second season as the head men's basketball coach at Virginia Tech. Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record in his first season in Blacksburg.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams began building the culture that will allow the Hokies future success. The team went a long ways towards establishing an identity of hard work, accountability both on and off the court and a tough, competitive nature.

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, Williams had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season, the same season the team won the Big East Conference regular season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players have made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure. In his eight seasons as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 173-113.

"Buzz Williams' first season at Virginia Tech set a tone for the future," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit

Babcock said. "This program achieved on the court, in the classroom and in the community. His focus and tireless work ethic is indelible throughout the program. His expectations and standards are high and we will continue to improve in all areas because of this environment."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette in the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 19 seasons, and 2013-14 was his seventh campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached over 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league players of the year, two conference freshmen of the year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07 and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top-50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as

an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40-best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure and he was named one of the top assistants in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M- Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.

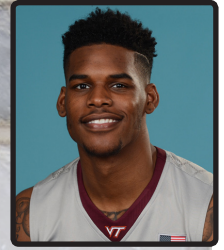

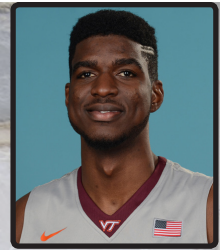

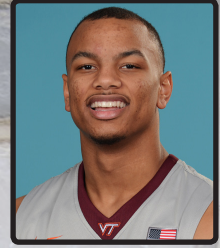
