The Hokies lost at No. 14/10 Duke. 82-58, on Saturday afternoon ... Zach **LeDay** led the Hokies with 18 points and nine rebounds and Kerry Blackshear Jr., came off the bench with 12 points and five rebounds.

Series Against The Demon Deacons

The series, which dates back to 1912, is tied, 30-30 ... The Hokies won the last meeting, 81-80 in the first round of last season's ACC Tournament in the Greensboro Coliseum ... Tech is 21-10 in home games in the series and 13-7 in games played in Cassell Coliseum ... This series has been played not only in Blacksburg and Winston-Salem, but also in Wake Forest, N.C. (the original home of Wake Forest University), Greensboro, Roanoke, Raleigh and Tampa, Florida.

Nine Tips

This is the second of four 9 p.m. tip-offs for the Hokies this season in ACC action ... Tech won the first such game, a 70-68 win over No. 4/4 Virginia on Jan. 4, at home in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies' last two 9 p.m. tips will be mid-week road games, Feb. 17 at Miami and Feb. 23 at Boston College.

Second Half Improvement

So far in ACC play, Virginia Tech is averaging just 24.3 points per first half ... But when the intermission is over, Tech comes out and is averaging 38.7 points per second half ... When you add in the 12 points scored in overtime in the win over Virginia, the Hokies are averaging 42.7 points following halftime, compared to 37.7 points for their opponents.

A Difference in TOs

So far in ACC action this season, the Hokies are averaging 9.0 turnovers per game and are forcing its opponents to 13.0 turnovers per game ... Last season, the Hokies averaged 10.7 turnovers per game in conference play, while forcing 10.6 turnovers per game.

JRob Taking Care of the Ball

So far in conference play, freshman point guard **Justin Robinson** has 10 assists and just two turnovers, while averaging 22.7 minutes played per game ... In the win over Virginia, he posted one of his best games as a Hokie ... The freshman point guard came off the bench

to see 24 minutes of action and handed out a game-high six assists, while not committing a turnover ... He is tied for third in ACC action in assist/turnover ratio ... As a team, the Hokies are second in turnover margin in ACC play.

Ranked Wins

Tech's 70-68 win over No. 4/4 Virginia on Jan. 4 was the Hokies' first victory against at top-5 opponent since a 64-60 win over No. 1 Duke on Feb. 26, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum ... It was the Hokies first victory over a ranked team since an 81-71 victory over No. 15 Oklahoma State on Dec. 1, 2012 ... Tech is now 2-3 in its last five home games against top 5 teams.

Three Notes

Zach LeDay entered the Virginia game with just two, three-pointers on the season ... In the win over the Cavaliers, he was 3-of-4 from beyond the arc ... **Justin Bibbs** was 4-of-5 from three-point range ...

As a team, Tech was 9-of-17 from three-point territory.

According to stats on Kenpom.com, **Seth Allen** is 97th nationally in offensive rating, seventh-best among ACC players ... As a team, the Hokies are 30th in point distribution and 60th in 2-point field goal percentage.

We Like 23, and 4

Jalen Hudson scored 23 points in the win over NC State ... That is a season high for Hudson and third time in his Virginia Tech career he has scored 20-ormore points in a game ... All three have come against ACC competition ... Seth Allen scored 23 points for the Hokies ... This is his third, 20-plus point game of the season.

All the Way Back

In the win over NC State, the Hokies rallied from a 16-point deficit ... That is the largest comeback

In the win over NC State, the Hokies committed just four turnovers ... The four turnovers is the fewest-ever for the Hokies in a regular season ACC game ... It is the fewest turnovers for the Hokies since turned the ball over three times against Miami in the first round of the 2014 ACC Tournament ... Tech committed just eight turnovers in the win over No. 4 Virginia on Jan 4.

Commonwealth Notes

With the win over No. 4/4 Virginia, Virginia Tech is now 428-313 (.578) all-time against schools from Virginia ...Tech is 3-0 this season against Virginia schools ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state all-time ... The only state Division I school that Tech has not played is Hampton ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech has played Virginia, VMI and Radford from the Commonwealth this year.

Consistent Transfers

Sixteen games into the season and **Seth Allen** and **Zach LeDay** have shown great
consistency scoring points for the Hokies
... Both players sat out last season after
transfering from Maryland and South Florida,
respectively ... Allen and LeDay have each
scored in double-figures in 13 of the 16
games ... On top of that, LeDay has been in
double-figures in rebounding in eight of the
16 games.

Shane Steps Up

Entering the West Virginia game, senior **Shane Henry** had scored a combined 11 points on the season ... Entering the game with 2:58 remaining in the first half, Henry would play a season-high16 minutes and record a career-high 12

points, to go along with four rebounds ... He was four-of-four from the field in the game ... Henry earned the start against NC State and had a big blocked shot for Tech on the Wolfpack's final possession to send the game into overtime ... He also started the Virginia game and had four rebounds and two assists in nine minutes of action and had six points and four rebounds in 11 minutes at Duke.

Clarke Out

Freshman forward **Chris Clarke** suffered a fracture to the fifth metatarsal in his right foot and had successful surgery on Dec. 29 ... The injury occurred working out during the Christmas break ... Clarke had started 10 of the first

12 games of the season and is averaging 10.5 points and 7.4 rebounds per game.

Doubling Our Pleasure

With his 10 point, 11 rebound performance against St. Joseph's, **Zach LeDay** recorded his seventh double-double of the season, in just 16 games ... The last Hokies to record seven double-doubles in a single season was Jeff Allen, with 15 double-doubles in the 2010-11 season.

Really Young Again This Season

The Hokies once again this season field one of the youngest teams in the nation ... According to kenpom.com, Tech is 315 out of 351 NCAA Division I teams in experience, at just 1.20 years per player ... Tech is 14th out of 15 ACC teams in experience ... Players new to the Virginia Tech program this season account for 60.4 percent of minutes played for the Hokies, second-highest among ACC teams ... Only Boston College at 66.1 percent is higher.

A Lot of Doubles

With **Zach LeDay's** double-double against St. Joseph's, the Hokies now have 12 double-doubles for the season ... This is the most double-doubles for the Hokies in a single season since the 2010-11 season, when the Hokies recorded 18 double-doubles.

Swat!

In the loss to St. Joseph's, Zach LeDay recorded a career-high four blocked shots ... That is the most by a Hokie this season and the most by a Hokie since Joey van Zegeren blocked six shots against Morgan State on Nov. 30, 2014 ... He had three blocked shots in the win over NC State.

Freshmen Doubles Kerry Blackshear Jr.

and Chris Clarke have each recorded double-doubles far this season ... This is the first time since the 2007-08 season that two Hokies (Jeff Allen and JT Thompson) have recorded doubledoubles in their freshman seasons.

It Is Better to Give, A Lot

In the loss to Northwestern. Devin Wilson recorded five assists and just one turnover, cracking the 300 career assists total ... Following the West Virginia game, he has 324 career assists, good for 4.2 assists per game ... Now in his iunior season, Wilson

entered the top 10 in assists in school history at 10th place in the win over Grambling State, when he dished out four assists ... His 324 career assists is sixth among active ACC players.

Ending the Road Blues

When the Hokies defeated Radford, 74-65, at the Dedmon Center on Dec. 9, it marked the first win for Tech on an opponent's home court in more than two calendar years ... The last true road win for Tech was on Dec. 8, 2013, when the Hokies defeated Miami, 61-60, in the BankUnited Center to open ACC play in the 2013-14 season.

A Freshman Double Feat

Chris Clarke recorded his second consecutive double-double with 11 points and 13 rebounds in the Northwestern game ... It's the first time a Virginia Tech freshman recorded consecutive double-doubles since Jeff Allen in the 2007-08 season ... Allen had 11 points and 12 rebounds in the regular season finale at Clemson and 10 points and 10 rebounds in the first round of the ACC Tournament against Miami ... Kerry **Blackshear Jr.,** also equaled that mark with double-doubles against Lamar and Grambling State.

20-Plus for Allen

Seth Allen scored 25 points in the Northwestern game ... That marks the first time a Hokie has scored 20-or-more points in consecutive games since Adam Smith had 26 points against Miami of Ohio and 22 points against Morgan State last season ... Allen had 23 points in the win over UAB on Nov. 28.

Buzz Williams Info

Buzz Williams begins his second season as the head coach of the Hokies ... Now in his ninth season as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 174-114 ... A complete bio is available on page 5 of these notes.

415 and Counting

Tech has now hit a three-point field goal in 415 consecutive games, the most in school history ... The Hokies have hit a three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Since the three-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time Tech did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

Three So Far

With **Kerry Blackshear Jr.'s**, doubledoubles in the wins over Lamar and Grambling, the Hokies now have three players to record double-doubles this season ... It marks the first time since the 2013-14 season that three different Hokies had doubledoubles in a single season.

A Golden Opportunity

Virginia Tech's **Justin Bibbs** won a gold medal as a member of the championship USA team at the FIBA U19 World Championship, held in late June and early July in Heraklion, Crete, Greece ... Bibbs becomes the first Hokie

to win a gold medal in a sanctioned USA Basketball FIBA world championship ... USA Basketball named the 2015 USA Basketball Men's and Women's U19 World Championship Teams as co-recipients of the 2015 USA Basketball Team of the Year Award.

Head Coach Buzz Williams



Buzz Williams begins his second season as the head men's basketball coach at Virginia Tech. Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record in his first season in Blacksburg.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams began building the culture that will allow the Hokies future success. The team went a long ways towards establishing an identity of hard work, accountability both on and off the court and a tough, competitive nature.

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, Williams had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season, the same season the team won the Big East Conference regular season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players have made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure. In his eight seasons as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 174-114.

"Buzz Williams' first season at Virginia Tech set a tone for the future," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. "This program achieved on the court, in the classroom and in the community. His focus and tireless work ethic is indelible throughout the program. His expectations and standards are high and we will continue to improve in all areas because of this environment."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette in the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 19 seasons, and 2013-14 was his seventh campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached over 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league players of the year, two conference freshmen of the year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07 and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top-50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, serving as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40-best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure and he was named one of the top assistants in the country by HoopScoopOnline.com.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M- Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.




