Media Notes

About Tonight's Game

The Hokies, the sixth seed in the 2016 ACC Tournament, are 19-13 overall ... The Hurricanes are the third seed and are 24-6 overall ... Miami is ranked 11th in both polls.

Last Time Out: VT 96, FSU 85

The Hokies extended their winning streak to six games with a 96-85 victory over Florida State in the second round of the ACC Tournament on Wednesday night ... Seth Allen came off the bench to score 20 points to lead four Hokies in double-figures ... Tech never trailed in the game and shot 53.7 percent from the field.

Series Against the Hurricanes

The Hurricanes lead the all-time series, 18-13 ... Tech won the last meeting, 77-62, in Cassell Coliseum on Saturday ... Tech is 2-3 in neutral court games in the series and 2-3 in ACC Tournament games against Miami.

Winning Streak

The Hokies have now won six consecutive games, all coming against ACC competition ... This marks the longest such winning streak since the Hokies joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... The six consecutive wins against conference competition is the longest such streak since the Hokies won eight consecutive games against conference opponents in the 1964-65 season, Tech's final season in the Southern Conference ... The six straight wins are the most consecutive wins for the Hokies, conference and/or non-conference, since Tech opened the 2012-13 season with seven consecutive victories.

The Hokies in D.C

Tech has played in the Verizon Center six times over the years, with a 3-3 record, including last night's win over Florida State ... Before last night, Tech's last appearance in the building was on Dec. 7, 2008, when the Hokies defeated Navy, 79-70, in the BB&T Classic ... Tech is 1-1 in ACC Tournament games in this arena, a 73-54 loss to Georgia Tech in the Hokies' very first ACC Tournament game and last night's win over Florida State.

Pointing Out Points

The Hokies defeated Florida State, 96-85, in the second round of the 2016 ACC Tournament ... The 96 points scored by the Hokies is the most-ever in an ACC Tournament game for Tech and the most points against any ACC competition in a regulation games since Tech defeated Georgia Tech, 102-77, on Feb. 13, 2011 in Cassell Coliseum ... The last time Tech scored at least 96 points on a neutral court in a non-overtime game was March 5, 1982, when Tech defeated Cincinnati, 106-92, in the Metro Conference Tournament in Memphis, Tennessee.

Wrapping Up the FSU Game

The Hokies have won games in consecutive ACC Tournament for the first time since the 2011 and 2012 ACC Tournaments ... The Hokies are now 8-11 all-time in the ACC Tournament and 1-1 in ACC Tournament games at the Verizon Center ... The Hokies are now 2-0 against Florida State in the ACC Tournament ... Tech is 7-5 in ACC Tournament opening games since joining the league in the 2004-05 season.

Some Topped Marks

Zach LeDay's 12 rebounds sets a new school record for individual rebounds in an ACC Tournament game ... The old mark was 11 by Jamon Gordon (3-7-07) and Jeff Allen (3-12-10) ... LeDay's five blocked shots sets a new school record for blocked shots in an ACC Tournament game ... The old mark was three, set by Coleman Collins against Virginia in the 2006 ACC Tournament ... The Hokies' 18 assists sets a new school record for most team assists in an ACC Tournament game ... The old mark was 15, set against Wake Forest in 2007 and North Carolina in 2009 ... The team's five blocked shots (all by LeDay) ties the school record for blocked shots in an ACC Tournament game ... Tech also blocked five shots against Virginia in the 2006 ACC Tournament and Wake Forest in the 2007 ACC Tournament.

Beating Top Teams

With the win over No. 7 Miami on March 5, the Hokies have won two games against top 10 teams this season, the first time that has happened since Tech won three top 10 (actually top 5) games in the 2006-07 season.

Shooting Star

In the last two games, **Justin Bibbs** is 9-of-15 from beyond three-point range ... He is second in the ACC in three-point percentage ... This is the sixth time this season that he has made at least four three-pointers in a game.

The 400 Club

With **Zach LeDay's** 485 points and **Seth Allen's** 451 points, the Hokies have two 400-plus point scorers on the same team since Malcolm Delaney (637 pts.) and Jeff Allen (454 pts.) accomplished the feat in the 2010-11 season ... **Justin Bibbs** is just five points short of the mark.

LeDay's Doubles

Zach LeDay scored 15 points and grabbed 12 rebounds in the win over Florida State on Wednesday night ... That marked his 10th double-double of the season and third against ACC competition ... That is the most double-doubles for a Hokie since Jeff Allen had 15 double-doubles in the 2010-11 season ... Led by LeDay's 10 double-doubles, the Hokies have 17 double-doubles this season, the most since that same 2010-11 season, when Tech played combined for 18 double-doubles.

Some Numbers on Zach

Zach LeDay has 485 points this season ... That is the most points in a season for a Hokie since Erick Green scored his school-record 801 points in the 2012-13 season and LeDay's 15.2 points per game is the best since Green's 25.0 ppg that same season ... LeDay's 7.7 rebounds per game average is the best for Tech since Jeff Allen averaged 9.7 rpg in the 2010-11 season ... LeDay entered Tech's top 10 blocked shots in a single-season list in the win over Miami ... He is now tied with Rolan Roberts for eighth on the all-time list, with 50.

Getting It Done In The Classroom

Devin Wilson and **Jalen Hudson** have been named to the 2016 All-ACC Academic team ... This is Wilson's second year on the team and Hudson makes it for the first time.

Zach is Honored

Zach LeDay has been named honorable mention All-ACC for the 2015-16 season by the ACC coaches and the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association ... Entering the 2016 ACC Tournament, the redshirt junior is averaging 15.2 points and 7.6 rebounds per game in his first season with the Hokies.

Keeping It to Ourselves

In the win over Florida State on Wednesday night, the Hokies committed just nine turnovers ... With the win, Hokies are now 9-0 when they commit 10-or-fewer turnovers this season ... In the win over NC State on Jan. 2, the Hokies committed just four turnovers ... The four turnovers was the fewest-ever for the Hokies in a regular season ACC game ... It is the fewest turnovers for the Hokies since turned the ball over three times against Miami in the first round of the 2014 ACC Tournament.

Differentially Speaking

The Hokies lost at Miami by 16 points on Feb. 17 and defeated the Hurricanes by 14 points on March 5 ... The 30-point differential is the largest for the Hokies between a win and a loss in a single season since Tech defeated Virginia, 84-57 in Blacksburg and lost at Virginia, 69-56, in the 2006-07 season.

Close Encounters

The Hokies are 7-4 in games decided by four points or less, or in overtime ... The 11 total games are the most by any ACC team this season.

Analytics and Such

According to Kenpom.com, the Hokies are first nationally in free throw rate ... The Hokies are 75th out of 351 Division I teams in defensive efficiency, up from 245th last season ... Last season, the Hokies were 342nd in the nation in percentage of scoring from free throws; this season, the Hokies are second nationally in this metric ... **Seth Allen** is ranked 91st in Division I and fourth among ACC players in offensive rating.

To The Point

Virginia Tech allowed Boston College 56 points in their 71-56 victory in Chestnut Hill on Feb. 23 ... The 56 points is the fewest points Tech has allowed in an ACC road victory since defeating No. 15 Virginia, 47-45, in John Paul Jones Arena on Jan. 22, 2012 ... The Hokies allowed Pittsburgh 61 points in the 65-61 Tech home in on March 2 ... That is the second-lowest ACC opponent point total of the season for the Hokies.

The News on 5

Justin Robinson scored 18 points in the win over Florida State on Wednesday night; setting a new career high ... He has scored in double-figures in seven of the last eight games for the Hokies.

Buzz Williams Info

Buzz Williams begins his second season as the head coach of the Hokies ... Now in his ninth season as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 183-121.

From 3!

The Hokies made 11-of-19 three-point field goal attempts in the win over Florida State on Feb. 20 ... That ties a season-high for Tech (Tech was 11-of-21 from beyond the arc at Pittsburgh) ... The 57.9 percent from three-point range is also a season high ... Tech made 12 three-pointers against Duke last season and last shot better than 57.9 percent from three-point range in a game against VMI two seasons ago, making 11-of-17, for 64.7 percent ... The last time the Hokies shot better than 57.9 percent from three-point range in an ACC game was on Feb. 22, 2011, when Tech made 8-of-12 three-point attempts in a win at Wake Forest.

200 and Rising

Zach LeDay now has 247 rebounds on the year ... The last time a Hokie had more than 247 rebounds in a season was 2010-11, when Jeff Allen had 330 boards.

All the Way Back

In the win over NC State on Jan. 2, the Hokies rallied from a 16-point deficit ... That is the largest comeback of the season and the first time the Hokies had rallied from a double-digit deficit since coming back from a 10-point deficit to defeat Georgia Tech last season ... The last time the Hokies overcame more than a 16-point deficit was a 17-point comeback over West Virginia on Nov. 12, 2013 ... Tech has thrice come back from 10-point halftime deficits, the most by any ACC team.

The New Guys

Thirty-two games into the season, Tech has had 21 instances of a player scoring 20 points or higher ... Of those 21 times, 16 have been by either **Zach LeDay** or **Seth Allen**, each who began their Hokie playing careers this season ... **Justin Bibbs** and **Jalen Hudson** have collected the other five games ... LeDay has scored in double-figures in 26 of the 32 games and Allen in 26 of the 32 games.

ACC Features Tough Competition

This season, the Hokies have played consecutive games against a nationally-ranked team four times (either AP or coaches poll, or both) ... Overall, Tech has played 10 games against a ranked team, with eight of those games coming against ACC competition ... Last season, Tech played a total of seven games against ranked teams and six games the year before ... The 10 games against AP-ranked teams is a high for a season for the Hokies since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... In tonight's game, Miami enters the contest ranked 11th nationally.

Getting There

Throughout the 18-game ACC regular season, the Hokies averaged 24.9 free throws attempted per game ... Last season, Tech averaged 15.3 attempts per game ... Tech shot 448 free throws in ACC play this season, after attempting just 275 free throws in 18 ACC games a year ago ... A year ago, Tech shot 66.9 percent from the free throw line in conference play; this season, the Hokies are shooting 71.7 percent from the line in league play ... In the win over Florida State on Wednesday night, the Hokies were 30-of-37 from the line, for 81.1 percent.

10 Facts

The Hokies finished the regular season 10-8 in the ACC ... Tech won just two league games each of the last two seasons ... Tech's 19 overall wins surpasses the team's win total of last season and is the most since the Hokies went 22-12 overall in the 2010-11 season ... The 10 ACC wins is most since going 10-6 in the 2009-10 season ... Tech was 7-2 at home in ACC play and won seven home conference games for the first time since the 2009-10 season, when the Hokies also won seven ACC home games.

Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

Tech is 32-171 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... The Hokies are 15-63 against nationally-ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season ... Tech is 2-7 against ranked teams this season ... The last time the Hokies defeated a nationally-ranked team was March 5, 2016, when Tech defeated No.7 Miami, 77-62, in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies are 0-4 all-time against teams ranked 11th nationally ... These numbers are for teams ranked in the AP poll.

It Is Better to Give, A Lot

Against Northwestern, **Devin Wilson** recorded five assists, cracking the 300 career assists total ... He now has 353 career assists, good for 3.8 assists per game ... Wilson entered the top 10 in assists in school history at 10th place in the win over Grambling State, when he dished out four assists ... In front of his home-town fans in Pittsburgh, he moved into eighth place in career assists, passing Brendan Dunlap ... His 353 career assists is sixth among active ACC players.

Really Young Again This Season

The Hokies once again this season field one of the youngest teams in the nation ... According to kenpom.com, Tech is 308 out of 351 NCAA Division I teams in experience, at just 1.22 years per player ... Tech is 14th out of 15 ACC teams in experience ... Players new to the Virginia Tech program this season account for 58.3 percent of minutes played for the Hokies, second-highest among ACC teams.

431 and Counting

Tech has now hit a three-point field goal in 431 consecutive games, the most in school history ... The Hokies have hit a three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Since the three-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time Tech did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

The Hot Hands of the Hokies

The Hokies shot 53.7 percent for the game in the win over Florida State on Wednesday night ... That is the highest game percentage for the Hokies this season.

Earlier Against Miami

Virginia Tech is 1-1 against the Hurricanes this season ... Miami, ranked 11th at the time, defeated the Hokies, 65-49, in Coral Gables on Feb. 17 ... **Justin Robinson** led the Hokies with 12 points ... This past Saturday in Cassell Coliseum, the Hokies defeated Miami, then ranked No. 7, 77-62 ... Tech shot 52.9 percent from the floor, including 58.3 percent in the second half ... Four Hokies scored in double-figures, led by 19 points from **Justin Bibbs** and 15 points and eight assists from Robinson ... The Hokies and the Hurricanes are permanent ACC scheduling partners.
