### About Tonight's Game

The Hokies enter the game 2-0 on the season ... VMI is 1-1 this season.

### Last Time Out: VT 99, High Point 73

The Hokies defeated High Point, 99-73, in Cassell Coliseum on Tuesday night ... **Ahmed Hill** scored a career-high 20 points to lead four Hokies in double figures ... **Seth Allen** came off the bench to add 17 points, **Khadim Sy** had 14 points and **Zach LeDay** added 12 points.

### Series Against the Keydets

This is the Hokies second-longest rivalry, dating back to the 1908-09 season ... Tech is 90-43 all-time against VMI ... Tech has won the last five games in the series, including an 76-52 win last season in Cassell Coliseum ... The Hokies are 55-10 all-time in home games against VMI and 20-1 in Cassell Coliseum.

### Honoring T. Marshall Hahn

The Virginia Tech athletics family suffered a loss this past May when former president Dr. T. Marshall Hahn passed away at the age of 89 ... Dr. Hahn was the university's president from 1962-74, and transformed the school into the institution that it is today ... During his tenure, Hahn used athletics to bring national exposure to the university ... He oversaw the finishing of the building of Cassell Coliseum and the construction of Lane Stadium ... In the years that followed his tenure, he remained one of the athletics department's most ardent supporters ... The Hahn Hurst Basketball Practice Center is named in his honor, and Hahn was close friends with members of both the men's and women's coaching staffs until his passing ... Today, we celebrate his life and all his contributions to athletics.

### Welcome Back, Med

**Ahmed Hill** has made quite a comeback for the Hokies ... After missing the 2015-16 season following knee surgery, Hill made his Hokies return in the win over Maine ... Hill, earning the start, scored 14 points and grabbed three rebounds in 30 minutes of action ... Then in the win over High Point, Hill scored a career-high 20 points ... He also recorded career-highs with six made three-pointers and four assists ... He is shooting .522 from the field and an even-better .529 from three-point range.

### Making Points on Points vs. High Point

In the Hokies' win over High Point, the Hokies scored 99 points, the most points by a Virginia Tech team since a 105-92 win over VMI on Nov. 18, 2013 in Cassell Coliseum ... In the High Point win, Tech scored 60 points in the first half, the most for a Tech team since scoring 61 points in the second half of the aforementioned VMI game ... The 60 points is the most points scored in a first half since Tech joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season.

### Hot from the Field

In the win over High Point, the Hokies shot 56.1 percent from the field, the most in a game since shooting 61.0 percent in the win over Liberty on Nov. 19, 2014.

### In a Giving Mood

In the win over High Point, Tech had 24 assists in the game ... It's the most in a single game for the Hokies since Tech had 25 assists in a win over Charleston Southern on Jan. 7, 2008.

### Have a Day, LeDay

Senior **Zach LeDay** started the 2016-17 season right where he ended last season, on a hot note ... LeDay led the Hokies with 20 points and 12 rebounds in the win over Maine ... It marked his 13th double-double at Virginia Tech and the fifth double-double with at least 20 points ... It also marks his third consecutive double-double and his fourth in his last five games ... The performance is the first Hokie to have a 20-point double-double off the bench since Jeff Allen had 24 points and 13 rebounds off the bench in a win over VMI on Dec. 9, 2009.

### Wrapping Up the High Point Game

The Hokies held the Panthers to just three offensive rebounds ... The Hokies made 14 of their first 15 field goal attempts ... The Hokies are now 2-1 all-time against the Panthers.

### Hit the Road, Jack

Following tonight's game against VMI, the Hokies will embark on a 10-day, four game road trip against top-level competition ... Tech will travel to Anaheim, California to compete in the Wooden Legacy, to be played on the campus of Cal. State Fullerton and the Honda Center in Anaheim ... Tech will open play on Thanksgiving Day against New Mexico and then will play either Cal State Northridge or Texas A&M on Friday, in Fullerton ... The final game will be held in Honda Center, home of the Anaheim Ducks, on Sunday ... Tech then heads off to Ann Arbor, Michigan, to play the Wolverines in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on Wednesday, Nov. 30.

### Commonwealth Notes

Virginia Tech is 428-314 (.577) all-time against schools from Virginia ... Tech was 3-1 this season against Virginia schools ... The Hokies have played 14 schools from the state all-time ... The only state Division I school that Tech has not played is Hampton ... Tech holds winning records against 10 of the schools and even records against two others ... Tech will play VMI and Virginia from the Commonwealth this year.

### A Fine Start

**Khadim Sy** made his collegiate debut on Friday night in the win over Maine ... The freshman post earned the start and had a solid six points, four rebounds and team-high three blocked shots in the win ... In the win over High Point, Sy recorded his first double-figure scoring game of his career, with 14 points on 6-of-9 from the field ... He also had a team-high six rebounds.

### Solid Returns

The Hokies return their top four players in scoring average from last season and eight of the top nine ... Tech returns the top five players in rebounding average ... Only one player that averaged at least 20 minutes per game last year does not return this season.

### Not Here Now, Will Be Here Later

The Hokies will be without **Devin Wilson** for the early part of the season ... The senior guard, and wide receiver, is playing football for the Hokies this fall ... He currently has two catches for 13 yards ... He will rejoin the basketball team when the football season concludes.

### Who Returns from Missing Last Year

The Hokies return two players who missed last season due to medical issues ... **Ahmed Hill**, who averaged 8.7 points and 3.7 rebounds per game as a freshman two seasons ago, returns after missing last season following off-season knee surgery ... **Ty Outlaw**, a junior college transfer who missed last season due to a medical issue, also returns to action this season.

Virginia Tech assistant coach **Jamie McNeilly** spent some of his summer in Chile ... He was an assistant coach with the Canadian National team at the FIBA U18 Americas Championship in Valdivia, Chile, a team that featured Virginia Tech signee Nickeil Alexander-Walker and finished with the Silver Medal ... Last summer, he was an assistant with the Canadian team at the FIBA U19 Championship in Heraklion, Greece, where **Justin Bibbs'** USA Basketball team won the gold medal ... McNeilly has contributed to the Canadian National team system since 2011.

This year's team has some interesting brother notes ... Freshman guard **Tyrie Jackson's** older brother, Tadic, is a junior guard at ACC rival Georgia Tech ... Senior **Zach LeDay** doesn't have to wait for a January ACC game to see his younger brother, Seth ... **Seth LeDay** is a junior transfer for the Hokies ... Seth will sit out the 2016-17 season due to transfer rules.

### Two Who Won't Play

Two Virginia Tech players will not play this season ...

**Seth LeDay**, a junior college transfer from NW Mississippi Community College and **Nick Fullard**, a walk-on transfer from Division II Belmont Abbey, will not play this season due to transfer rules ... LeDay is the younger brother of Hokie senior **Zach LeDay**.

### Finishing Strong

Last season, **Zach LeDay** was named honorable mention All-ACC by both the coaches and the media ... In the four games he played following that announcement, LeDay scored a total of 73 points and grabbed 40 rebounds ... He averaged 18.3 points and 10.0 rebounds per game in those four contests and recorded three double-doubles.

### The 400 & 500 Clubs

With **Zach LeDay's** 543 points, **Seth Allen's** 514 points and **Justin Bibbs' 411** points, the Hokies had three 400-plus point scorers on the same team since Malcolm Delaney (667 pts.), Dorenzo Hudson (500 pts.) and Jeff Allen (409 pts.) accomplished the feat in the 2009-10 season ... That season was also the last year that Tech had two 500-point scorers.

### Winning Streak

The Hokies won six consecutive games against ACC competition after defeating Florida State in the ACC Tournament last season, the first time since the 1964-65 season that has occurred, when the Hokies won eight consecutive games against conference foes ... That was Tech's final season in the Southern Conference.

### Century Mark

In the win over Maine, Virginia Tech guard **Justin Robinson** dished out his 100th career assist.

### What is a Hokie?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics ... The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Virginia Tech has announced the signing of two players to National Letters of Intent during the November early signing period ... Nickeil Alexander-Walker, a 6-6 guard/forward from Toronto, Canada who plays at Hamilton Heights Christian Academy in Chattanooga, Tennessee and Wabissa Bede, a 6-1 guard from North Andover, Massachusetts who plays at Cushing Academy in Ashburnham, Massachusetts ... Welcome to the Hokie Nation!

### 563 in the Cassell

With the win over High Point on Tuesday night, the Hokies have a 563-188 overall record in Cassell Coliseum, good for a .750 winning percentage ... The win over Florida State in 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and two losing seasons in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech is 2-0 in Cassell this season ... Tech was 7-2 in ACC games in Cassell Coliseum last season and 14-5 overall.

### 200 and Rising

**Zach LeDay** grabbed 275 rebounds last year ... That is the most rebounds in a season for a Virginia Tech player since 2010-11, when Jeff Allen had 330 boards.

### Buzz's Bunch

Buzz's Bunch is a non-profit organization that Coach Buzz Williams created seven years ago when he was first named head coach at Marquette University.

Buzz's Bunch is a way to bring together children with disabilities and help them to fall in love with the game of basketball. Since it's creation, the group has evolved into so much more. Buzz's Bunch members create some unforgettable relationships and memories. Most of all, every player, coach, or staff member feels lucky to learn from these members and be touched by them.

Being a Buzz's Bunch member includes an invitation to a camp over the summer, which includes spending time with the team and staff, lunch and a free t-shirt. Additionally, there is a Buzz's Bunch calendar at the beginning of the year and another event over the winter. The team tries to keep in touch with members throughout the year and the organization changes with time as new opportunities exist.

Credentials may be picked up the day before a game from secretary Donna Smith in the Strategic Communications Office ... Credentials not mailed or picked up will be held at the Will Call Window located at the front entrance to Cassell Coliseum.

### Media Information

Media parking is extremely limited. Parking is available in Lot 3 beyond the south end zone of Lane Stadium ... There is a shuttle for media members parking in this lot ... Requests for parking credentials should be made using the online credentialing system ... In addition to being available online at [hokiesports.com](http://hokiesports.com), media information and game notes are available by email, as soon as they are updated ... Media members wishing to be placed on this list should email Bill Dyer, at [wdyer@vt.edu](mailto:wdyer@vt.edu), and ask to be placed on the list.

### Photo Information

The NCAA has established a control policy to keep the court free from congestion ... Only photographers on assignment and members of the television media are given photo credentials. Freelance or amateur photographers will not be issued credentials ... Accredited photographers may work along the playing floor at both ends behind the restriction line established by the NCAA ... Permission to install strobe lighting must be made, in writing, to Bill Dyer, men's basketball SID, at least 10 days in advance of the game ... There will be no cameras mounted behind the glass on either end of the court, except by rights holding broadcast entities ... Photographers should follow the same credentialing system as listed above.

### HEAD COACH BUZZ WILLIAMS



In his two years at Virginia Tech, Buzz Williams already has ushered in an exciting new era of basketball. The head coach of the men's squad is beginning his third season here in Blacksburg, and he has the Hokies poised to continue their growth as a program in the toughest conference in college basketball. He and his staff take a simplistic, yet very

effective approach – "Get Better."

Last season, the Hokies were one of the most improved teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference and the NCAA. Predicted, once again, to reside near the bottom of the league standings, the Hokies finished with a 20-15 overall record under Williams, including a 10-8 mark in the ACC. Tech advanced to the second round of the 2016 NIT, defeating Princeton at home in overtime before falling at BYU two days later.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record. He began building the culture that would allow the Hokies to enjoy future successes. The team went a long ways toward establishing an identity – one predicated on hard work, accountability both on and off the court and playing with a tough, competitive nature. Williams compiled a 31-37 record in his first two seasons in Blacksburg.

Recruiting is the lifeblood of any intercollegiate athletics program, and Williams has led the Hokies to new highs in this area. And while he has been able to attract elite recruits, he is less focused on national perception and more on finding what he likes to call, "OKGs", or "our kind of guys."

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, he had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season – the same season that the team won the Big East Conference regular-season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure. In his nine-plus seasons as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 186-123.

"The growth of the Hokies' basketball program and the renewed energy under Buzz Williams in his first two seasons has been remarkable," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. "We've seen improvement in all facets. He's an educator first and foremost. He loves his players. They play hard for him. Everyone within the program and around the department has embraced Buzz's work ethic, passion, and attention to detail. We certainly have positive momentum and want to do all we can to keep it going. We believe in Coach Williams and his staff. Exciting times in Blacksburg."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette during the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 20 seasons, and 2016-17 will mark his 10th campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached more than 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league Players of the Year, two conference Freshmen of the Year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07, and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top 50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games



coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40 best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA

Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure, and HoopScoopOnline.com named him one of the top assistants in the country.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M-Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.
