The Hokies enter the game 7-1 on the season ... Mississippi is 6-2 this season.

### Last Time Out: VT 75, UMES 59

The Hokies defeated Maryland-Eastern Shore, 75-59, on Wednesday night in Cassell Coliseum ... **Zach LeDay** led four Hokies in double figures with 23 points ... **Justin Robinson** added 12 points and **Seth Allen** scored 11 points and tied a career-high with eight assists ... Tech out rebounded the Hawks, 34-25 and did not allow UMES a fast break point.

### Series Against the Rebels

This is the fourth all-time meeting between the two schools and the Rebels hold a 2-1 advantage in the series ... Ole Miss won the last meeting, 81-72, on March 26, 2008, in Cassell Coliseum in the third round of the 2008 NIT ... Tech is 0-1 in home games against the Rebels ... Tech is 51-57 all-time against schools currently in the SEC.

### What a Sellout

Earlier this week, the Virginia Tech Athletics Department announced that the Dec. 31 ACC opener against Duke in Cassell Coliseum is officially a sellout ... Tech will do a student lottery for that game, which takes place during winter break ... It is the second sellout of the season, following the sellout of the home opener against Maine on Nov. 11 ... The Duke game sold out less than 24 hours after single game ACC tickets went on sale to Hokie Club members and season ticket holders ... There were no general public sales on the Duke game ... Single game tickets will go on sale to the general public on Wednesday, Dec. 14 at 10 a.m.

According to Kenpom.com, the Hokies are ranked 35th nationally ... Tech is eighth nationally in adjusted offensive efficiency and steal percentage and 27th in raw offensive efficiency ... Tech is 24th in effective field goal percentage and turnover percentage ... The Hokies are 16th in free throw rate ... Individually, **Zach LeDay** is 22nd nationally in player stats with 24% of possession used.

### Here You Go

**Seth Allen** was in quite the giving mood in the win over UMES ... Allen tied a career-high with eight assists, while only committing one turnover in 31 minutes of action ... The eight assists is tied for the most by a Hokies this season ... Allen also added 11 points, a blocked shot and a steal in the win.

### Hamilton to Have Surgery

**Johnny Hamilton** will have surgery on a ruptured flexor tendon in his left thumb and will miss the remainder of the season ... The surgery will likely take place next week ... Hamilton has appeared in three games this season and 20 games in his two-year Virginia Tech career.

### Fast Start

The Hokies are off to a 7-1 start this season ... This marks the team's best start through eight games since the 2012-13 season, when Tech started the campaign 7-1 ... The last time the Hokies started undefeated through eight games was the 1981-82 season, when Tech opened the season 9-0 ... The Hokies finished the month of November 6-1 overall.

### Not Many Points

The Hokies allowed Nebraska just 53 points in the third place game of the Wooden Legacy on Sunday ... That is the fewest points allowed by the Hokies since Tech defeated Grambling State, 87-52, on Dec. 19, 2015 ... It is the lowest point total of a Virginia Tech opponent from a Power 5 conference since Virginia defeated the Hokies, 50-47, on Jan. 25, 2015.

### What A Trip!

The Hokies have recently returned from an epic 10-day, four-game road trip, that included stops in Anaheim, California and Ann Arbor, Michigan ... Tech was 3-1 on the trip, all against top-level competition and highlighted by a 73-70 win at Michigan in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge ... Tech also posted wins against New Mexico and Nebraska and suffered a close, 68-65, loss to Texas A&M.

### B1G Week

When the Hokies defeated Nebraska, 66-53, in Anaheim, California in the Wooden Legacy and Michigan, 73-70, in Ann Arbor on Nov 30 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge, it marked the first time in school history that Tech defeated Big Ten schools in back-to-back games ... In 2009, the Hokies won at Iowa and at Penn State in December, but the games were not back-to-back ... The win over Nebraska marked the Hokies' first win over a Big Ten team since Nov. 27, 2012 (exactly four years to the day), when Tech defeated Iowa, 95-79, in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge in Cassell Coliseum ... It was the Hokies first win over a Big Ten school away from Blacksburg since the Hokies downed the Hawkeyes, 70-64, in Iowa City in the 2009 ACC/Big Ten Challenge ... As a side note, the Hokies won two games against Big Ten schools in the 2009-10 season (also won 66-64 at Penn State that season).

### Up to the Challenge

With the help of Virginia Tech's 73-70 win at Michigan on Nov. 30, the ACC reclaimed the title of the ACC/Big Ten Challenge ... The ACC won nine of the 14 contests ... It marked the ACC's first win in the annual series since 2008 ... The ACC has now won 11 of the 18 titles.

### Welcome Back, Med

**Ahmed Hill** has made quite a comeback for the Hokies ... Hill missed the 2015-16 season following knee surgery ... Hill, earning the start in the opener against Maine, scored 14 points in 30 minutes of action ... In the win over High Point, Hill scored a career-high 20 points ... He also recorded career-highs with six made 3-pointers and four assists ... In the loss to Texas A&M, Hill tied his career-high in three-pointers made, going 6-for-11 from behind the arc against the Aggies ... In the win over Nebraska, Hill scored all 12 of his points in the second half in the win.

### Strong Start for LeDay

**Zach LeDay** started the 2016-17 season right where he ended last year ... LeDay led the Hokies with 20 points and 12 rebounds in the win over Maine ... It marked his 13th double-double at Tech and the fifth double-double with at least 20 points ... It also marked his third consecutive double-double and his fourth in his previous five games ... The performance was the first Hokie to have a 20-point double-double off the bench since Jeff Allen had 24 points and 13 rebounds off the bench in a win over VMI on Dec. 9, 2009 ... In the win over VMI, LeDay had his second double-double of the season with 23 points and 12 rebounds ... He scored 19 points and grabbed nine rebounds in the win over Nebraska and followed that with 18 points and six rebounds in the win at Michigan ... He recorded his third 20-plus point game of the season with 23 points in the win over UMES ... He has scored in double figures in seven of the eight games this season.

### From the Start

Entering today's game, the Hokies have used the same starting line-up in each of the first eight games ... Last season, the Hokies used 12 different starting line-ups last season.

### Putting a Lid on the Hoop

The Hokies allowed Nebraska just 29.8 percent from the floor in the win on Nov. 27 ... That is the lowest opponent field goal percentage for Tech this season and the lowest since Tech held VMI to 25.7 percent from the floor on Nov. 21, 2015.

### They Are Free

The Hokies made 19 of 20 free throws in the win over New Mexico, good for 95.0 percent from the line ... That is the Hokies' second-best free throw percentage in a game with at least 20 attempts of all time ... The only better performance with at least 20 attempts was a 95.7 percent night against Dayton on Dec. 17, 1976 ... In that game, the Hokies made 22 of 23 from the line ... In the Wooden Legacy, the Hokies were a combined 45-55 from the line, for 81.8 percent ... Entering the tournament, the Hokies were shooting 59.4 percent from the free throw line for the season ... Tech is now averaging 73.2 percent from the line this season ... In the win over Nebraska, the Hokies were 3-of-their-first-9 from the line, then proceeded to make their final 13 attempts ... In the win at Michigan, Tech was 19-of-21 from the line, for 90.5 percent and made all 12 attempts in the second half and Tech was 15-of-19 from the line in the win over UMES.

### Hot from the Field

In the win over High Point, the Hokies shot 56.1 percent from the field, the most in a game since shooting 61.0 percent in the win over Liberty on Nov. 19, 2014 ... In the win over VMI, the Hokies shot 60.0 percent ... That marked the first time that the Hokies have shot 55 percent or better from the field in back-to-back games since Jan. 23 and 28, 2007, when Tech shot 58.1 percent at Miami and 59.9 percent at Georgia Tech.

### What A Day!

**Justin Robinson** had his best-ever performance for the Hokies in their win over New Mexico ... The sophomore point guard had a career-high 22 points, to go along with a career-high-tying eight assists ... Robinson also played a career-high 40 minutes, but did not commit a turnover in the game ... He added 14 points in the loss to Texas A&M and 11 points and four assists in the win at Michigan.

### From 3!

The Hokies enter today's game shooting 38.9 percent from three-point range ... The school record for highest three-point field goal percentage in a season is 39.5 percent, set in the 1995-96 season ... The Hokies are averaging 8.8 made three-pointers per game this season ... The Hokies are second in the ACC in three-point field goal percentage and third in three-point field goal percentage.

### Hokies in the National Stats

Through the games of Dec. 8, Tech is 18th nationally in assist/turnover ratio ... The Hokies are 21st in (fewest) turnovers per game and fewest total turnovers.

### Sharing is Good

In the win over High Point, Tech had 24 assists ... It's the most in a single game for the Hokies since Tech had 25 assists in a win over Charleston Southern on Jan. 7, 2008 ... The Hokies had 19 assists in the win over VMI ... Combined with the 24 assists against High Point, this marks the first time that the Hokies have had 19-or-more assists in back-to-back games since the second and third games of the 2011-12 season ... Tech had 20 assists against both Monmouth and FIU ... In the win over New Mexico, the Hokies dished out 20 assists and in the win over UMES, Tech had 19 assists ... **Justin Robinson** is fourth in the ACC in assists and Tech is third in the ACC in assist/turnover ratio.

### More on Sharing

In the win over VMI, **Justin Robinson** had six assists and **Seth Allen** and **Chris Clarke** had five assists each ... This marks the first time since the Hokies joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season that three Hokies had at least five assists in a single game.

### From the Start

Entering today's game, the Hokies have used the same starting line-up in each of the first eight games ... Last season, the Hokies used 12 different starting line-ups last season.

### 442 and Counting

Tech has now hit a three-point field goal in 442 consecutive games, the most in school history ... The Hokies have hit a three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Since the three-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time Tech did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

### Lotsa Points

During the first four games of the 2016-17 season, the Hokies scored 359 points ... That was the most points scored by a Tech men's basketball team in the first four games of a season since the 1988-89 season, when Tech scored 376 total points ... The 1988-89 team featured Tech's all-time leading scorer Bimbo Coles and sharp-shooter Wally Lancaster.

### A Fine Start

**Khadim Sy** made his collegiate debut in the win over Maine ... The freshman post earned the start and had a solid six points, four rebounds and team-high three blocked shots in the win ... In the win over High Point, Sy recorded his first double-figure scoring game of his career, with 14 points on 6-of-9 from the field and a team-high six rebounds ... Sy took it a step further in the win over New Mexico, as he grabbed a team-high 10 rebounds, the most for him this season.

### Double Century Marks

In the win over Maine, Virginia Tech guard **Justin Robinson** dished out his 100th career assist and **Seth Allen** hit the century mark for his Virginia Tech career in the win over VMI ... **Justin Bibbs** recorded his 100th career assist in the win over UMES.

### On The List

**Seth Allen** has been named to the Bob Cousy Award watch list for the 2016-17 season ... The award is given annually to the nation's top point guard.

### Few Points

The Hokies allowed UMES 16 points in the first half ... That is the fewest points allowed in a half this season.

### Making Points on Points vs. High Point

In the Hokies' win over High Point, the Hokies scored 99 points, the most points by a Virginia Tech team since a 105-92 win over VMI on Nov. 18, 2013 in Cassell Coliseum ... In the High Point win, Tech scored 60 points in the first half, the most for a Tech team since scoring 61 points in the second half of the afore mentioned VMI game ... The 60 points is the most points scored in a first half since Tech joined the ACC in the 2004-05 season.

### Finishing Strong

Last season, **Zach LeDay** was named honorable mention All-ACC by both the coaches and the media ... In the four games he played following that announcement, LeDay scored a total of 73 points and grabbed 40 rebounds ... He averaged 18.3 points and 10.0 rebounds per game in those four contests and recorded three double-doubles.

### O Canada

Virginia Tech assistant coach **Jamie McNeilly** spent some of his summer in Chile ... He was an assistant coach with the Canadian National team at the FIBA U18 Americas Championship in Valdivia, Chile, a team that featured Virginia Tech signee Nickeil Alexander-Walker and finished with the Silver Medal ... Last summer, he was an assistant with the Canadian team at the FIBA U19 Championship in Heraklion, Greece, where **Justin Bibbs'** USA Basketball team won the gold medal ... McNeilly has contributed to the Canadian National team system since 2011.

### While We Were Away

On the Hokies' recent 10-day, four game road trip, Tech made 64 of 76 free throw attempts, good for 84.2 percent from the line over that stretch ... Tech entered the first game of that trip, a victory over New Mexico, shooting 59.4 percent from the line and arrived back in Blacksburg shooting 72.4 percent from the line ... Tech made 19 of 20 attempts in the win over New Mexico and 19 of 21 attempts in the win at Michigan ... Justin Bibbs has made all 10 free throw attempts this season.

### Balanced Time

The Hokies have only one player averaging 30 minutes of action per game this season ... Six Hokies are averaging between 24 and 33 minutes of action this season ... Eight Hokies are averaging in double-figures in minutes played so far this season.

### 200 and Rising

**Zach LeDay** grabbed 275 rebounds last year ... That is the most rebounds in a season for a Virginia Tech player since 2010-11, when Jeff Allen had 330 boards ... He is on a similar pace again this season.

### Zach is Honored

**Zach LeDay** was named to the Wooden Legacy All-Tournament team, following his performance in Anaheim ... LeDay averaged 14.3 points and 5.7 rebounds in the three-game event.

### Winning Streak

The Hokies won six consecutive games against ACC competition after defeating Florida State in the ACC Tournament last season, the first time since the 1964-65 season that has occurred, when the Hokies won eight consecutive games against conference foes ... That was Tech's final season in the Southern Conference.

### The 400 & 500 Clubs

With **Zach LeDay's** 543 points, **Seth Allen's** 514 points and **Justin Bibbs' 411** points, the Hokies had three 400-plus point scorers on the same team since Malcolm Delaney (667 pts.), Dorenzo Hudson (500 pts.) and Jeff Allen (409 pts.) accomplished the feat in the 2009-10 season ... That season was also the last year that Tech had two 500-point scorers.

### Solid Returns

The Hokies returned their top four players in scoring average from last season and eight of the top nine ... Tech returned the top five players in rebounding average from last season ... Only one player that averaged at least 20 minutes per game last year did not return this season.

### Scoring Balance

Entering tonight's game, the Hokies have four players averaging in double figures ... The Hokies have played 10 players this season and nine have scored at least 10 points so far ... Six players have scored at least 55 points, but only one player has scored at least 100 points so far this season.

### Call It a Comeback

Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

### HEAD COACH BUZZ WILLIAMS



In his two years at Virginia Tech, Buzz Williams already has ushered in an exciting new era of basketball. The head coach of the men's squad is beginning his third season here in Blacksburg, and he has the Hokies poised to continue their growth as a program in the toughest conference in college basketball. He and his staff take a simplistic, yet very

effective approach – "Get Better."

Last season, the Hokies were one of the most improved teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference and the NCAA. Predicted, once again, to reside near the bottom of the league standings, the Hokies finished with a 20-15 overall record under Williams, including a 10-8 mark in the ACC. Tech advanced to the second round of the 2016 NIT, defeating Princeton at home in overtime before falling at BYU two days later.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record. He began building the culture that would allow the Hokies to enjoy future successes. The team went a long ways toward establishing an identity – one predicated on hard work, accountability both on and off the court and playing with a tough, competitive nature. Williams compiled a 31-37 record in his first two seasons in Blacksburg.

Recruiting is the lifeblood of any intercollegiate athletics program, and Williams has led the Hokies to new highs in this area. And while he has been able to attract elite recruits, he is less focused on national perception and more on finding what he likes to call, "OKGs", or "our kind of guys."

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, he had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the regional finals in the 2012-13 season – the same season that the team won the Big East Conference regular-season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. Six Marquette players made it to the NBA during Williams' tenure. In his nine-plus seasons as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 191-124.

"The growth of the Hokies' basketball program and the renewed energy under Buzz Williams in his first two seasons has been remarkable," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. "We've seen improvement in all facets. He's an educator first and foremost. He loves his players. They play hard for him. Everyone within the program and around the department has embraced Buzz's work ethic, passion, and attention to detail. We certainly have positive momentum and want to do all we can to keep it going. We believe in Coach Williams and his staff. Exciting times in Blacksburg."

Williams was an assistant at Marquette during the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 20 seasons, and 2016-17 will mark his 10th campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached more than 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league Players of the Year, two conference Freshmen of the Year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07, and his roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top 50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 25 years in 2005-06 and the previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games



coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40 best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA

Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure, and HoopScoopOnline.com named him one of the top assistants in the country.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M-Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple has two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.
