HOKIE NOTES

About Tonight's Game

The Hokies enter the game 3-1 on the season ... The Huskies are 1-3 on the season ... This is the final game of the 2K Classic.

Last Time Out: VT 103, Washington 79

The Hokies defeated Washington, 103-79, in the consolation game of the Championship Round of the 2017 2K Classic on Friday evening in Madison Square Garden ... **Justin Bibbs** scored 30 points to lead four Hokies in double figures ... **Ahmed Hill** scored 23 points and **Nickeil Alexander-Walker** added 20 points in the win ... **Justin Robinson** had 11 points, five assists and tied a career-high with four steals.

Century Marks

The Hokies defeated Washington, 103-79, in MSG on Friday ... The 103 points is the most points Tech has scored against a current Power 5 school in a regulation game since a 109-68 victory over South Carolina on Jan. 25, 1985 in Cassell Coliseum ... It is the first time that have achieved that feat away from Cassell Coliseum since a 106-75 win over the Gamecocks in Salem, Virginia on Dec. 22, 1960, the only other time this has occurred ... Tech has scored more than 100 points in three of its first four games for the first time in school history ... Tech has scored 100-or-more points three times this season for the first time since 1988-89.

Plenty of Points

In the Hokies' win over Washington, **Justin Bibbs** scored 30 points, **Ahmed Hill** scored 23 points and **Nickeil Alexander-Walker** scored 20 points ... That is the first time that a Hokie scored 30 points and two teammates scored at least 20 points in a game since March 18, 2009, when A.D. Vassallo scored 33 points, Jeff Allen had 23 points, J.T. Thompson had 21 points and Malcolm Delaney scored 20 points against Duquesne in the first round of the 2009 NIT.

Ahmed is En Fuego

Ahmed Hill is currently shooting 60.0 percent from three-point range ... In Madison Square Garden, Hill made 11 of his 15 three-points attempts, for 73.3 percent ... He is 39.8 percent in his career from three-point territory ... Hill is making 64.7 percent of his field goals this season and 70.0 percent of his free throws.

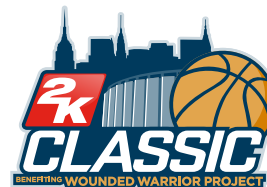

Sharing is Good

In the win over The Citadel, the Hokies recorded 36 assists in a game, breaking the old mark of 31, set against South Carolina State on Dec. 18, 1982 ... The Hokies assisted on 75 percent of their made baskets in The Citadel victory ... In the win over Washington, the Hokies assisted on 23 of their 30 made baskets, good for 76.7 percent ... For the season, Tech has 92 assists on 141 made field goals, good for 65.2 percent.

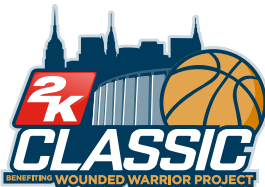
Hokies in the 2K Classic

The Hokies are competing in the 2K Classic benefiting Wounded Warrior Project, which began with the Hokies' 111-73 win over Detroit Mercy on Nov. 10 in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech was 1-1 in Madison Square Garden in the Championship Round last week

... Tonight's game will wrap up play in the event ...

This year marked the 20th year that The World's Most

Famous Arena will host the 2K Classic ... The mission of Wounded Warrior Project (WWP) is to honor and empower wounded warriors ... WWP's purpose is to raise awareness and to enlist the public's aid for the needs of injured service members, to help injured servicemen and women aid and assist each other, and to provide unique, direct programs and services to meet their needs.



The Hokies vs. Houston Baptist

This is the first-ever meeting between the two schools ... This is only the fourth all-time meeting between the Hokies and a current member of the Southland Conference ... Tech is 3-0 in those games.

Making Points About Points

Virginia Tech defeated Detroit Mercy, 111-79, in the season opener this season ... That is the most points for the Hokies since defeating The Citadel, 113-71, on Dec. 17 of last season ... The 111 points is the most in a season-opener for the Hokies since Tech defeated Johns Hopkins, 116-64 in the 1981-82 season opener in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech followed that with a 132-93 win over The Citadel ... The 132 points is the most points for a Virginia Tech team in a non-overtime game and is the second-highest point total of all time.

More Points About Points

Virginia Tech defeated The Citadel 132-93 ... Tech scored 66 points in each half ... The 66 points is the most points for Tech in a game since last Dec. 16, when Tech set a school-record with 73 second half points against The Citadel.

Even More Points About Points

The Hokies scored at least 111 points in back-to-back games to open this season ... That marks the second time in school history that the Hokies have accomplished that feat ... Tech defeated St. Bonaventure, 115-74, in Roanoke on Jan. 3, 1976 and Birmingham Southern, 112-67, in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 5, 1976.

Buzz Williams

Buzz Williams is 56-49 in his fourth year as the Hokies' head coach and an overall record of 209-135 record in 10-plus seasons as a collegiate head coach ... He won his 200th career game last season against Boston College on Jan. 29 in Cassell Coliseum.

10+11=Lotsa Minutes

Two Hokie players are two of the most experienced ACC players in the league this season ... **Justin Bibbs** has played a total of 3,100 minutes at Virginia Tech and **Devin Wilson** has played 2,847 minutes as a Hokie ... Tech has another player, **Ahmed Hill**, who has played 2,084 in just two-plus seasons at Virginia Tech.

He Earned It

Nick Fullard transferred from Division II Belmont Abbey College in North Carolina to Virginia Tech and joined the program as a walk-on ... Due to NCAA transfer rules, Fullard was forced to sit out last season ... Earlier this school year, head coach **Buzz Williams** awarded Fullard a scholarship ... Tech currently has 12 players on scholarship.

576 in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 578-190 overall record in Cassell Coliseum, for a .753 winning percentage ... The win over Florida State in 2011 was the 500th victory in the building ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and two losing seasons ... Tech is 2-0 in Cassell Coliseum this season ... Tech was 15-2 in Cassell last season, 7-2 in ACC games.

McNeilly has a Golden Summer

Virginia Tech assistant coach **Jamie McNeilly** has some new swag, a FIBA gold medal ... In July, McNeilly was an assistant coach on the Canadian team that won the gold medal in the FIBA U19 Basketball World Cup in Cairo, Egypt ... The Canadian team defeated the favored US team, 99-87, in the semifinals and captured the title with a 79-60 victory against Italy in the finals ... McNeilly, a Canadian from Toronto, has been involved in his country's developmental program for years, first as a player and now as a coach.

Selling Out

So far this season, the Hokies are two-for-two in sellouts ... The Hokies sold out the season opener against Detroit Mercy and again against The Citadel.

More on the Gate

With the five sellouts last season, the Hokies averaged 7,476 per game ... In the 2015-16 season, the Hokies averaged 6,658 and in the 2014-15 season, Tech averaged 5,744 ... Last year's attendance was the largest for the Hokies since averaging 8,395 in the 2010-11 season ... In the 2015-16 season, the Hokies averaged 7,529 for nine ACC home games; last season, Tech averaged 8,047 for ACC home games The best-ever ACC average attendance for the Hokies is 9,847 in the 2008-09 season.

We Miss Ty

Redshirt senior wing **Ty Outlaw** will miss the 2017-18 season following surgery for a torn ACL in his right knee ... He suffered the injury playing pick-up basketball in July ... Outlaw set a Virginia Tech record when he made eight three-pointers in the home win over No. 25 Miami on Feb. 27 ... Outlaw is on track to graduate with a degree in sociology in May.

The trio will enroll at Virginia Tech in the fall of 2018 ... Kabonogo is a 6-4, 180 lbs., guard from Toronto, Ontario and Putnam Science Academy in Putnam, Connecticut ... McAllister is a 6-4, 185 lbs., guard from Heritage High School in Wake Forest, North Carolina ... Nolley is a 6-7, 210 lbs., shooting guard at Langston Hughes High School in Fairburn, Georgia.

Providing Relief

The Virginia Tech men's basketball team participated in the "Hoops 4 Hurricane Relief" exhibition game against South Carolina in the Colonial Life Center in Columbia, South Carolina on Nov. 5 ... The exhibition event raised funds for those impacted by the recent storms, as net proceeds from the game supported hurricane relief efforts in Texas, South Florida and Puerto Rico ... Tickets for the game were \$10 for a general admission seat ... Funds raised from the game and the online donation will be directed to organizations benefitting the affected areas ... At halftime, both head coaches made sizable donations to the cause ... Both coaching staffs and members of each program have deep ties to the affected areas ... Frank Martin is a native of South Florida and **Buzz Williams** is a native Texan ... Virginia Tech associate head coach **Steve Roccaforte** is a Port Arthur, Texas, native that had family and close friends directly impacted by the devastation.

What is a Hokie?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics ... The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Trip of a Lifetime

Redshirt senior wing **Ty Outlaw** was part of a Virginia Tech Athletics trip to study in Rwanda ... Outlaw enrolled in UAP 3984: Sport, Policy and Society – a study abroad course that explores different sectors of international development and how sport can support such development ... Danny White, senior associate AD for student-athlete development, oversaw the course and led a contingent that included Tech student-athletes, students, and athletics department staff members Dr. Gary Bennett (sport psychologist) and Shelby Miller (coordinator of student-athlete development) on a two-week immersion in Rwanda, a small, landlocked country in Central Africa.

Reaching a Milestone

In the Hokies' 91-75 win at Boston College last season, **Justin Bibbs** scored his 1,000th career point ... He became the 45th Hokie to score 1,000 career points and currently has 1,091 points, 38th on the list, after passing five Hokies, including former teammate Zach LeDay, last week.

Title Changes

Several members of the Virginia Tech men's basketball staff received title changes this summer, to better reflect their duties and responsibilities ... Assistant coach **Steve Roccaforte** was promoted to associate head coach ... **Jeff Reynolds** is now the director of scouting and game management ... **Josh Chambers** is now the director of recruiting operations.

Conference Wins

The Hokies finished the 2016-17 regular season 10-8 in ACC play ... The 10 wins is tied for the most ACC wins for the Hokies since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... The Hokies have only won more than 10 games in any conference twice, in the 1995-96 season, when the Hokies were 13-3 in their first season in the Atlantic 10 and 11-4 in the 1956-57 season in the Southern Conference ... The Hokies were 10-4 in the 1984-85 season in the Metro Conference ... Tech's best conference record in the Big East Conference was 7-9 in the 2003-04 season, in the school's final season in the league.

Hokies in National Stats

As of Nov. 18, the Hokies are fourth nationally in field goal percentage, seventh in assists per game and 10th in three-point field goal percentage ... **Ahmed Hill** is 88th nationally in scoring.

470 and Counting

Tech has now hit a three-point field goal in 470 consecutive games, the most in school history ... The Hokies have hit a three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Since the three-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time Tech did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

5 was Honored

Justin Robinson was named to the 2017 All-ACC Academic team ... To be eligible, you must have a 3.0 GPA ... Robinson made the team for the first time.

Whew, That's Close

The Hokies were 10-8 in ACC games last season ... In the last eight victories, the Hokies won by more than three points just twice, in both Boston College games ... Tech won by double digits just three times in the ACC season, 89-75 over Duke, 83-73 over Syracuse and 91-75 at Boston College ... Tech was 6-2 in ACC games last season decided by five-or-fewer points and 8-3 in all games this season decided by five-or-fewer points ... Eleven ACC games were decided by six-or-fewer points and the Hokies were 7-4 in those games.

Special Night for Hokie Hoops

On Friday, Oct. 20, the Hokies hosted a pair of special events ... First, the annual National Bank of Blacksburg Tip-off Banquet was held on the court at the Hahn Hurst Basketball Practice Center ... Head coach **Buzz Williams** spoke about the upcoming season ... The sellout crowd was then led next door to Cassell Coliseum for the first Hokie Hoops Madness, a celebration of the men's and women's teams ... The crowd and special guests from the banquet witnessed special skills demonstrations, interactive games and the unveiling of the banners from the 2016-17 season ... The evening was punctuated by a special ring ceremony, where members of the men's team and staff received their NCAA Tournament rings ... The presentation was made special as honorary members of the community were invited onto the court to help with the ceremony.

Sprucing Up the Place

When Hokie fans arrive at Cassell Coliseum, there will be several new features for them to see, and a few they won't see ... Immediately following graduation in May, The Hokies removed about 4,000 seats in the lower bowl of the arena and replaced them with about 3,400 new, cushioned, wider seats with cup holders ... The new maroon seats are all part of the Hokies' commitment to give fans a more comfortable environment ... With the new seats, capacity in Cassell Coliseum is now 9,275 ... Another new feature fans will see is a newly re-designed playing court ... The new word marks are incorporated along with images of the War Memorial, Torgersen Bridge and Burruss Hall ... A maroon-tinted Hokie Stone is used in the lines around the playing court ... The name of the arena has also changed, as we are now known as "Carilion Clinic Court at Cassell Coliseum", reflecting the tremendous commitment of resources by Carilion Clinic, not only to Virginia Tech Men's Basketball, but to Virginia Tech as a whole ... One thing fans won't see is a total redesign and rebuild of the Bill Foster Basketball Suite locker room over the off-season, which also included the addition of a "green room" that will have multiple uses by a wide number of programs during each year.



Smile for the Camera

This season, the Virginia Tech men's basketball team will make a minimum of 27 television appearances ... All 18 ACC games will be telecast ... All games this season will either be televised or streamed live over the internet or to mobile apps ... Tonight is the first over-the-air broadcast of the season for Virginia Tech ... This is the first of 15 regular season games broadcast by the ESPN family of networks.

The Hokies in the Garden

After this past week, Tech is 8-3 in Madison Square Garden since 2004 ... Tech has also won two Holiday Festivals in this building ... All in all, the Hokies are 15-6 in MSG and won two NIT post-season titles, in 1973 and 1995.

Buzz Williams has proven that hard work, determination and an eye for details are key aspects in building an elite-level collegiate basketball program. The head coach of the men's squad begins his fourth season in Blacksburg, and he has the Hokies poised to continue their growth as a program in the toughest conference in college basketball. He and his staff take a simplistic, yet very effective approach – "Get Better."

Though his program has earned growing acclaim nationally, Williams does not focus on such external praise. He wakes up every morning with a sense of purpose to make the Hokies the best that they can be.

On Jan. 29, 2017, the Hokies defeated Boston College, 85-79, to give Williams his 200th career victory. Beginning his 11th season as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 209-135. Williams has compiled a 56-49 record in his first three-plus seasons in Blacksburg.

The Hokies are coming off their most successful season in the last decade. Tech finished the season 22-11 overall and earned their first NCAA Tournament bid since 2007. Tech was 10-8 in the ACC regular season for the second consecutive

season. The Hokies claimed three top 25 victories against ACC foes and finished with an impressive 11-1 in non-conference regular season action.

Williams led the Hokies through many of the usual obstacles that beset college basketball programs each season. Injuries were one such obstacle, but the Hokies weathered the injuries and continued to achieve. Towards the end of the season, with just a handful of healthy bodies, Tech thrived and earned its at-large NCAA Tournament berth through its efforts.

In his second season, the Hokies were one of the most improved teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference and the NCAA. Predicted, once again, to reside near the bottom of the league standings, the Hokies finished with a 20-15 overall record under Williams, including a 10-8 mark in the ACC. Tech advanced to the second round of the 2016 NIT, defeating Princeton at home in overtime before falling at BYU two days later.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record. He began building the culture that would allow the Hokies to enjoy future successes. The team went a long ways toward establishing an

identity – one predicated on hard work, accountability both on and off the court and playing with a tough, competitive nature.

"The continued growth of our basketball program under Buzz Williams has been dramatic and noticeable on a national level," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. "With the daily mantra of 'Get Better', this program has accomplished so much in his three seasons in Blacksburg. Buzz recruits and develops responsible, respectful student athletes who achieve and are successful on the court and in our community. Our future is very bright under Buzz's leadership"

Recruiting is the lifeblood of any intercollegiate athletics program, and Williams has led the Hokies to new heights in this area. While he has been able to attract elite recruits, he is less focused on national perception and more focused on finding what he likes to call, "OKGs", or "our kind of guys."

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, he had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the regional

Player of the Year. UNO claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top 50 nationally by HoopScoopOnline.com.

Prior to UNO, Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in

25 years in 2005-06. The previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, where he served as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40 best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure, and HoopScoopOnline.com named him one of the top assistants in the country.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M-Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple have two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.

finals in the 2012-13 season – the same season that the team won the Big East Conference regular-season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. During Williams' tenure, six Marquette players made it to the NBA.

Williams was an assistant at Marquette during the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 21 seasons, and 2017-18 will mark his 11th campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached more than 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league Players of the Year, two conference Freshmen of the Year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07. His roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference
