About Tonight's Game

The Hokies enter the game 5-1 on the season ... The Hawkeyes are 4-2 on the season ... This game is part of the 2017 Big Ten/ACC Challenge.

Last Time Out: VT 96, Morehead St. 63

The Hokies defeated Morehead State, 96-63, in Cassell Coliseum on Saturday afternoon ... Nickeil Alexander-Walker led four Hokies in double figures with 18 points ... Justin Bibbs added 15 points, Kerry Blackshear Jr., had 13 points and nine rebounds and Ahmed Hill scored 12 points ... Tech shot 57.4 percent from the floor, including 43.5 percent from beyond the arc ... Tech made 24 of 27 free throw attempts (88.9 percent).

The Hokies vs. Iowa

Tech is 3-0 all-time against the Hawkeyes, with all three previous meetings coming in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge ... Tech is 2-0 in Blacksburg in the previous meetings, most recently a 95-79 victory in 2012 ... Tech is 36-52 all-time against teams currently in the Big Ten.

The Hokies in the Challenge

The Hokies are 4-7 all-time in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge ... Tech is 2-3 in home Challenge games ... Both Virginia Tech home wins in the Challenge have come against lowa ... Tech



won its last game in the Challenge, 73-70, at Michigan last season, but lost its last home game in the Challenge, 81-79, to Northwestern in 2015.

Big Week

The Hokies host Iowa of the Big Ten tonight at 9 p.m. and then travel to Ole Miss of the SEC on Saturday for a 2 p.m. ET game ... This marks the first time since the 2012-13 season that Tech has played back-to-back games against Power 5 competition in less than a calendar week not part of an exempt tournament ... In that season, the Hokies defeated Iowa, 95-79, in Cassell Coliseum in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on Nov. 27 and followed that with an 81-71 home win over No. 15 Oklahoma State ... The last time Tech played such teams in which one of the games was a road game was the 2011-12 season, when Tech lost at Minnesota, 58-55, in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge and lost at home to Kansas State, 69-61, five days later.

Continuing to Climb

In the Hokies' 91-75 win at Boston College last season, **Justin Bibbs** scored his 1,000th career point ... He became the 45th Hokie to score 1,000 career points and currently has 1,131 points, 37th on the list, after passing Brian Chase

in the win over Houston Baptist ... Since his return to the line-up four games ago, Bibbs is averaging 21.3 points per game, shooting 66.7 percent from the floor, 50.0 percent from three-point range and 90.9 percent from the free throw line ... He has scored at least 15 points in all four games ... Bibbs is currently shooting 43.7 percent from three-point range for his career, which would be a new Virginia Tech school record.

Hokies in National Stats

As of Nov. 26, the Hokies lead the nation in scoring offense, assists per game, field goal percentage and three-point field goal percentage ... Tech is tied for 21st in three-point field goals per game and 25th in assist/turnover ratio.

10+11+13=Lotsa Minutes

Two Hokie players are two of the most experienced ACC players in the league this season ... **Justin Bibbs** has played a total of 3,159 minutes at Virginia Tech and **Devin Wilson** has played 2,873 minutes as a Hokie ... Tech has another player, **Ahmed Hill**, who has played 2,138 in just two-plus seasons at Virginia Tech.

Sharing is Good

In the win over The Citadel, the Hokies recorded 36 assists ... That sets a new school record for assists in a game, breaking the old mark of 31, set against South Carolina State on Dec. 18, 1982 ... The Hokies assisted on 75 percent of their made baskets in The Citadel victory ... In the win over Washington, the Hokies assisted on 23 of their 30 made baskets, good for 76.7 percent and in the win over Houston Baptist, Tech assisted on 21 of its 32 made baskets, for 65.6 percent ... For the season, Tech has 133 assists on 204 made field goals, for 65.2 percent ... So far this season, the Hokies' three point guards are a combined 57 assists and 22 turnovers ... Tech has five players with at least double figures in assists this season.

Century Marks

The Hokies defeated Washington, 103-79, in MSG on Nov. 17 ... The 103 points is the most points Tech has scored against a current Power 5 school in a regulation game since a 109-68 victory over South Carolina on Jan. 25, 1985 in Cassell Coliseum ... It is the first time that they have acheived that feat away from Cassell Coliseum since a 106-75 win over the Gamecocks in Salem, Virginia on Dec. 22, 1960, the only other time this has occurred ... Tech has scored more than 100 points in three of its first four games for the first time in school history ... Tech has scored 100-ormore points three times this season for the first time since 1988-89.

Bede Steps Up

In the Hokies' 99-73 win over Houston Baptist, freshman **Wabissa Bede** took every advantage of his time on the court ... Playing 11 minutes, all in the second half, Bede scored a career-high 13 points on 3-of-4 from the

field, including making his only three-point attempt ... He also was a perfect 6-of-6 from the free throw line ... All three true freshmen on this year's squad have nowscored in double figures at least once in the first five games.

Lots of Options

So far this season, the Hokies have had nine players record double figures in at least one of the six games played ... One other player has scored nine points in two separate games ... Last season, Tech had eight players score in double figures at least one ... Tech has four players with at least 20 points in a game and **Justin Bibbs** scored 30 points in the win over Washington.

Making Points About Points

Virginia Tech defeated Detroit Mercy, 111-79, in the season opener this season ... That is the most points for the Hokies since defeating The Citadel, 113-71, on Dec. 17 of last season ... The 111 points is the most in a season-opener for the Hokies since Tech defeated Johns Hopkins, 116-64 in the 1981-82 season opener in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech followed that with a 132-93 win over The Citadel ... The 132 points is the most points for a Virginia Tech team in a non-overtime game and is the second-highest point total of all time.

More Points About Points

Virginia Tech defeated The Citadel 132-93 ... Tech scored 66 points in each half ... The 66 points is the most points for Tech in a have since last Dec. 16, when Tech set a school-record with 73 second half points against The Citadel.

Even More Points About Points

The Hokies scored at least 111 points in back-to-back games to open this season ... That marks the second time in school history that the Hokies have accomplished that feat ... Tech defeated St. Bonaventure, 115-74, in Roanoke on Jan. 3, 1976 and Birmingham Southern, 112-67, in Cassell on Jan. 5, 1976.

Upcoming Numbers

Justin Bibbs made his 400th career field goal in the win over Morehead State and needs just one three-pointer to reach the 200 made plateau ... Chris Clarke needs two points for 500 for his career ... Kerry Blackshear Jr., needs two rebounds for 200 for his career and five points for 300 points for this career ... Justin Robinson needs six minutes for 2,000 minutes played for his career and 13 assists to reach the 300 assists plateau.

Buzz Williams

Buzz Williams is 58-49 in his fourth year as the Hokies' head coach and an overall record of 211-135 record in 10-plus seasons as a collegiate head coach ... He won his 200th career game last season against Boston College on Jan. 29 in Cassell Coliseum.

Plenty of Points

In the Hokies' win over Washington, **Justin Bibbs** scored 30 points, **Ahmed Hill** scored 23 points and **Nickeil Alexander-Walker** scored 20 points ... That is the first time that a Hokie scored 30 points and two teammates scored at least 20 points in a game since March 18, 2009, when A.D. Vassallo scored 33 points, Jeff Allen had 23 points, J.T. Thompson had 21 points and Malcolm Delaney scored 20 points against Duquesne in the first round of the 2009 NIT.

He Earned It

Nick Fullard transferred from Division II Belmont Abbey College in North Carolina to Virginia Tech and joined the program as a walk-on ... Due to NCAA transfer rules, Fullard was forced to sit out last season ... Earlier this school year, head coach **Buzz Williams** awarded Fullard a scholarship ... Tech currently has 12 players on scholarship.

The clubs at Clemson and Florida State were just shy of 25,000 members during the previous academic year ... Buzz Williams has announced the signings of Jonathan Kabongo, Jarren McAllister and Landers Nolley II to National Letters of Intent ... The trio will enroll at Virginia Tech in the fall of 2018 ... Kabonogo is a 6-4, 180 lbs., guard from Toronto, Ontario and Putnam Science Academy in Putnam, Connecticut ... McAllister is a 6-4, 185 lbs., guard from Heritage High School in Wake Forest, North Carolina ... Nolley is a 6-7, 210 lbs., shooting guard at Langston Hughes High School in Fairburn, Georgia.

The Virginia Tech men's basketball team participated in the "Hoops 4 Hurricane Relief" exhibition game against South Carolina in the Colonial Life Center in Columbia. South Carolina on Nov. 5 ... The exhibition event raised funds for those impacted by the recent storms, as net proceeds from the game supported hurricane relief efforts in Texas, South Florida and Puerto Rico ... Tickets for the game were \$10 for a general admission seat ... Funds raised from the game and the online donation will be directed to organizations benefitting the affected areas ... At halftime, both head coaches made sizable donations to the cause ... Both coaching staffs and members of each program have deep ties to the affected areas ... Frank Martin is a native of South Florida and Buzz Williams is a native Texan ... Virginia Tech associate head coach Steve Roccaforte is a Port Arthur, Texas, native that had family and close friends directly impacted by the devastation.

The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Last year's attendance was the largest for the Hokies since averaging 8,395 in the 2010-11 season ... In the 2015-16 season, the Hokies averaged 7,529 for nine ACC home games; last season, Tech averaged 8,047 for ACC home games ... The best-ever ACC average attendance for the Hokies is 9,847 in the 2008-09 season.

Trip of a Lifetime



Special Night for Hokie Hoops

On Friday, Oct. 20, the Hokies hosted a pair of special events ... First, the annual National Bank of Blacksburg Tip-off Banquet was held on the court at the Hahn Hurst Basketball Practice Center ... Head coach Buzz Williams spoke about the upcoming season ... The sellout crowd was then led next door to Cassell Coliseum for the first Hokie Hoops Madness, a celebration of the men's and women's teams ... The crowd and special guests from the banquet witnessed special skills demonstrations, interactive games and the unveiling of the banners from the 2016-17 season ... The evening was punctuated by a special ring ceremony, where members of the men's team and staff received their NCAA Tournament rings ... The presentation was made special as honorary members of the community were invited onto the court to help with the ceremony.

472 and Counting

Tech has now hit a three-point field goal in 472 consecutive games, the most in school history ... The Hokies have hit a three-pointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Since the three-point arc was added for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time Tech did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

Sprucing Up the Place

There are several new features for fans to see at Cassell CARILION CLINIC Coliseum, and a

few they won't see ... Immediately following graduation in May, the Hokies removed about 4,000 seats in the lower bowl of the arena and replaced them with about 3,400 new, cushioned, wider seats with cup holders ... The new maroon seats are all part of the Hokies' committment to give fans a more comfortable environment ... With the new seats, capacity in Cassell Coliseum is now 9,275 ... Another new feature fans will see is a newly re-designed playing court ... The new word marks are encorporated along with images of the War Memorial, Torgersen Bridge and Burruss Hall ... A maroon-tinted Hokie Stone is used in the lines around the playing court ... The name of the arena has also changed, as we are now known as "Carilion Clinic Court at Cassell Coliseum", reflecting the tremendous committment of resources by Carilion Clinic, not only to Virginia Tech Men's Basketball, but to Virginia Tech as a whole ... One thing fans won't see is a total redesign and rebuild of the Bill Foster Basketball Suite locker room over the off-season, which also included the addition of a "green room" that will have multiple uses by a wide number of programs during each year.

Smile for the Camera

This season, the Virginia Tech men's basketball team will make a minimum of 27 television appearances ... All 18 ACC games will be telecast ... All games this season will either be televised or streamed live over the internet or to mobile apps ... Tonight is the Hokies' first televised home game of the season.

McNeilly has a Golden Summer

Virginia Tech assistant coach **Jamie McNeilly** has some new swag, a FIBA gold medal ... In July, McNeilly was an assistant coach on the Canadian team that won the gold medal in the FIBA U19 Basketball World Cup in Cairo, Egypt ... The Canadian team defeated the favored US team, 99-87, in the semifinals and captured the title with a 79-60 victory against Italy in the finals ... McNeilly, a Canadian from Toronto, has been involved in his country's developmental program for years, first as a player and now as a coach.

Buzz Williams has proven that hard work, determination and an eye for details are key aspects in building an elite-level collegiate basketball program. The head coach of the men's squad begins his fourth season in Blacksburg, and he has the Hokies poised to continue their growth as a program in the toughest conference in college basketball. He and his staff take a simplistic, yet very effective approach – "Get Better."

Though his program has earned growing acclaim nationally, Williams does not focus on such external praise. He wakes up every morning with a sense of purpose to make the Hokies the best that they can be.

On Jan. 29, 2017, the Hokies defeated Boston College, 85-79, to give Williams his 200th career victory. Beginning his 11th season as a collegiate head coach, Williams has an overall record of 211-135. Williams has compiled a 58-49 record in his first three-plus seasons in Blacksburg.

The Hokies are coming off their most successful season in the last decade. Tech finished the season 22-11 overall and earned their first NCAA Tournament bid since 2007. Tech was 10-8 in the ACC regular season for the second consecutive

season. The Hokies claimed three top 25 victories against ACC foes and finished with an impressive 11-1 in non-conference regular season action.

Williams led the Hokies through many of the usual obstacles that beset college basketball programs each season. Injuries were one such obstacle, but the Hokies weathered the injuries and continued to achieve. Towards the end of the season, with just a handful of healthy bodies, Tech thrived and earned its atlarge NCAA Tournament berth through its efforts.

In his second season, the Hokies were one of the most improved teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference and the NCAA. Predicted, once again, to reside near the bottom of the league standings, the Hokies finished with a 20-15 overall record under Williams, including a 10-8 mark in the ACC. Tech advanced to the second round of the 2016 NIT, defeating Princeton at home in overtime before falling at BYU two days later.

In his inaugural season at Virginia Tech, Williams led the Hokies to an 11-22 overall record. He began building the culture that would allow the Hokies to enjoy future successes. The team went a long ways toward establishing an

identity – one predicated on hard work, accountability both on and off the court and playing with a tough, competitive nature.

"The continued growth of our basketball program under Buzz Williams has been dramatic and noticeable on a national level," Virginia Tech Director of Athletics Whit Babcock said. "With the daily mantra of 'Get Better', this program has accomplished so much in his three seasons in Blacksburg. Buzz recruits and develops responsible, respectful student athletes who achieve and are successful on the court and in our community. Our future is very bright under Buzz's leadership"

Recruiting is the lifeblood of any intercollegiate athletics program, and Williams has led the Hokies to new heights in this area. While he has been able to attract elite recruits, he is less focused on national perception and more focused on finding what he likes to call, "OKGs", or "our kind of guys."

Williams came to Virginia Tech following six seasons as the head coach of the Marquette Golden Eagles. At Marquette, he had a record of 139-69 and led the team to five NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the regional

finals in the 2012-13 season – the same season that the team won the Big East Conference regular-season title. Williams led the Golden Eagles to a 69-39 Big East Conference record during his time in Milwaukee. During Williams' tenure, six Marquette players made it to the NBA.

Williams was an assistant at Marquette during the 2007-08 season. MU concluded the year 25-10 and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2003.

His coaching career has included stints as an assistant, associate head and head coach. He has been at the NCAA Division I level for 21 seasons, and 2017-18 was will mark his 11th campaign as a head coach. Williams has recruited and coached more than 20 players who have earned all-conference accolades, including two league Players of the Year, two conference Freshmen of the Year and four Associated Press All-Americans.

Williams arrived in Milwaukee after serving for one season as the head coach at the University of New Orleans. He guided the Privateers to a 14-win campaign in 2006-07. His roster featured Bo McCalebb, the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. **UNO** claimed fourth place in the Sun Belt's Western Division and advanced to the league tournament quarterfinals. The squad claimed as many victories on the road that season as it had in the previous three seasons combined. His recruiting class for the 2007-08 season was ranked in the top 50 nationally by HoopScoop-Online.com.

Prior to UNO,

Williams served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Texas A&M for two seasons (2004-05 and 2005-06) under head coach Billy Gillispie. Both of his recruiting classes with the Aggies were ranked among the best in the nation and featured some of the top-ranked talent at the prep level. The squad made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in

25 years in 2005-06. The previous team posted the top turnaround in the nation, improving its win total in 2004-05 by 14 games compared to 2003-04.

Williams spent four seasons (2000-01 through 2003-04) at Colorado State, where he served as an assistant the first three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2003-04. Two of his recruiting classes were ranked among the 40 best in the nation, including the 2003 group, which was tabbed No. 1 in the Mountain West Conference. Colorado State made its first NCAA Tournament appearance in 13 years during his tenure, and HoopScoopOnline.com named him one of the top assistants in the country.

The Van Alstyne, Texas, native was previously an assistant at Northwestern State (1999-2000), Texas A&M-Kingsville (1998-99) and Texas-Arlington (1994-98). He earned a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Oklahoma City University in 1994 before completing his master's work in the same field at Texas A&M-Kingsville in 1999.

Williams is married to the former Corey Norman and the couple have two daughters, Zera and Addyson, and two sons, Calvin and Mason.
