Entering the NCAA Auburn Regional

The Hokies enter the NCAA Auburn Regional as the second seed and are ranked 12th in the Golf World/Nike Golf Coaches' poll, 12th in the Golfstat.com rankings and 14th in the Golfweek/Sagarin rankings ... This week will mark Virginia Tech's 16th appearance in the NCAA Men's Golf Championship ... Tech is making its eighth consecutive appearance and the 12th in the last 14 seasons ... The Hokies were the fifth seed in the NCAA Pullman Regional last season.

The Hokies This Season

Virginia Tech has won three tournaments this season and has finished in the top five in all 10 tournaments this season ... The Hokies' best individual finishes this season are **Scott Vincent's** three victories in the fall and **Trevor Cone's** two titles in the spring.

Topping the Charts

Four of the five Hokies competing in the ACC Tournament are among the top 10 all-time scorers at Virginia Tech, including the top two on the list ... Junior **Scott Vincent** is in the top spot of the career scoring list, with a 71.94 stroke average ... Junior **Trevor Cone** has supplanted PGA Tour player Brendon de Jonge into second place at 72.52 ... Senior **Bryce Chalkey** is sixth at 73.19 and sophomore **Maclain Huge** is in ninth place at 73.66 ... Associate head coach **Brian Sharp** is 13th on the list at 74.15.

New Face Next Year

During the early signing period in November, Virginia Tech announced that Ian Hildebrand (Purcellville, Va.) has signed a National Letter of Intent to attend Virginia Tech and play golf for the Hokies in Fall 2014.

Crunching the Numbers

During the 2013-14 season, Virginia Tech competed against 38 of the 80 other teams competing in the 2014 NCAA regionals ... Tech was a combined 50-14-1 (.777 winning percentage) ... The Hokies were 7-2 (.777) against teams in the Auburn Regional ... Tech was 14-10 (.583) against teams that earned Top 5 seeds.

A Busy Monday

On May 5, right about the time the Hokies were finding their NCAA seed and destination, junior **Trevor Cone** was on the course at the Greensboro Country Club's Farm Course, competing the U.S. Open local qualifying ... Cone shot a 6-under 66 and finished one stroke behind medalist Jonathan Hodge, who currently plays on the Web.com Tour ... Cone was one of six players that advance to sectional qualifying for the 2014 U.S. Open, which will be played at Pinehurst No. 2.

NCAA Odds & Ends

Virginia Tech faced teams that made the NCAA Regionals in all 10 events this season ... This is the Hokies' second trip to the Auburn University Club for an NCAA regional ... Tech was the 11th seed at the 2003 East Regional, played on this course ... Tech and Auburn are the only two teams in this year's field that competed here in 2003 ... Tech finished fifth at the Puerto Rico Classic; the four teams that finished ahead of Tech were No. 1 overall seed Alabama, No. 1 seed in Raleigh, Georgia Tech, No. 1 seed in San Antonio, Georgia and No. 6. seed in Rich Harvest Farms, Clemson ... 12 of the 15 teams that competed in the Puerto Rico Classic and the 3M Augusta Invitational made the 2014 NCAA Regionals, nine of the 14 teams at The Brickyard and eight teams at Blackthorn Club made the NCAAs.

A World-Class Player

Following the Hokies' third place finish at the 3M Augusta Invitational, **Scott Vincent** got on a plane and traveled to his native Zimbabwe to compete in the Golden Plisener Zimbabwe Open ... The junior from Harare was the only amateur in the event and made the cut in the professional tournament, shooting a final-round 5-under-par 67 to finish in a tie for 24th place overall.

Jay's the Only One

When the Hokies tied Georgia Tech for the 2007 ACC Men's Golf Championship, Virginia Tech head coach **Jay Hardwick** became the only coach in NCAA history to win conference titles in four different Division I athletic conferences ... Prior to winning the ACC, Hardwick had led the Hokies to conference titles in the Metro, Atlantic 10 and Big East Conferences.

Too "Sharp" of a Coach

Of the 12 players ranked ahead of Associate Head Coach **Brian Sharp** on the Virginia Tech all-time scoring list, 10 have been coached by Sharp ... Only current PGA Tour competitors Brendon de Jonge and Johnson Wagner were not coached by Sharp ... Sharp was the all-time leading scorer in Virginia Tech history when he graduated in 1995 ... Sharp was inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame in 2009.

Hokies on the PGA Tour

A pair of Hokies are currently competing on the PGA Tour ... Johnson Wagner won his first-ever PGA Tour event at the Houston Shell Open in 2008, earning him a berth the next week at the 2008 Masters Tournament ... He won two years ago at the Mayakoba Golf Classic in El Camaleon, Riviera Maya, Mexico on the PGA Tour and won the Sony Open in Hawaii in January, 2012, which helped him to claim PGA Tour Player of the Month for January 2012 ... Former teammate Brendon de Jonge was the 2008 Nationwide Tour Player of the Year ... He finished second on the money list and won the Xerox Classic in Rochester, N.Y. ... His second-place finish on the Nationwide money list earned him a return to the PGA Tour in 2009; he advanced out of qualifying school to earn his card four years ago and finished 34th on the money list in 2010 to earn his card for the 2012 season ... He also played on the PGA Tour in 2007 ... de Jonge was a captain's selection for the International team in the 2013 President's Cup and was teamed with Ernie Els.

The Rest of the Roster

Three players on the Hokie roster are not competing this weekend ... Junior **Miles Curley**, who missed the spring season due to an injury and freshmen **Drew Johnson** and **Ryan Mondy**, all have competed for Tech this season.

We Like this Conference

Virginia Tech's athletics program has made quite a splash in the ACC since joining the league in 2004 ... The Hokie football team won the 2004 ACC Championship and played in the inaugural ACC Football Championship game after winning the Coastal Division title, winning the conference title in 2007, 2008 and 2010 ... Football coach **Frank Beamer** has twice been named the ACC Coach of the Year ... The men's soccer team advanced to the College Cup in 2007 and the softball team appeared in NCAA Women's College World Series in 2008 and the women's soccer program advanced to the College Cup in the fall of 2013 ... The men's and women's track & field programs have won 14 NCAA titles by five athletes since 2005 ... Queen Harrison appeared in the 2008 Olympics in Beijing and won the 60-meter hurdle championship at the 2010 NCAA Indoor Championship and became the first woman ever to win both the 400m and 100m hurdle titles at the 2010 NCAA Outdoor Championship.

A Course to Dye For

Virginia Tech's commitment to golf became more evident 10 years ago, when it was announced that famed golf course architect Pete Dye would lead the renovation of the River Course of Virginia Tech ... The project, which began on Jan. 5, 2004, was completed in 2006 ... A new \$5.5 million clubhouse was completed in 2010 ... Upon completion, the course became a Pete Dye Signature Course and was rechristened as the Pete Dye River Course of Virginia Tech ... In addition to the upgraded course, a team facility boasts an indoor teaching center, locker room and team meeting room for the Virginia Tech golf team ... These improvements were made possible by support from Bill and Alice Goodwin of Richmond, Va. ... The gift covered all costs of design and construction ... As part of the project, Tech's artificial practice tee was covered and equipped with radiant heaters ... The indoor facility was constructed adjacent to the newly-dedicated golf team practice area, which was made possible through the generosity of long-time golf team supporter and scholarship donor, the late C.M. "Buddy" Neviasser ... This facility provides Tech players with one of the finest total practice complexes in the nation.

A Good Host

Virginia Tech hosted the 2011 NCAA East Regional Golf Championship at the Pete Dye River Course of Virginia Tech ... This was the first NCAA event hosted on the course ... Tech hosted the 1997 NCAA East Regional and the 2004 NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championship at the Homestead Resort in Hot Springs, Va.

Welcome, Whit

On Friday, Jan. 24, Virginia Tech announced the hiring of **Whit Babcock** as the new Director of Athletics ... Babcock, a native Virginian and a 1992 graduate of James Madison University, came to Blacksburg from the University of Cincinnati, where he served in the same capacity for the previous two years ... Welcome to the Hokie Nation!

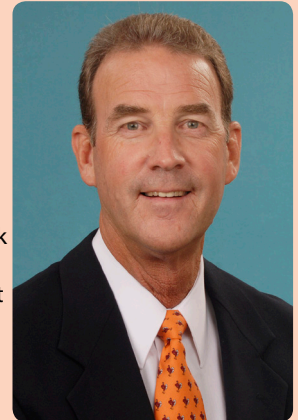
They Will Be Joining Us Soon

On May 13, 2013, Virginia Tech announced the addition of women's golf as the school's 22nd intercollegiate sport ... On July 8, 2013, Carol Robertson was hired as the program's head coach and in the fall, Robertson signed her first recruiting class ... The players will redshirt the 2014-15 season and the program will play its first event in the fall of 2015.



The Head Hokie

Jay Hardwick is in his 31st season as the head coach of Virginia Tech Golf ... Hardwick is a 1971 graduate of Virginia Tech ... Hardwick is also the Director of Golf at Virginia Tech and oversaw the incorporation of the University's new course, The Pete Dye River Course of Virginia Tech, into the Virginia Tech operation, as well as the construction of team facilities at the course ... Hardwick was inducted into the GCAA's Hall of Fame in 2008 and was the inaugural winner in 2005 of the Labron Harris Jr. Award, given by the PGA of America ... With the Hokies' 2007 ACC Golf Championship, Hardwick became the first coach in NCAA history to win four different conference titles at the same school ... What is a Hokie?

The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell, which is still used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell ... It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Hokies Earn Academic Recognition

The Virginia Tech women's soccer squad and the men's golf team both received Public Recognition Awards from the NCAA for top academic scores in the classroom, as announced by the NCAA on May 7 ... Public Recognition Awards get handed out based on a sport's multi-year Academic Progress Rate, better known as APR ... The APR is an annual scorecard of academic achievement calculated for all Division I sports teams nationally ... To receive a Public Recognition Award, a team must have an APR in the top 10 percent of its sport ... The Tech men's golf team received a Public Recognition Award a year ago (along with the men's cross country team) and has received this award for the past five straight years

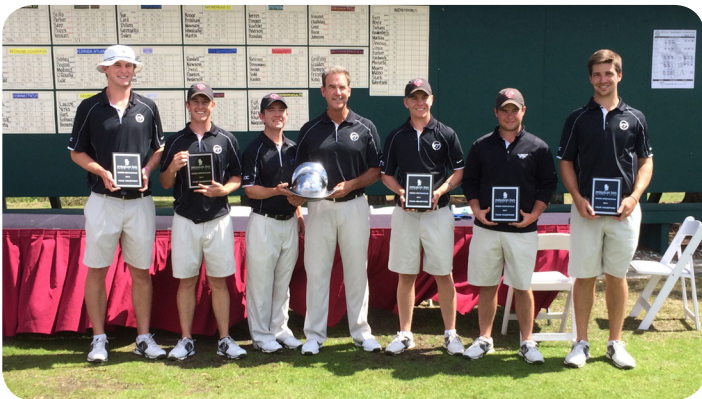
