OVERTIME HEARTBREAKER AT UVA

Virginia Tech made a solid bid at an ACC upset against then-No. 6 Virginia, falling 2-1 in overtime. Mikey Minutillo scored off a header in the 22nd minute, giving the Hokies the 1-0 edge. Minutillo scored two goals in the prior game, a 4-2 Tech victory over Alabama A&M. Tech led 1-0 at the half for its first halftime lead over a ranked opponent this season. The score remained in the Hokies' favor until Virginia's Brian Ownby evened it up in the 76th minute. At the end of regulation, the score remained tied, forcing overtime. The extra period did not last long, with the Cavaliers' Greg Monaco earning the game-winner in the 92nd minute. All told, Virginia outshot Tech 22-11, with the majority of its opportunities coming after the first half. Tech's keeper James Daly limitied the damage and kept the Hokies in the game, earning six saves.

TECH FALLS AT HOME TO UCF

Evan Slusser and Jed Prater earned their first goals of the season, but the Golden Knights early 2-0 lead proved enough to beat the Hokies, 4-2. Tech pressured the Knights, taking 11 of the match's 14 corner kicks and converting a goal on one in the 19th minute. Slusser headed the ball into the net off a Clarke Bentley corner kick to cut the Knights' lead in half, 2-1. Down 4-1 in the 72nd minute, Prater scored from six yards out off another Bentley assist, but the Knights' defense clamped down on the Hokies, preventing a late rally.

Born to Play

The Radford match on Oct. 27 falls on the 20th birthday of sophomore defender David Fiorello. Fiorello is one of five Hokies this season to start all fourteen games. A consistent force on the back end, Fiorello was named a team captain for 2010 along with senior Clarke Bentley. This season, Fiorello has earned one assist and leads the team in shots-ongoal percentage (.800), with four of his five shots finding the target.

BENTLEY LENDS A HELPING FOOT

Clarke Bentley's two-assist performance against UCF was only the third time this season a Hokie has notched multiple assists in a game. Greg Cochrane has had multiple-assist games twice this season, earning two at Howard and against Alabama A&M, both victories for Tech. Bentley now totals three assists on the season, tying his career high from 2008.

HOME STRETCH

The match against Radford marks the first of three consecutive home games for the Hokies to close out the 2010 regular season. After Radford, Tech will face No. 24 Duke on Oct. 30 and No. 20 Boston College on Nov. 5. This is the first time since 1998 that the Hokies have closed the regular season with at least three consecutive home games. During the 1998 season, Tech finished the year with four consecutive home matches, winning three.

OCTOBER EXCITEMENT

October will be an exciting closing month to the regular season for Virginia Tech fans...

- Five of Tech's nine October contests will be played at Thompson Field, followed by the tenth and final match of the season against Boston College on Nov. 5.
- Five of the nine October contests are against ACC opponents: at Wake Forest (L, 2-0), home against Maryland (L, 0-7), at Virginia (L, 1-2 (OT)), at North Carolina (Oct. 22) and back home facing Duke (Oct. 30).
- Four of the five October ACC opponents are currently ranked in the national top 25 by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. They are No. 4 North Carolina, No. 3 Maryland, No. 8 Virginia and No. 24 Duke. November's sole opponent, Boston College, is also currently ranked at No. 20.

2010 Game Recaps

Game 1: vs. St. John's (Sept. 3) L 0-2 Tech held the then-17th ranked St. John's Red Storm scoreless through the first half, but St. John's came back in the second half, breaking the tie in the 63rd minute and adding the insurance goal in the 86th. Tech keeper Jim Daly kept the score close, earning seven saves, five in the second half.

Game 2: vs. UAB (Sept. 5) L 1-3

Down 3-0 in the 87th minute, the Hokies refused to go out quietly, with freshman David Clemens netting Tech's first goal of the season, the first of his career, off a Clarke Bentley assist. Despite the score, the stat lines were nearly identical, with UAB edging out Tech 14-12 in shots, and Tech earning the edge in corners, 5-4.

Game 3: at South Florida (Sept. 10) L 0-2 Despite hard pressure from the Bulls' offense in the first half, the Hokies' defense and freshman keeper Kyle Renfro, in his collegiate debut, kept the ball out of the net, forcing a scoreless tie at the half. In the 59th minute, Tech's Vaughn Bandy was carded in the 18-yard box, leading to a USF score off the ensuing penalty kick. USF's Shane Wixted scored in the 82nd minute to bring the final score to 2-0.

Game 4: at Howard (Sept. 14) W 7-2 Tech earned their first win of the season, exploding on offense for seven goals. Sophomore Robert Alberti netted three goals of his own, just one shy of a Tech record for goals scored in a game. Freshman David Clemens drove in two of his own, his second and third of the season. Freshmen Mikey Minutillo and Adama Wakai also earned the first goals of their careers. Kyle Renfro earned the win at keeper.

Game 5: vs. Clemson (Sept. 17) T 1-1 (20T)

Regulation time wasn't enough in the Hokies' home opener against ACC foe Clemson, stretching through two ten-minute overtime periods, but ultimately resulting in a 1-1 tie. Tech fans were cheering early, as Clarke Bentley put the Hokies up 1-0 after capitalizing on a penalty kick for his third goal of the season. A first half rebuttal from Clemson proved the final goal of the game. Game 6: at Davidson (Sept. 21) L 1-0

Davidson prevailed in a low-scoring affair, 1-0. Statistically, both sides were very even. Each team took nine shots, four in the first half and five in the second. Tech took five corners to Davidson's four, while Davidson earned nine fouls to Tech's eight.

Game 7: at NC State (Sept. 25) W 2-1 Tech earned it's first conference win of the season in a tight contest against the NC State Wolfpack. Clarke Bentley put the Hokies up first with his second converted penalty kick of the season in the 34th minute. After an NC State rebuttal leading to a 1-1 tie at half, Greg Cochrane put Tech on top for good, sealing the 2-1 victory with his first goal of the season off a Beto Velazquez assist.

Game 8: vs. American (Sept. 28) W 1-0 The Hokies returned home for their second home contest of the season and came out victorious against the American Eagles, 1-0. After a scoreless first half, the difference maker was Mikey Minutillo's goal in the 55th minute, his second of the season. Kyle Renfro snagged six saves on 14 shots to earn his third win of the season.

Game 9: at Wake Forest (Oct. 1) L 0-2 Tech's two-game win streak was snapped by the Demon Deacons, who shutout the Hokies, 2-0. Wake Forest wasted little time, scoring in the first minute of regulation, putting them up 1-0 early. The score remained 1-0 at half, and it was a back-andforth battle for much of the second half. In the 83rd minute, Wake Forest added the final goal to seal the 2-0 victory for the Demon Deacons.

Game 10: at Longwood (Oct. 5) L 0-1 In the first half, only four total shots were taken, three by the Hokies. A 0-0 stalemate was finally shattered by Longwood's Devin Pierce in the 70th minute. The Hokie offense came alive in the second half, especially after the Longwood goal, taking four of their seven second-half shots following the goal. In the final minute of regulation, Evan Slusser took a shot just wide with 51 seconds remaining, and Greg Cochrane's shot, the potential equalizer, knocked off the post with just two seconds remaining.

2010 Game Recaps

Game 11: vs. No. 6 Maryland (Oct. 8) L 0-7

Maryland's offensive pressure proved too much for Tech. At half, Maryland only held a two-goal lead and barely out-shot Tech 7-5. The momentum of the second half slipped away from Tech after inadvertantly tipping the ball into its own net off a Maryland free kick. Maryland turned up the pressure, outshooting the Hokies 8-1 in the second half for five goals.

Game 12: vs. Alabama A&M (Oct. 11) W 4-2

Shots were in no short supply for Tech, taking a season-high 37 for the match towards earning a 4-2 victory over Alabama A&M. The Hokies overcame a 2-1 halftime deficit, exploding for three goals in the second half. Koen Oost earned the rare goal as a defender, his first of the season, and Mikey Minutillo recorded two goals himself.

Game 13: at No. 6 Virginia (Oct. 15) L 1-2 (OT)

Game 14: vs. Central Florida (Oct. 19) L 2-4 Tech chipped away at the UCF lead throughout the match, but the Golden Knights' early two-goal lead proved enough cushion for the match. Down 2-0, Evan Slusser found the net off a Clarke Bentley corner kick for his first goal of the season. In the second half, down 4-1, Jed Prater also earned his first goal of the season, capitalizing after a flurry of passes at the top of the goalie box.
