

Summary vs. Old Dominon...

The Hokies traveled to Norfolk, Va. on Aug. 16 and lost to Old Dominion, 2-0, in the first exhibition match of the season. ODU's Gideon Asante tallied a goal early in each half. 18 Hokies saw playing time, as Kyle Renfro and Hunter Maricle each played a half in goal.

Summary vs. William & Mary...

The Hokies tied #13 William & Mary, 0-0, on Aug. 20 in front of 1,957 fans at Thompson Field. Kyle Renfro had eight saves in goal for Tech and earned the shutout.

NEXT UP ...

The Hokies host Virginia, Cincinnati and Wisconsin at the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational next Friday and Sunday, Sept. 2 and 4. SCOUTING HOWARD...

- This is the first game of 2011 for both Howard and Virginia Tech. Howard finished the 2010 season with an overall record of 3-11-4 and a 1-2-1 mark in the Atlantic Soccer Conference.
- The Bison fell to Houston Baptist in the semifinals of the ASC Tournament on penalty kicks.
- As a team, Howard was outscored by their opponents last year 39-8. Phillip Borde and Mario Martin led Howard in scoring last year with three goals each. In goal, Larry Turner played all 18 games and logged 1,641 minutes with 87 saves and five shutouts.

SERIES HISTORY...

- This is the second all-time meeting between Virginia Tech and Howard in men's soccer.
- The only other meeting was last season when the Hokies beat the Bison, 7-2, in Washington D.C. on Sept. 14, 2010.
- The seven goals scored by the Hokies was the most during the 2010 season. Current junior Robert Alberti had a hat trick for Tech in the win and current sophomore David Clemens added two goals. Phillip Borde and Mario Martin scored for Howard.

OPENING GAME NOTES...

- The Hokies are 4-5-1 in their last 10 season openers, regardless of site. The last time the Hokies won a season opening game was in 2006 when they beat Navy, 3-0, at the UMBC Tournament. They are also 4-5-1 in their last 10 home openers in Blacksburg.

- The Hokies are excited to welcome back Shupp, who redshirted the 2010 season. Shupp has 59 career apperances and 55 starts to his credit.
- Tech also welcomes back Drew Ranahan, Taylor Lemmon and Ethan Ashong off redshirt seasons last year. All three are redshirt freshmen in 2011.

TEAMMATES...

- Freshmen Hunter Byrnes and Drew Hartell were high school teammates at F.W. Cox High School in Virginia Beach. They also both played club soccer for Beach FC, the same club that Jeremy Williams played for in his prep days.
- Freshmen Zach Hoover and Kevin Reitzel and sophomore Nick Smirniotopoulos all played club soccer for McLean Academy in Virginia.
- Drew Ranahan, sophomore Devante Dubose and junior Michael Garrick all played high school soccer at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland, Calif. Dubose and Garrick were also members of the Mustang Soccer Academy for club soccer.

RETURNING SCORERS...

- Three of Virginia Tech's top-four scorers from last year's team return. Sophomore Mikey Minutillo is the leading returning scorer after netting five goals and an assist as a freshman. Junior Robert Alberti and sophomore David Clemens each had four goals and an assist in 2010.

HOKIES BY STATE...

- The Hokies represent 10 states and one country outside the United States: Virginia leads the way with 11, followed by California (4), Pennsylvania (3), New Jersey (2), New York (2), Florida (1), Kansas (1), Georgia (1), Iowa (1), Texas (1), Australia (1)

Mike Brizendine enters his third year as Virginia Tech's head coach after spending five years as the Hokies' top assistant.

Brizendine's 2010 squad played five top-20 nationally ranked opponents, including taking sixth-ranked Virginia to overtime on the road. His 2009-10 team was one of only three Atlantic Coast Conference men's soccer programs to receive the NSCAA Team Academic Award, which honors teams with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. It marked the second time in program history and first since 2003, that the Hokies earned academic recognition from the NSCAA.



An experienced coach on all levels, Brizendine helped guide the Hokies to their first NCAA College Cup appearance in school history in 2007. He has worked with all aspects of the Hokie program. For his contributions, Brizendine was recognized as the NSCAA's Atlantic Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2007.

Brizendine joined the Hokie staff after a successful stint with Bridgewater College, a Division III program that participates in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC). After assisting both the men's and women's programs at Bridgewater in 2000, he became the head men's coach from 2001 to 2003, guiding the team from non-competitive status to a full-fledged Division III program. Brizendine led Bridgewater to its two best single-season records, 12-6 in 2003 and 11-7 in 2002, for a 23-13 mark over two seasons and a .639 winning percentage. For this significant turn-around, his peers named him ODAC Coach of the Year in 2003.

Brizendine graduated from James Madison University in 1999 and earned his Master of Education from Virginia Tech in 2005.

Prior to his time at Bridgewater College, he was an assistant coach at Ferrum College for the men's soccer team in 1999. He has also been active guiding and encouraging kids in youth soccer programs throughout his coaching career.

As a player, he lettered four seasons at James Madison University from 1995-98 and ended his career sixth in all-time scoring for the Dukes. He earned all-conference and all-region recognition during his four-year career. He also played professionally with the Roanoke Wrath (1999) and the Northern Virginia Royals (2000 and 2001) of the Division 3 league.

Brizendine and his wife, Lucy, reside in Blacksburg, Va.
