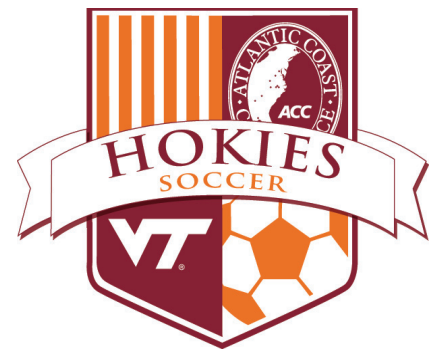

HILTON GARDEN HOKIE INVITE RECAP ...

The Hokies fell to Wisconsin, 1-0 in overtime, on Friday night as the Badgers' Josh Theirmann scored the game-winner in the 97th minute. However, the Hokies came back on Sunday and defeated Cincinnati, 2-1, for their first win of the season. Mikey Minutillo scored in the fifth minute off a pass from Ben Strong. Cincinnati equalized in the 60th minute, but the Hokies Michael Garrick was fouled in the box by Cincinnati goalkeeper Joey Barnard in the 82nd minute. Robert Alberti converted the penalty kick to give Tech the win. Kyle Renfro was solid in goal as he made four saves. Virginia won the tournament with a 2-0 record, with Wisconsin in second, Virginia Tech third and Cincinnati fourth.

The Hokies conclude their five-game homestand to begin the year on Tuesday, Sept. 13 against Longwood at 7:00 p.m. On Friday, Sept. 16, Tech hits the road for the first time this year as they travel to Boston, Mass., to play nationally-ranked Boston College at 7:00 p.m.

SCOUTING #1 NORTH CAROLINA...

- Like Virginia Tech, this is the Atlantic Coast Conference opener for North Carolina. The Tar Heels enter the game with a record of 3-0-0 and are ranked number one in the country by all major collegiate soccer polls.

- Last weekend, North Carolina hosted the Nike Classic in Chapel Hill, N.C. The Tar Heels rolled past Oregon State on Friday night, 5-1. UNC scored all five goals in the second half as it rallied from a 1-0 deficit. On Sunday night, the then-No.2 Tar Heels defeated then-No.1 Louisville, 2-1, once again coming from behind to claim the win.

- As a team, North Carolina is out scoring its opponents 10-3. Billy Schuler leads the Tar Heels in scoring with four goals while Rob Lovejoy has three goals and two assists. Enzo Martinez and Ben Speas lead the Tar Heels with three assists each. In goal, Scott Goodwin has played all 270 minutes for UNC and has six saves with a 1.00 goals against average.

SERIES HISTORY...

- This is the 11th all-time meeting between Virginia Tech and North Carolina in men's soccer.

- The Tar Heels hold an 8-2 series lead against the Hokies, including wins in the last three meetings. The last time the Hokies beat the Tar Heels was on Oct. 19, 2007 when then-No.5 Tech beat UNC, 2-1, in Blacksburg.

- Last year, the then-No.4 Tar Heels beat Tech, 3-1, in Chapel Hill, N.C. Since joining the ACC, Tech is 2-5 against UNC, including a 1-3 mark at home. The first meeting was in 1973 when UNC beat Tech, 5-0, in Chapel Hill.

HOKIES VS. #1...

- The last time the Hokies played a number one-ranked team was in 2009 when Tech lost to Akron, 2-0, in Blacksburg. Tech has played the top-ranked team five times since 2002 and has a 1-3-1 record. The Hokies' last win over a number one ranked team was in 2004 over Duke, 1-0, in Durham, N.C.

ALBERTI NETS GAME-WINNER...

- Junior midfielder Robert Alberti scored his first game-winner as a Hokie on Saturday as he converted an 82nd minute penalty kick to give Tech a 2-1 win over Cincinnati in the final game of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational.

ALL-TOURNAMENT HOKIES...

- Alberti was named to the all-tournament team at this weekend's Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. He was joined on the team by sophomore midfielder Jed Prater.

TEAMMATES...

- Freshmen Hunter Byrnes and Drew Hartell were high school teammates at F.W. Cox High School in Virginia Beach. They also both played club soccer for Beach FC, the same club that r-junior Jeremy Williams played for in his prep days.

- Freshmen Zach Hoover and Kevin Reitzel and sophomore Nick Smirniotopoulos all played club soccer for McLean Academy in Virginia.

- Redshirt freshman Drew Ranahan, sophomore Devante Dubose and junior Michael Garrick all played high school soccer at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland, Calif. Dubose and Garrick were also members of the Mustang Soccer Academy for club soccer.

HOKIES BY STATE...

- The Hokies represent 10 states and one country outside the United States. Virginia leads the way with 11 players, followed by California (5), Pennsylvania (3), New Jersey (2), New York (2), Florida (1), Kansas (1), Georgia (1), Iowa (1), Texas (1) and Australia (1).

COACHING FIRSTS AT TECH

Mike Brizendine enters his third year as Virginia Tech's head coach after spending five years as the Hokies' top assistant.

Brizendine's 2010 squad played five top-20 nationally ranked opponents, including taking sixth-ranked Virginia to overtime on the road. His 2009-10 team was one of only three Atlantic Coast Conference men's soccer programs to receive the NSCAA Team Academic Award, which honors teams with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. It marked the second time in program history and first since 2003, that the Hokies earned academic recognition from the NSCAA.

An experienced coach on all levels, Brizendine helped guide the Hokies to their first NCAA College Cup appearance in school history in 2007. He has worked with all aspects of the Hokie program. For his contributions, Brizendine was recognized as the NSCAA's Atlantic Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2007.

Brizendine joined the Hokie staff after a successful stint with Bridgewater College, a Division III program that participates in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC). After assisting both the men's and women's programs at Bridgewater in 2000, he became the head men's coach from 2001 to 2003, guiding the team from non-competitive status to a full-fledged Division III program. Brizendine led Bridgewater to its two best single-season records, 12-6 in 2003 and 11-7 in 2002, for a 23-13 mark over two seasons and a .639 winning percentage. For this significant turn-around, his peers named him ODAC Coach of the Year in 2003.

Brizendine graduated from James Madison University in 1999 and earned his Master of Education from Virginia Tech in 2005.

Prior to his time at Bridgewater College, he was an assistant coach at Ferrum College for the men's soccer team in 1999. He has also been active guiding and encouraging kids in youth soccer programs throughout his coaching career.

As a player, he lettered four seasons at James Madison University from 1995-98 and ended his career sixth in all-time scoring for the Dukes. He earned all-conference and all-region recognition during his four-year career. He also played professionally with the Roanoke Wrath (1999) and the Northern Virginia Royals (2000 and 2001) of the Division 3 league.

Brizendine and his wife, Lucy, reside in Blacksburg, Va.

Game-by-Game Recap

Game #1 vs. Howard | August 27 | L, 2-1

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- The Virginia Tech men's soccer team opened the 2011 season on Aug. 27 with a 2-1 loss to Howard at Thompson Field. All three of the goals scored in the game occurred after half-time, with two coming just 15 seconds apart in the 81st minute.

After a scoreless first half, in which Tech held a majority of the possession in the Howard half of the field, the Bison stunned the Hokies as they got on the board first when Mario Martin capitalized with a low finish from eight yards on a pass from Rahman Alarape at 59:02.

Then at 80:12, Martin again finished for Howard, this time off a pass from Akinbola Richardson, making the score 2-0 in favor of the Bison. However, Tech would get the board just 15 seconds later when Michael Garrick found David Clemens, who dribbled past Howard defenders into the box and finished off a nice individual effort from just outside the six-yard box. After their goal, the Hokies kept on pushing numbers forward as Howard tried to hold on. Garrick nearly got the equalizer at 86:08 as his flick over Hamilton's head hit the crossbar and came back down into play, but Tech couldn't put in the ensuing rebound.

For the game, Tech out-shot Howard, 18-4, and out-cornered the Bison, 14-0. Clemens led the Hokie offense with seven shots and his goal marked the second year in a row that he has scored Tech's first goal of the year. Kyle Renfro played all 90 minutes between the pipes for Tech.

Game #2 vs. Wisconsin | Sept. 2 | L, 1-0 (OT)

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- The Virginia Tech men's soccer team fell to Wisconsin, 1-0 in overtime, on day one of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational at Thompson Field. The Badgers' Josh Thiermann scored the game-winner in sudden death overtime in the 97th minute.

The start of the game was delayed by nearly two hours due to two lightning delays in the first match of the day between Cincinnati and Virginia. In the 20th minute, captain James Shupp came forward down the right side and put in a low cross which found Mike Wilkie who fired a shot just wide of the near post. In the first period, Tech held a 9-7 advantage in shots and recorded six corners to just two for Wisconsin.

Robert Alberti played well on the flank the entire night, serving in crosses and creating chances. He led Tech in shots for the game with five. Alberti nearly caught Wisconsin keeper Ciro Martinez off his line in the 64th minute when his shot hit from the left side hit the crossbar. Tech also outshot the Badgers, 11-6, in the second half, and had a 20-16 advantage on the game. However, neither team found the back of the net in regulation and the game was forced into a golden goal overtime period.

In the first extra session, Wisconsin's Thiermann found space down the left side and dribbled into the Tech box where his shot from 10 yards found the back of the net.

Kyle Renfro played all 96:44 in goal and made seven saves. Wisconsin improved to 2-0-0, while the Hokies fell to 0-2-0.

Game #3 vs. Cincinnati | Sept. 4 | W, 2-1

BLACKSBURG, Va. -- Robert Alberti converted a penalty kick in the 82nd minute to give the Virginia Tech men's soccer its first win of the season over Cincinnati, 2-1, in the final game of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational at Thompson Field. The Hokies improved to 1-2-0 overall on the season while the Bearcats dropped to 1-2-0.

In the first half, Tech got on the board only 4:28 into the game as Ben Strong played a through ball to Mikey Minutillo who finished first time from 10 yards out on the right side of the box. The assist was Strong's first as a Hokie.

In the second half, the Bearcats' Emmanuel Appiah found space in the center of the park and fired a shot from 30 yards that hit the crossbar and went in to tie the match at 60:55. Then, with eight and a half minutes remaining, Michael Garrick was fouled after the play in the box by Cincinnati goalkeeper Joey Barnard. Barnard was assessed a yellow card and Tech was awarded a penalty kick.

Alberti stepped up and buried the penalty in the lower left corner after Barnard guessed the other direction to give the Hokies the win, 2-1. It was his first game-winning goal as a Hokie.

Kyle Renfro was solid all game as he made four saves, including a crucial stop in the 84th minute off a shot from Cincinnati's Leon Powell. For the match, Cincinnati outshot the Hokies, 13-7, while corners were even at six apiece. After the game, Jed Prater and Alberti were named to the all-tournament team for Tech.
