#### SCOUTING TEMPLE/SERIES HISTORY

- The Owls will be opening their 2012 season Friday against the Hokies.
- Temple returns 11 players from last year's squad that 9-10-0 overall and 5-4-0 in the Atlantic 10.
- This will be Temple's final season competing in the A-10 before moving the BIG EAST in 2013.
- Virginia Tech holds a 5-0-0 advantage all-time versus the Owls, but the two haven't met since 1999 when the Hokies came away with a 1-0 win on the road.

#### SCOUTING ST. BONAVENTURE/SERIES HISTORY

- The Bonnies are 0-2 on the year after road losses to Bowling Green (3-0) and Buffalo (2-1) to start the season.
- St. Bonaventure holds a 14-shot advantage against its opponents through two games, but has only found the back of net once.
- The Bonnies will play host James Madison on Friday night.
- Virginia Tech holds a 3-2-0 series lead against St. Bonaventure, with the Hokies winning the last match in 1999, 3-1 at home.

#### **NEXT UP**

After this weekend's tournament, the Hokies travel to Chapel Hill, N.C. to face No. 1 North Carolina. On Sept. 10, 2011, Virginia Tech defeated the then-No. 1 Tar Heels 1-0 in double overtime at Thompson Field. James Shupp scored the game-winner in the 103rd minute. The Hokies were only one of two teams to defeat North Carolina last season as the Tar Heels went on to win the National Championship.

#### FIRST GOALS

- With only two goals a year ago, after an injury-plagued season, junior David Clemens scored the game-winner on a clever back-heel in the 21st minute against Richmond on Aug. 26.
- In Tech's loss on Aug. 24, freshman Daniel Lauretano netted the first goal of his career in the 69th minute against SIUE as he ran onto a long ball and slotted it inside the left post past the Cougar keeper. It was the Hokies first goal of the season.

#### MINUTE MEN

- Nine Hokies played the full 90 minutes on Aug. 26 in the 1-0 win over Richmond.
- DeVante DuBose, David Fiorello, Jed Prater, Kyle Renfro and Ben Strong all played every minute of the two matches in the Hilton Garden Inn Hokie Invitational.
- Prater, Renfro and Strong led the Hokies in minutes logged a season ago. The four totaled more than 5,232 minutes in 19 games.

## STANDING GUARD

Goalkeeper Kyle Renfro started this season where he left off last year. After leading the ACC with 100 saves in 2011, the junior currently leads the conference with 12 saves after the first weekend and is second in saves per game with 6.

#### CAPTAINS

Senior David Fiorello will finish out his Tech career as a three-time team captain for the Hokies, while junior Jed Prater will join him for his first time in the role.

#### ABUNDANCE OF YOUTH

Tech has 16 players this season who have been in the program for less than two years. With David Fiorello being the lone senior on the 2012 squad, and only seven upperclassmen in all, the Hokies will look toward the youth this season to provide valuable minutes both in the starting lineup and coming off of the bench.

#### **AMONG THE BEST**

The Atlantic Coast Conference has traditionally been one of the nation's top conferences in men's soccer and this year is no different. The league has three teams ranked in the NSCAA's top 25 preseason poll which is second behind the Big East, while five teams are ranked in Soccer America's top 25, the most of any conference.

Mike Brizendine enters his fourth year as Virginia Tech's head coach after spending five years as the Hokies' top assistant.

Brizendine's 2011 squad played five top-25 nationally ranked opponents, including a 1-0 double-overtime win over 2011 NCAA champion North Carolina. The victory was the program's first over a No. 1 ranked opponent since 2004. Academically, his teams in 2009-10 and 2010-11 earned the NSCAA Team Academic Award, which honors teams with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. Tech was one of three men's soccer programs in the Atlantic Coast Conference to earn the honor in both years.



An experienced coach on all levels, Brizendine helped guide the Hokies to their first NCAA College Cup appearance in school history in 2007. He has worked with all aspects of the Hokie program. For his contributions, Brizendine was recognized as the NSCAA's Atlantic Region Assistant Coach of the Year in 2007.

Brizendine joined the Hokie staff after a successful stint with Bridgewater (Va.) College, a Division III program that participates in the Old Dominion Athletic Conference (ODAC). After assisting both the men's and women's programs at Bridgewater in 2000, he became the head men's coach from 2001 to 2003, guiding the team from non-competitive status to a full-fledged Division III program. Brizendine led Bridgewater to its two best single-season records, 12-6 in 2003 and 11-7 in 2002, for a 23-13 mark over two seasons and a .639 winning percentage. For this significant turn-around, his peers named him ODAC Coach of the Year in 2003.

Prior to his time at Bridgewater College, he was an assistant coach at Ferrum College for the men's soccer team in 1999. He has also been active guiding and encouraging kids in youth soccer programs throughout his coaching career.

Brizendine graduated from James Madison University in 1999 and earned his Master of Education from Virginia Tech in 2005.

As a player, he lettered four seasons at James Madison University from 1995-98 and ended his career sixth in all-time scoring for the Dukes. He earned All-Conference and All-Region recognition during his four-year career. He also played professionally with the Roanoke Wrath (1999) and the Northern Virginia Royals (2000 and 2001) of the Division 3 league.

Brizendine and his wife, Lucy, reside in Blacksburg, Va.

# Game-by-Game Recap

## Game #1 vs. SIU-Edwardsville | Aug. 24 | L, 3-1

**BLACKSBURG** – In the nightcap of the first day of the Hilton Garden Inn Hokie Invitational, the Virginia Tech men's soccer dropped a tough 3-1 result to SIU-Edwardsville.

The Cougars came out early and often, putting pressure on Hokies backline. After four SIUE efforts to test the defense, Kyle Renfro was forced to come up with sliding save to stop SIUE's Christian Volesky as a got free on the left side.

Just under 15 minutes later, the Cougars took a 1-0 lead as Kevin Stoll took a run up through the middle of the Hokie defense and fired a low shot just inside the left post.

Under two minutes later, SIUE struck again as Jared Tejada found space on the right side chipped a ball to the far post over a surging Renfro.

Christrian Volesky pushed the SIUE advantage to 3-0 just over a minute later as slipped past the leftside of the Hokie defense went far post past Renfro.

With 31 minutes to go, Renfro was called upon again as he thwarted another Cougar 1-on-1 opportunity. 10 minutes later, Daniel Lauretano netted his first goal as a Hokie in the 69th minute. Captain David Fiorello sent a long ball from midfield to the top of the box, which the freshman ran onto and slid to left side past a diving Cougar keeper.

Tech closes out the tournament Sunday afternoon at 2:30 p.m. at Thompson Field against Richmond.

# Game #2 vs. Richmond | Aug. 26 | W, 1-0

**BLACKSBURG** – The Virginia Tech men's soccer team earned its first win of the young season this afternoon, earning a shutout in a 1-0 win over Richmond at Thompson Field in the final game of the Hilton Garden Inn Hokie Invitational.

Looking to rebound after Friday night's loss to SIU-Edwardsville, the Hokies came out quick as senior David Fiorello nearly found the back of the net in the fourth minute as he one-timed a shot from a Jed Prater corner.

The 16th minute saw Richmond nearly brake open the match as well, as a corner from Oliver Murphy found the head of Houston Oldhman that was blocked. Timmy Albright took a rip at the rebound, but Kyle Renfro was there to make the first of his six saves of the day.

Just over four minutes later, Tech found the goal it was looking for as Ben Strong found space down the right side of the Spider penalty box. The sophomore moved toward the endline and sent a low pass into the six-yard box that found David Clemens wide open. The junior calmly stepped toward the ball with his left foot before cleverly slotting it into the left side of the net with his right foot.

Strong again found space on the right side in the 33rd minute, but with a defender closing in his shot was just to the right of the post.

The Hokies took a 1-0 lead into the break, but Richmond came out looking for the equalizer, earning a pair of corners early in the second half. In the 57th minute, Tech nearly caught the Spiders on a counter attack as Prater sent a lobbed pass over the Richmond defense that Daniel Lauretano got onto the end of. The freshman's one-timer sailed just over the crossbar to leave Tech's advantage still at one.

Just over three minutes later, Albright thought he had the equalizer for the Spiders on a header from the left side. With his back post wide open Renfro was forced to react quickly to and reach back to get his left hand on the ball to deny the striker's attempt.

With Richmond furiously pushing to tie the game, the Hokies nearly put the game away in the final 10 minutes as Clemens beat two defenders and chipped a shot just over bar, and Drew Hartell placed a header just wide of the left post.

With a flurry at the end by the Spiders, the Tech defense was up to the challenge, stifling Richmond's final opportunities to seal the win.

Despite being outshot 15-10 overall, Tech nabbed the one it needed as Renfro came up with several key saves on the day to earn his first clean sheet of the season. Clemens led the Hokies with three shots, while Strong and Lauretano each had a pair.

The Hokies will be off until Aug. 31 when they take on Temple at 5 p.m. in Harrisonburg, Va., at University Park in the Fairfield Inn by Marriott Invitational hosted by James Madison University.
