## About Radford

Radford is off to a 16-5 start after a successful week in Hawaii, where the Highlanders knocked off Mississippi State, Oregon State and Hawaii. Last week, the Highlanders went 4-1 at their home tournament.

Freshman twins Michele and Nichole Beall are leading the team at the plate. Michele is batting .378 while Nichole is hitting .368 with six home runs. Kristen Shifflett is hitting .354 with a team-leading seven home runs. Radford is hitting .298 as a team with 29 home runs and 38 stolen bases.

The pitching staff is led by Kellie Snooks, who is 9-0 with a 1.65 ERA. The staff as a whole has a 2.76 ERA.

## The Series

Tech leads the series against Radford 26-8 after sweeping the Highlanders last year in Blacksburg.

In the opener, Tech scored three runs in the fourth inning to come back from a 1-0 deficit and win 3-1. In the second game, Beth Walker had four RBI and Erin Ota had three of her own as the Hokies rolled to a 13-3, five-inning win.

The Hokies took a commanding lead in the series after winning 17 straight from 1998-2004 and has won the last five and 10 of the last 11.

Tech is 16-6 all-time at home against the Highlanders, 16-2 at Tech Softball Park.

### Sibling Rivalry

No one in the stands will have the split loyalty like Preston and Sheree Everhart as they have a child on both Radford and Virginia Tech's softball squads.

This year marks the fourth and final matchup between seniors Jessica and Jenn Everhart, a set of twins from Purcellville, Va. Jessica is Tech's starting left fielder while Jenn starts at second for the Highlanders. Jessica's Hokies lead the series 5-1 against Jenn's Highlanders since the two arrived on their respective campuses in 2006. Jessica is hitting .317 with a team-leading four home runs, three doubles and 14 RBI while Jenn is batting .232 with a home run, five doubles, six RBI and eight stolen bases.

### Home Sweet Home

Tech Softball Park, home of Virginia Tech softball since 1998, has been a tough place for opposing teams to play of the years. Last year, Tech averaged 699 fans per date, 13th-best in the country.

With the construction project completely finished, the Hokies now play in a park that can hold 1,024 fans. Over the years, Virginia Tech has posted a 151-54 record at home, a winning percentage of .737.

#### The Countdown is On

Tech head coach **Scot Thomas** is approaching another coaching milestone as he is nearing his 500th career win. He enters this week needing eight victories to reach the mark. He has a current record of 492-322 in his 14th year at the helm.

## 217 and Counting

Senior Charisse Mariconda has started all 217 games played in her three-plus seasons at Tech and could end up being the first player in Tech softball history to start every game in a four-year span. The closest any player has come to accomplishing the feat was Michelle Meadows, who started 250 games out of 252 games played during her career. Mariconda has started 182 games at third base and 35 games at shortstop.

#### Goin!

Tech set the school record for stolen bases as a team in a season last year with 102 thefts. **Jenna Rhodes** led the way with a school-record 41 steals on 48 attempts. She broke the single-season record of 34 held by her older sister, Callie, who set the mark in 2006.

Between Rhodes (83-for-98), Charisse Mariconda (32-for-34) and Erin Ota (31-for-38), the Hokies have three veterans on the base paths who have combined for an 86 percent success rate for their careers.

Head coach Scot Thomas was in the same fraternity as country music star Kenny Chesney at ETSU ... Assistant coach Al Brauns served in the Vietnam War ... Marra Hvozdovic is a fourth-generation Hokie as her great grandfather, grandfather and both parents attended Virginia Tech ... Richelle McGarva used to work in construction with her dad ... At seven letters, Erin Ota has the shortest name of anyone in the history of Tech softball, while at 17 letters, Charisse Mariconda's name is tied with Christine Trunnell as the longest in Tech softball history ... Kenzie Roark was an aunt before she was even born and recently became a great aunt ... Kim Jalm's family lives across from Burt Reynolds' ranch in Florida ... Erin Ota donated 10 inches of her hair to "Locks for Love" in January ... Kristen Froehlich went to Italy over the summer and brought back some ash from Pompeii ... A Second Home: Trainer Katie Baer has had her hands full this season already as several key players are making the Eddie Ferrell Memorial Training Room a second home. Kristin Graham's arm troubles prevented her from pitching early in the season. Graham was able to hit and play first base and shortstop, at least and made her debut in the circle finally on March 21 against Georgia Tech. Another setback came on Feb. 10 when starting centerfielder Richelle McGarva suffered a lateral dislocation of her left ankle in a routine base running drill in practice. She had emergency surgery that night at Montgomery Regional Hospital that night and is likely out for the rest of the season. That left the Hokies with three full-time outfielders and forced Marra Hvozdovic - who had been working at shortstop and catcher - back as the fourth outfielder. Tech also lost shortstop/catcher Misty Hall for the season when she was dismissed from school for a violation of university policy and Kenzie Roark hurt her knee in a training session over Spring Break and but returned for the Georgia Tech series. Tech is now down to just 15 healthy players for the time being with seven of those being current or former true or invited walk-ons.

**Double Duty:** Assistant coach **Barb Sherwood** will pull double duty this summer as she was recently named the field manager (head coach) of the Akron Racers of the NPF. She will continue her duties with the Hokies while coaching the Racers. Sherwood will get to work with former Hokie and 2008 All-NPF selection Angela Tincher in the league.

**Tracking Tinch:** After being named the National Player of the Year by USA Softball in 2008, former Hokie pitcher Angela Tincher has kept things rolling. Last summer, she was a standout for the Akron Racers and this spring, she is in Japan for another adventure. She signed with LeoPalace 21 of the Japan Pro Softball League and is competing there for three months before returning to the NPF this summer. She will head back to Japan after the NPF season is complete to finish her stint across the seas.

# WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most often-asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.! Sola-Rex Sola-Rah Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!! Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

# Just Virginia Tech, Please

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

- Is approaching 500 career wins after leading Tech to the Women's College World Series last year, a first for the program. The Hokies also finished a program-best eighth in both final polls.
- Led the Hokies to a 1-0 upset win over the USA National Team in an exhibition game on March 26, 2008 at Oklahoma City, snapping the team's 185-game pre-Olympic exhibition tour winning streak.
- Guided Tech to its fourth straight NCAA Regional in 2008, a program first. Tech was seed 16th nationally and No. 1 at the Columbus Regional in 2007 and advanced to the NCAA Women's College World Series for the first time in program history in 2008.
- Led the Hokies to Atlantic Coast Conference tournament titles in both 2007 and 2008. Also led the Hokies to the regular-season title in 2007, a program first.
- Has had 10 winning seasons in 13 seasons, building the program from the ground up starting in 1996.
- Was named the 2007 ACC Coach of the Year and he and his staff were named the Northeast Region Coaching Staff of the Year by the NFCA in both 2007 and 2008.
- In 2006, won 39 games and were a No. 2 seed at the Knoxville Regional, despite starting seven sophomores or freshmen down the stretch. Helped coach Tech's first softball All-American, as well as five all-region, four all-conference and seven all-state selections.
