About Virginia

The Cavaliers, who received one first-place vote in the preseason ACC poll, are off to a 1-2 start in league play after losing a series at NC State last weekend.

Virginia (18-7) is batting an impressive .301 as a team and has a staff ERA of 2.25. At the plate, Sarah Tacke leads the regulars with a .448 batting average, eight home runs and 33 RBI. Nicole Koren is hitting .431 with eight home runs of her own and 28 RBI. The Cavs have hit 27 home runs, driven in 149 runs, scored 164 runs and stolen 44 bases. In the circle, Karla Wilburn is 13-2 with a 1.64 ERA.

The Series

The Hokies and Cavaliers have a lengthy history on the diamond, meeting 32 previous times with Tech leading 20-12 in a series that dates back to 1998.

The series was pretty even until the 2006 season when the Hokies took a small margin in the win column and have won nine of the last 10 games, including the last seven.

Last year, the Hokies swept the Cavs in a three-game set at Tech Softball Park, winning 4-0, 3-0 and 7-1.

In 2007, Tech swept Virginia at Charlottesville — 4-0, 2-1 and 10-0 in six innings — before rallying to beat the eighth-seeded Cavs 4-1 in the first round of the ACC Softball Championship at Tallahassee, Fla.

Virginia's last win against the Hokies came in the 2006 ACC Tournament when the Cavs beat the Hokies 3-0 at Chapel Hill.

Virginia Tech leads the series 7-3 in games played at The Park in Charlottesville. Virginia's last wins against the Hokies at its home field came in 2005 when the Cavs took two from Tech on April 30 in the first two games of a three-game ACC series.

Tech is 11-4 against UVa since joining the ACC for the 2005 season.

Tough at Home

Virginia is a perfect 8-0 on the season at home, but this will be the Cavs' first home ACC series. The Park, which has been home to UVa softball since 1995, has undergone several renovations and will be re-dedicated before Sunday's game.

The Countdown is On

Tech head coach Scot Thomas is approaching another coaching milestone as he is nearing his 500th career win. He enters this weekend's action needing seven victories to reach the mark. He has a current record of 493-323 in his 14th year at the helm.

219 and Counting

Senior Charisse Mariconda has started all 219 games played in her three-plus seasons at Tech and could end up being the first player in Tech softball history to start every game in a four-year span. The closest any player has come to accomplishing the feat was Michelle Meadows, who started 250 games out of 252 games played during her career. Mariconda has started 184 games at third base and 35 games at shortstop.

Go in!

Tech set the school record for stolen bases as a team in a season last year with 102 thefts. Jenna Rhodes led the way with a school-record 41 steals on 48 attempts. She broke the single-season record of 34 held by her older sister, Callie, who set the mark in 2006.

Between Rhodes (84-for-99), Charisse Mariconda (34-for-36) and Erin Ota (32-for-39), the Hokies have three veterans on the base paths who have combined for an 86 percent success rate (150 for 174) for their careers.

Records Watch

Senior Charisse Mariconda needs six more doubles to break the school's career doubles mark. Michelle Meadows had 48 two-baggers from 1997-2000. Mariconda picked up a double against Radford on Tuesday and now has 43.

Senior Erin Ota has been hit four times already this season, extending her school record for times hit by pitch. In four years, the Irvine, Calif., native has been plunked 21 times, well ahead of the second-most of 16 (Shanel Garofalo).

It'll take a strong finish, but senior Jenna Rhodes could finish with the school's highest batting average. She currently has a career average of .344, just a few points behind Meadows, who batted .347 for her career.

A Second Home: Trainer Katie Baer has had her hands full this season already as several key players are making the Eddie Ferrell Memorial Training Room a second home. **Kristin Graham's** arm troubles prevented her from pitching early in the season. Graham was able to hit and play first base and shortstop, at least, and finally made her debut in the circle on March 21 against Georgia Tech. Another setback came on Feb. 10 when starting centerfielder **Richelle McGarva** suffered a lateral dislocation of her left ankle in a routine base running drill in practice. She had emergency surgery that night at Montgomery Regional Hospital that night and is likely out for the rest of the season. That left the Hokies with three full-time outfielders and forced **Marra Hvozdovic** - who had been working at shortstop and catcher - back as the fourth outfielder. Tech also lost shortstop/catcher Misty Hall for the season when she was dismissed from school for a violation of university policy and **Kenzie Roark** hurt her knee in a training session over Spring Break and but returned for the Georgia Tech series. Tech is down to just 15 healthy players for the time being with seven of those being current or former true or invited walk-ons.

Double Duty: Assistant coach **Barb Sherwood** will pull double duty this summer as she was recently named the field manager (head coach) of the Akron Racers of the NPF. She will continue her duties with the Hokies while coaching the Racers. Sherwood will get to work with former Hokie and 2008 All-NPF selection Angela Tincher in the league.

Tracking Tinch: After being named the National Player of the Year by USA Softball in 2008, former Hokie pitcher Angela Tincher has kept things rolling. Last summer, she was a standout for the Akron Racers and this spring, she is in Japan for another adventure. She signed with LeoPalace 21 of the Japan Pro Softball League and is competing there for three months before returning to the NPF this summer. She will head back to Japan after the NPF season is complete to finish her stint across the seas.

WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most often-asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

• He has had over 23 different players named to the all-state team 44 different times, including at least three on every team in 10 of the last 11 seasons.

• Graduated from East Tennessee State University in 1991 with a bachelor's in physical education.

• Was also selected to be the head coach of a group of local collegiate all-stars who took on the U.S. Olympic Softball Team in Salem, Va., in the summer of 2004 and will do so again in the summer of 2008.

• A native of Blacksburg, Va., he graduated from Blacksburg High where he was a member of the football and baseball teams.

• Is married to the former Carolyn Croy, a Virginia Tech graduate from Blacksburg. The couple has a son, Andrew Scot, who is 11, and a daughter, Eliza Leigh, who turned 7 in November.
