Tech Looks to Get Back to Winning Ways

About Longwood

Longwood is 21-18 on the year and features a high-powered offense. Kami Nuckols leads the way (.380) for an offense that hits .283 with 30 home runs. Camille Ketsdever (.366), Nichole Simmons (.322, 7 HRs) and Emily Radford (.314, 8 HRs) are also having good years at the plate.

Briana Wells sees most of the action in the circle. She is 17-15 with a 2.68 ERA in 185.1 innings pitched.

The Series

Tech and Longwood have met just four previous times with the series tied 2-2.

In 2007, the Hokies traveled to Farmville for a doubleheader and the two split, with Tech falling 3-2 in the opener before winning the second game 13-8. Last year, the Lancers came to Blacksburg and the squads split again with the Hokies winning 2-0 in the first game before falling 5-4 in eight innings in the nightcap.

500 for Thomas

Tech head coach **Scot Thomas** reached another coaching milestone last Saturday when the Hokies beat Boston College 9-1 to pick up his 500th career win. He has a current record of 502-330 in his 14th year at the helm.

234 and Counting

Senior Charisse Mariconda has started all 234 games played in her three-plus seasons at Tech and could end up being the first player in Tech softball history to start every game in a four-year span. The closest any player has come to accomplishing the feat was Michelle Meadows, who started 250 games out of 252 games played during her career. Mariconda has started 199 games at third base and 35 games at shortstop.

Home Sweet Home

Tech Softball Park, home of Virginia Tech softball since 1998, has been a tough place for

opposing teams to play of the years. Last year, Tech averaged 699 fans per date, 13th-best in the country.

With the construction project completely finished, the Hokies now play in a park that can hold 1,024 fans. Over the years, Virginia Tech has posted a 155-55 record at home, a winning percentage of .738.

Records Watch

It'll take a strong finish, but Jenna Rhodes could finish with the school's highest career batting average. She currently has a career average of .367, just a few points ahead of Michelle Meadows, who batted .347 for her career. Coincidentally, Meadows is the SWA at Longwood.

Goin!

Between Jenna Rhodes (94-for-113), Charisse Mariconda (42-for-45) and Erin Ota (34-for-41), the Hokies have three veterans on the base paths who have combined for an 85 percent success rate (170-for-199) for their careers.

This year, the Hokies are a combined 63-for-73 on the basepaths a year after stealing a schoolrecord 102 bases.

Games Added to the Schedule

Head coach Scot Thomas has announced the addition of five games, including one home contest, to the schedule. Because the Hokies have been rained out seven times, he has added these games to the slate. Tech will travel to Greensboro on Thursday, April 23 for a 2 o'clock doubleheader at North Carolina A&T. On Tuesday, April 28, the Hokies will host Appalachian State in a single game starting at 7 p.m. On Thursday, April 30, Tech will travel back to Greensboro to take on UNC Greensboro in a 5 o'clock doubleheader.

Senior Weekend and Spring Game

Virginia Tech's Spring Football Game will be held this Saturday, the day Tech softball hosts Maryland, at 2 o'clock. As always, it's open parking for both events, so fans are encouraged to arrive early and be patient with the parking situation.

On Sunday, Tech will honor its six seniors — Jessica Everhart, Kim Jalm, Charisse Mariconda, Erin Ota, Jenna Rhodes and Beth Walker — before the 1 o'clock game against the Terps.

Marra Hvozdovic is a fourth-generation Hokie as her great grandfather, grandfather and both parents attended Virginia Tech ... Richelle McGarva used to work in construction with her dad ... At seven letters, Erin Ota has the shortest name of anyone in the history of Tech softball, while at 17 letters, Charisse Mariconda's name is tied with Christine Trunnell as the longest in Tech softball history ... Kenzie Roark was an aunt before she was even born and recently became a great aunt ... Kim Jalm's family lives across from Burt Reynolds' ranch in Florida ... Erin Ota donated 10 inches of her hair to "Locks for Love" in January ... Kristen Froehlich went to Italy over the summer and brought back some ash from Pompeii ... Beth Walker and Amber Walker used to be battery mates at Galax High when Beth pitched ... Whitney Davis went to the same high school as former MLB great Billy Wagner ... Jenna Rhodes was raised on a chicken farm ... Erin Ota's sister, Melissa, played softball at Brown ... Jessica Everhart is engaged to Stevie Ray Lloyd, a former Hokie football player who finished his career at Liberty University ... Beth Walker is President of Virginia Tech's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) ... A Second Home: Trainer Katie Baer has had her hands full this season already as several key players are making the Eddie Ferrell Memorial Training Room a second home. Kristin Graham's arm troubles prevented her from pitching early in the season. Graham was able to hit and play first base and shortstop, at least, and finally made her debut in the circle on March 21 against Georgia Tech. Another setback came on Feb. 10 when starting centerfielder Richelle McGarva suffered a lateral dislocation of her left ankle in a routine base running drill in practice. She had emergency surgery that night at Montgomery Regional Hospital and is likely out for the rest of the season. Marra Hvozdovic, who was the fourth outfielder, was injured at Florida State and will lbe imited after having thumb surgery. That leaves Tech with three outfielders for the time being. Tech also lost shortstop/catcher Misty Hall for the season when she was dismissed from school for a violation of university policy and Kenzie Roark hurt her knee in a training session over Spring Break and but returned for the Georgia Tech series. Tech is down to just 14 healthy players for the time being with six of those being current or former true or invited walk-ons.

Double Duty: Assistant coach **Barb Sherwood** will pull double duty this summer as she was recently named the field manager (head coach) of the Akron Racers of the NPF. She will continue her duties with the Hokies while coaching the Racers. Sherwood will get to work with former Hokie and 2008 All-NPF selection Angela Tincher in the league.

Tracking Tinch: After being named the National Player of the Year by USA Softball in 2008, former Hokie pitcher Angela Tincher has kept things rolling. Last summer, she was a standout for the Akron Racers and this spring, she is in Japan for another adventure. She signed with LeoPalace 21 of the Japan Pro Softball League and is competing there for three months before returning to the NPF this summer. She will head back to Japan after the NPF season is complete to finish her stint across the seas.

WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most often-asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.! Sola-Rex Sola-Rah Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!! Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

Just Virginia Tech, Please

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

Tech finished in 21st in the nation in 2007, averaging 547 fans per home date, a year after finishing 17th in the country with an average of 551 fans per home date. Last year, Tech went way up in average attendance, averaging 699 fans per date.

Nearly 800 permanent seats have been added, along with lights, two more press boxes and a new sound system, making the facility a fine one for the Hokies to play.

Over the years, Tech has posted a 155-55 record at home, a winning percentage of .738.
