About Maryland

Maryland is 23-22 overall, 7-8 in the ACC. Tech and the Terps are tied for fourth in the conference standings. The Terrapins are led at the plate by Breanna Shaw, who is batting .331 while Nadine Blackie is hitting .316 with six home runs and 10 stolen bases. Vangie Gallindo (.313) is the only other player hitting over .300 for a team that hits .268 with 21 home runs and 46 stolen bases.

In the circle, Kerry Hickey is 10-8 with a 2.19 ERA and 143 strikeouts while Sarah Dooley is 12-18 with a 3.05 ERA.

The Series

The Hokies and Terps have met 18 previous times — Maryland leads 10-8 — in a series dating back to 1997. Last year, the Hokies won the series that was played in College Park, 2-1. Tech won the first game 8-1 and the third game 8-3. Maryland took the middle game, 2-1. The two met in the opening game of the ACC Tournament with the Hokies rallying for a 7-4 win en route to their second-straight ACC Tournament title. Tech is 3-3 against the Terrapins at Tech Softball Park.

What's at Stake

While it looks like theses two teams will meet in the first round of the ACC Tournament regardless of what happens this weekend, there's a lot at stake with this series. That's because in each of the last three seasons, every ACC team to finish in the top four of the regular season standings with a winning overall record and at least a .500 mark in conference games has made the NCAA Tournament.

In both 2006 and 2007, the top five teams went to the Big Dance and last year, the top four ACC teams made it to the NCAA Tournament, including Georgia Tech which had a 31-30 record heading into the NCAAs. The last time the ACC didn't get at least four teams into postseason was in 2004, back when just six teams were in the league and three went to the NCAA Tourney that year.

This is Tech's last ACC series while Maryland hosts Georgia Tech next weekend.

Records Watch

It'll take a strong finish, but Jenna Rhodes could finish with the school's highest career batting average. She currently has a career average of .375, well ahead of Michelle Meadows, who batted .347 for her career.

Senior **Charisse Mariconda** needs three more doubles to break the school's career doubles mark. Meadows had 48 two-baggers from 1997-2000. Mariconda picked up a double against North Carolina A&T and now has 46.

Home Sweet Home

Tech Softball Park, home of Tech softball since 1998, has been a tough place for opposing teams to play of the years. Last year, Tech averaged 699 fans per date, 13th-best in the country.

With the construction project completely finished, the Hokies now play in a park that can hold 1,024 fans. Over the years, Virginia Tech has posted a 156-56 record at home, a winning percentage of .736.

Record Crowds

The four largest crowds in Tech Softball Park history have come on the day the Spring Football Game has been held, like it will be held Saturday. In 2005, a record 1,977 fans crammed around the park to watch the NC State game on April 16. On April 15, 2006, 1,874 fans watched the Tech/UNC game. A crowd of 1,283 took in the April 21, 2007 game between Tech and Maryland and on April 19, 2008, 1,182 enthusiasts enjoyed the Tech and Florida State game. This will mark the fifth-straight year the Hokies have played at home on the same day as the Spring Football Game.

Senior Weekend and Spring Game

Virginia Tech's Spring Football Game will be held this Saturday, the day Tech softball hosts Maryland, at 2 o'clock. As always, it's open parking for both events, so fans are encouraged to arrive early and be patient with the parking situation.

On Sunday, Tech will honor its six seniors — Jessica Everhart, Kim Jalm, Charisse Mariconda, Erin Ota, Jenna Rhodes and Beth Walker — before the 1 o'clock game against the Terps.

A Second Home: Trainer Katie Baer has had her hands full this season already as several key players are making the Eddie Ferrell Memorial Training Room a second home. Kristin Graham's arm troubles prevented her from pitching early in the season. Graham was able to hit and play first base and shortstop, at least, and finally made her debut in the circle on March 21 against Georgia Tech. Another setback came on Feb. 10 when starting centerfielder Richelle McGarva suffered a lateral dislocation of her left ankle in a routine base running drill in practice. She had emergency surgery that night at Montgomery Regional Hospital and is likely out for the rest of the season. Marra Hvozdovic, who was the fourth outfielder, was injured at Florida State and will be imited after having thumb surgery. That leaves Tech with three outfielders for the time being. Tech also lost shortstop/catcher Misty Hall for the season when she was dismissed from school for a violation of university policy and Kenzie Roark hurt her knee in a training session over Spring Break and but returned for the Georgia Tech series. Tech is down to just 14 healthy players for the time being with six of those being current or former true or invited walk-ons.

Double Duty: Assistant coach **Barb Sherwood** will pull double duty this summer as she was recently named the field manager (head coach) of the Akron Racers of the NPF. She will continue her duties with the Hokies while coaching the Racers. Sherwood will get to work with former Hokie and 2008 All-NPF selection Angela Tincher in the league.

Tracking Tinch: After being named the National Player of the Year by USA Softball in 2008, former Hokie pitcher Angela Tincher has kept things rolling. Last summer, she was a standout for the Akron Racers and this spring, she is in Japan for another adventure. She signed with LeoPalace 21 of the Japan Pro Softball League and is competing there for three months before returning to the NPF this summer. She will head back to Japan after the NPF season is complete to finish her stint across the seas.

WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most often-asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy! Tech! Tech! V.P.I.! Sola-Rex Sola-Rah Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!! Rae, Ri, V.P.I.

Just Virginia Tech, Please

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its named to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

Tech Softball Park, home of Virginia Tech softball since 1998, has been a tough place for opposing teams to play of the years. Tech finished in 21st in the nation in 2007, averaging 547 fans per home date, a year after finishing 17th in the country with an average of 551 fans per home date. Last year, Tech went way up in average attendance, averaging 699 fans per date.

Nearly 800 permanent seats have been added, along with lights, two more press boxes and a new sound system, making the facility a fine one for the Hokies to play.

Over the years, Tech has posted a 156-56 record at home, a winning percentage of .736.

- Led the Hokies to Atlantic Coast Conference tournament titles in both 2007 and 2008. Also led the Hokies to the regular-season title in 2007, a program first.
