Series: VT leads 2-0

About Appalachian State

Appalachian State is led at the plate by All-America candidate Katie Boyd. The sophomore is batting .393 with 16 home runs, 43 RBI and 15 stolen bases. She hit a solo shot against Tech earlier this year. Sarah Rappe has 28 stolen bases. ASU bats .254 as a team and has a staff ERA of 2.90, led by Kayla Richardson (13-14, 2.47 ERA).

The Series

The Hokies and ASU have met two previous times with the Hokies winning both contests. In 2004, the Mountaineers came to Blacksburg and the Hokies beat them 6-0. Earlier this year, Jessica Everhart hit a three-run, walk-off home run in the eighth inning to lift Tech to a 5-4 win over State at the Kickin' Chicken Classic at Coastal Carolina.

Records Watch

Barring a complete collapse in the final seven games, Jenna Rhodes will finish with the school's highest career batting average. She currently has a career average of .380, well ahead of Michelle Meadows, who batted .347 for her career.

Rhodes has already broken the school's single-season hits record (78), is two stolen bases away from breaking her single-season mark (41) and is nine away from breaking the career record of 113 held by her sister, Callie. Rhodes will also set a new single-season batting average mark. She is hitting .481 heading into the final week of play with the record sitting at .376 (Michelle Meadows, 1997).

Senior Charisse Mariconda needs two more doubles to break the school's career doubles mark. Meadows had 48 two-baggers from 1997-2000. Mariconda picked up a double against Maryland and now has 47.

Home Sweet Home

Tech Softball Park, home of Tech softball since 1998, has been a tough place for opposing teams to play of the years. Last year, Tech averaged 699 fans per date, 13th-best in the country.

With the construction project completely finished, the Hokies now play in a park that can hold 1,024 fans. Over the years, Virginia Tech has posted a 157-58 record at home, a winning percentage of .734.

200-100-100

Senior Charisse Mariconda joined an elite club of softball players at Virginia Tech when she scored in the first game against Boston College. She became just the fifth player in program history to record 200 career hits, 100 career RBI and 100 career runs. Mariconda currently has 224 hits, 128 RBI and 108 runs scored.

Only four other Tech players have reached the 200-100-100 club in the 14-year history of the program and arguably they are among the top position players in the program's history. They are: Michelle Meadows (254-131-122), Kara Krumhardt (235-115-129), Megan Evans (212-161-117) and Clarisa Crowell (200-103-104).

Jessica Everhart could join that club with a strong finish. She currently has 195 hits, 103 RBI and 96 runs scored.

241 and Counting

Senior Charisse Mariconda has started all 241 games played in her three-plus seasons at Tech and could end up being the first player in Tech softball history to start every game in a four-year span.

The closest any player has come to accomplishing the feat was Michelle Meadows, who started 250 games out of 252 games played during her career. Mariconda has started 206 games at third base and 35 games at shortstop.

Go in!

Between Jenna Rhodes (105-for-125), Charisse Mariconda (47-for-50) and Erin Ota (35-for-42), the Hokies have three veterans on the base paths who have combined for an 86 percent success rate (187-for-217) for their careers.

This will be the final appearance at Tech Softball Park for the Hokies' six seniors: Jessica Everhart, Kim Jalm, Charisse Mariconda, Erin Ota, Jenna Rhodes and Beth Walker.

A Second Home: Trainer Katie Baer has had her hands full this season already as several key players are making the Eddie Ferrell Memorial Training Room a second home. **Kristin Graham's** arm troubles prevented her from pitching early in the season. Graham was able to hit and play first base and shortstop, at least, and finally made her debut in the circle on March 21 against Georgia Tech. Another setback came on Feb. 10 when starting centerfielder **Richelle McGarva** suffered a lateral dislocation of her left ankle in a routine base running drill in practice. She had emergency surgery that night at Montgomery Regional Hospital and is likely out for the rest of the season. **Marra Hvozdovic**, who was the fourth outfielder, was injured at Florida State and will be imited after having thumb surgery. That leaves Tech with three outfielders for the time being. Tech also lost shortstop/catcher Misty Hall for the season when she was dismissed from school for a violation of university policy and **Kenzie Roark** hurt her knee in a training session over Spring Break and but returned for the Georgia Tech series. Tech is down to just 14 healthy players for the time being with six of those being current or former true or invited walk-ons.

Double Duty: Assistant coach **Barb Sherwood** will pull double duty this summer as she was recently named the field manager (head coach) of the Akron Racers of the NPF. She will continue her duties with the Hokies while coaching the Racers. Sherwood will get to work with former Hokie and 2008 All-NPF selection Angela Tincher in the league.

Tracking Tinch: After being named the National Player of the Year by USA Softball in 2008, former Hokie pitcher Angela Tincher has kept things rolling. Last summer, she was a standout for the Akron Racers and this spring, she is in Japan for another adventure. She signed with LeoPalace 21 of the Japan Pro Softball League and is competing there for three months before returning to the NPF this summer. She will head back to Japan after the NPF season is complete to finish her stint across the seas.

WHAT'S A HOKIE?

That's the most often-asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute.

With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body. Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today.

Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention. Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Following is the "Old Hokie" yell in its original form:

**Hoki, Hoki, Hoki Hy!
Tech! Tech! V.P.I.!!
Sola-Rex Sola-Rah
Polytech-Vir-gin-i-a!!
Rae, Ri, V.P.I.**

JUST VIRGINIA TECH, PLEASE

While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech."

Founded in 1872, as Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896.

Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech.

The "State University" was added in 1970 to bring the official title to what it is today.

Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech."

Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

• In 2006, won 39 games and were a No. 2 seed at the Knoxville Regional, despite starting seven sophomores or freshmen down the stretch. Helped coach Tech's first softball All-American, as well as five all-region, four all-conference and seven all-state selections.

• Has been named the Virginia State Coach of the Year by the Virginia Sports Information Directors (VaSID) a record five times (1999, 2000, 2002, 2005 and 2008).

• He has had over 23 different players named to the all-state team 44 different times, including at least three on every team in 10 of the last 11 seasons.

• Graduated from East Tennessee State University in 1991 with a bachelor's in physical education.

• Was also selected to be the head coach of a group of local collegiate all-stars who took on the U.S. Olympic Softball Team in Salem, Va., in the summer of 2004 and will do so again in the summer of 2008.

• A native of Blacksburg, Va., he graduated from Blacksburg High where he was a member of the football and baseball teams.

• Is married to the former Carolyn Croy, a Virginia Tech graduate from Blacksburg. The couple has a son, Andrew Scot, who is 11, and a daughter, Eliza Leigh, who turned 7 in November.
