Men's NCAA Championships

- The 2011 Men's NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships, hosted by the University of Minnesota, will be held from March 24-26 at the Dorothy L. Sheppard Pool in Minneapolis, Minn.

- The University of Texas won last year's NCAA Championships, with a score of 500 points. The Longhorns were followed by California in second (469.5 pts) and Arizona in third (387 pts).

- Six ACC teams scored points at last year's NCAA Championships. Virginia led the conference with a 10th-place finish (123 pts), followed by North Carolina in 15th (76.5 pts), Duke in 18th (52 pts) and Florida State rounding out the top 20 in 19th (49.5 pts). Georgia Tech finished 23rd (35 pts) and Miami placed 28th (21 pts).

- Since 1999, only Auburn (6), Texas (4) and Arizona (1), have won the NAAs.

- Logan Shinholser, Ryan Hawkins and Daniel Martin all qualified for the 2011 NCAA Championships on March 11-13 at the NCAA Zone A Diving Championships. Hawkins won the 3-meter and placed second on the 1-meter and platform, Shinholser won the 1-meter and platform and placed second on the 3-meter, and Daniel Martin qualified with a third-place finish, behind only his own teammates, on the 3-meter. This is the first time in Tech history that the H₂Ogies will send three divers to the NCAA Championships.

2010 Men's NCAA Results

- The H₂Ogies had a total of seven athletes qualify for the 2010 NCAA Championships, four from the women's side and three from the men, and the women earned a strong top-25 finish.

- Charlie Higgins, Mikey McDonald and Logan Shinholser qualified and competed for the men. Though they didn't score any points, Higgins did set a new Virginia Tech school record in the 200 backstroke, recording a 23rd-place preliminary finish in 1:43.72. He also finished 25th in the 100 backstroke.

- McDonald earned 18th, 26th and 24th-place finishes, respectively, in the 1-meter, 3-meter and platform events, while Shinholser finished 33rd, 25th and 25th in the three diving events.

H₂Okies in the Polls

- After both teams finished ranked in the top 25 last season, the H₂Okies garnered respect in this season's first TYR/CSCAA national poll. The men opened the season ranked 23rd in the country, while the women missed the top 25 by one vote, earning 66 points, just one less than No. 25 Missouri.
- The men's team dropped out of the top 25 in the second poll, which was released on Dec. 15. In the most recent polls, the men were ranked 37th, but the women did not receive any votes.

Savage, Hajnal, Shinholser Named Athletes of the Week

- Sophomore transfer Heather Savage became the first H₂Okie of the season to earn Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week honors after a spectacular outing on Jan. 15 against William & Mary.
- Savage was the only swimmer of the day to take home three individual titles, winning all three events she swam: the 50, 100 and 200 freestyle. Additionally, she set new CAC records in the 50 and the 100.
- Erika Hajnal earned VT Athlete of the Week and ACC Performer of the Week honors on Jan. 31, after her strong performances in the Midwest tri-meets. It marks her second ACC honor (Oct. 27, 2009) and third VT honor (2010 ACC and NCAA Championships).
- Hajnal earned two silver medals against No. 14 Indiana and No. 16 Louisville on Jan. 28, breaking pool records in the 500 and 1000 free. She then won all three races she swam the following morning against Cincinnati and Kentucky, finishing first in the 500 and 1000 free and the 200 fly.
- Logan Shinholser was an automatic qualifier for Virginia Tech Athlete of the week on Feb. 21 after earning a gold medal at the ACC Championships on the platform diving event. Shinholser is Tech's first ever ACC diving champion.

Hajnal, Milton Represent H₂Okies at Women's NAAs

- Junior returning All-American Erika Hajnal and senior diver Sarah Milton represented the H₂Okies at the 2011 Women's NCAA Championships on March 17-19. Hajnal, Tech's third ever female to earn full All-America honors (not honorable mention), competed in the 1650 freestyle, the 400 IM and the 500 freestyle for the third straight year. Sarah Milton, Tech's first ever female diver to qualify for NAAs, competed in all three diving events.
- In a disappointing follow-up to last season's top-25 finish, the two women were unable to score any points for Virginia Tech in this year's championships. Hajnal began the meet with a 58th-place finish in the 500 free. She then placed 34th in the 400 IM, a surprising drop-off from last year's top-eight mark, and she then just barely missed scoring points in the final event with a 17th-place finish in the 1650 free with a season-best time of 16:08.28.
- Sarah Milton, concluding decorated diving career as Tech's first ever female diving qualifier, placed 32nd on the 1-meter and 23rd on both the 3-meter and the platform.
- No. 2 California won its second national championship in three years with a total of 424 points. No. 1 Georgia took home the silver medal with 394.5 points, followed by No. 5 Southern California in third (351 pts). No. 11 Virginia once again had the highest finish of all ACC member institutions, finishing 13th with 105 points. Miami followed in 16th (67 pts), followed by Duke in 19th (54 pts), Maryland in 22nd (42 pts) and North Carolina tied for 23rd (40 pts).

Record-High Four H₂Okie Divers Advance to NAAs

- The men's and women's divers competed at the NCAA Zone A Championships on March 11-13, looking to claim one of nine open positions in the NCAA Championships. In an unprecedented display of outstanding performances, the H₂Okies clinched three of the four male spots, as Logan Shinholser, Ryan Hawkins and Daniel Martin all qualified for the national championships, and Sarah Milton earned one of the five women's spots. Milton is the first female diver ever to represent the H₂Okies at NAAs.
- The men opened the weekend with their first ever event sweep at Zones, as Hawkins, Shinholser and Martin all finished in the top three. Shinholser and Hawkins both finished in the top two in all three events on the weekend, with Hawkins winning the 1-meter and Shinholser winning the other two. The H₂Okies sweep on day one turned out to be sufficient to send all three Tech divers to Minneapolis.
- Sarah Milton came in second on the 1-meter springboard on March 12, which clinched her one of the five open positions at NAAs and made her

the first ever female diver to qualify for the national championships at Virginia Tech. She will join Erika Hajnal in Austin, Texas on March 17-19.

Men Just Miss Podium at 2011 ACC Championships

- For the second year in a row, the Virginia Tech men's swimming and diving team placed fourth at the Atlantic Coast Conference Championships with a total of 508.5 points. The University of Virginia captured its fourth consecutive and 14th overall championship, earning a total of 820 points. North Carolina finished second, with 588 points, and Florida State overtook Virginia Tech in the final event of the meet, the 400 free relay, to earn the bronze medal with 511.5 points.
- Gregory Mahon earned the most points for Tech of any male or female participant, earning the bronze medal and Third-Team All-ACC in the 200 fly, while taking fourth in the 100 fly and the 200 IM, for a total of 46 points. Mahon's time of 1:46.34 in the individual medley broke the school record, which he set at the 2010 ACC Championships.
- Freshman Nick Tremols had an outstanding postseason debut, picking up 26 points for the H₂Ogies, including a fourth-place finish in the 200 fly. Zach McGinnis, swimming in the ACCs for Tech for the first time, earned 28, finishing fourth in the 200 back and sixth in the 100 back.
- Blake Trabuchi-Downey earned a total of 22 points in three events for Tech; Nevin Cook picked up 21, including a fourth-place finish in the 100 breast, and Alex Lutterbein earned a total of 20 points for the H₂Ogies, breaking the school record in the 400 IM and finishing fifth, swimming a 3:49.01.
- The H₂Ogies also had a pair of top-four relay finishes. Charlie Higgins, Cook, Mahon and Karl Botha earned the bronze in the

400 medley relay (3:12.23), and Higgins, Cook, Mahon and Rich Ulatowski opened the meet with a fourth-place finish in the 200 medley (1:27.67).

Women Finish Fifth at 2011 ACC Championships

- For the second year in a row, the Virginia Tech women's swimming and diving team placed fifth at the Atlantic Coast Conference Championships with a total of 358 points. The University of Virginia captured its fourth consecutive and ninth overall championship, earning a total of 776 points. North Carolina, who was in first place heading into the final day of competition, finished second with 734, and Florida State took third (417).
- Erika Hajnal was Tech's most lucrative swimmer, finishing in at least sixth in all three of her races and earning 44 points for Tech. She earned a bronze medal and All-ACC recognition in the 400 IM, came in fourth in the 1650 free and finished sixth in the 500 free.
- Keri Sink earned 25.5 points for the H₂Ogies, tying for seventh in the 100 breast and finishing 10th in both the 200 breast and 400 IM.
- Lauren Ritter picked up 25 points for Tech, finishing seventh in the 200 free, 10th in the 1650 free and 11th in the 500 free.
- Meaghan Holloway earned Tech 18 points with a seventh-place finish in the 200 fly and an 11th-place finish in the 100 fly, while Heather Savage earned an additional 15.5, placing eighth in the 100 fly and tied for 12th in the 50 free.
- Katarina Filova then scored 13 points for the H₂Ogies, placing ninth in the 200 free, 14th in the 100 free and 16th in the 50 free.
- Sarah Milton picked up significant points in all three diving events, finishing ninth on the 1-meter and platform and 10th on the 3-meter, for a total of 25 points.

- Carissa Santora earned 22 big points for the H₂Ogies with a pair of eighth-place finishes on the 3-meter and platform, and Cara Murnan set a new Tech record on the platform, earning 13 points with a sixth-place finish (264.30).

Shinholser Becomes Tech's First ACC Diving Champion

- On Feb. 19, Logan Shinholser once again broke his own school record, scoring a 449.15 in the finals of the platform diving event, to become the first ever ACC Diving Champion at Virginia Tech. After finishing second in the preliminary round with a 401.60 behind Duke's Nick McCrory, Logan hit six fantastic dives to beat out Florida State's Lando Marzullo (441.25) for the platform title. Shinholser placed second in the event last season as a freshman.
- Shinholser is the first Tech diver to win a conference title since Tech joined the ACC in 2004, and the only H₂Ogie to ever win the platform event. The last diver to win a conference title before him was Jackie Davoud, who won the 1-meter and 3-meter springboard events at the Atlantic 10 Championships in 1996, 1998 and 1999.
- Tech had three male conference champions, all on the 1-meter springboard, back when the H₂Ogies were members of the Southern Conference. Billy Walker earned Tech's first ever conference event title, winning the 1-meter springboard in 1938. J.V. Blondell was the Southern Conference Champion in 1959, and Bruce Reynolds won the event in 1965. Shinholser is thus the first male diver to earn a conference title in 46 years.



Ryan Hawkins Impresses at ACCs

- Freshman Ryan Hawkins had a tremendous outing at the Men's ACC Diving Championships on Feb. 17-19. Hawkins earned three top-five finishes to earn 44 big points for the Virginia Tech men.
- Hawkins began the weekend by breaking the 400-point mark for the first time, earning a fourth-place finish on the 3-meter springboard with a score of 402.95. He missed the podium by just one spot yet again the next day, finishing fourth on the 1-meter with a score of 365.85. The rookie then finished out the competition with a fifth-place finish on the platform, scoring a personal-best mark of 385.30.

Tech Hosts First Annual Virginia Tech Invitational

- On Feb. 5-6, the H₂Ogies closed out the regular season by hosting the first annual Virginia Tech Invitational at the brand new Christiansburg Aquatic Center. Small squads from James Madison, UNC Wilmington, Georgia Tech, VMI and Washington and Lee participated in the two-day invite.
- The H₂Ogies took home 14 gold medals at the event, with a Tech swimmer winning every event in which a H₂Ogie swam in the finals and there were more than two swimmers competing.
- Freshman Rachel Sepanski had a stellar weekend, earning three gold medals, finishing first in the 100, 200 and 500 freestyle events. Classmate Natalie Leake then went on to win both breaststroke events, while fellow-rookie Caroline Higgins won both backstroke events.

- Senior Morgan Allen, competing in the final meet of her Tech career, finished first in the 50 free and second, right behind Sepanski, in the 100 free.
- Michael Hallock earned two golds and a silver on the weekend, winning the 100 free and the 100 back, while placing second in the 50 free. Hallock swam the 100 back in 48.61 to become the second H₂Ogie male of the season to swim an NCAA B cut (Charlie Higgins, 100 back, 48.58).
- Adam Skipper, Nathan Hoisington, Chris Verboncoeur and Ben Munster won the final four events for the men. Skipper won the 50 free, Hoisington won the 100 breast, Verboncoeur finished first in the 100 fly and Munster brought it home in the 500 free.

H₂Ogies Earn Four Victories in Final Tri-Meet

- After a four tough losses the night before, the H₂Ogies rebounded with four big wins over Cincinnati and Kentucky on Saturday, Jan. 29 to finish out the dual-meet portion of the regular season. The wins give the men a final record of 5-2, while the women finish 6-3.
- Tech won 18 of the 32 events on Saturday, with nine wins apiece for the men and the women.
- Erika Hajnal and Blake Trabuchi-Downey led the way for the H₂Ogies, each winning all three events they swam. Both swimmers earned golds in the 500 and 1000 freestyle and the 200 fly.
- Katarina Filova and Keri Sink were the only other H₂Ogies to earn multiple titles, as Filova finished first in the 100 and 200 free and Sink won both breaststroke events.

Tech Swept by Nationally-Ranked Louisville, Indiana

- The H₂Ogies took on No. 18/16 Louisville and No. 13/14 Indiana on Friday, Jan. 28, in the toughest head-to-head competition of the 2010-11 season. Logan Shinholser had an outstanding night in the diving competition, but the nationally-ranked teams proved too much for the H₂Ogies, who ended up 0-4 on the night.
- Logan Shinholser won both competitions he participated, earning a 334.10 on the 1-meter springboard and a 385.40 on the 3-meter.
- Matt Baumler had an impressive night, earning Tech's only swimming title as well as two silver medals. Baumler began with a second-place finish in the 200 fly, followed by another second-place finish in the 100 free. He then finished his night by leading a H₂Ogie sweep of the 100 fly, finishing in 49.14.
- No Tech woman earned a first-place finish at the tough tri-meet, but the Lady H₂Ogies did take home three silver and four bronze medals. Erika Hajnal led the charge, finishing second and breaking Louisville pool records in the 500 and the 1000 freestyle. Lauren Ritter followed close behind, finishing third in the 1000 and fourth in the 500. Heather Savage then earned a silver medal in the 100 fly.
- Keri Sink and Katarina Filova earned the final two individual medals, finishing third in the 100 breast and 50 free, respectively. Filova then teamed up with Steffi Drechsel, Kaleigh Gomes and Addie Carne for a third-place finish in the 200 free relay.

Tech Women Defeat Richmond in Final Home Dual

- The Virginia Tech women hosted the Spiders of the University of Richmond in the H₂Okies' final dual meet of the season at the CAC. Tech came out victorious, winning 12 of the 16 events for a 173-121 victory.
- Erika Hajnal led the charge, earning first-place finishes while breaking CAC records and leading Tech sweeps in all three events she swam: the 500 free, the 1000 free and the 200 butterfly.
- Keri Sink and Heather Savage both earned three titles as well. Sink won the 100 breast and the 200 IM and teamed up with Savage, Steffi Drechsel and Kaleigh Gomes in the 200 medley relay. Savage also won the 100 fly and the 400 free relay, along with Drechsel, Gomes and Lauren Ritter.
- Addie Carne and Aubree Duncan earned Tech's final two swimming titles, winning the 200 free and the 200 back.
- Sara Mokhtari and Carissa Santora led a H₂Okie sweep of the diving competition, as Mokhtari won the 1-meter and Santora won the 3-meter.

H₂Okies Sweep Tribe on Seniors and Parents Day

- The H₂Okies returned home last Saturday to host a dual meet with William & Mary on Seniors and Parents Day. Tech earned a sweep of the Tribe, as the men won 162-117 and the women won 160-121.
- Virginia Tech took home titles in 29 of the 32 events, with 15 event sweeps including all four diving competitions, while breaking 20 pool records at the CAC.
- Heather Savage led the H₂Okie women, winning the 50, 100 and 200 freestyle events. She was the only swimmer of the day to earn three individual titles.
- Karl Botha and Matt Baumler each earned three titles as well. Botha led sweeps of the 100 and 200 fly, and teamed up with Baumler, Adam Skipper and Gregory Mahon for a sweep of the 200 free relay. Additionally, Baumler won the 200 free and the 200 medley relay, along with Skipper, Charlie Higgins and Nevin Cook.
- All five seniors on the women's team earned at least one title on senior day, as the four swimmers, Morgan Allen, Lauren Ritter, Steffi Drechsel and Kaleigh Gomes came in first in the 200 medley relay. Ritter also won the 500 free and Drechsel took home gold in the 200 backstroke.
- Sarah Milton and Logan Shinholser led sweeps of the 1-meter and 3-meter diving events.
- Richard Ulatowski represented the men's senior class, earning titles and setting pool records in the 50 and 100 free.

Shinholser Breaks Pool, School Platform Record

- At the Volunteer Invitational on Nov. 20, Logan Shinholser scored a 436.90 in the first platform diving competition of the season. Shinholser's impressive mark handed him a gold medal at the meet and set a new all-time record at the Jones Aquatic Center. Additionally, he broke Virginia Tech's school record, a record which he himself set last season at the ACC Championships.

Women Win, Men Take Second at Volunteer Invitational

- The H₂Okies traveled to Knoxville, Tenn., on Nov. 18-20 to compete in the Volunteer Invitational. Tech took on Tennessee, Alabama and Kentucky.
- The women had an outstanding weekend, coming in first with 1,118 points, ahead of No. 11 Tennessee in second, who scored 918 points. They earned five titles, including two individual swimming titles for Erika Hajnal, and broke three pool records: the 400 IM (Hajnal), the 200 free (Filova) and the 800 freestyle relay (Filova, Ritter, Hajnal, Howanitz). Additionally, Cara Murnan finished first on the platform.
- The No. 23 men took second at the meet, with 975.5 points, behind No. 16 Alabama (1,191 pts) and ahead of No. 15 Tennessee (932.5 pts). The Wildcats finished fourth in both competitions. Logan Shinholser broke Tennessee's pool record in the platform diving event, while breaking Virginia Tech's school record, which he set at last year's ACC Championships. Charlie Higgins took home the only swimming title for the men, swimming a "B" cut time of 48.58 in the 100 backstroke.

Tech Places Second at No. 11/9 Virginia

- The H₂Okies traveled to Charlottesville, Va., on Nov. 12-13 to face No. 11/9 Virginia and No. 25/NR Princeton. The Cavaliers dominated the meet, finishing ahead of the second-place H₂Okies and the third-place Tigers in both competitions.
- Tech came away with eight titles in the meet, including a win in all four diving competitions, with three sweeps.
- Erika Hajnal led the 26th-ranked women's team, earning a pair of NCAA "B" cut, first-place finishes, winning the 400 individual medley and the 1650 freestyle.
- Stephen Hawkins and Trey Stewart each picked up a title for the 23rd-ranked men's team, as Hawkins won the 100 backstroke and Stewart took the gold in the 200 fly.
- The men's diving team swept both diving events, with Ryan Hawkins winning the 1-meter springboard and Logan Shinholser winning the 3-meter. Sarah Milton led a sweep of the 3-meter for the women, while Carissa Santora took home the gold in the 1-meter event.

H₂Okies Split at Penn State

- The H₂Okies traveled to University Park, Pa., for a dual-meet with Penn State University. The men won 181.5-118.5, but the women lost, 187-113.
- The men's team won eight titles, including five individual swimming titles, one relay title, and Logan Shinholser's second-consecutive sweep of the diving competition.
- The women won four titles, as Erika Hajnal won the 500 and the 1000 freestyle, Carissa Santora won the 1-meter springboard event, and Sarah Milton led a H₂Okie sweep of the 3-meter springboard.
- Bryan Uncur took home two individual titles for the men, winning the 200 and the 500 freestyle events. Blake Trabuchi-Downey placed first in the 1000 freestyle, Charlie Higgins won the 100 backstroke, and Gregory Mahon took home the gold in the 100 butterfly.
- Additionally, Karl Botha, Stephen Hawkins, Michael Hallock and Matt Baumler swam to a first-place finish in the 400 freestyle relay.

H₂Okies Open CAC With 31 Titles, Pool Records

- The Virginia Tech H₂Okies opened the 2010-2011 season with the inaugural intercollegiate competition at the brand new Christiansburg Aquatic Center. The team started the season with a bang, winning 31 of the 32 events and inscribing Virginia Tech names in the record books in all but one event, the women's 100 backstroke, for original pool records.
- The men took home 16 titles with 12 event sweeps, while the women won 15 events, sweeping 13 of them.
- Erika Hajnal came home with the most individual titles, winning all three events she swam: the 200 backstroke (2:06.04), the 200 butterfly (2:04.19) and the 200 individual medley (2:06.33).
- Meaghan Holloway had two individual first-place finishes, winning the 100 and 200 breaststroke, and was a member of the winning 200 medley relay team along with Caroline Higgins, Heather Savage and Morgan Allen.
- Sarah Milton and Logan Shinholser swept the diving competitions, each winning the 1-meter and 3-meter springboard events.
- Karl Botha took home three gold medals, winning the 50 free and participating in both first-place relay events.
- Alex Lutterbein, Blake Trabuchi-Downey and Charlie Higgins each took home two individual titles.

NCAA "B" Cuts

- Erika Hajnal was the first H₂Okie of the season to earn an NCAA qualifying time, swimming a 4:51.82 in the 500 freestyle at Penn State and making the NCAA "B" cut (4:52.41). She then added two more "B" cut times on Nov. 12-13 at Virginia, with her pair of first-place finishes in the 400 IM (4:15.90) and the 1650 free (16:35.67).
- The H₂Okies swam several "B" cut times at the Volunteer Invitational on Nov. 18-20, as four of Hajnal's teammates qualified provisionally as individuals along with five relay squads.

- Charlie Higgins was the first men's swimmer to earn a "B" cut time, swimming a 48.58 in the 100 backstroke at the Volunteer Invitational.
- Katarina Filova, Lauren Ritter and Brittany Boone all qualified as individuals in at least one event at the Volunteer Invitational. Filova swam "B" cut times in the 100 free (49.97), the 200 free (1:47.15) and the 500 free (4:46.34), Ritter qualified in the 200 free (1:48.53), the 500 free (4:46.66) and the 1650 free (16:28.45) and Brittany Boone earned a "B" cut time in the 200 back (1:58.91).
- The H₂Okies then had five relay teams swim "B" cut times at the Volunteer Invite. Charlie Higgins, Nevin Cook, Gregory Mahon and Richard Ulatowski swam a "B" cut time of 1:29.68 in the 200 medley relay, placing second, and then Karl Botha, Stephen Hawkins, Richard Ulatowski and Michael Hallock earned a "B" cut time of 3:00.53 in the final race of the weekend, the 400 freestyle relay.
- The women's team qualified in all three freestyle relay events at the Volunteer Invitational. Katarina Filova, Kaleigh Gomes, Heather Savage and Emily Ferguson swam a 1:32.69 in the 200 free relay, Steffi Drechsel, Ferguson, Gomes and Filova swam a 3:22.85 in the 400, and Filova, Ritter, Hajnal and Jace Howanitz set a new pool record in the 800 free relay with a "B" cut time of 7:18.10.
- Four new female swimmers swam "B" cut times at the ACC Championships. Meaghan Holloway and Heather Savage both qualified in the 100 fly, swimming 54.59 and 54.13, respectively, and Savage added a "B" cut in the 50 free (23.01).
- Laura Simon swam "B" cut times in the 500 (4:51.55) and 1650 free (16:30.45), and Keri Sink qualified in both breaststroke events, swimming a 1:01.98 in the 100 and a 2:14.26 in the 200, as well as hitting a 4:17.21 in the 400 IM.
- While the men's team entered the ACC Championships with just one qualified individual swimmer, Charlie Higgins in the 100 back, 12 additional H₂Okies swam "B" cut times at the postseason meet. Matt Baumler qualified in the 100 and 200 fly, Karl Botha in the 50 free and 100 fly, and Nevin Cook in both breast events.
- Emmett Dignan swam a "B" cut in the 100 breast, while Higgins added a "B" cut in the 100 fly. Alex Lutterbein qualified in the 500 free and the 400 IM, and Gregory Mahon swam "B" cuts in both fly events and the 200 IM.
- Zach McGinnis qualified in both backstroke events, while Trey Stewart earned qualifying marks in both fly events, and Tom Sheranek also joined McGinnis in the 200 back. Blake Trabuchi-Downey qualified in three events, the 200 fly and the 500 and 1650 free, while freshman Nick Tremols made the standard in the 200 free, 200 fly and 200 IM. Rich Ulatowski capped it off with a "B" cut in the 50 free.

Team Titles

- Tech has posted 138 first-place finishes on the season, comprising 11 relay titles, 101 individual swimming titles and 26 diving titles.
- The women have earned 71 gold medals, while the men have 64 first-place finishes.
- The H₂Okies earned 31 first-place finishes against Charleston and Radford on Oct. 16, added 12 at Penn State on Oct. 23 and eight more on Nov. 12-13 at Virginia.
- Tech then earned seven gold medals while setting four new pool records on Nov. 18-20 at the Volunteer Invitational.
- The H₂Okies returned home to win 29 titles against William & Mary on Jan. 15, while breaking 20 pool records, and the women then earned 12 more against Richmond on Jan. 22, breaking eight additional records.
- Tech finished out the dual-meet season with a trip to the Midwest for two tough tri-meets. The men picked up three titles against No. 16 Louisville and No. 14 Indiana. Tech then earned 18 individual swimming titles, nine apiece, against Cincinnati and Kentucky.
- The H₂Okies earned 14 more titles at the VT Invitational on Feb. 5-6, eight for the women and six for the men.
- Logan Shinholser earned Tech's first ever ACC diving title, setting a new school record with a 449.15 on the platform.
- The H₂Okie men won all three events at the Zone A Diving Championships to send a program-best three male divers to NCAAs.
