• “The diving teams are coming off a very busy winter of competition and training, and are really getting to that point of the season where they have been doing a lot of their dives in both training and competition,” commented head diving coach **Ron Piemonte**. “Their overall strength, combined with the consistent effort we have had in the first semester is now coming together. I am looking forward to kicking off this semester’s competition against the University of Virginia. They are a fierce opponent, and they always help us to achieve a high level of competition as we head into our championships.”

SCOUTING THE CAVALIERS

• The Virginia men’s and women’s swimming and diving program is coming off its fourth consecutive ACC title. The men have won 14 conference championships, while the women have tallied nine. The Cavalier men put up a strong Championship finish as they defeated second-place North Carolina by 232 points, while the women beat out the Tar Heels by 42 points to grab first place.

• Virginia opened the 2011-12 season, with the women competing in the SMU Classic. The Cavaliers posted a fifth-place finish out of six teams, beating Wisconsin. Six days later, both squads competed in a dual meet against Navy on Oct. 28. The men fell the Midshipmen, 159-139, while the women came out with the win, 159-124. The Cavalier women posted 1-2-3 finishes in six individual events.

• In a dual meet against Penn State and Indiana, the women came out strong sweeping the meet, while the men split, beating Penn State and falling to No. 14 Indiana.

• At the Georgia Invite on Dec. 2, the women placed fifth overall, while the men notched a fourth-place showing. The women defeated Harvard, Florida, ACC opponent Maryland and Alabama, while the men out-swam Indiana, Florida, Maryland, Alabama and UNC Wilmington.

• The Virginia divers competed in two meets of their own. On Dec. 2, Virginia competed at the Princeton’s Big Al Open where the men placed first and the women posted a fourth-place showing. The men swept the 3-meter and platform events, with senior Briggly Imbriglia breaking a six-year pool record in the platform (289.85).

• On Jan. 5, the Cavalier divers competed in the Georgia Diving Invitational. Imbriglia had another strong performance as he was the only Cavalier to make the finals in all three events.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Virginia Tech swimming and diving team was on the road as it traveled to Atlanta, Ga., for Georgia Tech's Yellow Jacket Invitational.
- The No. 22 men exploded as they claimed first place with 1,319 points, beating a pool of eight teams, while the women placed third out of 10 teams, with a score of 874.5. The University of Florida notched first place for the women, while Florida State claimed second place.
- The men took home six individual titles and notched 20 top-10 finishes, including eight top-five showings. The women took home four overall titles, while also recording 11 top-10 performances, including six top-five outings.

DIVING MAKES A SPLASH AT USA NATIONALS

- With their last chance to qualify for the 2012 Olympic Trials and to earn a spot on the international teams, eight H₂Okie divers competed at the 2012 USA Diving Winter Nationals at the University of Tennessee. The duo of Logan Shinholser and Ryan Hawkins placed sixth in the finals of the men's synchronized 3-meter event. With the top eight automatically qualifying for the Trials, this marks the second event the duo has qualified for. With previously qualifying in the men's synchronized platform and two individual events over the summer, Shinholser has qualified for all four Olympic events.
- In addition to Shinholser and Hawkins, six other H₂Okies competed at the USA Nationals: Kaylea Arnett, Logan Kline, Sara Mokhtari, Kelli Stockton, Kyle Butts and John Trope.

MEN WIN YELLOW JACKET INVITATIONAL

- The No. 22 Tech men's team swept the Yellow Jacket Invitational, beating out seven teams. The H₂Okies beat out second-place finishers, Florida, by more than 100 points. Also competing was ACC opponents Florida State, Georgia Tech, Clemson and Miami, along with Florida Atlantic, Auburn and Alabama.

H₂OKIES EXPLODE AT GA TECH

- In addition to the H₂Okies 10 individual titles and 31 top-10 finishes, Tech recorded 16 NCAA qualifying standards. The men qualified for six 'B' standards and one 'A' standard, while the women qualified for nine 'B' standards.
- Senior Erika Hajnal led the women in overall points with 92. She took home two golds, a second-place and an eighth-place finishes, qualifying for the 'B' standards in every race except one.
- Qualifying for the NCAA 'A' standards was the quartet of Emmett Dignan, Greg Morgan, Gregory Mahon and Zach McGinnis as they placed fourth in the 200 freestyle relay.
- Leading the men was Gregory Mahon as he earned 92 points. Mahon took home the gold in the 100 butterfly, placed third in the 200 IM, fourth in the 100 backstroke and third in the 200 butterfly. He also was on two first-place relay teams.
- The women set 15 new career bests, while the men set 16. Freshmen Kaylea Arnett and Kelli Stockton also set new school records in the 3-meter and platform events, respectively.

OFF THE PLATFORM FOR THE FIRST TIME

- The Tech men's and women's diving squad competed in the first platform diving event of the season at the Georgia Tech Invitational.
- Freshman Kelli Stockton set a new Tech record as she placed fourth with a score of 265.30 in her first collegiate platform event. Following Stockton was Logan Kline in fifth (261.45) and Kaylea Arnett (249.50). As a team, the women added 71 points for the H₂Okies in the event.
- Ryan Hawkins finished second with a score of 375.80, while Logan Shinholser placed fifth with a score of 336.10. Freshman Kyle Butts placed in the top-10, as he earned a eighth-place score of 280.10 in his first collegiate platform event. As a team, the men added 67 points for the H₂Okies in the event.

H₂OKIE MEN RANKED NATIONALLY

- The Tech men entered the College Swimming Coaches Association of America national poll as they sat at the No. 22 spot on Dec. 8. The H₂Okies have recently dropped out of the poll. See page three for the full rankings.

MEN NOTCH FIRST EVER WIN OVER FLORIDA STATE

- In the dual meet on Saturday, Oct. 29 the men's swimming and diving team recorded a convincing win, 182-117, over the Seminoles. Not only was it the first-ever win, but was an exciting victory since Florida State beat the H₂Okie men by only three points in the ACC Championship last season.

BENSON ON FIRE

- Freshman Sabrina Benson has been on fire in the 100 backstroke this season. Before placing sixth at the Yellow Jacket Invitational, the Raleigh, N.C., native was undefeated in the 100 backstroke as she has recorded four straight individual titles. She also took home another title in the 200 backstroke at Ohio State.
- Benson is currently unbeaten in the 100 backstroke at the CAC.

FRESHMAN SPRINGS OFF TO GREAT CAREER START

- Freshman diver Kaylea Arnett broke her own school record in the 3-meter event at the Yellow Jacket Invitational as she took home the gold with a score of 350.35. The Spring, Texas native previously set the record against North Carolina where she posted a score of 343.50.

DIVING TO NCAAs

- In the season opener against NC State and James Madison, six Tech divers qualified for the NCAA Zone meet.
- Ryan Hawkins, John Trope, Kyle Butts and Logan Shinholser qualified for the men, while Kaylea Arnett and Logan Kline qualified for the women.
- Kelli Stockton qualified against North Carolina on Oct. 28.

PERFECTION IN SEASON OPENER

- Senior Erika Hajnal, one of Tech's all-time lucrative swimmers, swam a perfect season opener against James Madison and NC State. The distance swimmer recorded first-place finishes in all three races she participated in. She touched the wall first in the 200 butterfly, 500 freestyle and 1000 freestyle. In the 1000 free she recorded a time of 10:03.95, which was close to 15 seconds faster than the runner-up.
- In diving competition, Logan Shinholser also performed perfect taking the top spots in both events. In addition to two first-place finishes, his two outings qualified him for the NCAA Zone Meet.



SEASON OPENER SETS FOUR NEW RECORDS

- The men's 200 medley relay set a new pool record against NC State in the season opener on Oct. 15, when the quartet of Charlie Higgins, Nathan Hoisington, Karl Botha and Greg Mahon swam a time of 1:30.26.
- Divers, junior Logan Kline and freshman Kaylea Arnett set new pool records in the 1-meter and 3-meter, respectively. Kline recorded a score of 310.95, while Arnett posted a 320.25.
- Freshman Collin Higgins set a new pool record in the men's 200 back with a time of 1:48.57.

VT HOST 2012 ACC CHAMPIONSHIPS

- The 2012 ACC Swimming & Diving Championships will be hosted by Virginia Tech at the new state of the art Christiansburg Aquatic Center. The women's championships are scheduled on Feb. 15-18, and the men's will start Feb. 22-25.

MEN'S SEASON PREVIEW

For the second year in a row, the men placed fourth at the ACC's with a total of 508.5 points. The team returns a majority of its top contributors, including two divers who qualified for the NCAA's.

Breaststroke

This group continues to evolve and develop for the men's squad. Senior Nevin Cook anchors the breaststroke crew, which includes freshman Harrison Cefalo, sophomore Emmett Dignan and juniors Adam Skipper and Nick Masterson. Cook scored 21 points for the H₂Ogies at the ACC Championships, finishing fourth in the 100 breast and 11th in the 200 breast. Skipper also looks to be a big contributor this season as he placed second in the 100 breast at the Virginia Tech Invitational last season. This group should be as deep and strong as any breaststroke group the squad has had in the past.

Backstroke

Charlie Higgins, Michael Hallock, Tom Sheranek and Zach McGinnis return to the backstroke crew after having a strong 2010-11 season. Higgins earned five individual titles last season, winning the 100 back in the Volunteer Invite and placed fifth in the 100 back at the ACC's. Hallock won the 100 back at the Virginia Tech Invitational, which was also the ninth-best time in the ACC. Sheranek finished with top-20 finishes in the 100 and 200 back at the ACC Championships. He won the 200 back at Cincinnati with Kentucky. McGinnis also bring a lot of depth to the group as he earned 28 points in his first season as a Hokie as ACC's. He finished fourth in the 200 and sixth in the 100. Joining Higgins this year, is his younger brother Collin Higgins. Collin joins the squad after an impressive high school career, where he was a four-year State Champion in the 100 back.

"We are very excited about our backstroke crew both in the 100 and 200 distances," said head coach Ned Skinner. "We have strength and depth and hope this to be one of our stronger events at ACC's and NCAA's."

Mid- and Distance Freestyle

Blake Trabuchi-Downey, Phillip LaRosa, Alex Lutterbein and Ben Muster all return for Tech. Trabuchi-Downey finished in the top-20 in both 1650 free and 500 free at the ACC Championships, while LaRosa finished 14th in the 1650 free. Newcomer Jake Ores will join the group. The Loveland, Col., native placed third in the AAAA High School State Championships in the 500 free. Munster will also look to add depth to the crew. This group has emerged to be a very strong threat and look to continue to be a force in the conference.

Sprint

"We have made great gains in all areas of freestyle within our team from last year's ACC's," noted Skinner. "We have targeted this as a high priority area and through recruiting and evolved training we hope to make great gains this season".

Anchoring the sprint crew is junior Karl Botha, who earned an individual title in the 50 free against Charleston. In addition to Botha, Garrett Hehn, Greg Morgan, Zach McGinnis, Adam Skipper, Nick Tremols and Emmett Dignan all return to the group. Skipper added a lot of depth to the group as he placed third in the 50 free against Cincinnati. He also won the 50 free and placed second in the 100 free at the Virginia Tech Invitational.

Individual Medley

Gregory Mahon and Matt Baumler anchor a very strong 200 individual medley crew, which also features Nevin Cook and Tom Sheranek along with four newcomers. Mahon set a new Virginia Tech record in the 200 IM, swimming a 1:46.34 at the ACC Championships and finished fourth. Baumler won an individual title in the season opener against Charleston, while coming in at 25th at the ACC's. This group looks to have a lot of depth and strength that will bring a lot of competition in the conference.

Butterfly

The H₂Ogies call this group the "Snake Pit" as they are a tough group with much speed and talent. Arguably the strongest core of swimmers, the butterfly crew is led by Gregory Mahon and includes Blake Trabuchi-Downey, Matt Baumler, Charlie Higgins and Karl Botha. Mahon led all swimmers with 46 points at the ACC Championships. He earned All-ACC honors in the 200 fly and finished fourth in the 100 fly. He was third in the ACC and 29th in the nation in the 200 fly last season. Baumler also earned double-digit points for the Hokies at the ACC's, finishing sixth in the 200 fly and 12 in the 100 fly. He brings a lot of talent to the group and the crew looks to have a promising 2011-12 season.

Diving

The Tech diving squad has some extremely experienced returners and a freshman who is adding huge depth to the strength of the team. Leading the group is junior Logan Shinholser, who became Tech's first diver to earn All-America honors and the second male H₂Ogie ever to go All-American. The 11 points that Shinholser scored for Tech put the men in double digits for the second time in school history at the NCAA's. Joining Shinholser is Ryan Hawkins, John Trope and Jared Butts. Hawkins had an outstanding season as a freshman, shining at ACC's and Zone A Championships, while earning a spot at the NCAA Championship as well.

WOMEN'S SEASON PREVIEW

For the second-straight year, the women placed fifth at the ACC's with a total of 358 points. The H₂Okie women return several key contributors from last season's ACC and NCAA Championships, but lost five letterwinners, including NCAA competitor, diver Sarah Milton.

Breaststroke

"Always a strong area for our program and the Lady H₂Ogies have speed and endurance in the 100 and 200 events," commented head coach Ned Skinner.

Junior Keri Sink returns to Tech after finishing seventh in the 100 breast and 10th in the 200 breast at the ACC Championships. Fellow junior, Katie Steeves, competed in three events at the ACC's, with an eighth-place finish in the 200 breast. Joining the junior duo are sophomores Abby Houchin and Natalie Leake and freshman Alyssa Bodin.

Backstroke

Sophomores Brittany Boone, Aubree Duncan and Caroline Higgins returns for the H₂Ogies in the young backstroke crew. Newcomers Sabrina Benson and Susan Justis will compete this season as well. Duncan competed at the ACC Championships as a freshman and won the 200 back against Richmond on Jan. 22. The Woodstock, Ga., native was a four-star recruit on the Swimming World rankings, and a three-time all-county swimmer. The Backstroke group is rounded out by Caroline Higgins, who won the 100 and 200 back at the Virginia Tech Invitational.

Freestyle

Tech returns All-American Erika Hajnal, who competed in the 1650 free, 400 IM and 500 free for the third-straight year at the NCAA Championships. She is the only Tech swimmer to qualify in three events. In addition to Hajnal, three juniors Laura Simon, Becky Flora and Addie Carne also bring a lot of depth to this strong crew. Flora finished 14th in the 1650 free at the ACC Championships and won the 500 free in the season opener against Charleston and Radford. Three newcomers join the group are Emily Ryczek, Erin Foster and Katie Rogers.

"We have found much success at the conference and NCAA level in this area and we continue to have much depth and talent in this range," noted Skinner.

Sprint

"The Hokies landed some real strong talent and coupled with speed from the upperclassmen, we are very excited about this group of sprinters both this year and in the future," commented Skinner.

Anchoring the sprint crew is senior Emily Ferguson, who finished fourth in the 100 free and 10th in the 50 free at the Volunteer Invitational. She won the 50 free at the season opener against Charleston and Radford along with the 200 free relay. In addition to Ferguson, Heather Savage and Jace Hawanitz bring depth to the group. Savage posted top-10 finishes in the 100 and 50 free at the Volunteer Invitational. Rounding out the group are sophomore Rachel Sepanski and newcomers Kayla Hammerberg and Margaret Parcel.

Individual Medley

Hajnal and Jace Howanitz lead the pack in the individual medley, while juniors Keri Sink, Katie Steeves, Meaghan Holloway and Addie Carne all return for the H₂Ogies. Hajnal also earned All-ACC honors with a third-place finish in the 400 IM and held the team's top times for the season in five categories, including the 400 IM. Howanitz brings a lot of strength to the group as she finished eighth in the 200 IM at the Volunteer Invitational and led the women in 2009 in the 200 IM with a 15th-place finish at the ACC's.

Butterfly

"We are excited about the strength and leadership from our upperclassmen in this area," commented Skinner. "Five ladies scored in the 200 fly at ACC's last year so we hope to continue to build in the fly events."

Hajnal also is the top swimmer in the butterfly event, along with Meaghan Holloway, Katie Steeves and Dana Kalnins. The four upperclassmen welcome newcomer Erin Foster to the mix. The Woodlands, Texas, native qualified for the Olympic Trials in 2008 and was a State Champion in 2009 as an individual. Holloway adds depth to the group as she finished seventh in the 200 fly and 11th in the 100 fly at the ACC Championships.

Diving

Andrea Sawchuk, Sara Mokhtari and England Barimo return to the diving group. Three new members of the squad, Kaylea Arnett, Kelli Stockton and junior transfer Logan Kline, have brought in a new energy and a heightened level of competitiveness, as well. All three newcomers have already qualified for the Olympic Trials over the summer.

"I am very excited about how our newcomers have impacted the daily training environment so far," commented head diving coach Ron Piemonte. "This element, coupled with our experienced returners should make a definite impact on this year's season both on the boards and the platform."

NCAA CHAMPIONSHIPS

The H₂Ogies had five athletes qualify for the NCAA Championships, with a school-record four divers, including Tech's first female diver since 1982.

Sophomore Logan Shinholser headed a trio of male divers, along with Ryan Hawkins and Daniel Martin, who competed in all three diving events. The squad struggled on both springboard events, but Shinholser then scored a 401.55 in the preliminary round of the platform event, good for fourth place and All-America honors. The sophomore faltered on the second dive in the finals and was unable to fully recover, placing him eighth overall in the finals and scoring 11 points for the H₂Ogies.

Shinholser became Tech's first diver to earn All-America honors and the second male H₂Ogie ever to go All-American. The 11 points that Shinholser scored for H₂Ogies put the Tech men in double digits for just the second time in school history (19 pts, 27th, 2006), finishing in 28th place.

Junior returning All-American Erika Hajnal and senior diver Sarah Milton represented the H₂Ogies at the Women's NCAA Championships. Hajnal competed in the 1650 freestyle, the 400 IM and the 500 freestyle for the third straight year. Sarah Milton, Tech's first female diver to qualify for NCAAs since 1982, competed in all three diving events.

In a disappointing follow-up to last season's top-25 finish, the two women were unable to score any points for Virginia Tech in this year's championships. Hajnal began the meet with a 58th-place finish in the 500 free. She then placed 34th in the 400 IM, a surprising drop-off from last year's top-eight mark, and she then just barely missed scoring points in the final event with a 17th-place finish in the 1650 free with a season-best time of 16:08.28.

Sarah Milton, concluding her decorated diving career with a trip to NCAAs, placed 32nd on the 1-meter and 23rd on both the 3-meter and the platform.

ACC MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the second year in a row, the men placed fourth at ACCs with a total of 508.5 points. Gregory Mahon earned the most points for Tech of any male or female participant, earning the bronze medal and third-team All-ACC in the 200 fly, while taking fourth in the 100 fly and the 200 IM, for a total of 46 points. Mahon's time of 1:46.34 in the individual medley broke the school record, which he had set at the 2010 ACC Championships.

Freshman Nick Tremols had an outstanding postseason debut, picking up 26 points for the H₂Ogies, including a fourth-place finish in the 200 fly. Sophomore transfer Zach McGinnis earned 28, finishing fourth in the 200 back and sixth in the 100 back. Blake Trabuchi-

Downey earned a total of 22 points in three events for Tech; Nevin Cook picked up 21, including a fourth-place finish in the 100 breast; and Alex Lutterbein earned a total of 20 points for the H₂Ogies, breaking the school record in the 400 IM and finishing fifth, swimming a 3:49.01.

The H₂Ogies also had a pair of top-four relay finishes. Charlie Higgins, Cook, Mahon and Karl Botha earned the bronze in the 400 medley relay (3:12.23), and Higgins, Cook, Mahon and Rich Ulatowski opened the meet with a fourth-place finish in the 200 medley (1:27.67).

Logan Shinholser once again broke his own school record, scoring a 449.15 in the finals of the platform diving event, to become the first ever ACC Diving Champion at Virginia Tech. Shinholser is the first Tech diver to win a conference title since 1965, and the only H₂Ogie to ever win the platform event.

Freshman diver Ryan Hawkins had a tremendous outing, earning three top-five finishes to score 44 big points for the Virginia Tech men.

ACC WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the second straight year, the women placed fifth at ACCs with a total of 358 points. Erika Hajnal was Tech's most lucrative swimmer, finishing in at least sixth in all three of her races and earning 44 points for Tech. She earned a bronze medal and All-ACC recognition in the 400 IM, came in fourth in the 1650 free and finished sixth in the 500 free. Keri Sink earned 25.5 points for the H₂Ogies, tying for seventh in the 100 breast and finishing 10th in both the 200 breast and 400 IM. Lauren Ritter picked up 25 points for Tech, finishing seventh in the 200 free, 10th in the 1650 free and 11th in the 500 free.

Sarah Milton picked up significant points in all three diving events, finishing ninth on the 1-meter and platform and 10th on the 3-meter, for a total of 25 points. Carissa Santora earned 22 big points for the H₂Ogies with a pair of eighth-place finishes on the 3-meter and platform, and Cara Murnan set a new Tech record on the platform, earning 13 points with a sixth-place finish (264.30).

VOLUNTEER INVITATIONAL

The women had an outstanding weekend, coming in first with 1,118 points, ahead of No. 11 Tennessee in second (918 pts). They earned five titles, including two for Hajnal, and broke three pool records: the 400 IM (Hajnal), the 200 free (Filova) and the 800 freestyle relay (Filova, Ritter, Hajnal, Howanitz). Additionally, Cara Murnan finished first on the platform.

The No. 23 men took second at the meet, with 975.5 points, behind No. 16 Alabama (1,191 pts) and ahead of No. 15 Tennessee (932.5 pts). Kentucky finished fourth in both competitions. Logan Shinholser broke Tennessee's pool record in the platform diving event, while breaking his own school record. Charlie Higgins took home the only swimming title for the men, swimming a "B" cut time of 48.58 in the 100 backstroke.

STATE-OF-THE-ART CHRISTIANBURG AQUATIC CENTER OPENS

The Christiansburg Aquatic Center opened in July, 2010. Tech hosted the first meet ever on Oct. 16, earning decisive victories over Charleston and Radford's women. The H₂Ogies went 6-0 in the inaugural season at the CAC. The facility also played host to the 2011 Speedo Championship Series meet.
