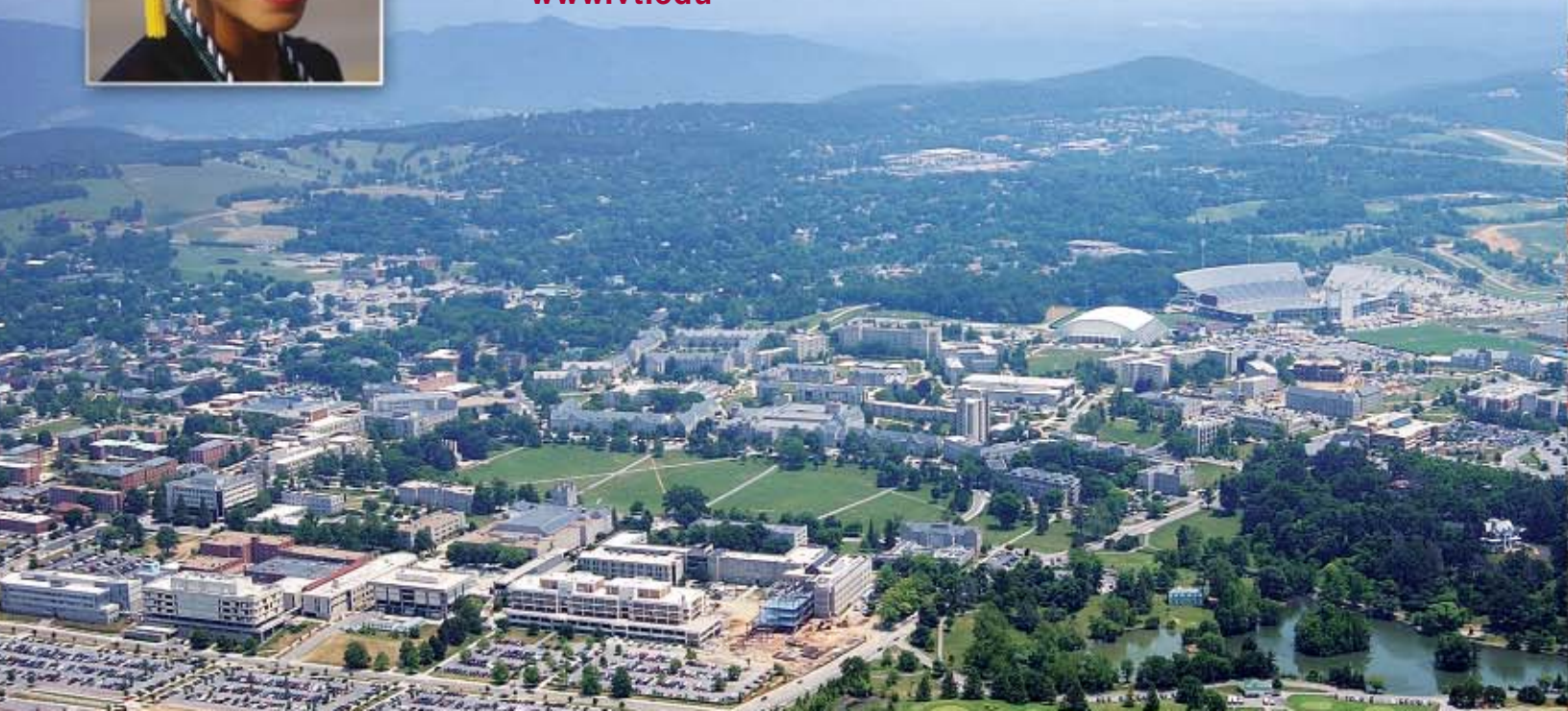

Virginia Tech was established in 1872 as an all-male military school dedicated to the original land-grant mission of teaching agriculture and engineering. Today, the co-educational institution, which operates a European studies center based in Switzerland and educational, research and outreach/Extension facilities throughout Virginia, has recognized programs in music, business, architecture and the humanities, as well as its traditional strengths in the sciences, engineering and technology.

Virginia Tech is organized into eight colleges – Agriculture and Life Sciences, Architecture and Urban Studies, Science, Pamplin College of Business, Engineering, Liberal Arts and Human Sciences, Natural Resources, and Virginia-Maryland Regional College of Veterinary Medicine. Together, the colleges offer about 175 bachelor's, master's and doctoral degree programs to approximately 28,000 students, who hail from countries throughout the world.

Virginia Tech follows the dictates of its motto, *Ut Prosim* ("That I May Serve"), focusing on its land-grant missions of instruction, research, and solving the problems of society through outreach and Extension activities. Through the generation of new knowledge and the outreach mandate, the university disseminates practical knowledge through the classroom and to society as a whole. It is a university that puts knowledge to work.

War Memorial Pool

War Memorial Pool, located just off the campus Drill Field in War Memorial Gym, is Virginia Tech's swimming and diving facility. The complex includes a 25-yard pool with eight lanes and a diving well. The movable bulkhead which separates the pool from

the diving well can be adjusted to lengthen the pool to 25 meters.

Complete with underwater windows and sound system, the facility is also equipped with the Colorado Electronic Timing System and scoreboard. Three

years ago, a 12-line readout scoreboard was installed for swimming, as well as a three-line scoreboard for diving.

The diving well is made up of two one-meter boards, a three-meter board and a five-meter platform.

The pool has served as the site for two Virginia State Championship meets and one Metro Conference Championship.

War Memorial Gym itself houses numerous other facilities including saunas, weight rooms, racquetball courts and six basketball courts. The Hokies also have the use of other equipment such as power-racks for strength swimming and VASA trainers, VASA climbers and bicycles for dry land.

Men's Outlook

Veteran Squad Looking for BIG EAST Title

Head coach Ned Skinner will have to rely on the leadership and mentoring ability of his upperclassmen this season as the Hokies begin the year on a quest for a conference championship.

However, Skinner and his staff know that they have a solid group of newcomers to complement the talented returnees.

"One might think that having graduated a very strong group of seniors, the men's team would not be a factor at the BIG EAST meet this year.

"That is not the case, however. With an excellent year of recruiting, and a strong group of upperclassmen, we look to once again contend for a conference title," Skinner said.

SPRINTERS

Senior **Christian Lindberg** returns to lead an excellent group of sprinters. Lindberg has three years behind him as one of the top swimmers and looks to use his experiences to propel the Hokies to the next level. Joining him to help the Hokie sprinters will be senior **David Litchfield**.

Junior **Kevin Furlong** has excellent speed and should contend for conference honors, while newcomers **Christian DeLollo**, **Tommy Evans** and junior **Tom Alberi** will also be strong factors for the Hokies.

Sophomore **Casey Moore** should see more action this year and will be another strong anchor for the sprinters' group as well.

DISTANCE FREESTYLE

Mike Della Noce returns as one of the premiere distance freestylers for Skinner's squad. The sophomore swimmer should help the Hokies at the conference meet this season.

Junior **Keith Gettys** also returns for his third season as a distance freestyler. A tall, talented swimmer, Gettys will provide depth and experience.

Newcomers **Gustavo Calado**, **Stephen Jensen** and **Neil Savage** should team up to provide solid depth behind Della Noce and Gettys in the distance events.

FREESTYLE

Senior **Chris Bassler**, one of the tallest swimmers on the team, will see most of his action in middle distance freestyle.

Fellow senior **David Szabo**, sophomore **Trevor Jamerson** and Alberi will join Bassler in anchoring the middle distance group.

Junior **Aaron Sherman** will also be called upon in sprint freestyle events this season.

BACKSTROKE

One of the most versatile swimmers, Lindberg will also anchor the talented group of backstrokers. Gettys and sophomore **Marc Severin** will provide important depth as well.

Freshman **Cabot Pitts** will be called upon immediately to help the backstroke crew, and he will be joined by Savage and Jensen as that pair's versatility gives the Hokies depth at backstroke as well as distance freestyle.

BREASTSTROKE

Senior **Joey Piekarski**, Furlong and Szabo will once again lead an amazingly talented group of breaststrokers. Litchfield will also be a significant factor for the breaststroke crew.

Sherman could also be called upon to assist in the butterfly events as well as freestyle. Expect to see Evans and Moore helping out in butterfly events as well.

Freshman **Chris Soniak** is also a strong swimmer in the butterfly events and will help strengthen the Hokie lineup.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

A core group of returnees, led by Smith, Piekarski and Szabo will strengthen the Hokies in IM events.

Pitts, Savage and Jensen are also expected to see time in the water during IM events and will be strong contributors. Soniak could also see action.

DIVERS

Senior **Doug Roper** will lead a young men's squad this season. Last year, Roper qualified for the finals in the three-meter diving event at the BIG EAST Championships and is expected to be a leader again this year.

Newcomers **Brent Jacobs**, **Matt Jones** and **Luke Mulhern** will round out the men's squad and will be counted on to score points for the Hokies this year.

SPRINTERS

Senior **Jamie Trivett** and sophomore **Emily Guschke** head a very talented group of sprinters.

Trivett returns to provide leadership, while Guschke looks to continue the success she enjoyed last season in her first year competing for the Hokies.

Junior **Whitney Johnsen**, sophomores **Meagan Cleary** and **Juliana Daniell**, and newcomer **Laura Campbell** will also be significant factors in sprint and relay events.

Newcomer and Virginia native **Mason Walsh** is another factor for the Hokies in the sprint events

DISTANCE FREESTYLE

Two seniors, **Jamie Spradlin** and **Lindsey Saufley**, return for their final season to anchor the "Lady Distance" crew.

Juniors **Jeanette Batten** and **Sarah Gardner** will also play important roles on the squad and will be called upon to assist Spradlin and Saufley. Newcomer **Lauren Dillon** adds depth as she competes in her first season at the collegiate level.

FREESTYLE

Gardner and Spradlin will showcase their versatility, as they lead the Hokies in all components of the freestyle events.

Redshirt senior **Ally Hamilton**, freshman **Erin Courtney** and Guschke will also be looked upon to help in various levels of freestyle events.

Freshman **Erin Tarpey** is a talented newcomer who will provide the Hokies depth and skill in the sprint freestyle.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

Senior **Jen Brielmaier** is one of the most experienced swimmers for the

Hokies, and she will join Spradlin in anchoring the IM crew.

Junior **Katy Peterson** and freshman **Emily Chen** will provide needed depth for Skinner, as will freshman **Liane Bianco** and Campbell.

Hamilton and senior **Alyson Dabney** are the Hokies' 400 IM specialists and will see most of their action in the IM events.

BACKSTROKE

Peterson headlines the backstroke crew. She also competes in freestyle and IM and has two years experience as a Hokie swimmer. That factor should help her compete for conference honors.

Gardner, Courtney, Johnsen, Trivett and sophomore **Mandie Yothers** will be significant factors in the backstroke events.

BUTTERFLY

Yothers returns for her second season as the Hokies' strongest sprint flyer. Batten, Chen and Hamilton will join Yothers in the 200 butterfly event.

Daniell, Bianco and Campbell could also see time in butterfly. Junior **Erin Veltman** and Tarpey are slated to see action in the sprint butterfly event.

BREASTSTROKE

Brielmaier and junior **Kelly Burke** will once again anchor the Hokies' breaststroke crew. At last year's conference meet, Brielmaier placed third in the 200 while Burke came in fifth.

Campbell and Walsh could also see action in this event as well.

Dabney's versatility will allow her to compete in the breaststroke as well as the 400 IM.

DIVERS

Senior **Katie Grossi** leads this year's squad and will be looked upon to be a leader.

She will be joined by sophomore **Claire Jakabcin** as the only two divers with a full year of college diving under their belt. **Jen Urbach** was injured most of last season but looks to be back and ready to help the squad.

Newcomer **Shannon Marriner** should contribute right away and will be counted on to score points for the Hokies.

Coach Ned Skinner



Ned Skinner, who has led the Hokies to the upper echelon of the BIG EAST, opens his sixth year at the helm of the Virginia Tech men's and women's swimming and diving teams.

In 2001, his first year in the BIG EAST, he led the women to a second-place finish, while the men placed third. In

2002, the men duplicated their finish while the women went 9-1 in dual meets and placed fourth in the conference. Last year, the women went 7-3 and finished fourth in the conference, while the men placed second. Skinner was named the BIG EAST Men's Coach of the Year while Kevin Furlong was named the Outstanding Men's Swimmer.

In his first two years as head coach of the Hokie swimming and diving squads, Skinner was named the Atlantic 10 Women's Coach of the Year twice and led

the women's team to two Atlantic 10 Championships, while the men won their first conference title ever.

He has also founded the Fighting Gobbler Swim Camp, a one-week swim camp held at Virginia Tech.

Skinner came to the Hokies after serving four years as the director of competitive swimming at William & Mary. In his last season at W&M, he coached the Tribe women to a second place finish at the ECACs, while the men were fourth of 40 teams. The women's team finished in the top 12 at the ECAC event during each of Skinner's four seasons.

The W&M men's team posted a fourth-place showing at the '98 ECAC Championships and finished seventh in 1997. During Skinner's tenure, both the men's and women's squads were named Academic All-America Teams four straight years.

Skinner also coached Kristen Schnittger to four consecutive ECAC titles in the 100 breaststroke at the College of William & Mary.

Before his stint at William & Mary, Skinner was the head coach and aquatics director at Central Connecticut State University for four seasons.

A 1989 graduate of Louisiana State University, Skinner was captain of the 1988 squad that captured the SEC Championship. He graduated from LSU with a bachelor of arts in advertising and a split minor in marketing and economics. His fifth year he served as an assistant to the associate athletics director. Skinner earned his masters of science at Ohio University in athletic administration while serving the swim team as a graduate assistant. While at Ohio University, he helped coach the women's team to the 1990 MAC Championship.

On the non-collegiate level, Skinner founded, directed and coached the Central Connecticut Aquatics team, a 75-member team of children from ages 7 to 17. He also served as the head swim coach for the Kingsmill Swim Team in Williamsburg.

While in Williamsburg, Skinner conducted Team Williamsburg Swim Camps, which provided the community with clinics and camps year round.

Skinner is married to the former Allison Cox, who is an attorney for the honorable David Faber in Bluefield, W.Va. A native of Worthington, Ohio, Skinner is working on his doctorate in health promotions.

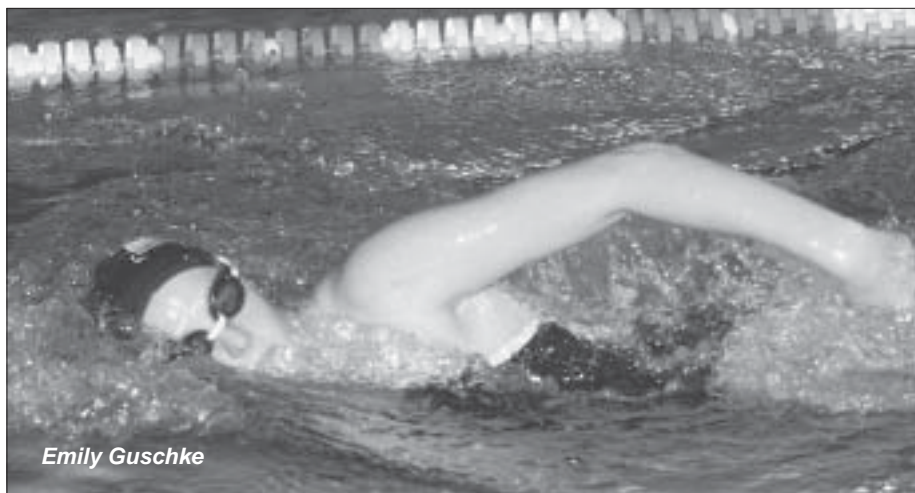

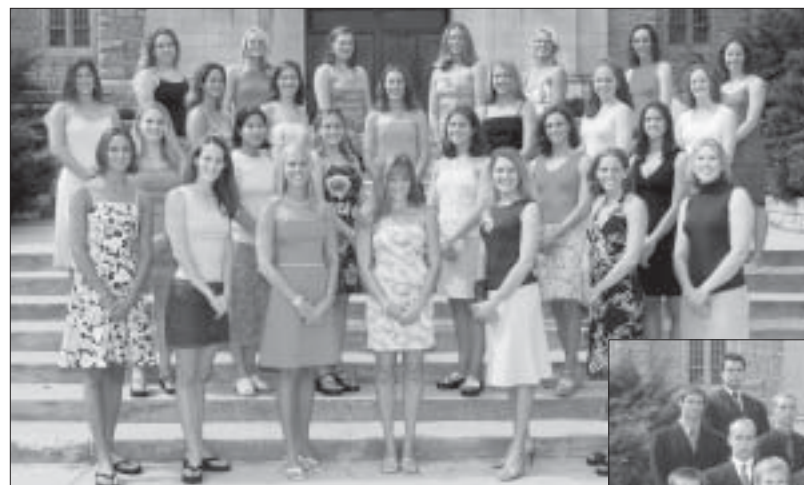

The women, who went 7-3 in dual meet action, started off slowly, dropping two match-ups in a tri-meet at the University of Maryland. The Hokies fell to the Terrapins by a score of 73-170 and to the Clemson Tigers, 94-149.

After stumbling early, the women continued on the road at the University of Richmond, downing the Spiders, 160-140.

Remaining on the road, the women dominated in a meet versus Radford and James Madison, downing the Highlanders 149-75 and the Dukes 147-68.

Next up, the women hosted N.C. State in the first home meet of the season. Notching eight first-place finishes, the team defeated the Wolfpack 133-110.

The women then headed to Chapel Hill, N.C., for the Nike Cup Invitational and turned in a second-place finish for the third straight year. The women then continued their success on the road with a win over East Carolina, 154-91.

Next, the Hokies returned to Blacksburg for a record-breaking Senior Day. Four pool records were broken on the women's side as they defeated West Virginia 125-72 and American 141-71. Senior Jill Turner broke the pool mark in the 50 free (23.49) and the 100 free (51.34), while teaming up with Jamie Trivett, Emily Guschke and Meagan Drolet to break the mark in the 400 freestyle relay (3:29.72). Kelly Furlong broke the other pool record, with a 2:06.74 in the 200 IM.

After seven straight wins, the women went back on the road to face Pittsburgh in their final dual meet action of the season. The Hokies fell to the Panthers, 110.5-132.5, to end the season 7-3.

At the BIG EAST Championships, the women had several strong performances en route to a fourth-place finish. The women brought home six top-six finishes and ended the meet with 411 points.

Junior Jamie Spradlin broke the Tech record in the 1,650 freestyle, swimming a time of 16:46.37 and bringing home fourth place. Jen Brielmaier finished third and Kelly Burke took fifth in the 200 breast in times of 2:19.04 and 2:19.67, respectively.

Turner swam the 100 free in a time of 50.73, finishing fourth. In the 200 back, Katy Peterson took sixth in a time of 2:01.30. The women's 400 free relay swam by Turner, Guschke, Drolet and Spradlin, finished fourth in a time of 3:24.80.

The men, who finished the season 5-3 in dual meet action, began on the road and split the first meet of the season. The Hokies defeated Maryland by a score of 135-102, while falling to Clemson 117-126. The men then traveled to Radford to down James Madison 143-100.

The men then kicked off their first home action of the season. Despite setting two new pool records, the Hokies lost to N.C. State, 105-146. Anders Frahm set the new pool mark of 1:50.99 in the 200 butterfly, while the Hokie men set a new best time of 3:23.27 in the 400 medley relay.

At the Nike Cup, the men finished in third place. The men then traveled to East Carolina, where a 149-94 win over the Pirates improved their record to 3-2.

Following ECU, the men returned to War Memorial Pool for a 157.5-83.5 Senior Day win over West Virginia and a 164-75 triumph over American. Two pool records were broken, with Frahm setting a pool record in the 200 backstroke in a time of 1:49.28, while the 400 freestyle relay team

of Lindberg, Brian Piantadosi, Steve Tozer and David Litchfield broke the pool mark with a time of 3:05.50.

Tech's men wrapped up dual meet action by traveling to Pittsburgh. Despite five first-place finishes and a double-win from Frahm, the Hokie men fell to the Panthers, 132-111.

At the BIG EAST Championships, the men used strong individual and relay performances to notch their highest-ever finish at the conference meet. The Hokies finished in second place with 555 points behind Pittsburgh.

The Hokies were propelled by a record-setting day by Kevin Furlong. Furlong defended his title and broke the BIG EAST record in the 100 breaststroke in a time of 53.54, giving him an NCAA A cut time.

Frahm also captured a first-place finish, swimming a school-record time of 1:46.98 in the 200 yard backstroke. The men also had a strong showing in the 200 breast, grabbing three of the top five spots. Joey Piekarski took second in a time of 2:00.28, while Furlong came in third and David Szabo took home fifth.

Skinner was named the Men's Coach of the Year while Furlong was named Most Outstanding Men's Swimmer based on his record-breaking performance at the conference championships.

Furlong traveled to the NCAA Championships in Austin, Texas. It marked the first time in recent history that a member of Tech's men's swimming and diving team advanced to the NAAs.

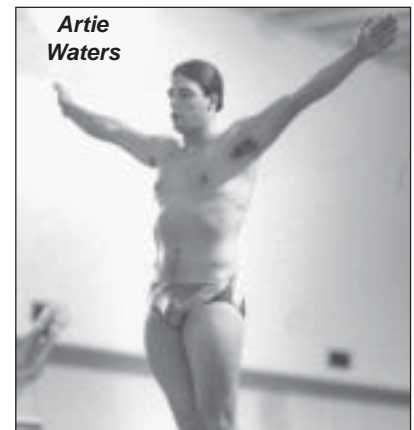

War Memorial Pool, home of the Hokie swim team, was originally built in the early 1920s, but was renovated and moved in March of 1975.

Since then, numerous records at the pool have come and gone, but some have lasted longer than others.

Tech's 400 freestyle relay team set the mark on Jan. 16, 1991, and held the mark until it was broken last season.

Last year, four women's pool records were broken, all broken by Hokies (two by Jill Turner, one by Kelly Furlong & 400 freestyle relay).

The Tech men broke five War Memorial Pool records. Anders Frahm set two of those records and the 400 freestyle relay team broke that record set in 1991.

The BIG EAST Conference

As The BIG EAST Conference celebrates its 25th anniversary in 2003-04, it takes pride in its long list of accomplishments. Providing opportunities to excel amongst the nation's best, both athletically and academically, has always been its mission.

Since opening its doors in 1979, the league has won 22 national championships in six different sports and 118 student-athletes have won individual national titles. The BIG EAST has always been able to boast that some of its best students are also some of its best athletes. More than 300 student-athletes have earned Academic All-America honors, including Connecticut basketball standout Emeka Okafor who earned first team recognition last year. A BIG EAST student-athlete has won the Honda-Broderick Cup as Collegiate Woman of the Year four times, the last by Notre Dame soccer player Cindy Daws in 1997-98.

BIG EAST student-athletes have continued their success after leaving the classrooms and playing fields. Former Connecticut women's basketball standout Dr. Leigh Curl was inducted into the Verizon Academic All-America Hall of Fame in 1999.

Former Georgetown men's basketball star Dikembe Mutombo was named a winner of the President's Service Award, the highest honor in the U.S. for volunteer service.

The BIG EAST continued to thrive amongst the nation's elite in 2002-03. It became the first conference to win the men's and women's NCAA titles and the men's NIT Championship in the same year. The Syracuse men won their first national championship, the Connecticut women took home their fourth national title and St. John's won the NIT for the sixth time. The BIG EAST has won each of the last four women's basketball titles.

In the classroom, 21 student-athletes earned 2002-03 Academic All-America honors, including 10 who garnered first team accolades. UConn's Diana Taurasi was the consensus national player of the year in women's basketball. Additionally, she was the women's basketball Honda Award winner.

Whether it's the student-athletes or the league as a whole, moving forward successfully has been the norm for the conference that was formed in 1979.

In the spring of 2001, the BIG EAST added women's lacrosse to its growing list of sports and the inaugural women's golf championship was held in the spring of 2003.

When the 1990s began, The BIG EAST Conference had just completed its eighth season with nine members. The league was arguably as healthy as a conference could be.

The BIG EAST was a headline-grabber immediately, especially in men's basketball, its signature sport. The BIG EAST Football Conference did not exist.

The '90s was a decade of enormous change in college athletics with conferences adding new members and new leagues beginning. The BIG EAST was no different than most groups. The BIG EAST Football Conference, with eight members, became a major player in college football immediately after its inception in 1991.

The BIG EAST became a reality on May 31, 1979, following a meeting of athletic directors from Providence College, St. John's, Georgetown and Syracuse Universities. Seton Hall, Connecticut and Boston College completed the original seven school alliance.

After one season, Villanova was added and began play in 1980-81. Two seasons later, Pittsburgh joined the group and started competition in '82-83.

Miami was admitted in 1990 and began BIG EAST competition in '91-92. Rutgers, West Virginia and Notre Dame joined in '94 and started to compete in '95-96. Virginia Tech became the league's 14th full member in 2000-01.

While the membership has increased, the focus of the BIG EAST remains unchanged. It is a group that reflects a tradition of broad based programs, led by

administrators and coaches who place a constant emphasis on academic integrity. The BIG EAST Conference has enjoyed a leadership role nationally. Its student athletes own significantly high graduation rates and their record of scholastic achievement notably reflect a balance between intercollegiate athletics and academics.

Any successful consortium enjoys outstanding leadership. Michael Tranghese, the league's first full-time employee, and for 11 years the associate of Dave Gavitt, took over the Commissioner's reins in June, 1990. In his first year at the helm, he administered the formation of The BIG EAST Football Conference.

BIG EAST sports attract the interest of followers in the nation's largest media markets including New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Boston, Washington, D.C., Miami, Pittsburgh and Hartford. The league has long been considered a leader in innovative concepts in promotion and publicity, particularly regarding television. Those efforts have resulted in unparalleled visibility for BIG EAST student athletes.

While BIG EAST basketball games are regular sellouts at campus and major public arenas, including the annual BIG EAST Championship in Madison Square Garden, attendance figures also are significant at BIG EAST soccer, women's basketball and baseball games.

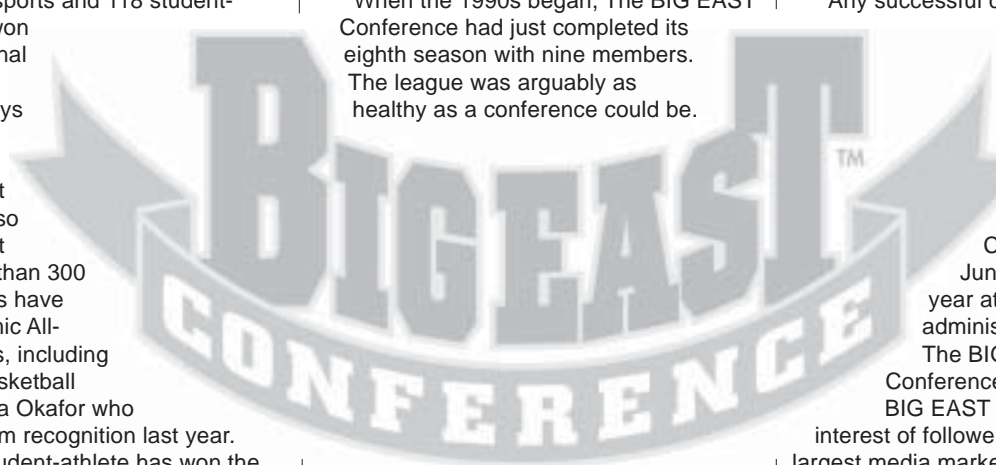
More than 500 BIG EAST athletes have earned All America recognition and dozens have won individual NCAA national championships.

The BIG EAST has been well represented in U.S. or foreign national and Olympic teams, with several athletes earning gold medals in the summer Olympiads in Sydney in 2000, Atlanta in '96, Barcelona in '92, Seoul in '88 and Los Angeles in '84.

The BIG EAST has its headquarters in Providence where the conference administers to more than 5,500 athletes in 23 sports.

Virginia Tech is in its final season in the BIG EAST conference.

All 21 varsity sports will begin competition in the Atlantic Coast Conference for the 2004-05 school year.

Athletic Training

The Virginia Tech Sports Medicine Department is an ever-changing and developing unit that strives to provide the most current and comprehensive care to all student-athletes.

The department, under the leadership of Gunnar Brolinson, D.O., Delmas Bolin, M.D., and Mike Goforth, director of athletic training, is constantly evolving to incorporate new ideas and state-of-the-art resources for the betterment of student-athletes.

A professional staff — including primary care physicians who are Board certified in family medicine and sports medicine, orthopaedic surgeons, certified athletic trainers, physical therapists, chiropractors, massage therapists, sports psychologists, nutritionists and orthotists — is available to manage the health care of Tech's student-athletes.

As part of the evolution, Tech recently completed its first full year in the new 4,300-square-foot Eddie Ferrell Memorial Training Room. This area consolidated the training rooms

that existed in the Merryman Center and Cassell Coliseum. The new facility gives the training staff a centralized area to care for Tech's student-athletes.

The new room, which nearly doubles the size of the former Merryman Center facility, also allows the staff to utilize that room for physical therapy, chiropractic care and massage therapy.

With its completion, Virginia Tech now has more than 10,000 square feet dedicated to sports medicine, placing Tech in the top five percent nationally.

In addition, the \$10 million Merryman Center, a state-of-the-art facility which includes 2,400 square feet of medical space, supplements the training room.

This treatment room has numerous treatment modalities, including portable X-ray, electric stimulation, ultrasound, hot and cold packs and a lumbar/cervical traction unit. It also has offices for the staff, dozens of training tables, two cold tubs, whirlpools, an underwater treadmill, a

Biodes System 3 and various other pieces of rehabilitation equipment.

The training, medical and strength and conditioning staffs each have a role in bringing the athlete back quickly and ready to play. After an injury, an athlete will go through rehabilitation and physical therapy. Athletes are then moved to weight training, as they become able. The strength and conditioning staff uses specific programs for each injury in an effort to get the athlete back quickly.

The range of benefits athletes have access to include custom orthotics, custom mouth guards, specialized DonJoy prophylactic bracing and many other options to help prevent or protect them from injuries.

A vital part of student-athletes services is the access to the Schiffert Student Health Center in McComas Hall. A health center and counseling services are available on one side of McComas Hall, while recreation sports and fitness programs are available on the

other. The center also has a fully operational diagnostic laboratory, X-ray facilities and eight full-time physicians.

If physical therapy is needed, student-athletes can be seen by therapist Mark Piechoski in the Ferrell Training Room. In addition, staff sport psychologist Gary Bennett is available to all student-athletes for personal and performance issues. Virginia Tech also enjoys the services of Dr. Greg Tilley, team chiropractor.

Team orthopaedic surgeons Dr. Marc Siegel, Dr. Scott Urch and Dr. Joe Prudhomme bring a wealth of experience and skills to assist when athletes need orthopaedic surgery.

Tech also maintains a special relationship with Montgomery Regional Hospital, the choice for state-of-the-art equipment to perform surgeries, diagnostic imaging and processing of laboratory requests.

Student Athlete Academic Support Services

The success of Virginia Tech's swimming & diving program rests largely on the academic progress of each student-athlete. The academic performance of Tech student-athletes has improved each year due in part to the Student Athlete Academic Support Services (SAASS).

The Virginia Tech graduation rate for student-athletes has risen significantly in recent years and reached 70 percent in 2003 as compared to the national average of 60 percent.

The 70 percent student-athlete graduation rate marks the second straight year and five in the last 10 years that Tech has reached that level.

In addition to posting impressive graduation figures, Virginia Tech's student-athletes continue to excel in the classroom. Last spring, the Athletic Director's Honors Breakfast paid tribute to a record 371 student-athletes, student trainers, student

managers, cheerleaders and HighTechs who posted 3.0 or greater GPA's in the 2002 calendar year.

Student-athletes are the most visible student component of a university. They entertain thousands of fans, students and alumni. Their athletic ability and achievement is the primary focus for national media attention. Athletic events bring back not only faithful alumni, but are a welcome mat for potential new students.

Student-athletes devote many hours to practice, conditioning and training that are not required of all students. Due to their time commitment and their high visibility, it is an obligation and in the best interest of the university to supply these students with services which will allow them to maximize their academic potential.

SAASS commits to providing fundamental and supplemental programming, consistent with

University and NCAA policy, aimed at enhancing each student athlete's educational experience leading to graduation.

The expectations of the Virginia Tech community are that each student-athlete achieves their maximum academic and athletic potential. With the proper assistance, facilities and encouragement, these potentials can become a reality.

SAASS provides programming for student-athletes from their freshman year through graduation. This includes a comprehensive orientation to Tech, study hall, mentoring, tutoring, academic monitoring, academic recognition and eligibility education.

Additionally, student-athletes are referred to and encouraged to take advantage of other campus agencies charged with helping students in their academic pursuits.

Academic facilities for student-athletes include the Monogram Room, a large room used as a study hall area, adjacent to the SAASS office in Cassell Coliseum.

The HEAT (Hokies Engaging in Advanced Technology) Lab and its satellite sites house over 40 computers in Cassell Coliseum.

Laptop computers are also available for Tech athletes to use when travelling to away contests. The athletic department also provides areas for private, quiet study for the athletes' convenience.

Chris Helms, in his fifth year at Tech, is the director and is responsible for the development and leadership of the office.

Assisting him are associate directors Lois Berg and Colin Howlett, Katie Ammons, Renia Edwards, Drew Scales and Terrie Repass.

Berg oversees the academic progress of the swimming & diving teams.

Athletic Performance

Thanks to the direction of Assistant Athletics Director for Athletic Performance Mike Gentry, the Virginia Tech strength and conditioning program is among the best in the nation.

Gentry is in his 16th season as the Hokies' director of strength and conditioning.

As assistant athletics director for athletic performance, his duties include overseeing the strength and conditioning training of athletes in all 21 varsity sports at Virginia Tech.

A native of Durham, N.C., he received his bachelor's degree in physical education from Western Carolina University in 1979 and received his master's from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1981. He received his doctorate in curriculum and instruction, with an emphasis in motor behavior, from Tech in 1999.

Gentry worked as an assistant strength coach at UNC and as the head strength coach

at East Carolina University prior to coming to Virginia Tech in 1987.

In 1995 and 1996, Gentry was recognized by the National Strength and Conditioning Association as a finalist for the National Strength and Conditioning Professional of the Year.

The swimming & diving teams train in the Jim "Bulldog" Haren Weight Room. Located in Jamerson Athletic Center, the 5,000-square foot weight room was officially dedicated in September 1985 to Haren, a former Hokie football player and long-time supporter of the Virginia Tech Athletic Department.

Assisting Gentry in the weight room this year are three full-time assistant strength and conditioning coaches: Jay Johnson, assistant director of strength and conditioning, Terry Mitchell, strength and conditioning coordinator of men's Olympic sports and Emily

Chones, strength and conditioning coordinator for women's Olympic sports. Gentry will also have the services of four graduate assistants — Erin O'Neil, Lisa Guarneri, Gabe Teeple and Jarrett Ferguson.

Sports Nutrition

In July 2000, the Virginia Tech Athletics Department added another program to better serve the needs of student-athletes — sports nutrition. Amy Freel serves as the Director of Sports Nutrition at Virginia Tech.

Freel works one-on-one with student-athletes to provide them with information that they need on their diet.

She also provides individual players with diet counseling on issues such as gaining lean muscle mass, losing body fat, and how to eat to improve performance.

The sports nutritionist works with the "Training Edge," a dining option for health-conscious students and athletes,

to design menus for training tables and daily menu selections.

Sport Psychology

A service offered to Virginia Tech student-athletes since August 2000, is sport psychology.

The sport psychology staff includes Dr. Gary Bennett, who coordinates psychological services for student-athletes, and Dr. Robert Miller, director of the Cook Counseling Center.

The psychologists meet with student-athletes on an individual basis for personal counseling and to discuss the mental aspects of the game.

As a team, the sport psychologists work on team building, communication and performance enhancement.

The psychologists also offer an injury group to afford injured athletes the opportunity to meet with other injured athletes and talk about their recovery process.

Blacksburg, Va.

One of America's classic college towns, Blacksburg is a perfect setting for Virginia Tech.

Located in Southwest Virginia on a plateau between the Blue Ridge and Alleghany Mountains, Blacksburg combines the laid-back lifestyle of a small town with the amenities one would expect to find around a major center of higher education. 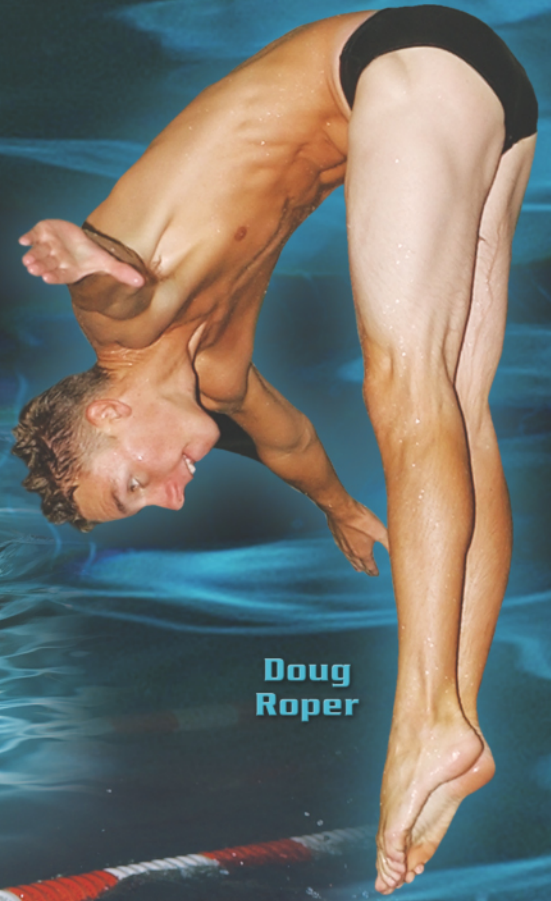
