Season in Review

Chris Riley, in his third year as head coach of the Virginia Tech volleyball team, led this season's squad to a battle for the ACC title, and matched the school's longest winning streak with 11 victories in a row. The Hokies swept NC State in the season series. Tech opened its season with a third consecutive sweep of the Hawthorn Suites Hokie Invitational, and finished the non-conference slate 9-2. The Hokies continued the hot start with five straight wins to open conference season, including a sweep of Virginia, a 3-1 decision over preseason ACC favorite Clemson, and a sweep of Georgia Tech in Cassell Coliseum.

Last season, Riley coached freshman Felicia Willoughby to the program's first ACC Freshman of the Year selection, and saw the program collect its first two All-ACC Freshman Team nominees, in Taylor Parrish last season and Willoughby this year. Willoughby also went on to become the first Hokie to be named the AVCA's All-East Region Freshman of the Year and in 2008, the second Hokie ever to be named All-American.
