## **ABOUT VIRGINIA**

Scouting the Cavaliers: The Cavaliers opened the season 5-0, but then lost the next five straight, dropping three 3-set matches in California to nationally-ranked teams and then falling to Tech at their own home tournament. Virginia then lost the next three ACC matches to dig itself into an early 0-4 hole in conference play. However, the team has since gone 8-7 to salvage the season and keep from falling further behind. On Oct. 30, the Cavs pulled out a historic victory over then-No. 25 Florida State for their second win in program history over a nationally ranked team, the first for head coach Lee Maes.

**Hokies vs. Cavaliers:** Tech has a 25-30 overall record against the Cavaliers and the Hokies are 15-10 against Virginia at home. Tech defeated Virginia earlier this season on Sept. 17 at the Marriott Cavalier Classic for its first defeat of the Cavs in Charlottesville since 1992. The win was also the Hokies' 600th win in program history. The Hokies have won their past four meetings with the Cavs in Blacksburg, and have not lost to them at home since Nov. 1, 2005.

**Preseason Rankings** - In the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches' Poll, Virginia Tech was picked to finish eighth in the conference with 55 points. Senior Felicia Willoughby was named preseason All-ACC for the third consecutive year.

**Tech Hits Two Milestones** - On Sept. 17, 2010, the Hokies claimed their first victory at the University of Virginia since 1992, which also goes down in the record books as their 600th win in program history. Additionally, on Oct. 29, the Hokies claimed their first win over a ranked opponent in school history, simultaneously winning their 300th match at home, downing No. 25 Florida State, 3-2.

Newcomers - Tech welcomes six freshmen to the squad this season. Samantha Gostling and Victoria Hamsher both saw action in the first three matches of the season. Gostling, who hails from Charlotte, N.C., stuffed 26 kills at the Comcast Lady Vol Classic, opening her collegiate career second on the team in kills. Hamsher, a Nazareth, Pa., native, made her Tech debut with 13 kills and seven blocks at the tournament.

Laura Misiewicz made her first collegiate appearance at the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational on Sept. 4 against Long Island, where she recorded three digs and an assist from the back row. After Amy Wengrenovich suffered an injury against Clemson on Oct. 1, Misiewicz made her first appearance at libero where she recorded an impressive 21 digs.

Allison Munter entered her first Tech match on Sept. 18 against Towson, where she notched two assists. Corrie Sanders got into the game for the first time on Nov. 5 against Boston College, where she put up and then received two serves. Rachel Lindsey is still awaiting her first collegiate appearance.

RPI Rankings - On Oct. 4, the NCAA released the first Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) ranking of the season. The Hokies came in at 33rd in the nation, a new program record. Despite the previous weekend's losses to Clemson (69) and Georgia Tech (99), the Hokies' victories over Western Kentucky University (34) and Missouri (45) as well as their narrow margin of loss to then-No. 13 Florida State (14) demonstrated their strength of schedule, placing them in the top 35 for the first time in school history.

After dropping to 48th, the Hokies' defeat of then-RPI #9 Duke pulled them back up into the top 35 where they had remained for the next five weeks. However, after last weekend's

loss to the n-#74 Wake Forest, the Hokies dropped to 40th.

The ACC now has four teams in the top 25, and though it has slipped out of the top 35, Virginia Tech continues to be ranked fifth out of the conference teams. The four teams ahead of the Hokies are Duke (12), North Carolina (21), Miami (24) and Florida State (25).

Ranked Opponents - On Oct. 29, the Hokies made history, defeating the No. 25 Florida State Seminoles in their first ever victory over an AVCA Top-25 team. The Hokies, led by Justine Record's 26-kill, 20-dig effort, won the first two sets, 25-15 and 27-25, before allowing the Seminoles to tie the match with 25-20 and 25-23 victories. However, the Hokies were not willing to surrender after their early 2-0 lead, as they defeated the Seminoles 15-13 in the tiebreaking set. The win avenged their heartbreaking loss to the then-No. 13 Seminoles on Sept. 26, where they came back from a 2-0 deficit to tie the match, but fell 15-13 in set five.

Tech also defeated Missouri earlier this season on Sept. 11, who then received 16 votes in the Bison/AVCA poll the next day to place them 29th in the nation. The Hokies then went on to defeat Duke on Oct. 14, who was ranked ninth in the RPI and was the top vote-getter in the AVCA poll outside the top 25.

Athletes of the Week - For her efforts at the Comcast Lady Vol Classic, Erin Leaser was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week on Aug. 30. She was the first Hokie this season to receive the honor. Leaser notched 103 assists, 28 digs, 12 blocks, 14 kills and struck at a team-leading .393 hitting percentage. She recorded a double-double in both matches on Aug. 28, with 45 assists and 12 digs against Xavier and 26 assists and 12 digs at No. 19 Tennessee.

Sophomore Cara Baarendse tabbed the weekly honor on Sept. 7 for her outstanding performance at the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational on Sept. 3-4. The Mason, Ohio, native led the team with 31 kills and a .491 hitting percentage at the tournament. Her solid weekend also garnered her all-tournament MVP and a spot on CVU.com's national Top Performers list.

Felicia Willoughby and Victoria Hamsher swept the ACC's weekly honors on Oct. 18, earning Player and Freshman of the Week, respectively, after outstanding performances against Duke and Wake Forest. Additionally, Willoughby was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week.

Willoughby hit .609 on the week with 29 kills and eight blocks, averaging 4.14 kills and 1.14 blocks per set. She had a season-high 19 kills against Duke, earning a 2010 Hokiebest .731 attack percentage. Hamsher hit .414 with 17 kills and 10 blocks, seven of which

came against Duke. She led the match in attack percentage against Wake Forest, hitting .533 with 10 kills. Hamsher is the first Hokie to win ACC Freshman of the Week.

Justine Record became the fouth volleyball player of the season to win Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week after an oustanding showing on Oct. 29-30. Record notched 26 kills and 20 digs against No. 25 Florida State on Oct. 29 to lead the Hokies past the Seminoles in their first ever victory over a top-25 team. Record matched her career high in kills and set a new career best in digs, and her 26 kills were the most for a Hokie all season. She is the first Hokie since 2006 to record 20+ kills and 20+ digs in the same match, and the first Hokie this season to record 20+ kills or digs in a doubledouble. She notched a second double-double against Miami the next night, recording 16 kills and 15 digs for a whopping 42 kills and 35 digs on the weekend.

Hamsher on the Block - Freshman middle blocker Victoria Hamsher stuffed a whopping 10 block assists on Sept. 18 against Towson, which places her in sixth all-time in single-match block assists and 10th in total blocks. Additionally, she set two new Hokie records for 3-set matches, as every occurrence ahead of her on both lists came in a 4- or 5-set match.

Hamsher's four blocks against Duke on Nov. 19 elevated her season total to 99, which puts her in fifth place all-time in Virginia Tech's freshman record books with 99 total blocks on the season. She sits just two blocks behind Michelle Lang's 101 from 2006. Additionally, she ranks 28th nationally in blocks per set among freshmen.

For the Record - Junior Justine Record registered a career-high six service aces on Sept. 26 at No. 13 Florida State. She is the first Hokie to notch that many since Amy Wengrenovich found the floor on six serves on Sept. 13, 2008. There are just six Hokies in history who have recorded more than six aces in a single match and only one in the past 20 seasons. Record currently leads the ACC and is 50th in the nation in service aces per set, averaging 0.38 with a total of 41. Additionally, she notched four aces on Nov. 19 at Duke, which brought her career total up to 123, moving her into ninth place all-time at Virginia Tech in career aces. There is just one Hokie ahead of her on that list who played in the new millenium, Annie Spicer '04, and the most recent Hokie on the list before her graduated in 1997.

On Oct. 29, Record led the Hokies past the No. 25 Florida State Seminoles, registering 26 kills and 20 digs in Tech's historical first-ever victory over a ranked opponent. Record, who matched her career high in kills and set a new career high in digs, was the first Hokies since Taylor Parrish back in 2006 to register 20+ kills and 20+ digs in the same match. Additonally, her 26 kills are the most for a Hokie so far this season, and she was the first 2010 Hokie to register 20+ kills or digs as part of a double-double.

Willoughby on Top - Senior Felicia Willoughby recorded seven block assists against Jacksonville State on Sept. 4 to elevate her career total to 375 and set a new all-time record for the Hokies. On Oct. 10, she registered three blocks, which gave her a career sum of 495 total blocks, pushing her past Jennifer Schmidt's 494 mark



which had been the all-time record since 1995.

Additionally, the Pleasanton, Calif., native looks to hang on to her top spot in career hitting percentage, currently hitting at .330, ahead of Katie Esbrook's .324 mark, a category in which she is third the ACC and 38th in the nation this season, hitting .365. She is also fifth on the team in career block solos, stuffing 96, and eighth in kills with 1,263.

Leaser on the Loose - Junior Erin Leaser recorded 34 assists on Oct. 22 against North Carolina, moving her into fourth place all-time in career assists, passing Laura Hanner's mark of 3,190 set in 1997. Her career total is now 3,643. Moreover, Leaser, who passed the 1,000-assist mark for the third consecutive season on Nov. 5 against Boston College, is second in the ACC and 24th in the nation in assists per set, averaging 11.23.

On Oct. 29, Leaser notched a career-high 68 assists to help the Hokies acheive their first-ever victory over a ranked opponent, defeating No. 25 Florida State. Her 68 assists was the most for a Hokie since Melissa Markowski notched 70 against Rutgers back on Oct. 13, 2002.

**Consistency Key, Baar None** - Middle blocker Cara Baarendse vaulted up the freshman record books last season, breaking the freshman school record for season hitting percentage. Baarendse struck at a .354 clip, surpassing the old mark of .333 set by Katie Esbrook in 2003, and ranked third all-time among all Hokies with the .354 season hitting percentage. The Mason, Ohio, sophomore currently holds a .374 career percentage, which puts her in first place on the all-time career list, and her .390 clip this season leads the ACC and ranks 19th in the nation.



Just Virginia Tech, Please - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

Following the Hokies - Fans and media can keep up with the Hokies via the Internet with live stats. At all home matches and select away matches, play-by-play, up-to-date box scores and stats can be accessed by clicking the LiveStats link next to the scheduled event on Tech's home page at hokiesports.com. Fans will also be able to watch or listen to select home contests thanks to Hokies All-Access. VT fans can access Hokies All-Access through the link on the volleyball schedule page. Jerry Massey will broadcast the volleyball matches. Single Game Pay-Per-View Licenses for \$7.95 will give you access to live audio and video on a single event basis; Monthly Subscriptions will be \$9.95 and will give you access to all live and archived radio broadcasts, video highlights and any other content behind the subscription wall; Annual Subscriptions will be sold for \$79.95 and will give you access to all live and archived radio broadcasts, video highlights and live video of the Virginia Tech Hokies in action.

What is a Hokie, Anyway? - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product

used only as an attentiongetter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors Chicago maroon and burnt orange - also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not elsewhere at the time.

## **HEAD COACH CHRIS RILEY**

Chris Riley is in his fifth season as head coach of the Virginia Tech volleyball team.

Riley led the Hokies to a 12-3 record in Cassell Coliseum, picking up the most home wins since 1998. It was just the sixth time in Hokie history that the team won 12 or more at matches home. Tech finished with a 19-12 overall record, going 9-11 in ACC play and finishing in a tie with Wake Forest for seventh.

In 2008, Riley took a young squad, welcoming seven newcomers, and turned it into a strong ACC contender. The Hokies went 20-11, 11-9 in the league, winning 20 matches for the first time since 2002, and sat atop the ACC standings for much of the conference season. Tech also won 11 straight matches at one point in the season, matching the longest winning streak in school history.

Riley guided a young Tech squad to a 14-18 record overall in 2007, and an 8-14 mark in the ACC, tying for eighth place in the conference. Riley led the group to the program's 550th victory, coming over Wake Forest on Oct. 20th.

Under Riley, the Hokies earned Virginia Tech records with 611 block assists and 394.5 total blocks as a team in 2007. Freshman standout Felicia Willoughby flourished under Riley's direction, having one of the best seasons ever for a Hokie rookie. Willoughby set a Tech record with 172 total blocks on the season, ranking first in the ACC and 11th in the nation.

In 2006, Riley led the team to its best finish since joining the ACC. The Hokies finished with a 17-14 overall record, their first winning season since 2002, and fourth in the past 14 years.

Prior to coming to Tech, Riley spent six seasons at Towson University, where he led the team to five straight 20-win seasons, three Colonial Athletic Association regular season championships, the 2004 CAA tournament championship and the 2004 NCAA Tournament.
