The Hokies open the 2011 season at home for the first time since 2009. They are 28-6 all-time in home-openers and begin the year with the Hokie Tournament, the first of three home tournaments this season. Tech will look to extend its 18-match winning streak in home tournaments this weekend that dates back to the 2005 season.

Tech concluded the 2010 season with its first ever NCAA appearance and will work to continue the recent success and momentum into 2011.

Series Info

Cleveland State - The Hokies and Vikings will meet for the first time since 2003. The series is tied at one win a piece as Tech swept CSU in the first meeting in 1990, 3-0, and most recently fell to the Vikings, 1-3, at home. The Hokies will look to defend their home court and pick up their first win over CSU in Blacksburg.

High Point - Tech will host the Panthers for the fifth time in program history this weekend as it holds the all-time series edge at 5-2. The Hokies also control the advantage in Blacksburg, sitting at 3-1 all-time. The two teams first met in 1979, when Tech took a 2-1 road victory. The Hokies are currently in the midst of a two-match winning streak against the Panthers, sweeping them 3-0 in 1990 and 2003.

Indiana - The Hokies will face the Hoosiers for the first time in program history this weekend. Tech is 1-8 all-time against teams currently in the Big 10. The Hokies' most recently Big 10 opponent was Penn State, who ended Tech's NCAA Tournament run last season with a 3-0 victory at home.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHT



Erin Leaser • Senior • Setter • Allentown, Pa.

After completing her third-consecutive season with 1,000-plus assists, senior setter Erin Leaser is on pace to finish second all-time in the Tech record books, while currently holding down the No. 4 spot entereing the season. The Allentown, Pa., native tallied 1,336 assists in 2010, which upped her career total to 3,755. Her 11.18 assist per set average last year, which ranked her second in the conference and 27th in the nation by season's end.

Leaser also added 264 digs, 97 kills and a team best 11 double-doubles in her junior season as she helped her team to its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance.

Scouting Report

Cleveland State - The Vikings will begin the 2011 season in Blacksburg after putting together a 27-7 record in 2010, wrapping up the year in the Horizon League Semifinals with a 3-2 loss to Butler.

Four starters and the libero return for the Vikings this season. Senior Jordan Groad, who sits at fourth on the team's all-time assists list and junior Kara Koch, who led the team in points and kills last season, highlight the veteran squad.

High Point - Coming off of their first-ever Big South Championship last season, the Panthers will open their season in Blacksburg, first taking on Indiana on Friday night before facing the Hokies Saturday afternoon. HPU finished its 22-13 season last year with a loss in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, but lost six key members in the off season. The Panthers will look to sophomore middle blocker Michelle Chakirelis and an impressive freshmen lineup to carry the history-making momentum into 2011.

Indiana - The Hoosiers will be the third and final opponent for Tech in the opening weekend of play and are the second squad of the weekend to have participated in the 2010 NCAA Tournament.

The Hoosiers lost some key components from their 2010 Sweet 16 team, including the team kills leader Jordan Haverly to a knee surgery. IU will look to Caitlin Cox, who is nearing the school's digs record after pacing the team with 513 last season.

ACC Preseason Poll

The Hokies were picked to finish sixth this season in the ACC as the league's coaches voted in the annual preseason poll. Duke was selected to repeat as the conference

champion after earning its ninth regular season crown last season and receiving nine of the first place votes. Florida State was the only other team to receive top-spot votes as it earned the final three.

Historic Happenings

The Hokies made history last season when they earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament after an impressive regular season. Tech also earned its first tournament victory when it defeated Delaware 3-0 in the opening round. En route to the post season, the Hokies wrapped up the regular season with the 600th win in program history and the 26th win over in-state rival Virginia, 3-2.

Midway through conference play, Tech claimed its first win over a ranked opponent as it defeated then-No.25 Florida State, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum.

To begin the year, the Hokies extended their home tournament winning streak to 18 games as they started the season with a 10-1 record. They dropped just one match, on the road, to then-No. 19 Tennessee.

Top Tier in Tournaments

The Hokies are currently in the midst of an impressive run in home tournaments, as they have claimed victory in their last 18 matches. Tech's last loss in a home tournament was on Sept. 3, 2005. The Hokies will look to keep this streak alive this season as they are hosting three tournaments for the first time in program history.

Raising the Baar

Junior middle blocker Cara Baarendse has been a consistent source of production for the Hokies in her first two seasons. After an impressive collegiate premiere, the recently named Preseason All-ACC team member proved herself with a dominant sophomore outing.

She currently sits in second-place all-time at Tech with a .367 career hitting percentage. Last season the Mason, Ohio, native led the team with 385 kills, while hitting at teambest .376 clip.

Baarendse added 121 digs, 48 assists and 41 blocks in her 27 starts last season en route to numerous post season accolades, including AVCA All-America Honorable Mention honors.

Serving Up Greatness

Senior outside hitter Justine Record has been dominating the competition with her powerful serve over her past three seasons as a starter. Record led the ACC and the squad in service aces with 46 on the year, good for 0.38 per set.

The Preseason All-ACC honoree also ranked second on the team with 300 digs and third in kills with 293. Record currently sits at ninth all-time at Tech with 128 career aces.

-Sher Thing

Carrying on the freshman tradition in her collegiate debut, now-sophomore Victoria Hamsher became the fifth Hokie in as many years to earn a spot on the ACC All-Freshman team. Hamsher started all 32 matches for Tech, while also appearing in all 120 sets. The Nazareth, Pa., native led the league's newcomers with 95 block assists and 107 total blocks. Her 107 blocks last season ranks fourth all-time on Tech's all-time freshman list.

Competitive Conference

The Atlantic Coast Conference is home to some top competition. Though only one team is ranked (No. 17 Duke) in the AVCA Preseason Poll, four other teams are

Tech Welcomes Eight Newcomers

The Hokies welcome eight newcomers this season, including seven freshmen and senior-transfer Kelsey Maloney. Maloney transferred from Wisconsin-Madison.

The freshmen class includes Jordan Fish, Alyssa Gammel, Delaney Pittari, Bailey Dowd, Kathryn Caine, Gabrielle Talley and LaTasha Samson-Akpan.

No two members of the class of 2015 hail from the same state as Caine is the only Virginian in the class, while Fish and Pittari become the only players on the squad from their respective states, Michigan and Louisiana.

Samson-Akpan joins junior Cara Baarendse as the only Ohio natives on the team, while Gammel, Dowd and Talley become the third members of the squad from California, Pennsylvania and Florida, respectively.

Just Virginia Tech, Please - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.



What is a Hokie, Anyway? - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.
