Tech will take its undefeated show on the road this weekend for its only road tournament of the year. The Hokies opened the 2011 season last weekend, sweeping the competition at the Hokie Tournament and extending their home tournament winning streak to 21 games. Senior Justine Record highlighted play as she moved into eighth place on Tech's all-time service aces list with six on the weekend.

#### Series Info

*Ohio* - The Hokies face Ohio University for the third time in program history this weekend. The Bobcats hold a 2-0 edge in the series, claiming 3-0 victories over Tech in 2002 and 2004. This will be the second time the two teams face off in tournament play as the Hokies will look to take their first set and win from Ohio this weekend.

*Western Kentucky University* - Tech boasts a 3-1 series record against the Hilltoppers. The teams first collided in 1992 and later in 1995 as the Hokies claimed 3-1 victories in both outings. Tech's only loss in the series came in 2008, when it fell 3-2, but most recently the Hokies earned a 3-2 win over WKU last season.

*Kentucky* - Kentucky will be the second team of the weekend that that Hokies will be searching for their first ever win against. Tech is 0-3 all-time against the Wildcats. The Hokies have only ever won one set against Kentucky as they fell 2-0 in 1977, 2-0 in 1980 and 3-1 in 1999.

## PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

### Cara Baarendse • Junior • Middle Blocker • Mason, Ohio

Baarendse began the 2011 season in an impressive fashion, leading the team in kills and hitting percentage in two of the three opening matches. She was awarded for her outstanding play and bold leadership on the court as she was named the Hokie Tournament MVP, as well as the Hardees Star of the Week for Virginia Tech Athletics.

Baarendse is currently in the three-way tie as the team's kills leader with 29, while also pacing the squad with a .383 hitting percentage.

#### Scouting Report

**Ohio** - The Bobcats opened the season last weekend at the Lady Vol Invitational and currently sit at 2-1 on the year. The tireless squad faced then-No. 24 Tennessee, Maryland and Villanova, all five-set matches, in their first weekend of play.

Lexie Harnett led the way for Ohio and was rewarded for her efforts as she was named the MAC Defensive Player of the Week and tallied 26 blocks on the weekend.

**Western Kentucky University** - WKU, like the Hokies, will enter the second weekend of action with a 3-0 record as it swept the competition at the Belmont Invite last week. Ashley Potts was named Tournament MVP, while Tiffany Elmore earned co-Sun Belt Player of the Week honors after tallying 11 blocks and hitting at a .531 clip.

**Kentucky** - The Wildcats sit at 2-2 entering the weekend as they are in the midst of a 10-match home stand that began earlier this week when they hosted and fell to Cincinnati.

Jackie Napper was named SEC Freshman on the Week this week after she averaged 2.50 digs per set in the opening weekend action at the FSU Invite. Stephanie Klefot has also produced for the Wildcats as she threw down 18 kills against the Bearcats and leads the SEC with 5.27 digs per set.

#### ACC Preseason Poll

The Hokies were picked to finish sixth this season in the ACC as the league's coaches voted in the annual preseason poll. Duke was selected to repeat as the conference champion after earning its ninth regular season crown last season and receiving nine of the first place votes. Florida State was the only other team to receive top-spot votes as it earned the final three.

#### Historic Happenings

The Hokies made history last season when they earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament after an impressive regular season. Tech also earned its first tournament victory when it defeated Delaware 3-0 in the opening round. En route to the post season, the Hokies wrapped up the regular season with the 600th win in program history and the 26th win over in-state rival Virginia, 3-2.

Midway through conference play, Tech claimed its first win over a ranked opponent as it defeated then-No.25 Florida State, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum.

To begin the year, the Hokies extended their home tournament winning streak to 18 games as they started the season with a 10-1 record. They dropped just one match, on the road, to then-No. 19 Tennessee.

#### Top Tier in Tournaments

The Hokies are currently in the midst of an impressive run in home tournaments, as they have claimed victory in their last 21 matches, including three as they opened play last weekend. Tech's last loss in a home tournament was on Sept. 3, 2005. The Hokies will look to keep this streak alive this season as they are hosting three tournaments for the first time in program history.

#### Raising the Baar

Junior middle blocker Cara Baarendse has been a consistent source of production for the Hokies in her first two seasons. After an impressive collegiate premiere, the recently named Preseason All-ACC team member proved herself with a dominant sophomore outing.

She currently sits in second-place all-time at Tech with a .367 career hitting percentage.

Last season the Mason, Ohio, native led the team with 385 kills, while hitting at team-best .376 clip.

Baarendse added 121 digs, 48 assists and 41 blocks in her 27 starts last season en route to numerous post season accolades, including AVCA All-America Honorable Mention honors.

#### Serving Up Greatness

Senior outside hitter Justine Record has been dominating the competition with her powerful serve over her past three seasons as a starter. Record led the ACC and the squad in service aces with 46 on the year, good for 0.38 per set.

The Preseason All-ACC honoree recently moved claimed sole possession of eighth place in Tech's all-time record book after upping her career service ace total to 135 last weekend. She needs just four more to move into seventh place.

#### -Sher Thing

Carrying on the freshman tradition in her collegiate debut, now-sophomore Victoria Hamsher became the fifth Hokie in as many years to earn a spot on the ACC All-Freshman team.

Hamsher has already carried that success over into her second season as she earned All-Tournament team honors in the Hokie Tournament last weekend after tallying 24 kills and 18 blocks through three matches.

#### Leaser on the Loose

After completing her third-consecutive season with 1,000-plus assists, senior setter Erin Leaser is on pace to finish second all-time in the Tech record books, while currently holding down the No. 4 spot entering the season. The Allentown, Pa., native tallied 1,336 assists in 2010, which upped her career total to 3,755. Her 11.18

Leaser also added 264 digs, 97 kills and a team best 11 double-doubles in her junior season as she helped her team to its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance.

### Tech Welcomes Eight Newcomers

The Hokies welcome eight newcomers this season, including seven freshmen and senior-transfer Kelsey Maloney. Maloney transferred from Wisconsin-Madison.

The freshmen class includes Jordan Fish, Alyssa Gammel, Delaney Pittari, Bailey Dowd, Kathryn Caine, Gabrielle Talley and LaTasha Samson-Akpan.

No two members of the class of 2015 hail from the same state as Caine is the only Virginian in the class, while Fish and Pittari become the only players on the squad from their respective states, Michigan and Louisiana.

Samson-Akpan joins junior Cara Baarendse as the only Ohio natives on the team, while Gammel, Dowd and Talley become the third members of the squad from California, Pennsylvania and Florida, respectively.

**Just Virginia Tech, Please** - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.



**What is a Hokie, Anyway?** - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.
