The Hokies return home after competing in their only road tournament of 2011. Tech will look to bounce back this weekend and return to its winning ways at home after going 0-3 in its only three non-conference road games of the year. The Hokies are in the midst of a 21-match home tournament winning streak that dates back to 2005. Senior Justine Record will also chase history this weekend, as she needs just two service aces to move into seventh all-time at Tech in the category.

Series Info

American - The Hokies will face American for the sixth time in program history this weekend. Tech has never lost a match to the Eagles and will look to keep that five-match winning streak rolling. The Hokies have swept American twice, including in the first meeting in 1986, and most recently topped the Eagles, 3-1, in D.C. in 2009.

Seton Hall - Tech holds the slight, 3-2 series edge over the Pirates, winning the first meeting in 1998. The two teams last collided in 2002 and 2003 and the Hokies dropped just one set through the two matches.

Tennessee - After traveling to Knoxville last season, the Lady Vols will arrive in Blacksburg with a 14-1 all-time advantage over the Hokies. Tech's only win of the series came in 1995. Though they are just receiving votes this week, Tennessee has been ranked in each of the last two meetings with Tech.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Jennifer Wiker • R-Junior • Outside Hitter • Charlotte, N.C.

Wiker began last weekend on the right foot as she led the team with 15 kills in a thrilling five-set match against Ohio. Wiker was one of three Hokies with double-digit kills in the match as she set new season highs in numerous categories including kills, attempts (42), block assists (3) and total blocks (4).

So far in her third season, Wiker ranks fourth on the squad with 48 kills and third as she averages 2.40 kills per set.

Scouting Report

American - The Eagles enter the weekend at 3-3 on the year as they embark on their second-straight weekend on the road. American is 1-0 in away contests and 2-1 in neutral matches.

A young squad, eight freshmen have seen time on the court so far this year. Newcomer Sara Rishell paces the team with 83 kills and 23 blocks, her classmate Monika Smidova has tallied a team-best 134 assists and 15 blocks.

Seton Hall - The Pirates will face Tennessee on Friday evening before taking on the Hokies Saturday afternoon. They come into the weekend with a 3-3 record and are coming off of their only home match so far, a 3-0 win over Long Island.

Meghan Matusiak leads the offense with 74 kills, while Alyssa Warren has tallied team-bests of seven aces and 119 digs.

Tennessee - Tech will cap off the weekend with a SEC member for the second-straight week as the Lady Vols are Tech's third and final opponent. Entering the weekend, Tennessee boasts a 4-2 record after sweeping competition in its home tournament during opening weekend and falling to Illinois and Houston.

Leading the way for the Lady Vols is Kelsey Robinson with 136 kills and 14 aces, while Shaelyn Kolosky has tallied an impressive 21 blocks so far.

ACC Preseason Poll

The Hokies were picked to finish sixth this season in the ACC as the league's coaches voted in the annual preseason poll. Duke was selected to repeat as the conference champion after earning its ninth regular season crown last season and receiving nine of the first place votes. Florida State was the

only other team to receive top-spot votes as it earned the final three.

Historic Happenings

The Hokies made history last season when they earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament after an impressive regular season. Tech also earned its first tournament victory when it defeated Delaware 3-0 in the opening round. En route to the post season, the Hokies wrapped up the regular season with the 600th win in program history and the 26th win over in-state rival Virginia, 3-2.

Midway through conference play, Tech claimed its first win over a ranked opponent as it defeated then-No.25 Florida State, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum.

To begin the year, the Hokies extended their home tournament winning streak to 18 games as they started the season with a 10-1 record. They dropped just one match, on the road, to then-No. 19 Tennessee.

Top Tier in Tournaments

The Hokies are currently in the midst of an impressive run in home tournaments, as they have claimed victory in their last 21 matches, tacking on the last three in opening weekend. Tech's last loss in a home tournament was on Sept. 3, 2005. The Hokies will look to keep this streak alive this season as they are hosting three tournaments for the first time in program history.

Raising the Baar

Junior middle blocker Cara Baarendse has been a consistent source of production for the Hokies in her first two seasons. After an impressive collegiate premiere, the Preseason All-ACC team member proved herself with a dominant sophomore outing.

She currently sits in second-place all-time

at Tech with a .367 career hitting percentage.

The Mason, Ohio, native currently leads the team, hitting at a .328 clip, while ranking second with 52 kills and 25 blocks. Baarendse also ranks sixth in the ACC averaging 1.14 blocks per set.

Serving Up Greatness

Senior outside hitter Justine Record has been dominating the competition with her powerful serve over the past three seasons as a starter. Record currently leads the squad with 59 kills and nine service aces, also ranking second with 65 digs.

The Preseason All-ACC honoree recently claimed sole possession of eighth place in Tech's all-time record book after upping her career service ace total to 135 in the first weekend of the season. She needs just two more to move into seventh place.

-Sher Thing

Carrying on the freshman tradition in her collegiate debut, now-sophomore Victoria Hamscher became the fifth Hokie in as many years to earn a spot on the ACC All-Freshman team.

Hamscher has already carried that success over into her second season as she earned All-Tournament team honors in the Hokie Tournament after tallying 24 kills and 18 blocks through three matches.

The Nazareth, Pa., native sits at fourth in the conference as she averages 1.36 blocks per set.

Leaser on the Loose

After completing her third-consecutive season with 1,000-plus assists, senior setter Erin Leaser is on pace to finish second all-time in the Tech record books, while currently holding down the No. 4 (3,934) spot.

Leaser's 179 assists so far this year pace the

squad, while her 8.14 per set are good for eighth in the conference.

Atop the Conference

The Hokies have tallied 63 total blocks so far this season, which ranks them second in the conference behind only Florida State. Tech's 2.86 blocks per set average also sits the squad at second-best in the ACC.

Tech Welcomes Eight Newcomers

The Hokies welcome eight newcomers this season, including seven freshmen and senior-transfer Kelsey Maloney. Maloney transferred from Wisconsin-Madison.

The freshmen class includes Jordan Fish, Alyssa Gammel, Delaney Pittari, Bailey Dowd, Kathryn Caine, Gabrielle Talley and LaTasha Samson-Akpan.

No two members of the class of 2015 hail from the same state as Caine is the only Virginian in the class, while Fish and Pittari become the only players on the squad from their respective states, Michigan and Louisiana.

Samson-Akpan joins junior Cara Baarendse as the only Ohio natives on the team, while Gammel, Dowd and Talley become the third members of the squad from California, Pennsylvania and Florida, respectively.

Just Virginia Tech, Please - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.



What is a Hokie, Anyway? - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.
