Tech will both wrap up its non-conference slate and begin conference play this weekend as it hosts its third and final home tournament of the season. The Hokies got back to their winning way last weekend, going 2-1 through three matches, but ended the home winning streak at 23 matches after falling to Tennessee. Tech opens conference play with in-state rival Virginia tonight and will face Chattanooga and BIG EAST-member Connecticut on Saturday.

Series Info

Virginia - Tech will face the Cavaliers for the 57th time in program history this weekend. The Hoos hold the all-time advantage, 30-26, but the Hokies boast a 16-10 edge in Blacksburg. The two teams first met in 1979 and most recently the Hokies swept Virginia last season with a pair of 3-2 victories.

Chattanooga- This will mark the fourth-ever meeting between Tech and the Mocs. First meeting in 1979, the two teams last clashed a season ago in Knoxville, Tenn., when Tech took home a 3-0 win.

Connecticut - The Huskies lead the four-match series 3-1 entering the weekend but Tech is coming off of its only win against UConn. Tech claimed a 3-2 victory over the Huskies in 1997 and have never taken down UConn at home despite two opportunities.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Tori Hamsher • Sophomore • Middle Blocker • Nazareth, Pa.

Hamsher is coming off a big weekend at the net after tallying 14 total blocks last weekend during the Hokie Invite. Hamsher had at least four blocks in every match and currently leads the team with 44 total blocks. The sophomore has led the team in blocks in six of the team's nine matches so far this season.

Hamsher currently ranks second in the ACC with a 1.38 blocks per set average.

Scouting Report

Virginia - The Cavaliers enter the weekend at 6-3 on the year and are coming off of a 2-1 performance last weekend, dropping the second match to Louisville, 3-1. Virginia is currently ranked second in the ACC with 14.30 kills per set and digs with 17.33 per set.

Simone Asque is second in the ACC with 4.07 kills per set and leads the squad with 122 total. Jessica O'Shoney has paced the defense with 27 total blocks, while Emily Rottman has contributed 135 digs.

Chattanooga - The Mocs will face UConn on Friday evening before taking on the Hokies Saturday morning and enter play in Blacksburg with a 1-9 record. Chattanooga won't its first match of the season and has not managed a victory since.

Leading the Chattanooga offense has been Jennifer Kuroski, who tallied 44 kills last weekend, upping her season total to 114. Christina Teter has also thrown down over 100 kills (106), while also leading the team with 34 total blocks.

Connecticut -The Huskies will face Tech in the final match of the weekend but come into it with a 6-4 record. UConn went 2-1 last weekend at New Hampshire, dropping the middle match, 3-0, to Indiana State.

Jordan Kirk leads the Huskie offense with 122 kills so far this season, while Kelsey Marving has scooped up 168 digs. Six different Huskies have already tallied double-digit blocks this year.

ACC Preseason Poll

The Hokies were picked to finish sixth this season in the ACC as the league's coaches voted in the annual preseason poll. Duke was selected to repeat as the conference champion after earning its ninth regular

season crown last season and receiving nine of the first place votes. Florida State was the only other team to receive top-spot votes as it earned the final three.

Historic Happenings

The Hokies made history last season when they earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament after an impressive regular season. Tech also earned its first tournament victory when it defeated Delaware, 3-0, in the opening round. En route to the post season, the Hokies wrapped up the regular season with the 600th win in program history and the 26th win over in-state rival Virginia, 3-2.

Midway through conference play, Tech claimed its first win over a ranked opponent as it defeated then-No.25 Florida State, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum.

To begin the year, the Hokies extended their home tournament winning streak to 18 games as they started the season with a 10-1 record. They dropped just one match, on the road, to then-No. 19 Tennessee.

Top Tier in Tournaments

The Hokies recently ended a 23-match home tournament winning streak last weekend. The streak dated back to the 2005 season. Tech extended the streak early this year as it swept the competition at the Hokie Tournament and seemed to keep things rolling during the Hokie Invite as it swept American in its first match and later Seton Hall the following day. The final match of the tournament did the Hokies in, though, as they fell 3-1 to a talented Tennessee team.

Block Party

The Hokies made their presence at the net known last weekend during the Hokie Invite. Tech got up for 54 total blocks in the

weekend, six solo blocks and 48 assisted blocks. Tech currently leads the ACC with 2.75 blocks per set average.

Raising the Baar

Junior middle blocker Cara Baarendse has been a consistent source of production for the Hokies in her first two seasons. After an impressive collegiate premiere, the Preseason All-ACC team member proved herself with a dominant sophomore outing.

She currently sits in second-place all-time at Tech with a .367 career hitting percentage.

The Mason, Ohio, native currently leads the team, hitting at a .342 clip, while ranking second with 82 kills and 33 total blocks.

Serving Up Greatness

Senior outside hitter Justine Record has been dominating the competition with her powerful serve over the past three seasons as a starter. Record currently leads the squad with 87 kills and 14 service aces, also ranking second with 95 digs.

The Preseason All-ACC honoree recently claimed sole possession of eighth place in Tech's all-time record book after upping her career service ace total to 142. She needs just four more to move into sixth place.

-Sher Thing

Carrying on the freshman tradition in her collegiate debut, now-sophomore Victoria Hamsher became the fifth Hokie in as many years to earn a spot on the ACC All-Freshman team.

Hamsher has already carried that success over into her second season as she earned All-Tournament team honors in the Hokie Tournament after tallying 24 kills and 18 blocks through three matches.

The Nazareth, Pa., native sits at second in the conference as she averages 1.38 blocks per set. Her team-best 44 total blocks is also

Leaser on the Loose

After completing her third-consecutive season with 1,000-plus assists, senior setter Erin Leaser is on pace to finish second all-time in the Tech record books, while currently holding down the No. 4 (3,934) spot.

Leaser's 245 assists so far this year pace the squad, while her 8.14 per set are good for ninth in the conference.

Atop the Conference

Tech currently leads the ACC in total blocks and service aces. The Hokies have tallied 88 blocks so far this season, good for a 2.75 per set average. Tech's 44 aces has also brought them to the top of the league's lists. The Hokies are averaging 1.38 aces per set.

Tech Welcomes Eight Newcomers

The Hokies welcome eight newcomers this season, including seven freshmen and senior-transfer Kelsey Maloney. Maloney transferred from Wisconsin-Madison.

The freshmen class includes Jordan Fish, Alyssa Gammel, Delaney Pittari, Bailey Dowd, Kathryn Caine, Gabrielle Talley and LaTasha Samson-Akpan.

No two members of the class of 2015 hail from the same state as Caine is the only Virginian in the class, while Fish and Pittari become the only players on the squad from their respective states, Michigan and Louisiana.

Samson-Akpan joins junior Cara Baarendse as the only Ohio natives on the team, while Gammel, Dowd and Talley become the third members of the squad from California, Pennsylvania and Florida, respectively.

Just Virginia Tech, Please - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.



What is a Hokie, Anyway? - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.
