After beginning conference play with a 3-1 win over Virginia at Cassell Coliseum last weekend, the Hokies remain at home for the third straight weekend as they host a pair of ranked opponents. Tech will look to keep the momentum going as No. 21 Miami comes to town Friday and No. 23 Florida State rolls through on Saturday. The two Florida teams recently faced each other last week, while Tech wrapped up its non-conference slate with a 6-4 record. It struggled on the road but bounced back, going 5-1 in the next six matches.

Series Info

Miami - The Hurricanes boast the series lead against the Hokies, 11-5. Tech is 4-4 against the Canes in Blacksburg as the two teams have only met as conference foes, both in the ACC and BIG EAST. First matching up in 2002, the only time they have faced off outside of the regular season was during the 2002 BIG EAST Tournament. This will mark the first time either team has been ranked in a meeting as Miami is tied for No. 21 in this week's AVCA Poll.

Florida State - The Seminoles have had much success against Tech as they hold a 26-3 all-time advantage, first matching up in 1980. The Hokies are 3-9 against Florida State at home, but claimed a 3-2 victory last season in Blacksburg that gave them their first ever victory over a ranked opponent as FSU was the No. 25 team in the country at that time. The Seminoles are ranked No. 23 in this week's AVCA Poll, which marks the fifth-consecutive time they have faced Tech as a ranked opponent.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Morgan O'Neill • Junior • Libero • Atherton, Calif.

Junior Morgan O'Neill has stepped up in a big way for the Hokies this season. As the full-time libero this season, O'Neill leads the team with 169 digs so far this season and tallied a team season high against Chattanooga over the weekend as she scooped up 29. The Atherton, Calif., native had her most successful defensive weekend thus far as she tallied 72 digs during the course of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational.

With the impressive weekend under her belt, O'Neill has cracked the ACC's top ten digs chart as she is currently averaging 3.93 per set, good for ninth among the league's best.

Scouting Report

Miami - The No. 21 Hurricanes enter the weekend at 9-1 on the year after dropping their conference opener at Florida State, 3-0. Miami began the season sweeping all three tournaments it participated in and dropped just four sets before they were swept.

Alex Johnson has spearheaded the Miami offense as she paces the squad with 117 kills, while six different players have tallied double-digit blocks thus far on the defensive end.

Senior Lane Carico has been a big contributor across the board for the Canes, racking up 92 kills, 11 aces, 136 digs and 16 blocks, earning her two of the four ACC Player of the Week honors so far this year.

Florida State - The No. 23 Seminoles are coming off a big win over Miami last week but will travel to Charlottesville, Va., before arriving in Blacksburg. FSU will enter the weekend of play at 7-4 on the season.

Jekaterina Stepanova leads the way for the Seminoles with 130 kills this year, while Ashley Neff leads the league averaging 1.50 blocks per set and ranks fourth in the conference with a .389 hitting percentage.

Katie Mosher has also helped pace the defense as she leads the squad with 174 digs.

Elise Walch was recently named ACC Player of the Week this week after throwing down 12 kills, good for a .706 hitting percentage against Miami last week.

Conference Leaders Collide

The Hokies will face some of the conference's top competition as the only two ranked ACC teams come to town.

Highlighting the Florida State match will be the ACC blocks leader Ashley Neff (1.50) against Tech's Victoria Hamsher (1.43) who ranks second and leads all competitors with 63 total blocks.

Tech senior Justine Record currently ranks second in the conference with a 0.38 ace-per-set average, while FSU's Visnja Djurdjeric is just behind her in third averaging 0.35 per set.

As a team, Miami leads the league in digs, while also ranking fifth with a .266 hitting percentage. FSU holds the No. 2 spot on that list hitting at a .286 clip.

Career Weekend for Tech

Four different upperclassmen wiped out career highs during last weekend's sweep at the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Headlining the top performers was sophomore Victoria Hamsher who tallied 16 kills against Chattanooga and earned season bests in consecutive matches with seven and then eight block assists.

Junior Cara Baarendse's 16 digs against Virginia set a new personal mark, while senior Erin Leaser's four service aces also set a new bar. Junior Morgan O'Neill set a new team season high as she got down for 29 digs against Chattanooga.

Block Party

The Hokies have made their presence at the net known over the past two weeks. Tech got up for 30 total blocks, six solo and 48 assisted during the Hokie Invite and bettered that total at last weekend's Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational with 35 total blocks, including 60 assisted and five solo.

Raising the Baar

Junior middle blocker Cara Baarendse has continued to dominate in her third season at Tech. Baarendse has already earned Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week and Hokie Tournament MVP honors after garnering Preseason All-ACC accolades before the season began.

The Mason, Ohio, native has six double-

digit kills matches under her belt already this year and recently tallied her first double-double of the year (13 k, 16 d) against Virginia.

Baarendse leads the team with 115 kills and a .348 hitting percentage.

Serving Up Greatness

Senior outside hitter Justine Record has been a staple in the Tech offense this season as she currently leads the team with a 2.62 kills-per-set average, as well as 15 service aces. Her 0.38 aces per set lands her the second-best average in the ACC.

The Redwood City, Calif., native tallied a career-high six aces against High Point earlier in the year and is currently in need of three more aces to up her 143 career total and move into sixth place on Tech's all-time list.

Record not only leads the team with six double-digit kills and six double-digs matches, but she is also the only player with more than one double-double this year, as she has racked up six so far.

-Sher Thing

Sophomore middle blocker Victoria Hamsher has been a strong force for the Hokies at the net so far this season. She has led the squad in blocks in nine of the 12 matches and currently leads the team in every blocking category.

Hamsher had a career weekend during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational as she tallied double-digit kills in two of the three matches, including a new career high, 16, against Chattanooga. Hamsher also set a new season high of seven blocks in that match, only to later up the total to eight against UConn. For her efforts she was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week.

The Nazareth, Pa. native stands at second in the ACC with 1.43 bps.

Leaser on the Loose

Senior setter Erin Leaser has been an important part of the Tech offense over the past three seasons and her final one is no exception. Leaser recently moved into third place on Tech's all-time career assists list against Virginia in the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational as she easily surpasses the seven assists she needed and upped her three-year total to 4,065 by tournament's end.

The Allentown, Pa., native also ranks second on the team with 14 service aces and third with 76 digs.

Big Weekend for Wiker

Redshirt junior Jennifer Wiker tallied double-digit kills twice in the same weekend for the first time this season during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Wiker threw down 10 against Virginia in the opening match before going for 11 against UConn. The Charlotte, N.C., native just missed against Chattanooga as she tallied nine, while also posting four blocks.

Wiker, who has already earned a degree in Finance and is currently working towards her MBA, is tied for third on the squad with 95 kills while also ranking fourth with 24 blocks.

Setting Up Early Success

Freshman Jordan Fish made the first start of her career against Virginia last Friday and rose to the occasion. While splitting time with senior setter Erin Leaser, Fish tallied a career high 24 assists in the match, along with six digs. Fish nearly matched that total against on Saturday night against UConn when she tossed up 21 helpers.

The North Branch, Mich., native also had a successful serving weekend as she racked up seven aces, which propelled her to a 0.35 per set average and the No. 9 spot among the ACC's best.

Atop the Conference

Tech currently leads the ACC in total blocks and is second service aces. The Hokies have tallied 123 blocks so far this season, good for a 2.80 per set average. Tech's 66 aces have helped it rank among the top two, averaging 1.51 per set.

Top Tier in Tournaments

The Hokies recently ended a 23-match home tournament winning streak last weekend. The streak dated back to the 2005 season. Tech extended the streak early this year as it swept the competition at the Hokie Tournament and seemed to keep things rolling during the Hokie Invite as it swept American in its first match and later Seton Hall the following day. The final match of the tournament did the Hokies in, though, as they fell 3-1 to a talented Tennessee team.

Historic Happenings

The Hokies made history last season when they earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament after an impressive regular season. Tech also earned its first tournament victory when it defeated Delaware, 3-0, in the opening round. En route to the post season, the Hokies wrapped up the regular season with the 600th win in program history and the 26th win over in-state rival Virginia, 3-2.

Midway through conference play, Tech claimed its first win over a ranked opponent as it defeated then-No.25 Florida State, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum.

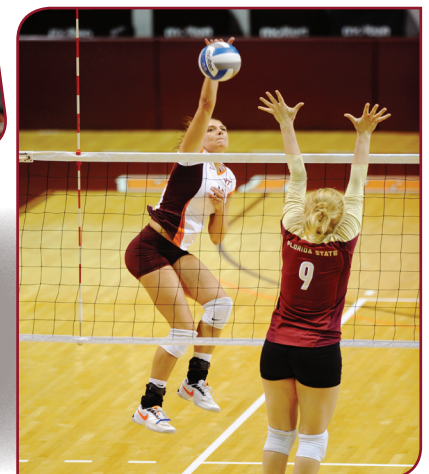

Just Virginia Tech, Please - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.



What is a Hokie, Anyway? - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.
