Tech will look to bounce back in conference play this week as the squad hits the road for the second time this season and first time in nearly four weeks. The Hokies participated in just one road tournament this year, at Kentucky, while hosting three of their own. After beginning conference play with a 3-1 win over Virginia, Tech hosted No. 21 Miami and No. 23 Florida State last weekend and was unable to claim a set through the two matches.

#### Series Info

**Boston College** - The Eagles enter the Thursday evening match with a 4-10 record. They have yet to claim a victory through three conference games, falling most recently to North Carolina, 3-0.

Pacing BC's offense has been Tsvetelina Dureva with 139 kills, as she is the only member of the squad with over 100 kills. Like Tech, the Eagles have made use of two different setters this season as Cagla Sen leads the way with 261 assists and Kellie Barnum has tallied 106. Brennan Clark has spearheaded the defense from the back row, scooping up 240 digs as one of three players with 100-plus digs.

**Maryland** - The Terrapins will host Virginia on Friday before Tech comes to town Sunday. They enter the weekend with an 8-7 record, 2-1 in league play. Maryland recently ended NC State's 13-match winning streak at home with a 3-0 victory.

The Terps have had two newcomers earn ACC Freshman of the Week honors so far this year, as Ashleigh Crutcher took the title the week of Sept. 5 and Adreene Elliot was honored this week after throwing down eight kills in three straight matches and boasting a .435 hitting percentage through the three conference matches.

## PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

### Alyssa Gammel • Freshman • Outside Hitter • Bakersfield, Calif.

Freshman Alyssa Gammel set a new career high last weekend as she tallied 10 kills against Florida State. Gammel has played in seven matches so far in her young career and has made two starts. Her 10 kills was the first time she has notched double-digit kills, and made her the only Tech player to hit double figures in any category against the Seminoles.

The Bakersfield, Calif., native has tallied 23 total kills this season as she is one of three freshmen that have seen action in at least seven matches. Classmates Kathryn Caine and Jordan Fish have also made an impact so far this season. Each of the three have also made at least one start.

#### Scouting Report

*Boston College* - Tech boasts the 9-5 series advantage against the Eagles, also holding onto the slight 4-3 edge on the road. The two teams first met in 2001 and have only ever met as conference foes in the BIG EAST and ACC. The Hokies claimed victory in the first-ever meeting, 3-0, and swept BC by way of two 3-0 sweeps in the 2010 season.

The Hokies have claimed the last five meetings between the two teams.

*Maryland* - The Terrapins hold a 9-6 series edge against Tech, playing well at home with the 7-2 advantage in College Park. The Hokies claimed the most recent meeting last season, 3-0.

The two teams first met in 1992 when the Terps took a 3-0 win to kick off the series. The pair faced off three times before becoming conference foes in 2004.

#### Atop the Conference

Tech currently ranks second in the ACC in blocks and service aces. The Hokies have tallied 133 blocks so far this season, good for a 2.66 per set average. Tech's 70 aces have helped it rank among the top two, averaging 1.40 per set.

Three Hokies rank among the leagues top five as Justine Record and Jordan Fish hold the No. 2 and 3 spots in service aces with 0.36 and 0.35 respective averages. Victoria Hamsher rounds out the trio as she holds the No. 2 spot in the ACC with a 1.36 bps average.

Tech will face a defensive challenge this weekend as Maryland and BC's defenses rank among the best in the conference and Sarah Harper (Md.) and Brennan Clark (BC) hold the No. 4 and 5 spots in digs with 4.60 and 4.54 respective per set averages.

#### Block Party

The Hokies have made their presence at the net known this season. Tech got up for 30 total blocks, six solo and 48 assisted during the Hokie Invite and bettered that total during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational with 35 total blocks, including 60 assisted and five solo.

#### Career Weekend for Tech

Four different upperclassmen wiped out career highs during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Headlining the top performers was sophomore Victoria Hamsher who tallied 16 kills against Chattanooga and earned season bests in consecutive matches with seven and then eight block assists.

Junior Cara Baarendse's 16 digs against Virginia set a new personal mark, while senior Erin Leaser's four service aces also set a new bar. Junior Morgan O'Neill set a new team season high as she got down for 29 digs against Chattanooga.

#### Raising the Baar

Junior middle blocker Cara Baarendse has continued to dominate in her third season at Tech. Baarendse has already earned Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week and Hokie Tournament MVP honors after garnering Preseason All-ACC accolades before the season began.

The Mason, Ohio, native has six double-digit kills matches under her belt already this year and recently tallied her first double-double of the year (13 k, 16 d) against Virginia.

Baarendse leads the team with 128 kills and a .338 hitting percentage.

#### Serving Up Greatness

Senior outside hitter Justine Record has been a staple in the Tech offense this season as she currently leads the team with a 2.73

kills-per-set average, as well as 16 service aces. Her 0.36 aces per set lands her the second-best average in the ACC.

The Redwood City, Calif., native tallied a career-high six aces against High Point earlier in the year and is currently in need of two more aces to up her 144 career total and move into sixth place on Tech's all-time list.

Record not only leads the team with seven double-digit kills and seven double-digs matches, but she is also the only player with more than one double-double this year, as she has racked up six so far.

#### -Sher Thing

Sophomore middle blocker Victoria Hamsher has been a strong force for the Hokies at the net so far this season. She has led the squad in blocks in 10 of the 14 matches and currently leads the team in every blocking category.

Hamsher had a career weekend during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational as she tallied double-digit kills in two of the three matches, including a new career high, 16, against Chattanooga. Hamsher also set a new season high of seven blocks in that match, only to later up the total to eight against UConn. For her efforts she was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week.

The Nazareth, Pa. native stands at second in the ACC with 1.36 bps.

#### Leaser on the Loose

Senior setter Erin Leaser has been an important part of the Tech offense over the past three seasons and her final one is no exception. Leaser recently moved into third place on Tech's all-time career assists list against Virginia in the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational as she easily surpasses the seven assists she needed and upped her three-year total to 4,065 by tournament's end. Leaser leads the squad with 362 assists and her 7.24

average places her at ninth about ACC members. The Allentown, Pa., native also ranks second on the team with 14 service aces and is tied for third with 86 digs.

### Big Weekend for Wiker

Redshirt junior Jennifer Wiker tallied double-digit kills twice in the same weekend for the first time this season during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Wiker threw down 10 against Virginia in the opening match before going for 11 against UConn. The Charlotte, N.C., native just missed against Chattanooga as she tallied nine, while also posting four blocks.

Wiker, who has already earned a degree in Finance and is currently working towards her MBA, is tied for third on the squad with 105 kills while also ranking fourth with 27 blocks.

### Setting Up Early Success

Freshman Jordan Fish made the first start of her career against Virginia and rose to the occasion. While splitting time with senior setter Erin Leaser, Fish tallied a career-high 24 assists in the match, along with six digs. Fish nearly matched that total the following night against UConn when she tossed up 21 helpers.

The North Branch, Mich., native also had a successful serving weekend as she racked up seven aces. Her 0.35 per set average ties her for third in the league.

### Top Tier in Tournaments

The Hokies recently ended a 23-match home tournament winning streak last weekend. The streak dated back to the 2005 season. Tech extended the streak early this year as it swept the competition at the Hokie Tournament and seemed to keep things rolling during the Hokie Invite as it swept American in its first match and later Seton Hall the following day. The final match of the tournament did the Hokies in, though, as they fell 3-1 to a talented Tennessee team.

### Historic Happenings

The Hokies made history last season when they earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament after an impressive regular season. Tech also earned its first tournament victory when it defeated Delaware, 3-0, in the opening round. En route to the post season, the Hokies wrapped up the regular season with the 600th win in program history and the 26th win over in-state rival Virginia, 3-2.

Midway through conference play, Tech claimed its first win over a ranked opponent as it defeated then-No.25 Florida State, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum.

**Just Virginia Tech, Please** - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.



**What is a Hokie, Anyway?** - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.
