After turning things around at Maryland with a come-from-behind, five-set win on Sunday, the Hokies will look to carry that momentum into this weekend as they return home to host Wake Forest and Duke at Cassell Coliseum. Both of Tech's opponents this weekend will begin their weekend in Blacksburg before traveling to Charlottesville to take on Virginia the following day.

Series Info

L, 0-3

Wake Forest - Tech holds the 24-10 series advantage over the Demon Deacons, while also boasting an impressive 13-1 record at Cassell Coliseum. The two teams split the series last season, as the Hokies swept Wake at home and fell in Winston-Salem, 3-1.

The Hokies and Deacons first met in 1977 in Richmond, Va., as Tech took a 2-0 win to open the series. Head Coach Chris Riley is 6-4 all-time against Wake, while the Hokies are 8-6 since the two teams became conference foes in 2004.

Duke- The Blue Devils have had Tech's number since the two teams first met in 1979, Tech's first year as a varsity program. Duke took the first match of the series, 3-0 in Knoxville, Tenn., and currently holds the 22-2 all-time edge. Both of the Hokies' wins have come at home, including a 3-1 victory last season.

Since joining the ACC, Duke boasts a 12-2 record against Tech.

Hokies All-Access

The Hokies will have numerous matches broadcast with live audio and video this season, including this Thursday's match against Wake Forest. PLAYER SPOTLIGHT



Jennifer Wiker • RS-Junior • Outside Hitter • Charlotte, N.C.

Redshirt junior Jennifer Wiker had an impressive outing against Maryland on Sunday as she tallied a new season high with 16 kills, while also hitting at a season-best .441 clip in the five-set victory for the Hokies. Wiker was a big part of the momentum shift for the Hokies as she also added two solo blocks on back-to-back rallies and assisted on another block in the match.

Days before, Wiker tallied a new season high at the net when she assisted on four blocks at Boston College.

Scouting Report

Wake Forest - The Deacons enter Thursday's match with a 4-10 overall record and a 1-4 record in conferece play. Like the Hokies, Wake kicked off ACC action with a victory as it knocked off Duke, 3-1, during the Black & Gold Challenge in Winson-Salem. The Deacons also topped High Point, 3-0, that weekend and have since been on a fivematch skid, including four ACC matches.

Kadija Fornah has paced Wake's offense with 158 kills (3.22/s), while Carlin Salmon has thrown down a second-best 128 kills and gotten up for a team-leading 55 blocks (1.12/s). Three Deacons have tallied 100-plus digs, with Dani Thompson leading the way with 174, while Danae Rosendall has been the team's primary setter and leads the way with 431 assists.

Duke - The Blue Devils began the season as the ACC favorite and the only conference team to be ranked in the top 25, but after beginning the season 4-0 they have since struggled. Duke spent last weekend in Florida and fell to both the Seminoles and Hurricanes as they fell to 8-6 overall, 2-3 in league play.

Duke has five players with 100-plus digs as Sophia Dunworth leads the way with 140 (2.69/s) so far this season. Kellie Catanach has tallied 571 assists as the squad's primary setter. Five different players have also racked up double-digit digs this year and Ali McCurdy's 280 (5.28/s) pace the team.

Among the Best

Tech currently ranks mong the nation's and ACC's best in blocks and service aces. As a team, the Hokies hold the No. 21 spot in the nation as they average 2.70 blocks per set. The average is also good for second among league teams. Sophomore middle blocker Victoria Hamsher is a big part of

Tech's impressive numbers as she is the only individual to represent Tech nationally, ranking 24th in the nation with a 1.33 blocks per set average.

Tech also currently sits at first among conference teams as it averages 1.31 aces per set on the season.

Top Competition

With the Duke Blue Devils coming to town this weekend, the Hokies will have their work cut out for them. As a squad, Duke ranks 39th nationally as it averages 12.89 assists per set, and 50th with a 16.47 digs per set average.

Two Blue Devils also rank among some of the best in the country as the league digs leader, Ali McCurdy's 5.82 digs per set average is also good for 17th nationally. Kellie Catanach boasts the 35th spot in the nation as she averages 10.98 assists per set.

Block Party

The Hokies have made their presencce at the net known this season. Tech got up for 30 total blocks, six solo and 48 assisted during the Hokie Invite and bettered that total during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational with 35 total blocks, including 60 assisted and five solo.

Terps Turnaround

In true dramatic fashion, the Hokies made a huge turnaround last weekend as they came from behind to top Maryland 3-2 on the road. The victory was Tech's first in the three matches and the first road win of the season for the squad.

Numerous players put up season and career-best numbers in the match as five different Hokies set new highs. As a team, Tech set new season highs in kills (62), assists (56) and digs (87).

Raising the Baar

The ever-improving but already dominant Cara Baarendse has been a staple in Tech's lineup over the past three seasons and has yet to let her guard down. The honorable mention All-American and Preseason All-ACC honoree has ranked in the top 10 among conference members in hitting percentage all season, while also leading the team in eight matches so far.

The Mason, Ohio, native was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week as well as Hokie Tournament MVP in the same week earlier this season and recently set new season highs with 14 kills and 16 digs at Maryland. She has tallied two doubledoubles this season and seven double-digit kills matches.

Serving Up Greatness

Senior outside hitter Justine Record has had her way with Tech's all-time record books this season as she has rapidly climbed the ranks and will continue to do so this weekend. She has tallied 17 service aces this season and leads the squad with six doubledoubles.

The Redwood City, Calif., native tallied a career-high six aces against High Point earlier in the year and is currently in need of one more ace to up her 145 career total and move into sixth place on Tech's all-time list.

Record set a new career high against Maryland as she scooped up 24 digs in the victory, making it her eighth match with double-digit digs this season.

-Sher Thing

Sophomore middle blocker Victoria Hamsher has spearheaded Tech's net game this season as she leads the team with 77 total blocks. Her 1.33 per set average makes her the only player on the team to rank nationally in any category and puts her at

The Nazareth, Pa. native has also been a force on offense, as she had a career weekend during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. She tallied double-digit kills in two of the three matches, including a new career high, 16, against Chattanooga. Hamsher also set a new season high of seven blocks in that match, only to later up the total to eight against UConn. For her efforts she was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week.

Leaser on the Loose

Senior setter Erin Leaser has been an important part of the Tech offense over the past three seasons, and her final one is no exception. Leaser recently moved into third place on Tech's all-time career assists list against Virginia in the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational as she easily surpassed the seven assists she needed and upped her three-year total to 4,065 by tournament's end. Leaser leads the squad with 419 assists and her 7.22 average places her at ninth about ACC members.

The Allentown, Pa., native is also tied for team lead with 17 service aces this year.

Big Weekend for Wiker

Redshirt junior Jennifer Wiker tallied double-digit kills twice in the same weekend for the first time this season during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Wiker threw down 10 against Virginia in the opening match before going for 11 against UConn. The Charlotte, N.C., native just missed against Chattanooga as she tallied nine, while also posting four blocks.

Wiker, who has already earned a degree in Finanace and is currently working towards her MBA, recently dominated on the offensive end as she led the team in its come-from-behind win over Maryland. She threw down a season-best 16 kills, hitting at a season-high .441 clip.

Last Line of Defense

Junior libero Morgan O'Neill has been outstanding for the Hokies this season after making the move to libero this season. O'Neill set a new career high earlier in the year against Chattanooga when she scooped up 29 digs, and matched the total in Tech's recent win over Maryland last weekend.

The Atherton, Calif., native averages 4.11 digs per set, good for eighth in the conference, and has led the Hokies in digs in all but four matches this season.

Freshman Kathryn Caine has been a staple in Tech's starting lineup for much of this season and leads all other newcomers with seven starts so far. The McLean, Va., native recently wiped out all of her previous career highs when she threw down seven kills and hit at a season-best .429 clip. Her four block assists in the match also tied a previous high set earlier in the year.

Setting Up Early Success

Freshman Jordan Fish made the first start of her career against Virginia and rose to the occassion. While splitting time with senior setter Erin Leaser, Fish tallied a career-high 24 assists in the match, along with six digs. Fish nearly matched that total the following night against UConn when she tossed up 21 helpers.



Career Weekend for Tech

Four different upperclassmen wiped out career highs during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Headlining the top performers was sophomore Victoria Hamsher who tallied 16 kills against Chattanooga and earned season bests in consecutive matches with seven and then eight block assists.

Junior Cara Baarendse's 16 digs against Virginia set a new personal mark, while senior Erin Leaser's four service aces also set a new bar. Junior Morgan O'Neill set a new team season high as she got down for 29 digs against Chattanooga.

Top Tier in Tournaments

The Hokies recently ended a 23-match home tournament winning streak last weekend. The streak dated back to the 2005 season. Tech extended the streak early this year as it swept the competition at the Hokie Tournament and seemed to keep things rolling during the Hokie Invite as it swept American in its first match and later Seton Hall the following day. The final match of the tournament did the Hokies in, though, as they fell 3-1 to a talented Tennessee team.

Historic Happenings

The Hokies made history last season when they earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament after an impressive regular season. Tech also earned its first tournament victory when it defeated Delaware, 3-0, in the opening round. En route to the post season, the Hokies wrapped up the regular season with the 600th win in program history and the 26th win over instate rival Virginia, 3-2.

Midway through conference play, Tech claimed its first win over a ranked opponent as it defeated then-No.25 Florida State, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum.

Just Virginia Tech, Please - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.



What is a Hokie, Anyway? - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.
