The Hokies are back on the road this week after returning home from their first conference road trip of the year a week ago. Tech went 1-1 last week and made it three straight five-set matches as it topped Wake Forest before falling to Duke. Tech has gone 2-1 through that five-set stint. Despite falling to the Blue Devils last week, numerous Hokies have set new season highs in the past three matches and Tech will look to bring that high level of play on the road this week.

#### **Series Info**

*North Carolina* - The Tar Heels boast a 16-4 all-time record against Tech, including a 10-1 record in Chapel Hill. The two teams first met in 1979, Tech's first year at the varsity level, as the Heels took a 2-0 win. The Hokies' last win over Carolina came in 2009, the last time Tech hosted the Heels. This will be the Hokies' third straight trip to Chapel Hill as the two teams only met once last season.

*NC State* - Tech holds the 15-8 series edge against the Wolfpack, as well as a 7-3 advantage on the road. Since joining the ACC in 2004, the Hokies have never lost to NC State and boast a 13-0 record against the Wolfpack. The two teams only met once during the 2010 season as the Hokies traveled to Raleigh for the match up. Though NC State took the series opener, 2-0 in 1979, the Hokies have not dropped a single set to the Wolfpack in the last four meetings.

## PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

### Cara Baarendse • Junior • Middle Blocker • Mason, Ohio

Junior Cara Baarendse has been a consistent leader in Tech's offense this season. She has taken things to another level in the past three matches as she has set new career highs in kills in each of the most recent outings. After throwing down 14 kills at Maryland, Baarendse tallied 15 in Tech's five-set win over Wake Forest. The very next day, she notched a team-leading 16 kills against Duke.

Baarendse paces the squad with nine double-digit kills matches so far this season, while also leading the team in hitting percentage in eight of the 18 matches.

#### Scouting Report

**North Carolina** - The Tar Heels enter the Thursday match at 14-4 on the season, recently falling to Florida State, 3-1, at home before topping Miami, 3-2. The loss to the Seminoles is Carolina's only conference loss this season and it snapped a seven-match winning streak.

Emily McGee, this week's ACC Player of the Week, leads the team's offense with 257 kills (4.08/s). Erica Behm has taken care of the setting duties for the Heels and averages 7.86 per set, while Chaniel Nelson has dominated the net with 62 total blocks (1.02/s) on the year.

**NC State** - The Wolfpack began the year with a loss but took off running afterwards, winning 13 straight matches. After ending its streak at Maryland, NC State has stumbled a bit and sits at 14-6 heading into the weekend. NC State is currently in the midst of a four-match losing streak, all of which have been five-set decisions.

Margaret Salata has been a huge part of the Wolfpack's success this season as she leads the team with 210 kills (2.96/s) and 88 blocks (1.24/s), including 14 solo blocks. Megan Cyr has handled the setting duties for NC State and tallied 783 assists so far this season (10.58/s), while also leading the team with a .428 hitting percentage. Nicole Glass, who earned ACC Freshman of the Week honors this week, leads the team with 19 service aces.

#### Among the Best

Tech currently ranks among the nation's and ACC's best in blocks and service aces. As a team, the Hokies hold the No. 24 spot in the nation as they average 2.63 blocks per set. The average is also good for third among league teams. Sophomore middle blocker Victoria Hamsher is a big part of

Tech's impressive numbers as she is the only individual to represent Tech nationally, ranking 32nd in the nation with a 1.28 blocks per set average.

Tech also currently sits at second among conference teams as it averages 1.29 aces per set on the season.

#### Top Competition

The Tar Heels are statistically one of the top teams in the ACC and the nation. Carolina ranks second and third nationally with 13.89 a/s and 14.84 k/s, respectively. The Heels also hold the No. 15 spot as they collectively hit at a .267 clip on the season. Carolina also leads the ACC in assists and kills.

Individually, all three teams in action have one representative on the national stage. Besides Victoria Hamsher ranking 32nd in blocks, Carolina's Emily McGee ranks 48th with 4.06 kills per set and NC State's Maragret Salata holds the No. 42 spot with 1.24 blocks per set.

#### Block Party

The Hokies have made their presence at the net known this season. Tech got up for 30 total blocks, six solo and 48 assisted during the Hokie Invite and bettered that total during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational with 35 total blocks, including 60 assisted and five solo.

#### Terps Turnaround

In true dramatic fashion, the Hokies made a huge turnaround when they came from behind to top Maryland 3-2 on the road. The victory was Tech's first in the three matches and the first road win of the season for the squad.

Numerous players put up season and career-best numbers in the match as five different Hokies set new highs. As a team,

Tech set new season highs, to date, in kills (62), assists (56) and digs (87).

The Hokies kept things rolling as they hosted Wake Forest the very next match and rallied for a 3-2 win over the Deacons. Two players tallied 20-plus digs for the second-straight match while Justine Record and Erin Leaser also recorded double-doubles. As a team, Tech set new kills (68) and assists (63) marks.

#### Raising the Baar

The ever-improving but already dominant Cara Baarendse has been a staple in Tech's lineup over the past three seasons and has yet to let her guard down. The honorable mention All-American and Preseason All-ACC honoree has ranked in the top 10 among conference members in hitting percentage all season, while also leading the team in eight matches so far.

The Mason, Ohio, native was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week as well as Hokie Tournament MVP in the same week earlier this season. Most recently Baarendse has been lights-out offensively as she has upped her previous season high in kills in each of the last three matches. After throwing down 14 at Maryland, Baarendse tallied 15 against Wake Forest and later 16 against Duke.

#### Serving Up Greatness

Senior outside hitter Justine Record has had her way with Tech's all-time record books this season as she has rapidly climbed the ranks. She has tallied 22 service aces this season and leads the squad with seven double-doubles.

The Redwood City, Calif., native tallied a career-high six aces against High Point earlier in the year and recently took sole possession of sixth place on the all-time list

against Wake Forest.

Record set a new career high against Maryland as she scooped up 24 digs in the victory, making it her eighth match with double-digit digs this season.

Record continued the momentum against Wake Forest, with a new season-high 19 kills and 20-plus digs for the second straight match.

### -Sher Thing

Sophomore middle blocker Victoria Hamsher has spearheaded Tech's net game this season as she leads the team with 87 total blocks. Her 1.28 per set average makes her the only player on the team to rank nationally in any category and puts her at third among league members

The Nazareth, Pa. native has also been a force on offense, as she had a career weekend during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. She tallied double-digit kills in two of the three matches, including a new career high, 16, against Chattanooga. Hamsher also set a new season high of seven blocks in that match, only to later up the total to eight against UConn. For her efforts she was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week.

### Leaser on the Loose

Senior setter Erin Leaser has been an important part of the Tech offense over the past three seasons, and her final one is no exception. Leaser recently moved into third place on Tech's all-time career assists list against Virginia in the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational as she easily surpassed the seven assists she needed and upped her three-year total to 4,065 by tournament's end. Leaser leads the squad with 475 assists and her 6.99 average places her at ninth about ACC members.

The Allentown, Pa., native notched her second double-double of the season against Wake Forest when she tossed up a whopping 34 assists and scooped up 11 digs. Her assists total helped Tech set a new team season high of 63 in the Wake match.

### Big Weekend for Wiker

Redshirt junior Jennifer Wiker tallied double-digit kills twice in the same weekend for the first time this season during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Wiker threw down 10 against Virginia in the opening match before going for 11 against UConn. The Charlotte, N.C., native just missed against Chattanooga as she tallied nine, while also posting four blocks.

Wiker, who has already earned a degree in Finance and is currently working towards her MBA, recently dominated on the offensive end as she led the team in its come-from-behind win over Maryland. She threw down a season-best 16 kills, hitting at a season-high .441 clip.

### Last Line of Defense

Junior libero Morgan O'Neill has been outstanding for the Hokies after making the move to libero this season. O'Neill set a new career high earlier in the year against Chattanooga when she scooped up 29 digs, and matched the total in Tech's recent win over Maryland. O'Neill made it back-to-back 20-plus digs matches as she scooped up 25 against Wake Forest.

The Atherton, Calif., native averages 4.09 digs per set, good for ninth in the conference, and has led the Hokies in digs in all but four matches this season, including every ACC match.

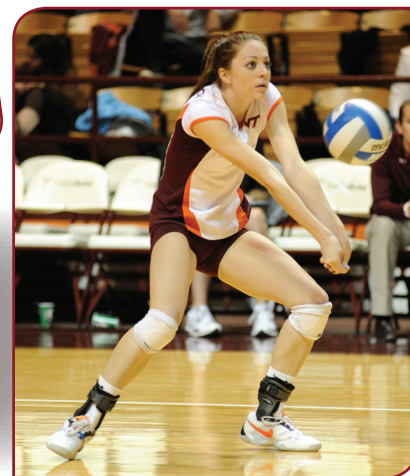

## Fresh Start

Freshman Kathryn Caine has been a staple in Tech's starting lineup for much of this season and leads all other newcomers with nine starts so far. The McLean, Va., native recently wiped out all of her previous career highs when she threw down seven kills and hit at a season-best .429 clip. Caine upped her single-match numbers against Wake Forest as she tallied eight kills and got up for five blocks.

## Setting Up Early Success

Freshman Jordan Fish made the first start of her career against Virginia and rose to the occasion. While splitting time with senior setter Erin Leaser, Fish tallied a career-high 24 assists in the match, along with six digs. Fish nearly matched that total the following night against UConn when she tossed up 21 helpers.

Fish was recently part of a new team season high as her 23 assists against Wake Forest helped the Hokies tally 63 total assists in the match.

## Career Weekend for Tech

Four different upperclassmen wiped out career highs during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Headlining the top performers was sophomore Victoria Hamsher who tallied 16 kills against Chattanooga and earned season bests in consecutive matches with seven and then eight block assists.

Junior Cara Baarendse's 16 digs against Virginia set a new personal mark, while senior Erin Leaser's four service aces also set a new bar. Junior Morgan O'Neill set a new team season high as she got down for 29 digs against Chattanooga.

## Top Tier in Tournaments

The Hokies recently ended a 23-match home tournament winning streak last weekend. The streak dated back to the 2005 season. Tech extended the streak early this year as it swept the competition at the Hokie Tournament and seemed to keep things rolling during the Hokie Invite as it swept American in its first match and later Seton Hall the following day. The final match of the tournament did the Hokies in, though, as they fell 3-1 to a talented Tennessee team.

## Historic Happenings

The Hokies made history last season when they earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament after an impressive regular season. Tech also earned its first tournament victory when it defeated Delaware, 3-0, in the opening round. En route to the post season, the Hokies wrapped up the regular season with the 600th win in program history and the 26th win over in-state rival Virginia, 3-2.

Midway through conference play, Tech claimed its first win over a ranked opponent as it defeated then-No.25 Florida State, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum.

**Just Virginia Tech, Please** - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.



**What is a Hokie, Anyway?** - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.
