The Hokies return home this weekend for the first time in over two weeks. Tech will look to put an end to the four-match losing streak they are in the middle of right now, as all three teams in action in Blacksburg this weekend are looking to end losing streaks. The Hokies are also looking for revenge on the Eagles after being swept on the road earlier in the season, while Tech will aim for the sweep against Maryland.

Both matches this weekend will be streamed live on Hokies All-Access, as well as Tech's final two home matches next weekend.

Series Info

Maryland - The Terrapins hold a 9-7 series edge against Tech, but Tech boasts a 4-2 record against Maryland in Cassell. The Hokies claimed the most recent meeting at College Park, 3-2, this season. The two teams first met in 1992 when the Terps took a 3-0 win to kick off the series. The pair faced off three times before becoming conference foes in 2004.

Boston College - Tech boasts a 9-6 series advantage against the Eagles. The two teams first met in 2001 and have only ever met as conference foes in the BIG EAST and ACC. The Hokies claimed victory in the first-ever meeting, 3-0, and swept Boston College in both meetings in the 2010 season. Tech is 5-2 against the Eagles in Cassell.

First Time Around

The Hokies hit a turning point in the season last time they faced this pair of teams. In search of its first conference road win of the season, Tech continued to struggle at Boston College as it fell 3-0 for the third straight conference match. In need of a change and a spark, the Hokies traveled to Maryland days later and found that turning point. Tech took the Terrapins to five sets and not only claimed its first five-set victory but also its first conference win in three matches.

As numerous Hokies set new career and season highs in the match at Maryland, the win gave the Hokies the spark they needed moving forward through conference play.

PLAYER SPOTLIGHT

Erin Leaser • Senior • Setter • Allentown, Pa.

Senior Erin Leaser returned to her dominant ways over the weekend as she put together arguably her best back-to-back matches of the season. Leaser kicked off the weekend with a near-career-high 61 assists at Wake Forest, while also setting a new season high with six kills.

The very next night, Leaser continued to roll as she tossed up an impressive 42 assists at Duke and also notched her third double-double of the season as she added another career high. Her 17 digs against the Blue Devils and six kills set new marks for the Allentown, Pa., native.

Scouting Report

Maryland - The Terrapins are in the midst of an 11-match losing streak that began with a 3-2 loss to the Hokies in the two teams' first meeting earlier this season. Sitting at 9-18 on the year and 3-12 in the ACC, Maryland most recently fell at home to Clemson and Georgia Tech by 3-1 scores.

Mary Cushman leads the Terps' offense with 291 kills on the year (2.91/s), while setter Remy McBain's .306 hitting percentage and 1,004 assists (9.56/s) so far this year also pace the squad. Sarah Harper's 480 digs and 4.57 per-set average rank her fourth among conference members. Caitlin Adams leads the net game with 95 blocks (0.92/s)

Boston College - The Eagles will stop in Charlottesville to face Virginia before arriving in Balcksburg on Saturday. They enter the weekend of play at 7-19 overall and 3-12 in ACC action. Boston College's losing streak was extended to six matches last weekend as it dropped matches against Georgia Tech and Clemson, both by 3-1 outcomes.

Tsvetelina Dureva leads the BC offense with 262 kills (3.01/s), and Kellie Barnum paces the team with 532 assists (7.60/s). Brennan Clark, who ranks second in the ACC with a 4.97 digs per set, has scooped up 447 total digs this season. Melissa McTighe has gotten up for 82 blocks on the year, good for a 0.91 average.

Among the Best

Tech currently ranks among the nation's and ACC's best in blocks and service aces. As a team, the Hokies hold the No. 35 spot in the nation as they average 2.56 blocks per set. The average is also good for third among league teams. Sophomore middle blocker Victoria Hamsher is a big part of Tech's impressive numbers as she is the

only individual to represent Tech nationally, ranking 38th in the nation with a 1.25 blocks per-set average.

Tech also currently sits at second among conference teams as it averages 1.24 aces per set on the season.

Party For Five

The Hokies have been a part of eight five-set matches this season, seven of those coming in conference play. They have only dropped three five-set matches this season, against Ohio, Duke and at Wake Forest.

Owning October

As a team, Tech went 5-4 through the month of October and has set a new team season high in every statistical category, except hitting percentage and aces.

Tech's starting lineup has also prospered through the fall month as Morgan O'Neill has grabbed double-digit digs in all seven matches, including three 20-plus outings. Victoria Hamsher has tallied at least four blocks in each match, while Erin Leaser has tossed up 21-plus assists six times throughout October. Four of Jennifer Wiker's double-digit kills matches have come in October's seven matches, while Kathryn Caine has solidified her spot in the starting lineup and has not missed a set or a start last month. Justine Record's three 20-plus dig outings have all happened last month.

Terps Turnaround

In true dramatic fashion, the Hokies made a huge turnaround when they came from behind to top Maryland 3-2 on the road. The victory was Tech's first in three matches and the first road win of the season for the squad.

Numerous players put up season and career-best numbers in the match as five

different Hokies set new highs. As a team, Tech set new season highs, to date, in kills, assists and digs.

The Hokies kept things rolling as they hosted Wake Forest the very next match and rallied for a 3-2 win over the Deacons. Two players tallied 20-plus digs for the second-straight match while Justine Record and Erin Leaser recorded double-doubles. As a team, Tech set new kills (68) and assists (63) marks.

Raising the Baar

Junior middle blocker Cara Baarendse has been red hot offensively as she has led the squad in kills in six of the last nine outings. After setting a new career high in kills against Maryland, the Mason, Ohio, native has reset that mark three other times, including 17 against Georgia Tech.

Baarendse, who was named to the Preseason All-ACC team, has tallied a team-best 16 double-digit kills matches, seven of those coming in the most recent matches. For her performance during the Hokie Tournament earlier in the season, Baarendse earned Tournament MVP and Virginia Tech Hardees Star of the Week honors.

Serving Up Greatness

Senior outside hitter Justine Record is currently in fourth place on Tech's all-time career aces list with 164 to date. Record matched her previous career high earlier in the year with six aces against High Point and came up big for the Hokies recently against Clemson as she started the fifth set off with two consecutive aces and nearly had a third as she forced an attacking error.

The Redwood City, Calif., native leads the team with nine double-doubles on the year after tallying two more against Clemson and Georgia Tech.

Sophomore middle blocker Victoria Hamsher has spearheaded Tech's net game this season as she leads the team with 126 total blocks. Her 1.25 per-set average makes her the only player on the team to rank nationally in any category and puts her at fifth among league members

The Nazareth, Pa., native tallied double-digit kills in two of the three matches during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational, including a new career high, 16, against Chattanooga. Hamsher also set a new season-high with seven blocks in that match, only to later up the total to eight against UConn. For her efforts, she was named Virginia Tech Hardees Star of the Week.

Hamsher recently tied her career high at No. 19 Florida State when she got up for 10 blocks for the second time in her career.

Leaser on the Loose

Senior setter Erin Leaser has been Tech's primary setter over the past three seasons and currently sits in third place in Tech's all-time record books with 4,452 assists to date.

Though she has been splitting the setting duties for much of the season, the Allentown, Pa., native has remained the starter and regained her primary duties over the weekend. Leaser did not disappoint as she tossed up a near-career-high 61 assists at Wake Forest, also setting a new team season high (69) nearly single handedly. The following evening, Leaser tallied 42 helpers at Duke.

Big Weekend for Wiker

Redshirt-junior Jennifer Wiker gave Tech an offensive boost during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational in the beginning of the season when she threw down 10 kills against UVa and 11 versus UConn. Wiker made it back-to-back double-digit kills outings for the first time this season when she tallied a season-high 16 kills at Maryland and 14 against Wake Forest.

Wiker, who has already earned a degree in finance and is currently working towards her MBA, went back-to-back again with 10 kills against Georgia Tech and Clemson.

Stringing together another outstanding weekend, Wiker was Tech's go-to offensively at Wake Forest and Duke last week. Wiker wiped out her previous season and career-high as she threw down 29 kills at Wake, topping her previous season high the following evening as well with 17 kills at Duke.

Last Line of Defense

Junior Morgan O'Neill has been outstanding for the Hokies after making the move to libero this season. O'Neill set a new career high earlier in the year against Chattanooga when she scooped up 29 digs, and matched the total in Tech's win over Maryland. O'Neill made back-to-back 20-plus digs matches as she scooped up 25 against Wake Forest. She recently nearly matched her career high for a third time this season when she recorded 28 digs against Clemson.

The Atherton, Calif., native averages 3.94 digs per set, good for 10th in the conference.

Fresh Start

Freshman Kathryn Caine has been a staple in Tech's starting lineup for much of this season and leads all other newcomers with 17 starts so far. The McLean, Va., native wiped out all of her previous career highs when she threw down seven kills and hit at a season-best .429 clip at Maryland. Caine upped her single-

match numbers against Wake Forest as she tallied eight kills and got up for five blocks.

Digs Demon

Making her debut at libero in the starting lineup last weekend, sophomore Laura Misiewicz did not disappoint. Against Wake Forest in the weekend opener on Friday, Misiewicz wiped out her old career high after scooping up 29 digs against the Demon Deacons. The very next night, the Herndon, Va., native made it back-to-back double-digit digs outings as she notched 16 at Duke.

Setting Up Early Success

Freshman Jordan Fish made the first start of her career against Virginia and rose to the occasion. While splitting time with senior setter Erin Leaser, Fish tallied a career-high 24 assists in the match, along with six digs. Fish nearly matched that total the following night against UConn when she tossed up 21 helpers.

Fish was part of a then-team season high as her 23 assists against Wake Forest helped the Hokies tally 63 total assists in the match. She recently notched the first double-double of her career as she tallied 23 assists and 12 digs against Clemson for her third straight 20-plus assist match.

Career Weekend for Tech

Four different upperclassmen wiped out career highs during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Headlining the top performers was sophomore Victoria Hamsher who tallied 16 kills against Chattanooga and earned season bests in consecutive matches with seven and then eight block assists.

Junior Cara Baarendse's 16 digs against Virginia set a new personal mark, while senior Erin Leaser's four service aces also set a new bar. Junior Morgan O'Neill set a new team season high as she got down for 29 digs against Chattanooga.

Top Tier in Tournaments

The Hokies ended a 23-match home tournament winning streak this season. The streak dated back to the 2005 season. Tech extended the streak earlier this year as it swept the competition at the Hokie Tournament and seemed to keep things rolling during the Hokie Invite as it swept American in its first match and later Seton Hall the following day. The final match of the tournament did the Hokies in, though, as they fell 3-1 to a talented Tennessee team.

Historic Happenings

The Hokies made history last season when they earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament after an impressive regular season. Tech also earned its first tournament victory when it defeated Delaware, 3-0, in the opening round. En route to the post season, the Hokies wrapped up the regular season with the 600th win in program history and the 26th win over in-state rival Virginia, 3-2.

Midway through conference play, Tech claimed its first win over a ranked opponent as it defeated then-No. 25 Florida State, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum.

Just Virginia Tech, Please - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.



What is a Hokie, Anyway? - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.
