Tech remains at home this weekend to close out 2011 play at Cassell. The Hokies will host North Carolina before welcoming NC State for Senior Night. Tech will honor the team's five seniors, Kirsty Blue, Kirsten Higareda, Erin Leaser, Justine Record and Kelsey Maloney prior to Saturday's match.

Competition will be tough this weekend as all three teams had successful weekends a week ago, each earning at least one sweep through two straight wins after at least two losses the week before that. Tech is the only team in the trio to have swept both matches last weekend.

# Series Info

*North Carolina* - The Tar Heels boast a 17-4 all-time record against Tech, including a 5-3 advantage on Tech's home court. The two teams first met in 1979, as the Heels took a 2-0 win. The Hokies' last win over Carolina came in 2009, the last time Tech hosted the Heels. The Hokies made their third straight trip to Chapel Hill earlier this year as the two teams only met once last season. The Heels claimed a 3-0 win at home midway through this season.

*NC State* - Tech holds the 16-8 series edge against the Wolfpack, as well as aa commanding 7-1 lead in Blacksburg. Since joining the ACC in 2004, the Hokies have never lost to NC State and boast a 14-0 record against the Wolfpack. The two teams only met once during the 2010 season as the Hokies traveled to Raleigh for the match up. Though NC State took the series opener, 2-0 in 1979, the Hokies won the last match in Raleigh, 3-2.

# **First Time Around**

When Tech traveled to North Carolina earlier in the season it split the weekend in the Tar Heel State, falling in Chapel Hill but later bouncing back with a five-set win at NC State. The victory in Raleigh sparked a three-match winning streak for the Hokies, all of which came in five-set battles. Cara Baarendse led the offense with 15 kills against the Wolfpack and also kicked off an eightmatch double-digit kills streak in the outing.

# **PLAYER SPOTLIGHT**



# Jennifer Wiker • R-Junior • Outside Hitter • Charlotte, N.C.

Jennifer Wiker has been red hot for the Hokies offensively as of late. She has paced the team in kills over the past four matches, stringing together a pair of outstanding weekends in the past two weeks. Wiker led the way for the Hokies against Maryland with 16 kills, hitting at a .364 clip, to help Tech open the weekend with a sweep and break a four-match skid.

On Saturday evening Wiker was back at it as the Hokies earned back-to-back sweeps for the first time in conference play, this time against Boston College. Wiker threw down nine kills and hit at a .375 clip, adding a season-high three solo blocks.

### **Scouting Report**

*North Carolina* -North Carolina will arrive in Blacksburg with a 21-7 overall record, while sitting 13-4 in ACC action. After dropping two matches in Florida the Tar Heels bounced back last weekend with home wins over Georgia Tech and Clemson.

Emily McGee leads the way for North Carolina with 388 kills (4.00/s) on the year, while Erica Behm's 754 assists are good for a 8.47 per-set average. Kaylie Gibson leads the defense with 445 digs (4.59/s), and Chaniel Nelson's 94 blocks (0.99/s) are good for team lead in the category.

*NC State* - The Wolfpack will head to Charlottesville to take on Virginia before arriving in Blacksburg on Saturday evening. NC State enters the weekend at 19-11 on the year and 7-10 in conference play. Last weekend the Wolfpack also grabbed two home wins over Clemson and Georgia Tech, going five with the Tigers before sweeping the Yellow Jackets.

Margaret Salata leads the offense as well as the net game for the Wolfpack, averaging 3.18 kills pers set (343) and 1.34 blocks per set (145) so far this year. Megan Cyr has handled the setting duties for NC State and has tossed up 1,160 assists (10.45/s), while Kelly Wood has led the defense with 460 digs (4.14/s).

#### Among the Best

Tech currently ranks among the nation's and ACC's best in blocks and service aces. As a team, the Hokies hold the No. 35 spot in the nation as they average 2.57 blocks per set. The average is also good for third among league teams. Sophomore middle blocker Victoria Hamsher is a big part of Tech's impressive numbers as she is one of just two players to represent Tech nationally, ranking 40th in the nation with a 1.22 blocks per-set average. Senior Justine Record also ranks nationally as her 0.44 aces per set is good for 25th in the country.

Tech also currently leads all conference teams as it averages 1.24 aces per set on the season.

## **Top Competition**

Tech welcomes some top competition to Blacksbug this weekend as both visiting teams are represented among the league and nation's best. Entering the week of play, North Carolina ranks third in the country with 14.04 assists per set, as well as fifth with 14.98 kills per set. The Tar Heels are hitting at a .258 clip on the year, which is good for 24th in the nation. Among conference teams, the Tar Heels lead the ACC in assists and rank second in kills. Representing the Heels individually is Emily McGee, whose 3.99 kills per set average ranks her 48th nationally.

NC State is averaging 2.57 blocks per set entering the week, which is good for 36th nationally. Margaret Salata ranks 23rd in the nation with 1.34 blocks per set, while also sitting at 35th as she hits at a .359 clip on the season.

#### Senior Spectacular

The Hokies will honor five seniors this weekend as they play their final matches at Cassell Coliseum. Kirsty Blue, Kirsten Higareda, Erin Leaser, Kelsey Maloney and Justine Record have combined to play in 365 matches, making 264 starts.

The group of five has together thrown down 1,499 kills entering the weekend and also tossed up 4,641 assists. On defense they have tallied 2,462 digs and 410 blocks through their time as Hokies.

#### **Party For Five**

The Hokies have been a part of eight

five-set matches this season, seven of those coming in conference play. They have only dropped three five-set matches this season, against Ohio, Duke and at Wake Forest.

#### **Owning October**

As a team, Tech went 5-4 through the month of October and set a new team season high in every statistical category, except hitting percentage and aces.

Tech's starting lineup also prospered through the fall month as Morgan O'Neill has grabbed double-digit digs in eight of the nine matches, including three 20-plus outings. Victoria Hamsher tallied at least four blocks in each match, while Erin Leaser tossed up 21-plus assists six times throughout October. Four of Jennifer Wiker's double-digit kills matches came in October's nine matches, while Kathryn Caine has solidified her spot in the starting lineup and did not miss a set or a start last month. Justine Record's three 20-plus dig outings all happened last month.

#### **Terps Turnaround**

After an impressive and much needed momentum shift earlier in the season, the Hokies again took to a match against Maryland to make a change late in the year. Snapping a four-match losing streak with a dominate 3-0 sweep of the Terrapins, the Hokies carried that energy into the very next evening to earn back-to-back conference sweeps for the first time this year with a win over Boston College.

Earlier this year, the Hokies made a huge turnaround when they came from behind to top Maryland 3-2 on the road. The victory was Tech's first in three matches and the first road win of the season for the squad.

Numerous players put up season and career-best numbers in the match as five different Hokies set new highs. As a team,

Tech set new season highs, to date, in kills, assists and digs.

The Hokies kept things rolling as they hosted Wake Forest the very next match and rallied for a 3-2 win over the Deacons. Two players tallied 20-plus digs for the second-straight match while Justine Record and Erin Leaser recorded double-doubles. As a team, Tech set new kills (68) and assists (63) marks.

### **Raising the Baar**

Junior middle blocker Cara Baarendse has been a force offensively as she has led the squad in kills on 11occassions this season. After setting a new career high in kills against Maryland, the Mason, Ohio, native has reset that mark three other times, including 17 against Georgia Tech.

Baarendse, who was named to the Preseason All-ACC team, has tallied a team-best 17 double-digit kills matches, eight of those coming in the nine most recent matches. For her performance during the Hokie Tournament earlier in the season, Baarendse earn Tournament MVP and Virginia Tech Hardees Star of the Week honors.

## **Serving Up Greatness**

Senior outside hitter Justine Record is currently in fourth place on Tech's all-time career aces list with 172 to date, while also sitting at seventh all-time with 1,186 career digs. Record matched her previous career high earlier in the year with six aces against High Point and came up big for the Hokies against Clemson as she started the fifth set off with two consecutive aces and nearly had a third as she forced an attacking error. Record nearly matched her career and season high against Boston College as she tallied five aces in the match last weekend.

The Redwood City, Calif., native leads the team with ten double-doubles on the year after tallying two more against Clemson and Georgia Tech and another against Maryland.

#### -Sher Thing

Sophomore middle blocker Victoria Hamsher has spearheaded Tech's net game this season as she leads the team with 131 total blocks. Her 1.22 per-set average makes her one of just two players on the team to rank nationally in any category and puts her at fifth among league members.

The Nazareth, Pa., native tallied double-digit kills in two of the three matches during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational, including a new career high, 16, against Chattanooga. Hamsher also set a new thenseason-high with seven blocks in that match, only to later up the total to eight against UConn. For her efforts, she was named Virginia Tech Hardees Star of the Week.

Hamsher tied her career high at then-No. 19 Florida State when she got up for 10 blocks for the second time in her career.

## Leaser on the Loose

Senior setter Erin Leaser has been Tech's primary setter over the past three seasons and currently sits in third place in Tech's all-time record books with 4,517 assists to date.

Though she split the setting duties for part of the season, the Allentown, Pa., native has remained the starter and recently regained her primary duties. Leaser did not disappoint as she tossed up a near-career-high 61 assists at Wake Forest, also setting a new team season high (69) nearly single handedly. The following evening, Leaser tallied 42 helpers at





### Duke.

Leaser has tallied ten 30-plus assist matches this season and has tossed up at least 28 helpers in each match of November, including 37 aginainst Maryland and 28 against Boston College last weekend.

## **Big Weekend(s) for Wiker**

Redshirt-junior Jennifer Wiker gave Tech an offensive boost during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational in the beginning of the season when she threw down 10 kills against UVa and 11 versus UConn. Wiker made it back-to-back double-digit kills outings for the first time this season when she tallied a then-season-high 16 kills at Maryland and 14 against Wake Forest.

Wiker, who has already earned a degree in finanace and is currently working towards her MBA, went back-to-back again with 10 kills against Georgia Tech and Clemson.

Stringing together another outsanding weekend, Wiker was Tech's go-to offensively at Wake Forest and Duke. Wiker wiped out her previous season and career-high as she threw down 29 kills at Wake, topping her previous season high the following evening as well with 17 kills at Duke.

Keeping things rolling, Wiker continued to pace the offense against Maryland and Boston College last weekend. She threw down 16 while hitting at a .364 clip against the Terps and nine with a .375 hitting percentage versus the Eagles.

## **Digs Demon**

Making her debut at libero in the starting lineup two weeks ago, sophomore Laura Misiewicz did not disappoint. Against Wake Forest in the weekend opener on Friday, Misiewicz wiped out her old career high after scooping up 29 digs against the Demon Deacons. The very next night, the Herndon, Va., native made it back-to-back double-digit digs outings as she notched 16 at Duke.

The Herdon, Va., native kept things rolling last weekend when she scooped up 24 digs in a 3-0 win over Maryland and 14 in another sweep of Boston College.

## **Fresh Start**

Freshman Kathryn Caine has been a staple in Tech's starting lineup for much of this season and leads all other newcomers with 19 starts so far. The McLean, Va., native wiped out all of her previous career highs when she threw down seven kills and hit at a season-best .429 clip at Maryland. Caine upped her single-match numbers against Wake Forest as she tallied eight kills and got up for five blocks.

# Last Line of Defense

Junior Morgan O'Neill has been outstanding for the Hokies after making the move to libero this season. O'Neill set a new career high earlier in the year against Chattanooga when she scooped up 29 digs, and matched the total in Tech's win over Maryland. O'Neill made it back-to-back 20-plus digs matches as she scooped up 25 against Wake Forest. She nearly matched her career high for a third time this season when she recorded 28 digs against Clemson.

The Atherton, Calif., native averages 3.89 digs per set, good for 10th in the conference.

# **Setting Up Early Success**

Freshman Jordan Fish made the first start of her career against Virginia and rose to the occassion. While splitting time with senior setter Erin Leaser, Fish tallied a career-high 24 assists in the match, along with six digs. Fish nearly matched that total the following night against UConn when she tossed up 21 helpers.

Fish was part of a then-team season high as her 23 assists against Wake Forest helped the Hokies tally 63 total assists in the match. She recently notched the first double-double of her career when she tallied 23 assists and 12 digs against Clemson for her third straight 20-plus assist match.

# **Career Weekend for Tech**

Four different upperclassmen wiped out career highs during the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. Headlining the top performers was sophomore Victoria Hamsher who tallied 16 kills against Chattanooga and earned season bests in consecutive matches with seven and then eight block assists.

Junior Cara Baarendse's 16 digs against Virginia set a new personal mark, while senior Erin Leaser's four service aces also set a new bar. Junior Morgan O'Neill set a new team season high as she got down for 29 digs against Chattanooga.

## **Top Tier in Tournaments**

The Hokies ended a 23-match home tournament winning streak this season. The streak dated back to the 2005 season. Tech extended the streak earlier this year as it swept the competition at the Hokie Tournament and seemed to keep things rolling during the Hokie Invite as it swept American in its first match and later Seton Hall the following day. The final match of the tournament did the Hokies in, though, as they fell 3-1 to a talented Tennessee team.

# **Historic Happenings**

The Hokies made history last season when they earned their first-ever bid to the NCAA Tournament after an impressive regular season. Tech also earned its first tournament victory when it defeated Delaware, 3-0, in the opening round. En route to the post season, the Hokies wrapped up the regular season with the 600th win in program history and the 26th win over in-state rival Virginia, 3-2.

Midway through conference play, Tech claimed its first win over a ranked opponent as it defeated then-No. 25 Florida State, 3-2, in Cassell Coliseum.

Just Virginia Tech, Please - While the full name of the school is Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, the school is commonly referred to as "Virginia Tech". Founded in 1872 as Virginia Agriculture and Mechanical College, the university changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1896. Fans of the athletic department, as well as media covering the Hokies, shortened the name to VPI, but it eventually became Virginia Tech. The "State University" was added to bring the official title to what it is today. Those covering Hokie athletics are asked to refer to the university as simply "Virginia Tech". Virginia Tech University, VPI and SU, VPI&SU, VT or VA Tech are not recognized names and should not be used.

What is a Hokie, Anyway? - That's the most often-asked question in Virginia Tech athletics. The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute. With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body.

Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell which still is used today. Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell. It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics. The official school colors — Chicago maroon and burnt orange — also were introduced in 1896. They were chosen because they made a "unique combination" not worn elsewhere at the time.
