The Hokies, who returned to the national polls this week holding the No. 25 spot in the *Soccer America* poll, are in the midst of a two-game winning streak. They return home for a week of conference play at Thompson Field after traveling to Boston College and claiming a 2-1 victory over the top 5 team. This will be the first time Tech plays two games in a one week span in over two weeks. The Hokies will play host to No. 19 Wake Forest in a mid-week matchup before hosting No. 23 Duke on Sunday. Both teams' rankings are according to the *Soccer Times* poll.

Scouting Report: Wake Forest

The Demon Deacons enter the Thursday match at 10-4-0 on the year, 4-1-0 in conference play. They too are in the midst of a two-game win streak after topping Miami on the road and NC State at home.

Katie Stengel leads the team's offense with 11 scores on the year. Rachel Nuzzolese is atop the assists category with five, while she has also tallied nine goals.

Wake's keeper Aubrey Bledsoe boasts the team's record, having allowed 14 goals, made 36 saves and shut two teams out.

Scouting Report: Duke

The Blue Devils will travel to Charlottesville to face No. 9 Virginia before arriving in Blacksburg on Sunday. Heading into the week of play, Duke is 7-4-3 on the year, 0-3-1 in the ACC. The Blue Devils recently snapped a four-game winless streak, defeating Clemson, 4-1, after falling to both the conference's Florida teams and tying Maryland.

Lauren Weinberg leads the team with five goals so far, while four other players have scored three. Kaitlyn Kerr, Molly Lester and Gilda Doria are all tied for the team lead with three assists.

In net for Duke has been Tara Campbell, who has made 44 saves this year, allowing 13 goals and tallying four shutouts.

Series Info: Wake Forest

Though Wake Forest holds the 5-3-0 all-time series edge against the Hokies, Tech had the Demon Deacons' number last season, defeating them twice away from home. The Hokies claimed their first-ever victory in Winston-Salem, 4-3, last season as senior leader Marika Gary and sophomore Kelly Conheeny showcased their talents with four and three points, respectively. Conheeny's late heroics later bounced Wake from the first round of the ACC Tournament as the then-freshman buried the only goal of the game in overtime. This was the first time the two teams have never needed overtime to decide a match.

Series Info: Duke

The Blue Devils enter the match with the 5-1-0 all-time series lead after defeating the Hokies in Durham, 4-1, last season. The two teams have only faced each other as members of the ACC. Tech earned its first win over the Blue Devils in 2008, 1-0.

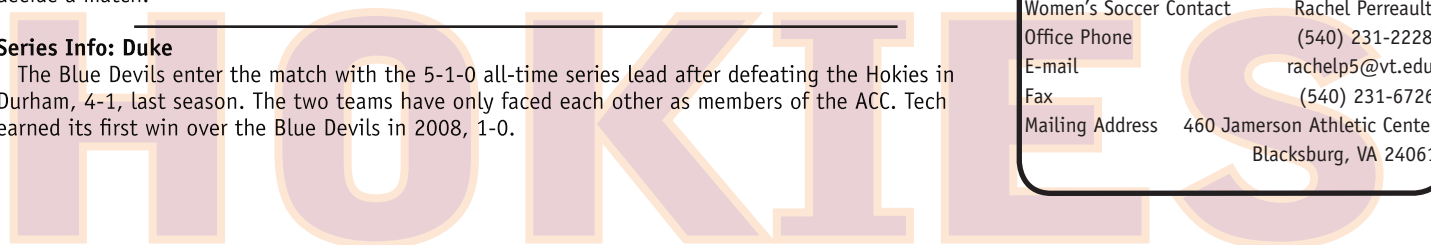

Ranking The Competition

- The Hokies will host No. 19 Wake Forest and No. 23 Duke (according to the *Soccer Times* poll) this week after topping No. 4/2 Boston College on the road last week and No. 7/5 Maryland a week prior to that at home.
- There are currently eight teams on Tech's schedule that rank among the 25 best in the nation in at least one of the three major polls, including seven conference foes.
- Of the team's nine non-conference opponents, three were participants in the 2009 NCAA Tournament.

What A Week!

- The Hokies traveled to No. 4/2 Boston College over the weekend and earned their first-ever road victory over the Eagles, defeating them 2-1.
- Exactly one week prior, Tech defeated No. 7/5 Maryland at home, claiming its first conference win as well as its first defeat of a ranked opponent this season.
- This is the first time that the Hokies have ever outed two top 10 teams in back-to-back outings and just the second time they have ever defeated two ranked teams in back-to-back games. The only other time was last season when they topped then-No. 18 Virginia and then-No. 1 North Carolina in the same week.

Man, Oh Manning!

- Freshman Ashley Manning has come into her own in the past week of play, tallying the only two game-winners of her career against two top 10 teams.
- Manning scored the only goal of the game against Maryland at home and buried the go-ahead goal, allowing Tech to regain the lead at Boston College.
- The Round Hill, Va., native has just three goals on the year and has yet to make a start.

Hokies At Home

- Tech is 5-1-0 at home this season after claiming its first conference win, stunning No. 7/5 Maryland, 1-0, and ending the Terps' nine-game unbeaten streak.
- Tech swept through another Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational this year, defeating Villanova and Vanderbilt in the process. In 2009, the home tournament sparked school-record seven-game overall and home win streaks.
- Tech is 84-55-15 all-time at home and has gone 21-6-0 at Thompson Field since 2008.

Record Races

- Entering the year, Marika Gray was the only current player to hold a career record of her own (game-winning goals, 9), while she is also tied for first with seven multi-goal games. So far this season she has already taken over the top spot in points (65) and is on the verge in three other categories.
- Senior Jennifer Harvey also ranks among Tech's best and continues to climb the charts, while sophomore Kelly Conheaney is also about to break into the career goals and points lists, after recently adding her name to the career assists list.

Last Time Out...

The Hokies made it two wins in a row against top 10 teams for the first time in program history, as they topped No. 4/2 Boston College, 2-1, on the road.

Tech was the first on the board when junior Brittany Michels scored her first goal of the season on a relay from Jennifer Harvey and Jazmine Reeves.

The Hokies entered the halftime break out-shooting the Eagles 8-5, but BC would even things up just after the intermission. Kristie Mewis was the goal-scorer.

With just over 15 minutes remaining in the match, freshman Ashley Manning was the hero yet again for the Hokies as she put away the go-ahead goal on a pass from Michels.

- With the recent victory and shutout over Maryland, freshman keeper Dayle Colpitts has already made her mark at Tech. Full details on page 5.

Fresh New Look

- The Hokies have mixed things up in the starting line up as of late, awarding two freshmen their first career starts and repositioning a few upperclassmen.
- The changes have helped the team to victories over No. 7/5 Maryland and No. 4/2 Boston College.
- Against Maryland, freshmen Ashley Manning and Dayle Colpitts came up big as Manning scored the only goal of the game and her first career game-winner, while Colpitts kept Tech alive, making five saves and earning the shutout.
- Manning came up big again at BC, scoring yet another game-winner.
- This year's newcomers have accumulated 11 points on five goals and an assist so far.

Cool Under Pressure

- Freshman keeper Dayle Colpitts was the difference-maker in the Hokies' 1-0 defeat of No. 7/5 Maryland. She made five crucial saves for Tech, her highest total when earning a victory. The performance was also Colpitts' third shutout of the year.
- Senior captain Kelsey Billups helped Tech to its second-straight overtime victory when she put away the go-ahead goal just over five minutes into overtime against James Madison.

Next Up ...

Tech will depart for Florida next week, traveling first to Miami for a mid-week matchup with the Hurricanes before progressing north to Tallahassee to take on No. 10 Florida State. This will be the Hokies' third and final long trip of the regular season after trekking to Massachusetts and Texas.

- At the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational, sophomore Kelly Conheeny came up big for Tech as she netted the second overtime game-winner of her two-year career after scoring the go-ahead goal against Vanderbilt to give Tech the 2-1 win.
- Senior leader Jennifer Harvey was Tech's go-to in pressure situations last year and she has carried that over to this season. Harvey went 5-for-5 last year on penalty kicks and has buried two so far in 2010.

Hokie Invite, Harvey's Stage

- The Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational has displayed some of the best talents and games Jennifer Harvey has to offer over the past two seasons. Harvey earned the second multi-goal game of her career at this year's invite, scoring two goals against Villanova. In last year's tournament, the Roanoke, Va., native became the 11th Hokie to ever tally a hat trick after scoring three goals against the College of Charleston.

Remixing Roles

- Senior leader Marika Gray has excelled in a different way so far this season. Instead of leading the team in goals, like she did in 2009, Gray is second on the team's assists list with five this year. Gray still leads the team in shots with 41, ranking first in shots on goal (21) as well, and has scored three times this year.

Senior Spectacle

- Senior captain Kelsey Billups has been a jack of all trades for the Hokies throughout her career. Coming to the team as a midfielder, Billups made the switch to defense as a sophomore and saw time at both positions as a junior. Billups is currently the team's leading scorer, also leading all forwards, with six goals so far this year.
- Billups was named Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week for her performance at the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational after tallying five points in two games and setting new personal single-game highs in shots (7) and shots on goal (5).

Extra! Extra!

- The Hokies needed extra time to decide two straight matches and boast a 14-8 all-time record in extra time.
- Tech has only played back-to-back regular season overtime games two other times in program history. In 2008 the Hokies fell to James Madison, 4-3, and tied then-No. 25 Miami, 1-1, in Coral Gables. In 1998, Tech saw similar results to this season's predicament, claiming 2-1 wins in overtime at La Salle and then at home against Fordham two days later.

Cornering The Opponent

- The Hokies set a new single-game corner kick record when they hosted American in their home opener. The previous record of 16, set in 2007, was blown out after Tech took 22 against the Eagles.

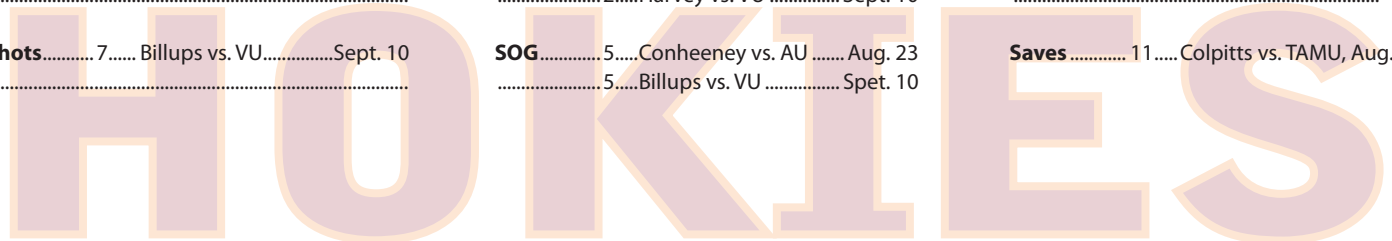
