The Hokies, recently snapped a three-game unbeaten streak, falling to No. 23 Duke at home, but the team will look to bounce back against both of the ACC's Florida teams this week. Tech will travel to Miami for a mid-week matchup, before heading back towards home, making a stop in Tallahassee to take on No. 10/9 Florida State. As a member of the ACC, Tech is 1-2-1 in conference play in the Sunshine State.

Scouting Report: Miami

The Hurricanes are 9-5-1 on the year, and 3-3-0 in conference play. They recently fell to North Carolina, 5-0, on the road.

Brittany Steinbruch is currently the only Miami player that has tallied double-digit points, as she leads the team with seven scores on the season. Ali Brennan and Lauren Singer are tied at the top of the assists category with three apiece.

Vikki Alonzo has been Miami's keeper this year, boasting the team's record while tallying six shutouts and 65 saves, allowing just 16 goals on the year.

Scouting Report: Florida State

The Seminoles are 11-3-0 entering the week of play and 5-1-0 in the ACC. They will host Virginia before welcoming the Hokies on Sunday. Florida State recently topped NC State, 4-1, after falling to North Carolina, 1-0, on the road. The loss ended a six-game winning streak.

Tori Huster and Janice Cayman lead the 'Noles' offense with six goals and five assists each.

Florida State's keeper, Kelsey Wys, has shut out seven teams on the year, allowing just nine goals and making 60 saves.

Series Info: Miami

The Hokies hold the 5-2-3 edge in their all-time series with the Hurricanes. Tech defeated Miami last season at home, 2-1. The Hokies have never lost to the 'Canes as a member of the ACC, boasting a 5-0-2 record since both schools made the conference switch.

Series Info: Florida State

The Seminoles have been one of Tech's toughest opponents over the years and they remain as the only conference opponent the Hokies have yet to conquer. Florida State has taken three of the last four meetings between the two schools over the past two years, though Tech was able to advance past the school on penalty kicks in the first round of the 2008 ACC Tournament.

The Seminoles currently sit at 8-0-1 all-time against the Hokies.

Ranking The Competition

- The Hokies Will head to unranked Miami before stooping by No. 10/9 Florida State.
- There are currently seven teams on Tech's schedule that rank among the 25 best in the nation in at least one of the three major polls, including six conference foes.
- Of the team's nine non-conference opponents, three were participants in the 2009 NCAA Tournament.

Going For Gray-tness

- Senior leader Marika Gray is currently closing in on two Tech records, after acheiving one earlier this year and entering the season with two career records to her name.
- Gray began the year as the all-time leader in career multi-goal games (7) and game-winning goals (9), while she has also taken over the top spot in career points with her 13 so far this year, which ups her total to 67.
- With 26 career scores, the Alexandria, Va., native is three goals away from Emily Jukich's record of 29 goals. Gray's 201 shots throughout her career is also nearing the school record of 209, which was set by Emily Barnhart (2000-03).
- The forward currently leads the team in shots (47) and shots on goal (24), is tied for second in assists (5) and tied for third in points (13) and goals (4) this season.

What A Week!

- When the Hokies traveled to No. 4/2 Boston College, they earned their first-ever road victory over the Eagles, defeating them 2-1.
- Exactly one week prior, Tech defeated No. 7/5 Maryland at home, claiming its first conference win as well as its first defeat of a ranked opponent this season.
- This is the first time that the Hokies have ever outed two top 10 teams in back-to-back outings and just the second time they have ever defeated two ranked teams in back-to-back games. The only other time was last season when they topped then-No. 18 Virginia and then-No. 1 North Carolina in the same week.

Man, Oh Manning!

- Freshman Ashley Manning has come into her own as of late, tallying the only two game-winners of her career against two top 10 teams.
- Manning scored the only goal of the game against Maryland at home and buried the go-ahead goal, allowing Tech to regain the lead at Boston College.
- The Round Hill, Va., native has just three goals on the year and has yet to make a start.

Hokies At Home

- Tech is 5-2-1 at home this season after claiming its first conference win, stunning No. 7/5 Maryland, 1-0, and ending the Terps' nine-game unbeaten streak. Most recently, the Hokies dropped just their second home match of the year, falling to No. 23 Duke, 3-0, and battled to a 3-3 draw with No. 19 Wake Forest. This was the first home tie since tying then-No. 19 Clemson in 2007.
- Tech swept through another Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational this year, defeating Villanova and Vanderbilt in the process.

Last Time Out...

The Hokies ended a three-game unbeaten streak over the weekend, losing to Duke, 3-0. The loss is Tech's second at home this year and it came after battling Wake Forest to a 3-3 draw just four days prior. The tie was the Hokies' first at home since tying Clemson, 1-1, in 2007 at Thompson Field.

Tech came out slow against the Blue Devils and an early miscommunication between the defense and keeper resulted in an own goal, awarding Duke a 1-0 lead that it would carry into the halftime break.

In the 68th minute the Blue Devils finally scored their own goal and they tacked on another in the closing minutes to put the game out of reach. They outshot Tech 12-6 in the game, 8-2 on goal.

In 2009, the home tournament sparked school-record seven-game overall and home win streaks.

- Tech is 84-55-15 all-time at home and has gone 21-6-0 at Thompson Field since 2008.

Record Races

- Senior leader Marika Gray has been on the hunt for new Tech records since last season and is close to taking over two more records. Senior Jennifer Harvey also ranks among Tech's best and continues to climb the charts, while sophomore Kelly Conheaney is also about to break into the career goals and points lists, after recently adding her name to the career assists list.

- With the recent victory and shutout over Maryland, freshman keeper Dayle Colpitts has already made her mark at Tech. Full details on page 5.

Next Up ...

Tech will make its final road trip of the 2010 regular season when the team travels to South Carolina to take on Clemson. Three days later, the Hokies return home for Senior Day, as they host NC State.

Fresh New Look

- The Hokies have mixed things up in the startingline up as of late, awarding two freshmen their first career starts and repositioning a few upperclassmen.
- The changes helped the team to victories over No. 7/5 Maryland and No. 4/2 Boston College.
- Against Maryland, freshmen Ashley Manning and Dayle Colpitts came up big as Manning scored the only goal of the game and her first career game-winner, while Colpitts kept Tech alive, making five saves and earning the shutout.
- Manning came up big again at BC, scoring yet another game-winner.
- This year's newcomers have accumulated 11 points on five goals and an assist so far.

Cool Under Pressure

- Freshman keeper Dayle Colpitts was the difference-maker in the Hokies' 1-0 defeat of No. 7/5 Maryland. She made five crucial saves for Tech, her highest total when earning a victory. The performance was also Colpitts' third shutout of the year.
- Senior captain Kelsey Billups helped Tech to its second-straight overtime victory when she put away the go-ahead goal just over five minutes into overtime against James Madison.
- At the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational, sophomore Kelly Conheeneey came up big for Tech as she netted the second overtime game-winner of her two-year career after scoring the go-ahead goal against Vanderbilt to give Tech the 2-1 win.
- Senior leader Jennifer Harvey was Tech's go-to in pressure situations last year and she has carried that over to this season. Harvey went 5-for-5 last year on penalty kicks and has buried two so far in 2010.

Remixing Roles

- Senior leader Marika Gray has excelled in a different way so far this season. Instead of leading the team in goals, like she did in 2009, Gray is tied for second on the team's assists list with five this year. Gray still leads the team in shots with 47, ranking first in shots on goal (24) as well, and has scored four times this year.

Extra! Extra!

- Tech recently battled to an overtime draw with No. 19 Wake Forest, tying the Deacons 3-3 at home. This was the first regular season tie for the Hokies since 2008 (at No. 25 Miami, 1-1) and the first tie at Thompson Field since 2007 (No. 19 Clemson, 1-1).
- The Hokies needed extra time to decide two straight matches and boast a 14-8 all-time record in extra time.
- Tech has only played back-to-back regular season overtime games two other times in program history. In 2008 the Hokies fell to James Madison, 4-3, and tied then-No. 25 Miami, 1-1, in Coral Gables. In 1998, Tech saw similar results to this season's predicament, claiming 2-1 wins in overtime at La Salle and then at home against Fordham two days later.

Cornering The Opponent

- The Hokies set a new single-game corner kick record when they hosted American in their home opener. The previous record of 16, set in 2007, was blown out after Tech took 22 against the Eagles.

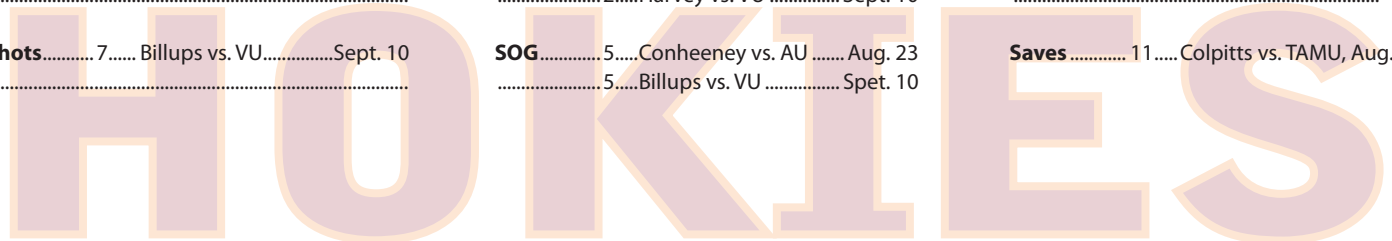
