### Scouting Report: Clemson

Clemson currently sits at 6-11-0 on the year, 0-10-0 in the ACC. The Tigers started the season with five-straight victories and then turned around and dropped their next 10 matches. Clemson recently snapped the losing streak, though, with a 4-1 win over Francis Marion.

Maddy Elder leads the Tigers' offense with five goals and three assists. The only other player that has tallied double-digit points this year is Vanessa Laxgang, who has scored four goals and assisted two more.

Lauren Arnold has been in goal for Clemson and has made 80 saves, earning one shutout this year.

### Scouting Report: NC State

The Wolfpack will head to Charlottesville for a midweek match before arriving in Blacksburg on Sunday. They enter the final week of the regular season at 7-10-0 on the season, 1-7-0 in conference play. NC State began ACC action with a win over Clemson, but have not won since. Most recently, the Wolfpack also dropped two conference matches in Florida.

Kristina Argiroff and Jennie Krauser lead NC State's offense with five goals and four assists each. Kim Kern has tallied 75 saves this season, also earning four shutouts.

### Series Info: Clemson

Tech earned its first victory over the Clemson Tigers last season, ending a three-year streak of ties with a 2-1 overtime thriller. Despite the recent victory, the Tigers still hold the 2-1-3 all-time series edge.

### Series Info: NC State

This week's match between the Hokies and Wolfpack will give the victor the series advantage as the series that began in 1998 is tied at 4-4-0. The Hokies have been the victor in the last three meetings, including last year's 3-0 win in Raleigh, N.C.

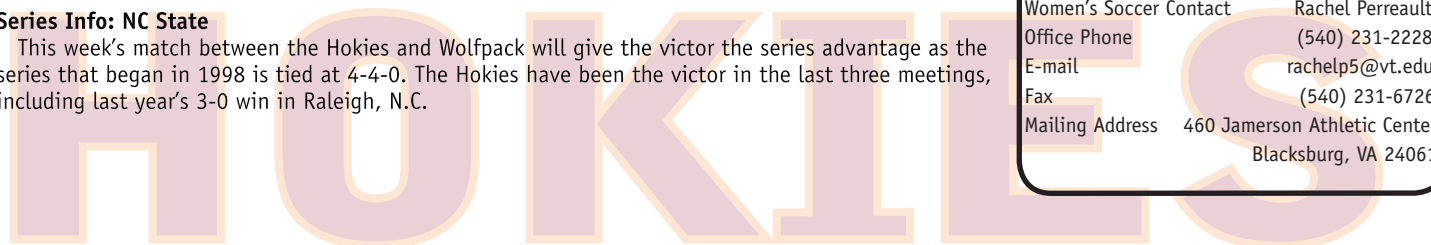

**Ranking The Competition**

- For the first time since the week of Sept. 12, the Hokies will embark on a week of play without facing a ranked team. Last week Tech traveled to Florida, where the team took on unranked Miami and No. 9/10 Florida State.
- There are currently seven teams on Tech's schedule that rank among the 25 best in the nation in at least one of the three major polls, including six conference foes.
- Of the team's nine non-conference opponents, three were participants in the 2009 NCAA Tournament.

**Going For Gray-tness**

- Senior leader Marika Gray is currently closing in on two Tech records, after acheiving one earlier this year and entering the season with two career records to her name.
- Gray began the year as the all-time leader in career multi-goal games (7) and game-winning goals (9), while she has also taken over the top spot in career points with her 13 so far this year, which ups her total to 67.
- With 26 career scores, the Alexandria, Va., native is three goals away from Emily Jukich's record of 29 goals. Gray's 208 shots throughout her career are also nearing the school record of 209, which was set by Emily Barnhart (2000-03).
- The forward currently leads the team in shots (54) and shots on goal (28), is tied for second in assists (5) and tied for third in points (13) and goals (4) this season.

**What A Week!**

- When the Hokies traveled to No. 4/2 Boston College, they earned their first-ever road victory over the Eagles, defeating them 2-1.
- Exactly one week prior, Tech defeated No. 7/5 Maryland at home, claiming its first conference win as well as its first defeat of a ranked opponent this season.
- This is the first time that the Hokies have ever outed two top-10 teams in back-to-back outings and just the second time they have ever defeated two ranked teams in back-to-back games. The only other time was last season when they topped then-No. 18 Virginia and then-No. 1 North Carolina in the same week.

**Man, Oh Manning!**

- Freshman Ashley Manning has come into her own as of late, tallying the only two game-winners of her career against two top-10 teams.
- Manning scored the only goal of the game against Maryland at home and buried the go-ahead goal, allowing Tech to regain the lead at Boston College.
- The Round Hill, Va., native has just three goals on the year and has yet to make a start.

**Hokies At Home**

- Tech is 5-2-1 at home this season after claiming its first conference win, stunning No. 7/5 Maryland, 1-0, and ending the Terps' nine-game unbeaten streak. Most recently, the Hokies dropped just their second home match of the year, falling to No. 23 Duke, 3-0, and battled to a 3-3 draw with No. 19 Wake Forest. This was the first home tie since tying then-No. 19 Clemson in 2007.

**Last Time Out...**

The Hokies continued to slip last week, traveling to the state of Florida and being shut out by both of the state's conference teams. Tech has not been shut out in three-straight games since the 2005 season.

Tech recently stopped in Tallahassee to take on No. 9/10 Florida State. The Hokies had one of their least productive games of the season, only taking three shots in the match, one on target.

The Seminoles got out to an early lead, scoring first in the seventh minute. The Hokies were able to defend and prevent another score before the halftime break.

Florida State struck again in the 57th minute, but a near-season-high 14 fouls prevented the Hokies from ever getting anything going on offense.

- Tech swept through another Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational this year, defeating Villanova and Vanderbilt in the process. In 2009, the home tournament sparked school-record seven-game overall and home win streaks.
- Tech is 84-55-15 all-time at home and has gone 21-6-0 at Thompson Field since 2008.

**Record Races**

- Senior leader Marika Gray has been on the hunt for new Tech records since last season and is close to taking over two more records. Senior Jennifer Harvey also ranks among Tech's best and continues to climb the charts, while sophomore Kelly Conheeneey is also about to break into the career goals and points lists, after recently adding her name to the career assists list.

- With the recent victory and shutout over Maryland, freshman keeper Dayle Colpitts has already made her mark at Tech. Full details on page 5.

Redshirt sophomore Amanda Gerhard has seen the most action of her career this season, appearing in all 17 games and making 11 starts. She also scored the first goal of her career this year against then-No. 19 Wake Forest.

### Next Up ...

Tech wraps up the regular season this week as the team travels to Clemson and then hosts NC State for Senior Day. The Hokies will need to win out to keep their season alive and earn a spot in the ACC Tournament, which they have attended each of the past two seasons. The Hokies' fate will also depend on the result of the teams around them in the rankings.

### Fresh New Look

- The Hokies have mixed things up in the starting line up as of late, awarding two freshmen their first career starts and repositioning a few upperclassmen.
- The changes helped the team to victories over No. 7/5 Maryland and No. 4/2 Boston College.
- Against Maryland, freshmen Ashley Manning and Dayle Colpitts came up big as Manning scored the only goal of the game and her first career game-winner, while Colpitts kept Tech alive, making five saves and earning the shutout.
- Manning came up big again at BC, scoring yet another game-winner.
- This year's newcomers have accumulated 13 points on six goals and an assist so far.

### Cool Under Pressure

- Freshman keeper Dayle Colpitts was the difference-maker in the Hokies' 1-0 defeat of No. 7/5 Maryland. She made five crucial saves for Tech, her highest total when earning a victory. The performance was also Colpitts' third shutout of the year.
- Senior captain Kelsey Billups helped Tech to its second-straight overtime victory when she put away the go-ahead goal just over five minutes into overtime against James Madison.
- At the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational, sophomore Kelly Conheeneey came up big for Tech as she netted the second overtime game-winner of her two-year career after scoring the go-ahead goal against Vanderbilt to give Tech the 2-1 win.
- Senior leader Jennifer Harvey was Tech's go-to in pressure situations last year and she has carried that over to this season. Harvey went 5-for-5 last year on penalty kicks and has buried two so far in 2010.

### Remixing Roles

- Senior leader Marika Gray has excelled in a different way so far this season. Instead of leading the team in goals, like she did in 2009, Gray is tied for second on the team's assists list with five this year. Gray still leads the team in shots with 47, ranking first in shots on goal (24) as well, and has scored four times this year.

### Extra! Extra!

- Tech recently battled to an overtime draw with No. 19 Wake Forest, tying the Deacons 3-3 at home. This was the first regular season tie for the Hokies since 2008 (at No. 25 Miami, 1-1) and the first tie at Thompson Field since 2007 (No. 19 Clemson, 1-1).
- The Hokies needed extra time to decide two-straight matches (Vanderbilt, James Madison) and boast a 14-8 all-time record in extra time.
- Tech has only played back-to-back regular season overtime games two other times in program history. In 2008, the Hokies fell to James Madison, 4-3, and tied then-No. 25 Miami, 1-1, in Coral Gables. In 1998, Tech saw similar results to this season's predicament, claiming 2-1 wins in overtime at La Salle and then at home against Fordham two days later.

### Cornering The Opponent

- The Hokies set a new single-game corner kick record when they hosted American in their home opener. The previous record of 16, set in 2007, was blown out after Tech took 22 against the Eagles.

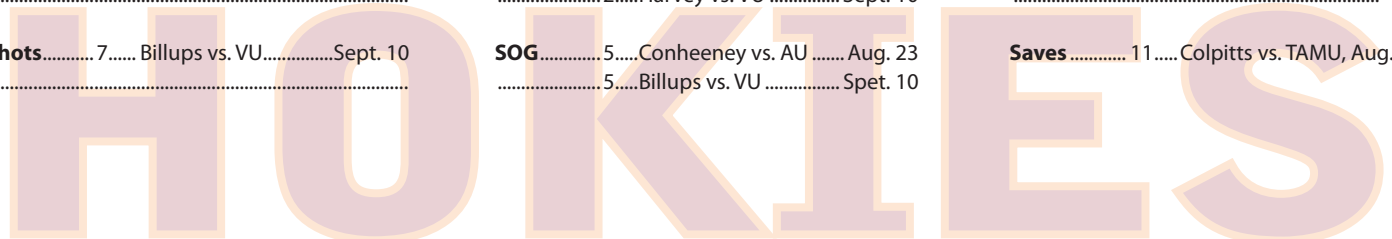
