NCAA Tournament - First Round

Game 21: Virginia Tech vs. Dayton
Columbus, Ohio - Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium
Friday, Nov. 12 - 7:30 p.m.

The Hokies enter the postseason for the fourth time in program history and face Dayton for the second-straight year in the NCAA Tournament. This is the third-consecutive year the Hokies have earned an NCAA Tournament bid, marking its longest stretch of showings. All Tech's postseason appearances, including conference tournaments, have come as a member of the ACC.

Ohio State, the three seed in the Maryland bracket will host the opening rounds and take on St. Francis (PA) in its first round match.

Scouting Report: Dayton

The Flyers are making it back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances this season after winning their second-straight Atlantic 10 Tournament title. This is also the seventh all-time postseason appearance for Dayton.

Boasting an 18-3-0 record on the year, the Flyers' offense has been led by Colleen Williams, who leads the team in scoring, assists and points with 17, 11 and 45 respectively.

In goal for Dayton has been Lisa Rodgers, who has made 14 starts this year, allowing just nine goals, while making 49 saves. She has put together a 14-1-0 record and shut out 10 opponents.

Series Info: Dayton

The Hokies are 1-8-0 all-time against the Flyers, with most of those matchups coming during Tech's five-year stint in the A-10. Tech's only victory came in the second round of last year's NCAA Tournament, when the Hokies defeated Dayton, 3-1, in Dayton. Marika Gray scored two goals, while Kelly Conheeny added the third.

The two teams have met once the year after the Hokies left the A-10 and twice since Tech joined the ACC. Tech tallied a 20-24-2 record as a member of the Atlantic 10 Conference.

Postseason History

This will be the third-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance for the Hokies and fourth all-time. Tech recently wrapped up its third-consecutive ACC Tournament appearance with a tough, 4-2, loss to North Carolina. All of the Hokies' NCAA Tournament bids have come after an ACC Tournament run.

Tech is 2-3 all-time in the NCAA Tournament and advanced all the way to the Sweet 16 last season. The 2009 appearance also earned the Hokies their first-ever Tournament victories.

Seniors Marika Gray and Jennifer Harvey, along with sophomore Kelly Conheeny, are the only current members of the team who have earned a point in the postseason as each scored at least one goal during last season's run.

Tech returns eight starters from last year's postseason lineup, as well as five more players who can add postseason play experience.

Ranking The Competition

- Four teams in this year's ACC Tournament pool ranked among the top 10 in the nation, while three more rank in the top 25 in at least one of the three polls.
- There are currently seven teams on Tech's schedule that rank among the 25 best in the nation in at least one of the three major polls, including seven conference foes.
- Of the team's nine non-conference opponents, three were participants in the 2009 NCAA Tournament.

ACCompleted Conference

- The Atlantic Coast Conference will send eight teams to the NCAA Tournament for the second-consecutive year, again leading all other conferences.
- In 2009, the ACC led all conferences and tied a league record with eight of its teams participating in the NCAA Tournament. Seven of those teams advanced to the final 16, with four more making it to the Elite 8.
- The ACC is home to the two-time defending national champion North Carolina Tar Heels and has been represented in the Final Four in 27 of the 28 times it has been held.

Going For Gray-tness

- Senior leader Marika Gray recently claimed Tech's all-time shots record, surpassing the 209 mark set in 2003. Gray has now taken 219 shots in her career.
- Gray began the year as the all-time leader in career multi-goal games (7) and game-winning goals (9), while she has also taken over the top spot in career points with her 19 so far this year, which ups her total to 73.
- With 27 career scores, the Alexandria, Va., native is two goals away from Emily Jukich's record of 29 goals.
- The forward currently leads the team in shots (65) and shots on goal (32), ranks second in assists (9) and points (19), and is tied for second in goals (5) this season.

Jaz-ing Things Up

- Freshman Jazmine Reeves turned it on in Tech's final two games of the regular season, tallying six points in the final week of play.
- At Clemson, Reeves earned the first multi-goal game of her career after scoring two goals in the 3-0 victory. Later in the week, Reeves scored Tech's second of four goals against NC State.
- Reeves has started nine-straight games and tallied five goals and one assist.

What A Week!

- When the Hokies traveled to No. 4/2 Boston College, they earned their first-ever road victory over the Eagles, defeating them 2-1.
- Exactly one week prior, Tech defeated No. 7/5 Maryland at home, claiming its first conference win as well as its first defeat of a ranked opponent this season.
- This is the first time that the Hokies have ever beaten two top-10 teams in back-to-back outings and just the second time they have ever defeated two ranked teams in back-to-back games. The only other time was last season when they topped then-No. 18 Virginia and then-No. 1 North Carolina in the same week.

Last Time Out...

The Hokies got out to a rough start in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals as they took on the defending champions and top-seeded North Carolina Tar Heels.

Carolina went up 1-0 just 22 seconds into the match and tacked on another first-half score to take a 2-0 lead and 8-2 shooting edge into the intermission.

The Heels struck again early in the second half and eventually went up 4-0 on the Hokies with 20 minutes remaining.

Freshman Katie DeTuro got Tech on the board in the 73rd minute and sophomore Julia Goldworthy kept the offense going just over five minutes later with her first goal of the season.

Despite the strong second half effort, the rally was halted and Tech was bumped in the first round.

Man, Oh Manning!

- Freshman Ashley Manning had one of the best weeks of her career earlier in conference play, tallying the only two game-winners of her career against two top-10 teams.
- Manning scored the only goal of the game against Maryland at home and buried the go-ahead goal, allowing Tech to regain the lead at Boston College.
- The Round Hill, Va., native has just three goals on the year and has yet to make a start.

Hokies At Home

- Tech is 6-2-1 at home this season.
- Tech claimed its first conference win, stunning No. 7/5 Maryland, 1-0, and ending the Terps' nine-game unbeaten streak, and most recently, the Hokies topped NC State, 4-0, on Senior Day. Senior leader Marika Gray put on a show in her final home game, tallying two assists and goal of her own.
- Tech swept through another Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational this year, defeating Villanova and Vanderbilt in the process.
- Tech is 84-55-15 all-time at home and has gone 21-6-0 at Thompson Field since 2008.

Hokies in November

Tech has played 22 games in the month of November since becoming a varsity program in 1993. Below are some of the Hokies' records and numbers in the fall month:

- Tech has played 22 games all-time in November and holds an 8-12-2 record.
- The Hokies are 5-5-0 in regular season games, 1-4-2 in conference tournament games* and 2-3 in NCAA Tournament games in November.
- Tech has advanced on PKs in both of its November ties.
- The Hokies have been outscored 42-25 all-time in November games but just 25-18 in the Cagle era.
- Tech has shut out its opponent eight times in November, but also been shut out nine times.

Hokie Honors

Three Hokies have been honored towards the end of the season for outstanding performances this year. Freshmen Jazmine Reeves and Dayle Colpitts were named to the ACC All-Freshmen team after impressive collegiate debuts.

Senior Jennifer Harvey was also honored, earning *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-District III First Team honors for the second-straight year. This award honors students who excel both on the field and in the classroom. Harvey was also named to the third team as a sophomore.

Record Races

- Senior leader Marika Gray has been on the hunt for new Tech records since last season and recently added the career shots to her collection of Tech records. Senior Jennifer Harvey also ranks among Tech's best and continues to climb the charts, while sophomore Kelly Conheeny has added her name to multiple lists after just two seasons.
- With the recent victory and shutout over Maryland, freshman keeper Dayle Colpitts has already made her mark at Tech.

Fresh New Look

- Katie DeTuro scored the second goal of her career, sparking a late Hokie rally and allowing Tech to avoid the shutout against North Carolina in the ACC Tournament.
- Freshman Jazmine Reeves has made nine-straight starts and tallied six points in Tech's final two games of the regular season.
- Against Maryland, freshmen Ashley Manning and Dayle Colpitts came up big as Manning scored the only goal of the game and her first career game-winner, while Colpitts kept Tech alive, making five saves and earning the shutout.
- Manning came up big again at BC, scoring yet another game-winner.
- This year's newcomers have accumulated 17 points on eight goals and an assist so far.

Cool Under Pressure

- Freshman keeper Dayle Colpitts was the difference-maker in the Hokies' 1-0 defeat of No. 7/5 Maryland. She made five crucial saves for Tech, her highest total when earning a victory. The performance was also Colpitts' third shutout of the year.
- Senior captain Kelsey Billups helped Tech to its second-straight overtime victory when she put away the go-ahead goal just over five minutes into overtime against James Madison.
- At the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational, sophomore Kelly Conheeny came up big for Tech as she netted the second overtime game-winner of her two-year career after scoring the go-ahead goal against Vanderbilt to give Tech the 2-1 win.
- Senior leader Jennifer Harvey was Tech's go-to in pressure situations last year and she has carried that over to this season. Harvey went 5-for-5 last year on penalty kicks and has buried two so far in 2010.

Extra! Extra!

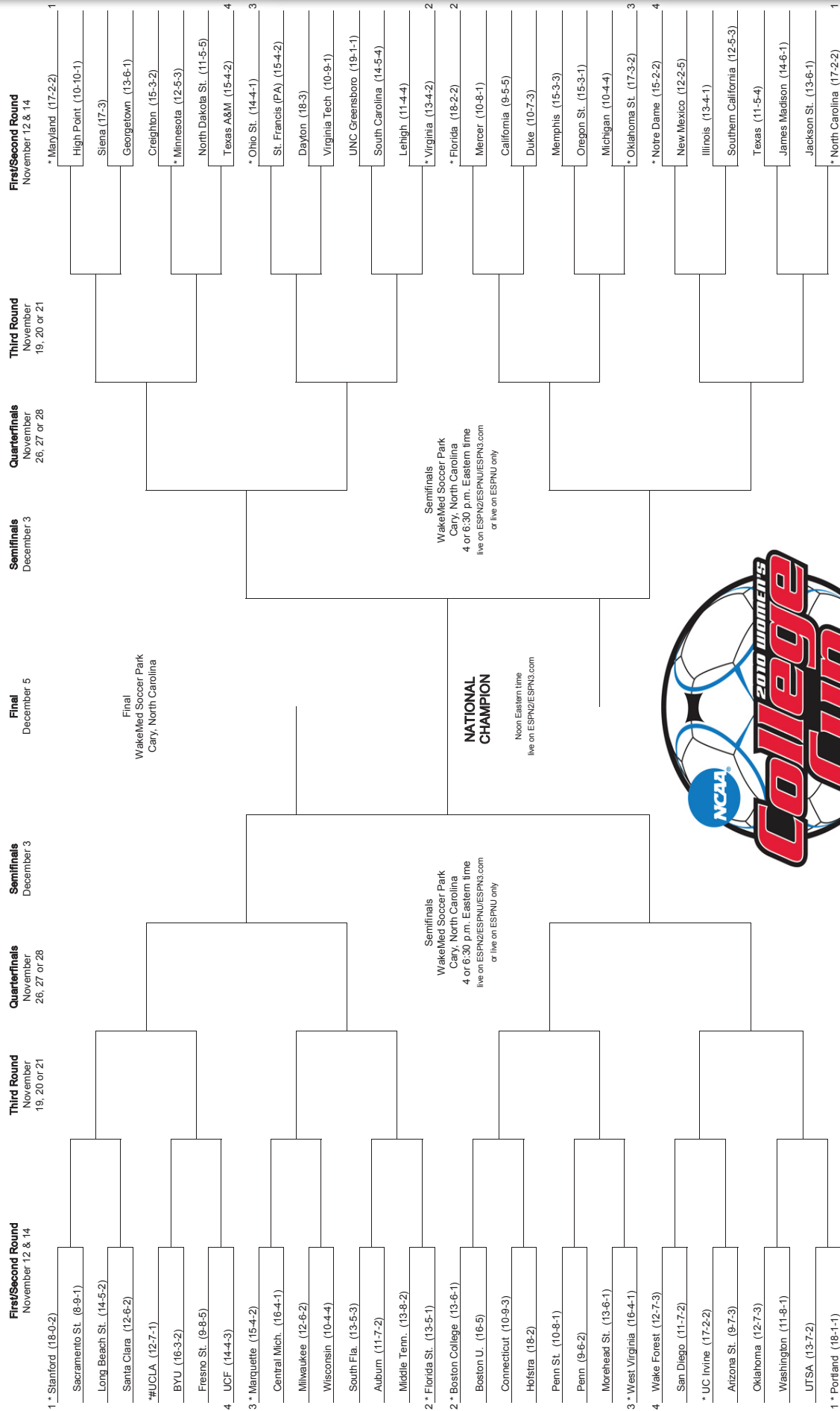
- Tech battled to an overtime draw with No. 19 Wake Forest, tying the Deacons 3-3 at home. This was the first regular season tie for the Hokies since 2008 (at No. 25 Miami, 1-1) and the first tie at Thompson Field since 2007 (No. 19 Clemson, 1-1).
- The Hokies needed extra time to decide two-straight matches earlier in the year (Vanderbilt, James Madison) and boast a 14-8 all-time record in extra time.
- Tech has only played back-to-back regular season overtime games two other times in program history. In 2008, the Hokies fell to James Madison, 4-3, and tied then-No. 25 Miami, 1-1, in Coral Gables. In 1998, Tech saw similar results to this season's predicament, claiming 2-1 wins in overtime at La Salle and then at home against Fordham two days later.

Cornering The Opponent

- The Hokies set a new single-game corner kick record when they hosted American in their home opener. The previous record of 16, set in 2007, was blown out after Tech took 22 against the Eagles.

Lynch has been a huge part of the Hokies' success over the past few seasons and a big reason they have made the postseason runs they have. Lynch will end her Tech career having played in the most games, making 85 appearances. She has also made the most career starts of any Hokie in program history, with 84 starts to her name.

The Mullica Hill, N.J., native helped Tech set a new shutout record in 2008 and tie the record again in 2009, as the last line of defense. Lynch has had her work cut out for her this season but has done a stellar job protecting her freshman keeper and keeping the opponent from reaching the goal.

A native of Brick, N.J., DeTuro has seen time in all but one of Tech's games this season, and scored her first goal earlier in the year against LSU.
