- The Hokies will kick off their 2011 season as they travel to Greensboro, N.C., to take on UNC Greensboro Friday, August 19, before they head north for a 7 p.m. matchup against James Madison on Sunday, August 21 in Harrisonburg, Va.
- The Hokies are looking to record their 10th season-opening victory in 18 seasons. Tech is 9-7-2 in season openers, including two consecutive wins over Elon and High Point in 2009 and 2010, respectively.

#### **SCOUTING THE SPARTANS**

- The Spartans will kick off their 2011 season against the Hokies after putting together an impressive 19-2-1 record in 2010 and claiming the Southern Conference title. UNCG APPALACHIAN STATE 6:00 lost much of its talent, including two newcomers who each scored 10 goals last season. Returning for the Spartans are senior Cat Barnekow and junior Lauren Hein. Barnekow recorded 4 goals and a team-leading 14 assists. Hein, the only other player who started at least 20 games in 2010, recorded 7 goals and 4 assists last season.
  - In goal, Kelsey Kearney will enter her senior season after starting all 22 contests. The keeper made 59 saves on the year, allowing 12 goals and notching 11 shutouts.

#### **SERIES INFO**

- The Spartans hold the advantage with an all-time series record 4-3. The two teams first met in 1993 and most recently collided in 2009, as the Hokies claimed a 4-0 victory on Thompson Field. The other two victories came in the 2001 and 2006 seasons.
- The Hokies hold a 15-8-1 all-time advantage against current teams from the Southern 7:00 Conference.

#### SCOUTING THE DUKES

- The Dukes return six starters from last season's 15-7-1 squad that captured the CAA title and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Women's Tournament. Senior Jessica Barndt (1g, 0a), sophomores Lauren Wilson (8g, 1a) and Becky Sparks (1g, 2a) highlight the James Madison squad.
- In goal, the Dukes lost Diane Wszalek, who started all 23 games and recorded eight shutouts last season. Marlee Stynchula, Kate Courter and Ellen Forrest are three freshmen that will battle to earn the top spot.

#### **SERIES INFO**

- The Dukes hold a 12-2-1 all-time advantage over the Hokies. The two teams first met in 1993 and most recently collided last year, as Tech claimed a thrilling 3-2 (OT) victory. The other victory came in 2003 when the Hokies shut out the Dukes, 3-0, at Thompson Field.
- Tech holds an 18-22-3 all-time record against current teams from the Colonial Athletic Association.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

#### Hokies defeat ECU, 4-1, in exhibition

Mayrose, Reeves, Conheeney and Loupee all connect on goals

**BLACKSBURG**, **Va.** - The Hokie offense sprouted late in the match to lead Virginia Tech women's soccer to a 4-1 advantage over East Carolina in each team's opening exhibition of the 2011 season.

In a match that had three 35-minute periods, both teams were quiet in the first period before freshman **Jodie Zelenky** set up **Shannon Mayrose** for the first goal of the game at the 53:05 mark.

The Pirates fired back at the beginning of the third period when Caty Butler fired from 18-yards back to put ECU on the board and tie the match. Shortly after, sophomore **Jazmine Reeves** was setup by freshman **Kelsey Loupee** and shot from 12-yards back to give Tech the lead.

The Hokies never looked back when **Kelly Conheeney** ripped a shot into the upper far post from 25-yards back (85:34), while 20-minutes later freshman **Kelsey Loupee** was assisted by **Katie Cramp** to secure the match.

Tech out shot ECU 18-8 and took six corner kicks, while the Pirates recorded nine saves.

#### TOUGH COMPETITION

• Six ACC women's soccer teams are included among the 2011 NSCAA preseason rankings, including four teams among the top six and five among the top 10. North Carolina holds a No. 3 preseason ranking in the poll, followed by 2010 College Cup participant Boston College at No. 4, Florida State at No. 5, Maryland follows at No. 6 and Virginia at No. 10. Defending ACC Champion Wake Forest holds the No. 18 spot.

#### **SEASONED VETS**

• The Hokies return five starters and four players who have played in at least 15 games from last year's squad. Now sophomores Jazmine Reeves and Dayle Colpitts both received ACC All-Freshmen accolades last season, while Kelly Conheeney was named to the 2010 VaSID All-State second team. Conheeney led the team in four categories, including shots (46), game-winning goals (3), assists (12) and points (22).

#### **NCAA HISTORY**

The Virginia Tech women's soccer program is coming off its third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and fourth all-time. In 2009, the Hokies advanced to the Sweet 16, which marks the first time in school history Tech advanced in the tournament.

Brittany Michels is entering her last season as a Hokie and is a huge part of the Tech defense. In 2010, she started all 21 games for Tech, while earning a spot on the ACC All-Academic team for the second straight year. She was named ACC Co-Player and Virginia Tech Athlete of the Week for her performance against Boston College, where she tallied a career-high three points by scoring a goal and assisting the game-winner.

The Virginia Beach, Va., native has played in over 65 games for the Hokies and has assisted the defense in shutouts against Murray State in the NCAA Tournament, then-No.10 Wake Forest, then-No. 1 North Carolina and NC State. She helped the Hokies tie their school-record nine shutouts in 2009 set in 2008.



**Kelly Conheeney** 

Junior Kelly Conheeney enters the 2011 season overflowing the Virginia Tech record books as she ranks fourth all-time with 15 career assists and 11th in career points with 42. She is tied for third in game-winning goals (7) and 12th in goals with 14.

The Ridgewood, N.J., native made 44 career starts and has played all 45 games Tech has had in the past two years. She was named to the 2010 VaSID All-State second team for the second consecutive year. Conheeney led the 2010 squad in points (21), assists (11) and game-winning goals (3). She attended both U-20 and U-23 National Camps in the summer of 2010. Conheeney looks to bring a lot of excitement and continue to be a huge impact this season.
