- The Hokies will face High Point Friday for their home opener at 7 p.m., before welcoming Elon on Sunday, Aug. 28. Tech is looking to record its 13th home-opening victory in its 18 years of existence.
- Junior Kelly Conheeney has scored a goal in each of the last two home openers, while seniors Brittany Michels, Katie Cramp and Brittany Popko have not lost an opening game at Thompson Field in their careers.

### **SCOUTING THE PANTHERS**

- The Panthers kicked off their 2011 season tying Navy on Aug. 19, beforing losing to Francis Marion on Sunday, Aug. 21, 2-1. High Point is coming off an 11-11-1 2010 season, including capturing the Big South title and facing No. 4 Maryland in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.
- HPU returns most of its squad, only losing three starters from last season. Leading the Panthers is sophomore Kelly Joline, who leads the team in every category except assists. She tallied 11 goals, 25 points and took 59 shots in 2010 as a freshman. Also returning is Katie Taber (5g, 5a, 15pts, 51s) and Sara Rager (9a, 17p).
- Andrea Ritchie will most likely be in goal for the Panthers. In 2010, she made 22 starts, while charting 85 saves, seven shutouts and posted an 11-10-0 record.

### **SERIES INFO**

- Tech holds the advantage with an undefeated all-time series record of 4-0. The two teams first met in 1996 and most recently collided in 2009, as the Hokies claimed a 2-0 victory on Thompson Field. The other two victories came in the 1998 and 2006 seasons. Tech has held the Panthers to only three goals throughout the years, while the Hokies have tallied 13.
- The Hokies hold a 25-7-2 all-time advantage against current teams from the Big South Conference.

#### **SCOUTING THE PHOENIX**

- The Phoenix return 16 players from last year's roster, including Chelsey Stark who recorded six goals last season. Elon lost Alana Winsper and Brittany Hallberg from 2010 who both were category leaders.
- In goal, the Phoenix lost Kristen Haney, who started all 21 games for Elon and recorded 61 saves and six shutouts last season. Possible starting keepers are Kate Murphy and Shannon Cosgove.

### **SERIES INFO**

- The Hokies hold a 2-0-0 undefeated all-time advantage over Elon. The two teams first met in 2007 and most recently collided last year, as Tech claimed a 2-1 victory in Elon, N.C.
- Tech holds a 16-8-1 all-time advantage against current teams from the Southern Conference.

#### LAST TIME OUT

Tech tops James Madison, 3-1, for the second consecutive win Yensen, Mayrose and Reeves all connect on goals

**HARRISONBURG, Va.** – The Hokie women's soccer squad defeated the James Madison Dukes, 3-1, on Sunday evening. Katie Yensen, Shannon Mayrose and Jazmine Reeves were the point-earners for Tech. This is the second consecutive win for the Hokies (2-0) as they opened their 2011 season with a road win over UNC Greensboro Friday night.

"We are excited with the win; it was a great battle between the squads," commented firstyear head coach Chugger Adair. "Our girls just came out for the occasion and played well. It was a great game for both teams, both teams played well and hard. We created a lot of chances and they scored a goal early in the second half and our girls responded well. Overall this is a huge win for us in the first week."

The Hokies' offense pushed the ball from the start of the game as it recorded four shots in the first 15 minutes of play. Yensen, a freshman, had five chances by the 21:09 mark, before she connected on a ball that Amanda Gerhard sent into the box that Yenson shot from 12-yards out into the left corner of the goal 27 minutes into the game to put Tech on the board, 1-0.

Ten minutes later, junior Kelly Conheeney sent a free kick from the middle of the field into the box and Mayrose sprinted ahead of the Dukes' defense and beat the JMU goalkeeper Kate Courter with an 8-yard shot into the left corner to give the Hokies the 2-0 advantage at the end of the half.

After the break, the Dukes (0-1-1) responded with an early goal that was set up by Jessica Barndt, as she sent a long throw-in from the left side of the field and was headed into the far corner of the goal by Yolie Anderson-Golhor that put JMU on the board.

After Conheeney had a chance with a penalty kick that the Duke keeper saved, Reeves was setup by Conheeney at the 81:01 mark, when she sent a ball into the box from the left touchline and it deflected off a JMU player, where Reeves knocked the ball into the net from 10-yards out to secure the game for the Hokies.

Tech just out-shot JMU by four shots as the Hokies tallied 15, while the Dukes charted 11. The Hokies started sophomore Dayle Colpitts in the goal, but left the game after a collision with a JMU player 37:06 into the game. Anna Romeiser replaced Colpitts for the final 52:54 minutes and she recorded two saves for Tech. JMU's redshirt-freshman goalkeeper Kate Courter made six saves.

### CONHEENEY HONORED BY COLLEGESOCCER360.COM

• For the opening weekend of the Divison I women's college soccer season, junior Kelly Conheeney was named a CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer Honoree. Conheeney helped lead the Hokies to a 2-0 start to the 2011 season. In the season opener against UNCG, Conheeney took four shots and connected on two of them, including the game-winning goal for Tech. She has scored the game-winning goal in every season opener in her career.

### **TOUGH COMPETITION**

• Six ACC women's soccer teams are included among the 2011 NSCAA preseason rankings, including four teams among the top six and five among the top 10. North Carolina holds a No. 3 preseason ranking in the poll, followed by 2010 College Cup participant Boston College at No. 4, Florida State at No. 5, Maryland follows at No. 6 and Virginia at No. 10. Defending ACC Champion Wake Forest holds the No. 18 spot.

#### **SEASONED VETS**

• The Hokies return five starters and four players who have played in at least 15 games from last year's squad. Now sophomores Jazmine Reeves and Dayle Colpitts both received ACC All-Freshmen accolades last season, while Kelly Conheeney was named to the 2010 VaSID All-State second team. Conheeney led the team in four categories, including shots (46), game-winning goals (3), assists (12) and points (22).



### **NCAA HISTORY**

• The Virginia Tech women's soccer program is coming off its third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and fourth all-time. In 2009, the Hokies advanced to the Sweet 16, which marked the first time in school history Tech advanced in the tournament.

Jazmine Reeves has been a huge aspect to the Tech offense for the past year. In 2010, she saw action in all 21 games, including 10 starts. She was named the team's co-Rookie of the Year, while earning a spot on the ACC All-Freshmen team. Against Dayton in the first round of the NCAA Tournament, she tallied a career-high eight shots. Reeves put up five goals last season, including the game-winner against Clemson.

The Dover, Del., native has started both games so far this season and helped the Hokies tally two consecutive wins over UNC Greensboro and James Madison. Against UNCG, she took four shots making one on goal, before connecting on her first goal of the season against JMU. She looks to continue to be a threat for the Hokies.



**Kelsey Loupee** 

Freshman Kelsey Loupee has already made her presence known for the Hokies. She made her first collegiate start in Tech's season opener against UNC Greensboro. She connected on her only shot of the game to tally her first career goal. She also found the back of the net in Tech's exhibition game against East Carolina, where she scored from 12-yards out.

The four-year letterwinner at Dakota Ridge High School, captained her squad as a sophomore, junior and senior. She earned first team All-Conference honors as a sophomore and junior and helped her team to a state championship in 2009, 2010 and 2011. Loupee was a member of the ECNL National League and Red Bull National League. She looks to have a standout freshman year for the Hokies.

HOKIES DOMINATE UNC GREENSBORO, 4-0, IN SEASON OPENERS

**GREENSBORO, N.C.** – The Hokie women's soccer squad opened the 2011 season with a 4-0 road victory over the UNC Greensboro Spartans Friday evening. Kelly Conheeney, Anne Lumpkin and freshman Kelsey Loupee were the point-earners, including two goals from Conheeney for Tech. This is the third year in a row that the Hokies have opened their season with a victory.

The Hokies dominated the ball from the start of the game, outshooting the Spartans (0-1) 7-2 in the first 45 minutes. After a UNCG defender got a hand on a Hokie cross in the box, Tech was awarded a penalty kick. Conheeney buried it with no problem at the 43:05 mark to give the Hokies a 1-0 lead heading into the break.

After the half, the Hokies picked up right where they left off, attacking the goal. Freshman Katie Yensen had the first chance, firing the first two shots of the half, giving Conheeney a chance for a corner kick. Lumpkin connected on the loose ball in the box from Conheeney's corner to make the score 2-0 two minutes into the period.

At the 57:24 mark, Lumpkin set Conheeney up for her second goal of the season as Conheeney fired from the right wing to give the Hokies the 3-0 advantage. Conheeney has scored a goal in every season opener in her career.

Making her first career start for the Hokies, Loupee secured the match with the final goal as she juked the keeper from eight yards back with 11 minutes to go.

Tech's defense shined throughout the match holding the UNC Greensboro to just four shots, while the Hokies fired 19. Sophomore Jazmine Reeves along with Conheeney led the squad both recording four shots each.

Charting the win for the Hokies is sophomore Dayle Colpitts, as she tallied two saves to record her fifth career shutout. UNC Greensboro's Kelsey Kearny made six saves.

TECH TOPS JAMES MADISON, 3-1, FOR THE SECOND CONSECUTIVE WIN HARRISONBURG, Va. – The Hokie women's soccer squad defeated the James Madison Dukes, 3-1, on Sunday evening. Katie Yensen, Shannon Mayrose and Jazmine Reeves were the point-earners, for Tech. This is the second consecutive win for the Hokies (2-0) as they opened their 2011 season with a road win over UNC Greensboro Friday night.

The Hokies' offense pushed the ball from the start of the game as it recorded four shots in the first 15 minutes of play. Yensen, a freshman, had five chances by the 21:09 mark, before she connected on a ball that Amanda Gerhard sent into the box that Yenson shot from 12-yards out into the left corner of the goal 27 minutes into the game to put Tech on the board, 1-0.

Ten minutes later, junior Kelly Conheeney sent a free kick from middle of field into the box and Mayrose sprinted ahead of the Dukes' defense and beat the JMU goalkeeper Kate Courter with an 8-yard shot into the left corner to give the Hokies the 2-0 advantage at the end of the half.

After the break, the Dukes (0-1-1) responded with an early goal that was set up by Jessica Barndt, as she sent a long throw-in from the left side of the field and was headed into the far corner of the goal by Yolie Anderson-Golhor that put JMU on the board.

After Conheeney had a chance with a penalty kick that the Duke keeper saved, Reeves was setup by Conheeney at the 81:01 mark, when she sent a ball into the box from the left touchline and it deflected off a JMU player, where Reeves knocked the ball into the net from 10-yards out to secure the game for the Hokies.

Tech just out-shot JMU by only four shots as the Hokies tallied 15, while the Dukes charted 11. The Hokies started sophomore Dayle Colpitts in the goal, but left the game after a collision with a JMU player 37:06 into the game. Anna Romeiser replaced Colpitts for the final 52:54 minutes and she recorded two saves for Tech. JMU's redshirt-freshman goalkeeper Kate Courter made six saves.
