• The Virginia Tech women's soccer team travels to Winston-Salem, N.C., this weekend to participate in the Wake Forest Tournament. Tech will face Campbell on Friday at 4 p.m., before an 11:30 a.m. matchup against Connecticut on Sunday. The Hokies (4-0-0) look to keep their unbeaten streak alive, while outscoring their opponents, 15-1, so far this season.

### SCOUTING THE CAMELS

• The Camels kicked off their 2011 season winning all three games so far, beating Francis Marion (3-0), Delaware State (5-0) and UMBC (2-0). Campbell is coming off an 8-10-1 2010 season, including wins over 2010 Big South Champion High Point, Longwood and a 4-0 shutout against South Carolina State.

• Ashley Clark leads the Camels with three goals on the season, including two gamewinners. The freshman forward has taken 15 shots and has recorded seven points for Campbell. Senior Marisa Muller follows Clark with two goals and one assist, while five other players have charted one goal each.

• Ryann Torrero will most likely be in goal for the Camels. The redshirt-junior has started all three games so far, recording two shutouts and five saves.

### **SERIES INFO**

• Campbell holds the advantage with an undefeated all-time series record, 3-0, over the Hokies. The two teams first met in 1993 which was Tech's first year as a varsity sport, and last collided in 1996, as the Camels claimed a 2-0 victory. The other matchup came in the 1995 season.

• The Hokies hold a 26-7-2 all-time advantage against current teams from the Big South Conference.

### SCOUTING THE HUSKIES

• The Huskies have started the 2011 season 1-1-0, with a 3-0 win over Colgate and a 2-1 loss to Northeastern. In 2010, Connecticut finished with a 10-10-3 record, including an appearance in the NCAA Tournament, where it fell to Hofstra in the first round, 1-0.

• Julie Hubbard leads the Huskies with one goal on the year, including nine shots and six shots on goal. In addition to the junior midfielder, three other players have recorded a goal for Connecticut.

• In goal for the Huskies will most likely be Jessica Dulski. The senior keeper has started both games for Connecticut, while allowing two goals and recording six saves on the season.

### **SERIES INFO**

• The Huskies hold a 3-0 undefeated all-time advantage over the Hokies. The two teams first met in 2001 and most recently collided in 2003, as Connecticut claimed a 5-3 victory in Blacksburg.

• Tech holds a 7-24-0 all-time record against current teams from the BIG EAST.

### Hokies remain undefeated cruising by Elon, 5-0

Conheeney scores two, Mayrose, Beaumont, Cramp all tally one goal each

**BLACKSBURG, Va.** – Junior Kelly Conheeney led the Virginia Tech women's soccer team to a 5-0 victory over the Elon Phoenix Sunday evening at Thompson Field. Shannon Mayrose, Rachel Beaumont and Katie Cramp also connected on one goal each. The Hokies remain unbeaten as they improve to 4-0-0 on the season.

The first half started a little slow. The two teams traded shots 10-minutes into the game, before Brittany Michels recorded a foul in the box to reward Elon (1-1-1) with a penalty kick in the 17<sup>th</sup> minute. Jaclyn Wood took the penalty kick for the Phoenix before Hokie keeper, Anna Romeiser made the huge stop for Tech.

Tech came alive after the save, as it recorded two shots and a corner kick before Conheeney connected on a header from Mayrose in front of the goal at the 25:30 mark, to give the Hokies the lead, 1-0.

Eight minutes later, Mayrose found the back of the net on a deflected shot from Jazmine Reeves to record her third goal of the season and put Tech up two. Shortly after, Mayrose shot a ball that hit the side of the post and Conheeney sinked the deflected ball to make it, 3-0 going into the break.

Beaumont recorded her first career goal in the 70<sup>th</sup> minute, as she head in a corner kick from freshman Kelsey Loupee. 10 minutes later, Loupee dished it to Cramp that shot from six-yards back to tally the last goal for the Hokies.

As a team, the Hokies took 25 shots and four corner kicks, while holding Elon to just three shots and one corner. Tech has held three of its four opponents to no more than four shots, while outscoring all of its opponents, 15-1, so far this season.

Romeiser recorded the shutout for Tech, while Elon's Shannon Cosgrove took the loss. Taylor Dawson and Kate Murphy saw time in goal for the Phoenix, charting two saves each. Redshirt-freshman Kimberley Anderson recorded the last 10-minutes for the Hokies.

### HOKIES RANKED NATIONALLY

• The Hokies have entered the Top-25 in the Soccer America rankings, sitting tied for 25 with Pepperdine. Tech is also starting to receive votes in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America Poll. This week they received 48 votes, just missing the Top-25.

### **CONHEENEY OVERFLOWS THE RECORD BOOKS**

• Junior midfielder Kelly Conheeney has reached the top 10 in every category except two in Tech's all-time record book. She recently tied former-teammate Marika Gray for first place in game-winning goals with nine, after scoring the game-winner against Elon. Conheeney also sits tied for third in assists (17), tied for fourth in multiple goal games (4), seventh in points (53), tied for eighth in goals (18) and tenth in shots (121).

### GOALS, GOALS, GOALS

• The Hokies are dominating their opponents on offense this season. Tech holds a 15-1 scoring record against its opponents in just four games. Three Hokies have recorded two goals and four or more points each, including Shannon Mayrose (3g, 8pts.), Julia Goldsworthy (2g, 4pts.) and Kelly Conheeney (4g, 10pts.). Six other Hokies have recorded one goal each, including freshmen Kelsey Loupee and Katie Yensen.

### **DEFENSE SHUTS IT DOWN**

• In the first four games this season, the Hokie defense has shut down its opponents by only allowing one goal so far. James Madison was the only team to be able to fire double-figure shots against the Hokies, while Elon, High Point and UNC Greensboro were limited to no more than four against Tech. Goalkeeper Anna Romeiser denied her first career penalty kick against Elon, while saving all three shots the Phoenix took.

### **CONHEENEY HONORED BY COLLEGESOCCER360.COM**

• For the opening weekend of the Divison I women's college soccer season, junior Kelly Conheeney was named a CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer Honoree. Conheeney helped lead the Hokies to a 2-0 start to the 2011 season. In the season opener against UNCG, Conheeney took four shots and connected on two of them, including the game-winning goal for Tech. She has scored the game-winning goal in every season opener in her career.

### **TOUGH COMPETITION**

• Seven ACC women's soccer teams are included among the Top-25 NSCAA rankings, including four teams among the top seven and five among the top 10. North Carolina holds the No. 1 spot in the poll, followed by Maryland at No. 3, Virginia at No. 4, Florida State follows at No. 7 and Duke at No. 9. Boston College holds the No. 12 spot and defending ACC Champion Wake Forest is No. 15.

### SEASONED VETS

• The Hokies return five starters and four players who have played in at least 15 games from last year's squad. Now sophomores Jazmine Reeves and Dayle Colpitts both received ACC All-Freshmen accolades last season, while Kelly Conheeney was named to the 2010 VaSID All-State second team. Conheeney led the team in four categories, including shots (46), game-winning goals (3), assists (12) and points (22).

### NCAA HISTORY

• The Virginia Tech women's soccer program is coming off its third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and fourth all-time. In 2009, the Hokies advanced to the Sweet 16, which marked the first time in school history Tech advanced in the tournament.

HOKIES DOMINATE UNC GREENSBORO, 4-0, IN SEASON OPENERS

**GREENSBORO**, N.C. – The Hokie women's soccer squad opened the 2011 season with a 4-0 road victory over the UNC Greensboro Spartans Friday evening. Kelly Conheeney, Anne Lumpkin and freshman Kelsey Loupee were the point-earners, including two goals from Conheeney for Tech. This is the third year in a row that the Hokies have opened their season with a victory.

The Hokies dominated the ball from the start of the game, outshooting the Spartans (0-1) 7-2 in the first 45 minutes. After a UNCG defender got a hand on a Hokie cross in the box, Tech was awarded a penalty kick. Conheeney buried it with no problem at the 43:05 mark to give the Hokies a 1-0 lead heading into the break.

After the half, the Hokies picked up right where they left off, attacking the goal. Freshman Katie Yensen had the first chance, firing the first two shots of the half, giving Conheeney a chance for a corner kick. Lumpkin connected on the loose ball in the box from Conheeney's corner to make the score 2-0 two minutes into the period.

At the 57:24 mark, Lumpkin set Conheeney up for her second goal of the season as Conheeney fired from the right wing to give the Hokies the 3-0 advantage. Conheeney has scored a goal in every season opener in her career.

Making her first career start for the Hokies, Loupee secured the match with the final goal as she juked the keeper from eight yards back with 11 minutes to go.

Tech's defense shined throughout the match holding the UNC Greensboro to just four shots, while the Hokies fired 19. Sophomore Jazmine Reeves along with Conheeney led the squad both recording four shots each.

Charting the win for the Hokies is sophomore Dayle Colpitts, as she tallied two saves to record her fifth career shutout. UNC Greensboro's Kelsey Kearny made six saves.

#### TECH TOPS JAMES MADISON, 3-1, FOR THE SECOND CONSECUTIVE WIN HARRISONBURG, Va. – The Hokie women's soccer squad defeated the James

Madison Dukes, 3-1, on Sunday evening. Katie Yensen, Shannon Mayrose and Jazmine Reeves were the point-earners, for Tech. This is the second consecutive win for the Hokies (2-0) as they opened their 2011 season with a road win over UNC Greensboro Friday night.

The Hokies' offense pushed the ball from the start of the game as it recorded four shots in the first 15 minutes of play. Yensen, a freshman, had five chances by the 21:09 mark, before she connected on a ball that Amanda Gerhard sent into the box that Yenson shot from 12-yards out into the left corner of the goal 27 minutes into the game to put Tech on the board, 1-0.

Ten minutes later, junior Kelly Conheeney sent a free kick from middle of field into the box and Mayrose sprinted ahead of the Dukes' defense and beat the JMU goalkeeper Kate Courter with an 8-yard shot into the left corner to give the Hokies the 2-0 advantage at the end of the half.

After the break, the Dukes (0-1-1) responded with an early goal that was set up by Jessica Barndt, as she sent a long throw-in from the left side of the field and was headed into the far corner of the goal by Yolie Anderson-Golhor that put JMU on the board.

After Conheeney had a chance with a penalty kick that the Duke keeper saved, Reeves was setup by Conheeney at the 81:01 mark, when she sent a ball into the box from the left touchline and it deflected off a JMU player, where Reeves knocked the ball into the net from 10-yards out to secure the game for the Hokies.

Tech just out-shot JMU by only four shots as the Hokies tallied 15, while the Dukes charted 11. The Hokies started sophomore Dayle Colpitts in the goal, but left the game after a collision with a JMU player 37:06 into the game. #### HOKIES REMAIN UNDEFEATED CRUISING BY ELON, 5-0

BLACKSBURG, Va. – Junior Kelly Conheeney led the Virginia Tech women's soccer team to a, 5-0, victory over the Elon Phoenix Sunday evening at Thompson Field. Shannon Mayrose, Rachel Beaumont and Katie Cramp also connected on one goal each. The Hokies remain unbeaten as they improve to 4-0-0 on the season.

The first half started a little slow. The two teams traded shots 10-minutes into the game, before Brittany Michels recorded a foul in the box to reward Elon (1-1-1) with a penalty kick in the 17<sup>th</sup> minute. Jaclyn Wood took the penalty kick for the Phoenix before Hokie keeper, Anna Romeiser made the huge stop for Tech.

Tech came alive after the save, as it recorded two shots and a corner kick before Conheeney connected on a header from Mayrose in front of the goal at the 25:30 mark, to give the Hokies the lead, 1-0.

As a team, the Hokies took 25 shots and four corner kicks, while holding Elon to just three shots and one corner. Tech has held three of its four opponents to no more than four shots, while outscoring all of its opponents, 15-1, so far this season.
