• The Virginia Tech women's soccer team travels to Winston-Salem, N.C., this weekend to participate in the Wake Forest Tournament. Tech will face Campbell on Friday at 4 p.m., before an 11:30 a.m. matchup against Connecticut on Sunday. The Hokies (4-0-0) look to keep their unbeaten streak alive, while outscoring their opponents, 15-1, so far this season.

SCOUTING THE CAMELS

- The Camels kicked off their 2011 season winning all three games so far, beating Francis Marion (3-0), Delaware State (5-0) and UMBC (2-0). Campbell is coming off an 8-10-1 2010 season, including wins over 2010 Big South Champion High Point, Longwood and a 4-0 shutout against South Carolina State.
- Ashley Clark leads the Camels with three goals on the season, including two game-winners. The freshman forward has taken 15 shots and has recorded seven points for Campbell. Senior Marisa Muller follows Clark with two goals and one assist, while five other players have charted one goal each.
- Ryann Torrero will most likely be in goal for the Camels. The redshirt-junior has started all three games so far, recording two shutouts and five saves.

SERIES INFO

- Campbell holds the advantage with an undefeated all-time series record, 3-0, over the Hokies. The two teams first met in 1993 which was Tech's first year as a varsity sport, and last collided in 1996, as the Camels claimed a 2-0 victory. The other matchup came in the 1995 season.
- The Hokies hold a 26-7-2 all-time advantage against current teams from the Big South Conference.

SCOUTING THE HUSKIES

- The Huskies have started the 2011 season 1-1-0, with a 3-0 win over Colgate and a 2-1 loss to Northeastern. In 2010, Connecticut finished with a 10-10-3 record, including an appearance in the NCAA Tournament, where it fell to Hofstra in the first round, 1-0.
- Julie Hubbard leads the Huskies with one goal on the year, including nine shots and six shots on goal. In addition to the junior midfielder, three other players have recorded a goal for Connecticut.
- In goal for the Huskies will most likely be Jessica Dulski. The senior keeper has started both games for Connecticut, while allowing two goals and recording six saves on the season.

SERIES INFO

- The Huskies hold a 3-0 undefeated all-time advantage over the Hokies. The two teams first met in 2001 and most recently collided in 2003, as Connecticut claimed a 5-3 victory in Blacksburg.
- Tech holds a 7-24-0 all-time record against current teams from the BIG EAST.

LAST TIME OUT

Hokies remain undefeated cruising by Elon, 5-0

Conheaney scores two, Mayrose, Beaumont, Cramp all tally one goal each

BLACKSBURG, Va. – Junior Kelly Conheaney led the Virginia Tech women's soccer team to a 5-0 victory over the Elon Phoenix Sunday evening at Thompson Field. Shannon Mayrose, Rachel Beaumont and Katie Cramp also connected on one goal each. The Hokies remain unbeaten as they improve to 4-0-0 on the season.

The first half started a little slow. The two teams traded shots 10-minutes into the game, before Brittany Michels recorded a foul in the box to reward Elon (1-1-1) with a penalty kick in the 17th minute. Jaclyn Wood took the penalty kick for the Phoenix before Hokie keeper, Anna Romeiser made the huge stop for Tech.

Tech came alive after the save, as it recorded two shots and a corner kick before Conheaney connected on a header from Mayrose in front of the goal at the 25:30 mark, to give the Hokies the lead, 1-0.

Eight minutes later, Mayrose found the back of the net on a deflected shot from Jazmine Reeves to record her third goal of the season and put Tech up two. Shortly after, Mayrose shot a ball that hit the side of the post and Conheaney sunked the deflected ball to make it, 3-0 going into the break.

Beaumont recorded her first career goal in the 70th minute, as she head in a corner kick from freshman Kelsey Loupee. 10 minutes later, Loupee dished it to Cramp that shot from six-yards back to tally the last goal for the Hokies.

As a team, the Hokies took 25 shots and four corner kicks, while holding Elon to just three shots and one corner. Tech has held three of its four opponents to no more than four shots, while outscoring all of its opponents, 15-1, so far this season.

Romeiser recorded the shutout for Tech, while Elon's Shannon Cosgrove took the loss. Taylor Dawson and Kate Murphy saw time in goal for the Phoenix, charting two saves each. Redshirt-freshman Kimberley Anderson recorded the last 10-minutes for the Hokies.

HOKIES RANKED NATIONALLY

• The Hokies have entered the Top-25 in the Soccer America rankings, sitting tied for 25 with Pepperdine. Tech is also starting to receive votes in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America Poll. This week they received 48 votes, just missing the Top-25.

CONHEENEY OVERFLOWS THE RECORD BOOKS

• Junior midfielder Kelly Conheaney has reached the top 10 in every category except two in Tech's all-time record book. She recently tied former-teammate Marika Gray for first place in game-winning goals with nine, after scoring the game-winner against Elon. Conheaney also sits tied for third in assists (17), tied for fourth in multiple goal games (4), seventh in points (53), tied for eighth in goals (18) and tenth in shots (121).

GOALS, GOALS, GOALS

• The Hokies are dominating their opponents on offense this season. Tech holds a 15-1 scoring record against its opponents in just four games. Three Hokies have recorded two goals and four or more points each, including Shannon Mayrose (3g, 8pts.), Julia Goldsworthy (2g, 4pts.) and Kelly Conheaney (4g, 10pts.). Six other Hokies have recorded one goal each, including freshmen Kelsey Loupee and Katie Yensen.

DEFENSE SHUTS IT DOWN

• In the first four games this season, the Hokie defense has shut down its opponents by only allowing one goal so far. James Madison was the only team to be able to fire double-figure shots against the Hokies, while Elon, High Point and UNC Greensboro were limited to no more than four against Tech. Goalkeeper Anna Romeiser denied her first career penalty kick against Elon, while saving all three shots the Phoenix took.

CONHEENEY HONORED BY COLLEGESOCCER360.COM

• For the opening weekend of the Division I women's college soccer season, junior Kelly Conheeny was named a CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer Honoree. Conheeny helped lead the Hokies to a 2-0 start to the 2011 season. In the season opener against UNCG, Conheeny took four shots and connected on two of them, including the game-winning goal for Tech. She has scored the game-winning goal in every season opener in her career.

TOUGH COMPETITION

• Seven ACC women's soccer teams are included among the Top-25 NSCAA rankings, including four teams among the top seven and five among the top 10. North Carolina holds the No. 1 spot in the poll, followed by Maryland at No. 3, Virginia at No. 4, Florida State follows at No. 7 and Duke at No. 9. Boston College holds the No. 12 spot and defending ACC Champion Wake Forest is No. 15.

SEASONED VETS

• The Hokies return five starters and four players who have played in at least 15 games from last year's squad. Now sophomores Jazmine Reeves and Dayle Colpitts both received ACC All-Freshmen accolades last season, while Kelly Conheeny was named to the 2010 VaSID All-State second team. Conheeny led the team in four categories, including shots (46), game-winning goals (3), assists (12) and points (22).

NCAA HISTORY

• The Virginia Tech women's soccer program is coming off its third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and fourth all-time. In 2009, the Hokies advanced to the Sweet 16, which marked the first time in school history Tech advanced in the tournament.

Shannon Mayrose

After sitting out the past two seasons due to back-to-back knee injuries, redshirt-sophomore Shannon Mayrose has already made a big impact in these first four games. She has scored three goals, including the game-winner against James Madison, while dishing two assists in the win against Elon.

The Freehold, N.J., native had a successful high school career at Freehold Boro. She helped her squad become the New Jersey Group 3 Champions in 2006 and 2007. In 2007, Mayrose was named New Jersey Gatorade Player of the Year and Freehold Boro High School Athlete of the Year. The feisty player who loves the game, looks to continue to be a big threat this season.



Julia Goldsworthy

Junior Julia Goldsworthy has been a big help to the Hokie defense so far this season. Goldsworthy has helped Tech hold three of its opponents to no more than four shots and three shutouts this season. She tallied the first multi-goal game of her career in the 3-0 victory against High Point.

The Jamison, Pa., native played in all 21 games last season, making 20 starts. She scored her second goal of her career against North Carolina in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals. Goldsworthy helped the Hokies shut out NC State and Clemson to closeout the regular season. The junior defender attacks the ball and makes a big difference on the field and looks to have a great 2011 season.

Shannon Mayrose, Rachel Beaumont and Katie Cramp also connected on one goal each. The Hokies remain unbeaten as they improve to 4-0-0 on the season.

The first half started a little slow.
