- The Virginia Tech women's soccer team returns home this weekend to host the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational. The Hokies will welcome ACC opponent Wake Forest, Nebraska and Loyola (Md.). Tech will not face Wake Forest this weekend, but will travel to back Winston-Salem, N.C., on Sept. 29 during conference play.
- This will be the seventh tournament the Hokies have hosted in Blacksburg. Tech holds a 9-2-1 home tournament record.

### SCOUTING THE CORNHUSKERS

- The Cornhuskers have started off the 2011 season 2-2-1, including two big wins over Arkansas (6-0) and North Arizona (8-1). Nebraska opened its season with a loss over then-No. 3 North Carolina, 1-2, before tying Baylor (1-1) and then dropping a 3-2 match at Denver
- Morgan Marlborough leads the Cornhuskers with seven goals on the season, including two game-winners. The junior forward has taken 21 shots and has recorded 15 points for Nebraska. Junior Jordan Jackson follows Marlborough with four goals and four assist, while Stacy Bartels has tallied three goals and one assist.
- Emma Stevens will most likely be in goal for the Nebraska. The sophomore has started all five games so far, recording 20 saves, while allowing six goals.

### **SERIES INFO**

• This will be the first meeting between the two teams. The Hokies hold a 0-3-0 all-time record against current teams from the Big Ten Conference, as they faced Indiana and Minnesota in 1994 and Ohio State in 2004.

### **SCOUTING THE GREYHOUNDS**

- The Greyhounds have started the 2011 season 1-5-0, including a 4-2 win over Saint Louis this past weekend. Loyola had trouble finding the back of the net in its first four games, before scoring its first two goals of the season in a 3-2 loss against High Point last Friday.
- Nicole Schiro leads the Greyhounds with two goal on the year, including six points and 12 shots. Schiro is the only Greyhound with more than one goal, four other players have scored for Loyola. Lauren Norcia has one goal and two assists on the year.
- In goal for the Huskies will most likely be Didi Haracic. The sophomore keeper has played all six games allowing 22 goals and recording 34 saves for the Greyhounds.

### **SERIES INFO**

- The Hokies hold a 1-0-1 all-time advantage over the Greyhounds. The two teams first met in 2000 and most recently collided in 2007, when they tied 1-1 during the Hawthorn Suites Hokie Invitational in Blacksburg.
- Loyola is the only current team from the MAAC that the Hokies have faced.

### LAST TIME OUT

Hokies match best season start as they shut out Connecticut, 1-0
Freshman Kelsey Loupee connected on the game-winner

**WINSTON-SALEM, N.C.** – The Hokies finished the Wake Forest Tournament undefeated as they shutout Connecticut 1-0 on Sunday afternoon. Freshman Kelsey Loupee recorded her second career goal in the 79th minute to secure the victory. Tech hasn't started a season 6-0-0 since 1994. The Huskies fell to 2-2-0 on the year.

"This was our best performance of the year," first-year head coach Chugger Adair said. "It was a little frustrating that it was 0-0 for a long time, but we had control the whole game. Our girls played well, it's a shame we couldn't score more but their goalkeeper played really well. We got to keep going and prepare for Nebraska on Friday."

The Hokies dominated the whole game out shooting the Huskies 20-2, while taking 14 corner kicks. Three minutes into the first half, the Tech had an opportunity to score off of its first corner kick by Loupee and Kelly Conheeney took her first shot of the game. The Hokies would take six corners in the period, while limiting UConn to one.

Tech took 10 shots before Loupee found the back of the net from the top of the box at the 79:06 mark to give the Hokies the victory. Sophomore Jazmine Reeves recorded the assist.

Tech's defense played extremely well, holding the Huskies to only two shots the whole game that all came in the second half. Sophomore Dayle Colpitts was in goal for the Hokies as she tallied her 12th career victory. Keeper Jessica Dulski charted the loss for Connecticut and recorded six saves.

The Hokies had four players make the All-Tournament team, including Shannon Mayrose, Brittany Popko, Loupee and Conheeney.

### TECH DOMINATES WAKE FOREST TOURNAMENT

• Last weekend Tech dominated the Wake Forest Tournament, recording wins over Campbell (3-2) and Connecticut (1-0). Four Hokies were named to the All-Tournament team, including Shannon Mayrose, Brittany Popko, Kelsey Loupee and Kelly Conheeney.

### HOKIES RANKED NATIONALLY

• After recieving 48 votes last week in the National Soccer Coachs Association of America poll, the Hokies enter this week at No. 25. In addition to the NSCAA Poll, Tech entered the Top-25 in the Soccer America rankings last week, sitting tied for 25 with Pepperdine. This week Tech jumped up to No. 15.

### CONHEENEY AND COLPITTS OVERFLOW THE RECORD BOOKS

- Junior midfielder Kelly Conheeney has reached the top 10 in every category except two in Tech's all-time record book. She recently took over first place in game-winning goals with 10, after scoring the game-winner against Campbell. Conheeney is also tied for first in multiple goal games (5), tied for third in assists (17), fourth in points (57), tied for fifth in goals (20) and ninth in shots (134).
- In addition to Conheeney, sophomore keeper Dayle Colpitts has also reached the top 10 in every goalie category except two in Tech's all-time record book. Colpitts sits first in goals against average with 1.00, tied for fifth in wins (12), sixth in minutes (2,130) and seventh in shutouts (6).

### GOALS, GOALS, GOALS

- The Hokies are dominating their opponents on offense this season. Tech holds a 19-3 scoring record against its opponents in six games. Three Hokies have recorded two goals and four or more points each, including Shannon Mayrose (4g, 11pts.), Julia Goldsworthy (2g, 4pts.), Kelly Conheeney (6g, 14pts.) and freshman Kelsey Loupee (2g, 7pts). Jazmine Reeves has six points on the year, including one goal and four assists.
- Five other Hokies have recorded one goal each, including freshman Katie Yenson.

### **DEFENSE SHUTS IT DOWN**

- In the first six games this season, the Hokie defense has shut down its opponents by only allowing only three goals so far. James Madison and Campbell are the only teams to able to find the back of the net against the Hokies.
- James Madison was the only team to be able to fire double-figure shots against the Hokies, while Elon, High Point and UNC Greensboro were limited to no more than four against Tech. UConn is the season low so far for the Hokies, as the Huskers were limited to just two shots. Goalkeeper Anna Romeiser denied her first career penalty kick against Elon, while saving all three shots the Phoenix took.

### CONHEENEY HONORED BY COLLEGESOCCER360.COM

• For the opening weekend of the Divison I women's college soccer season, junior Kelly Conheeney was named a CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer Honoree. Conheeney helped lead the Hokies to a 2-0 start to the 2011 season. In the season opener against UNCG, Conheeney took four shots and connected on two of them, including the game-winning goal for Tech. She has scored the game-winning goal in every season opener in her career.

### **TOUGH COMPETITION**

• Eight ACC women's soccer teams are included among the Top-25 NSCAA rankings, including five teams among the top 10. North Carolina holds the No. 1 spot in the poll, followed by Maryland at No. 3, Florida State at No. 5, Virginia follows at No. 7 and Duke at No. 10. Boston College holds the No. 15 spot, defending ACC Champion Wake Forest is No. 18 and the Hokies are No. 25.


### **SEASONED VETS**

• The Hokies return five starters and four players who have played in at least 15 games from last year's squad. Now sophomores Jazmine Reeves and Dayle Colpitts both received ACC All-Freshmen accolades last season, while Kelly Conheeney was named to the 2010 VaSID All-State second team. Conheeney led the team in four categories, including shots (46), game-winning goals (3), assists (12) and points (22).

### **NCAA HISTORY**

• The Virginia Tech women's soccer program is coming off its third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and fourth all-time. In 2009, the Hokies advanced to the Sweet 16, which marked the first time in school history Tech advanced in the tournament.

Freshman midfielder Katie Yensen has made a tremendous impact for the Hokies this season as she has started all six games so far. She scored her first collegiate goal against James Madison, while taking five shots. Yensen is second on the team in shots with 19. The freshman is not afraid to attack the ball, she brings a lot of speed and threat to the Tech offense.

The Falls Church, Va., native had a successful high school career at McLean. A four-year starter, Yensen, helped her team to a district championship and trip to the regional finals in 2009. Kaite earned First Team All-District and Second Team All-Region honors through her career, while playing club ball for the McLean Strikers for four seasons. The Strikers was one of the top 10 teams in the nation.

Redshirt-sophomore Anna Romeiser has stepped up tremedously as Dayle Colpitts was injured in the James Madison game. Making the next three starts after recording the win against JMU, Romeiser recorded the next shutout against High Point. Anna has recorded 11 saves, including a huge game-changer when she saved a penalty kick against Elon. In four games, she has only allowed one goal.

The Roanoke, Va., native had a successful high school career at Hidden Valley. She only allowed three regular season goals in her final campaign in 2009. Anna earned All-District, All-Reagion, and All-Timesland first team honors as a senior. She has helped her team to state semifinals all four years, including state finals in 2007 and 2009 and a state championship in 2006.
