• The Virginia Tech women's soccer team will take on the Appalachian State Mountaineers Thursday night at Thompson Field, before traveling to College Park, Md., for its ACC opener against the Maryland Terps.

SCOUTING THE MOUNTAINEERS

• The Appalachian State Mountaineers have started the 2011 season 3-3-0 with wins over UNC Asheville, Longwood and Virginia Commonwealth. The Mountaineers average 8.2 shots per game, while connecting on four goals this season.
• Freshman Julia Holz leads App State with two goals on the season and seven shots. Senior Katy Dodd and freshman Callie Johnson have both connected on one goal each for the Mountaineers.
• Sophomore Amy Kolowsky will most likely be in goal for the App State. The keeper has started all six games so far, recording 35 saves and two shutouts, while allowing five goals.

SERIES INFO

• This will be the second all-time meeting between the two teams. The Hokies and Mountaineers first met in 1994 where Tech defeated Appalachian State, 3-0, in Buies Creek, N.C.
• Tech holds a 17-8-1 all-time advantage against current teams in the Southern Conference, with a most recent 5-0 win over Elon on Aug. 28.

SCOUTING THE TERPS

• The Terps, who are currently ranked No. 6 in the NSCAA Poll, have started the 2011 season 6-0-2, including tying 0-0 with No. 1 Stanford and James Madison. Maryland has shutout all but one opponent, American, as they scored the only goal against the Terps. Maryland has outscored its opponents 24-1 so far, while averaging 19.4 shots per game.
• Junior Olivia Wagner leads the squad with four goals, one assist and nine points on the season. Four other Terps have recorded three goals each.
• In goal for Maryland will most likely be Yewande Balogun. The senior keeper has played all eight games allowing just one goal and recording 27 saves, while charting five shutouts for the Terps.

SERIES INFO

• The Hokies hold a 4-2-2 all-time advantage over the Terps. The two teams first met in 1995 and most recently collided in 2010, when the Hokies defeated Maryland 1-0 in Blacksburg. The Hokies are 2-2-1 in College Park, Md.

LAST TIME OUT

Tech closes Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational with a 3-0 win over Loyola
Michels, Cramp and Conheeneey connect on one goal each

BLACKSBURG, Va. – The Virginia Tech women's soccer team closed out the Hilton Garden Invitational with a 3-0 victory over the Loyola Greyhounds Sunday afternoon on Thompson Field. Brittany Michels, Katie Cramp and Kelly Conheeneey each connected on one goal for the Hokies.

Tech (7-1-0) set the tone for the game early in the first half as it dominated the Greyhounds (1-7-0) offensively and kept control of possession the entire half. Brittany Michels was very active on corner kicks as the Hokies tallied seven in the half, but she was unable to get a hold of anything.

Tech took the shooting edge in the first half 14-1, while it was a true team effort from the Greyhounds in the first half as they recorded three team saves.

The hard work finally paid off for Michels in front of the net, as she was able to get a hold of a Kelsey Loupee corner kick and head it into the back of the net in the 49th minute.

Kelly Conheeneey put the Hokies up 2-0 in the 67th minute, after Jazmine Reeves was taken down just inches outside the 18-yard box. Tech was awarded a free kick that was lifted over the Loyola wall and soared over the keeper's hands into the back of the net.

Tech tacked on another goal at the 78:14 mark when Anne Lumpkin served in a long ball from the right sideline that Katie Cramp was able to get a head on as she rose above the crowd and redirected the ball into the top left side of the net.

Anna Romeiser got the start in goal for the Hokies, played the full 90 minutes and stopped Loyola's only shot. Haracic also lasted the full 90 minutes and made 12 of the team's 15 saves.

PARTY LIKE ITS 1994

• Before falling to Nebraska, 3-4, in double-overtime, the Hokies matched their best season start with six consecutive wins since 1994. The 1994 squad shutout five of the six opponents, while outscoring them 18-1. In the six victories this season, Tech has shutout four of its eight opponents, while outscoring them 19-3.

HOKIES HOST HILTON GARDEN INVITATIONAL

• The Hokies hosted the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational last weekend, inviting ACC-opponent Wake Forest, Nebraska and Loyola (Md.). Tech did not see action against Wake Forest and fell to the Nebraska Cornhuskers in a thrilling double-overtime game Saturday. Tech closed the invitational with a shutout against Loyola, including four Hokies being selected to the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational All-Tournament Team. Ashley Manning, Kelly Conheeneey, Brittany Popko and Anne Lumpkin all made the squad.

TECH DOMINATES WAKE FOREST TOURNAMENT

• Tech dominated the Wake Forest Tournament, recording wins over Campbell (3-2) and Connecticut (1-0). Four Hokies were named to the All-Tournament team, including Shannon Mayrose, Brittany Popko, Kelsey Loupee and Kelly Conheeneey.

HOKIES RANKED NATIONALLY

• After receiving 48 votes the third week in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America poll, the Hokies entered week four at No. 25. In addition to the NSCAA Poll, Tech entered the Top-25 in the Soccer America rankings the previous week, sitting tied for 25 with Pepperdine. Week four Tech jumped up to No. 15, but fell to No. 20 this week.

2011 HOKIES OVERFLOW THE RECORD BOOKS

- Junior midfielder Kelly Conheeneey has reached the top 10 in every category except two in Tech's all-time record book. She recently took over first place in game-winning goals with 10, after scoring the game-winner against Campbell. Conheeneey is also tied for first in multiple goal games (5), tied for third in assists (17), fourth in points (57), tied for fifth in goals (20) and ninth in shots (134).
- Sophomore keeper Dayle Colpitts has also reached the top 10 in every goalie category except two in Tech's all-time record book. Colpitts sits first in goals against average with 1.00, tied for fifth in wins (12), sixth in minutes (2,158) and seventh in shutouts (6).
- Senior Brittany Michels just entered the top-10 in career games played as she sits tied for ninth with 75. She will have a chance to beat out former teammate Jennifer Harvey (86) for the top spot towards the end of the season.
- In addition to Colpitts, redshirt-sophomore Anna Romeiser entered the Tech's all-time record books at the goal position. She currently sits tied for tenth in career shutouts (2) and tied for eleventh in career wins with five.

GOALS, GOALS, GOALS

- The Hokies are dominating their opponents on offense this season. Tech holds a 25-7 scoring record against its opponents in eight games. Kelly Conheeneey leads the team with an impressive eight goals and two assists this season. In addition to Conheeneey, seven Hokies have recorded two goals and at least four points each, including Shannon Mayrose (4g, 11pts), Kelsey Loupee (2g, 8pts), Anne Lumpkin (2g, 6pts), Katie Cramp (2g, 4pts) and Julia Goldsworthy (2g, 4pts).
- Five other Hokies have recorded one goal each, including Jazmine Reeves, who leads the team in assists with six on the season.

DEFENSE SHUTS IT DOWN

- In the first eight games this season, the Hokie defense has shut down its opponents by allowing only seven goals so far. James Madison, Campbell and Nebraska are the only teams to find the back of the net against the Hokies.
- Tech was able to limit the Loyola Greyhounds this past weekend to only one shot, which marks the fewest shots taken since last year against American on Aug. 23, 2010. James Madison and Nebraska were the only teams to be able to fire double-figure shots against the Hokies, while Elon, High Point and UNC Greensboro were limited to no more than four against Tech. Goalkeeper Anna Romeiser denied her first career penalty kick against Elon, while saving all three shots the Phoenix took.

CONHEENEY HONORED BY COLLEGESOCCER360.COM

- For the opening weekend of the Divison I women's college soccer season, junior Kelly Conheeneey was named a CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer Honoree. Conheeneey helped lead the Hokies to a 2-0 start to the 2011 season. In the season opener against UNCG, Conheeneey took four shots and connected on two of them, including the game-winning goal for Tech. She has scored the game-winning goal in every season opener in her career.

HOKIES LEAD ACC

- Several Hokies sit in the top-10 in all stat categories in the ACC with six holding the top spots so far this season. Kelly Conheeneey is listed in seven categories and is no lower than third place in each. See column for all the Hokies in the ACC Top-10.

TOUGH COMPETITION

- Eight ACC women's soccer teams are included among the Top-25 NSCAA rankings, including five teams among the top 10. North Carolina holds the No. 1 spot in the poll, followed by Maryland at No. 3, Florida State at No. 5, Virginia at No. 7 and Duke at No. 10. Boston College holds the No. 15 spot, defending ACC Champion Wake Forest is No. 18 and the Hokies are No. 25.

SEASONED VETS

• The Hokies return five starters and four players who have played in at least 15 games from last year's squad. Sophomores Jazmine Reeves and Dayle Colpitts both received ACC All-Freshmen accolades last season, while Kelly Conheeny was named to the 2010 VaSID All-State second team. Conheeny led the team in four categories, including shots (46), game-winning goals (3), assists (12) and points (22).

NCAA HISTORY

• The Virginia Tech women's soccer program is coming off its third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and fourth all-time. In 2009, the Hokies advanced to the Sweet 16, which marked the first time in school history Tech advanced in the tournament.

NEBRASKA EDGES WOMEN'S SOCCER 4-3 IN DOUBLE-OVERTIME

BLACKSBURG, Va. – The Virginia Tech women's soccer team fell to Nebraska, 4-3 in a thrilling double-overtime game on the first day of the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational Friday night at Thompson Field. Kelly Conheaney, Anne Lumpkin and Ashley Manning all put the points on the board for the Hokies (6-1-0).

Tech started attacking the goal right when the clock started taking the first eight shots of the game, including a corner kick from freshman Kelsey Loupee a minute into the half. The Huskers would eventually take two shots before Conheaney put the first point on the board with a header off a cross ball from Kelsey Mitchell to give the Hokies the 1-0 lead.

Nebraska fired right back with a sneaky shot from Jordan Jackson 35 yards back that went over keeper Anna Romeiser's head and landed into the goal in the 33rd minute. The two teams went into the break tied 1-1.

Tech started the second period right where it left off, taking the next two shots and a corner before Jazmine Reeves dished a quick ball to Manning and Manning fired it over to Lumpkin where she found the back of the net from 12 yards back at the 51:59 mark to put the Hokies up, 2-1.

After Tech took two more corner kicks, Manning recorded her first goal of the season when Reeves fired a ball across the box and Manning ran in to tap the ball into the net to give the Hokies a two-point advantage in the 63rd minute.

The Huskers did not give up, as Jackson connected on a shot from the right side of the box from 12 yards back to close on the Hokie lead at the 78:51 mark. Seven minutes later, Morgan Marlborough dribbled down the field and fired a shot from the top of the box 20 yards back passed the hands of Romeiser to tie the game at three in the 82nd minute.

Nebraska out shot the Hokies six to four in the first overtime, but neither team could find the back of the net. Double-overtime lasted about three minutes when Jackson shot a ball that bounced off the crossbar and Stacy Bartels ran in and dished it in to end the game.

The Hokies out shot Nebraska 25-18 and took eight corner kicks, while limiting the Huskers to just one the entire game. Dayle Colpitts started the game for Tech, but left 28 minutes in due to injury. Romeiser recorded the loss for the Hokies, while Emma Stevens picked up her third win on the season.

TECH CLOSES HILTON GARDEN HOKIE INVITATIONAL WITH A 3-0 WIN OVER LOYOLA

BLACKSBURG, Va. – The Virginia Tech women's soccer team closed out the Hilton Garden Invitational with a 3-0 victory over the Loyola Greyhounds Sunday afternoon on Thompson Field. Brittany Michels, Katie Cramp and Kelly Conheaney each connected on one goal each for the Hokies.

Tech (7-1-0) set the tone for the game early in the first half as it dominated the Greyhounds (1-7-0) offensively and kept control of possession the entire half. Brittany Michels was very active on corner kicks as the Hokies tallied seven in the half, but she was unable to get a hold of anything.

Later in the half Katie Yensen received the ball up the field and fired a shot at the goal, but Loyola's keeper Didi Haracic came up with a big save. Tech nearly had another opportunity when Brittany Popko fired a header at the net but a Loyola defender was perfectly positioned at the post to deflect the ball away.

Towards the end of the half, Shannon Mayrose laid out as she dove at a ball in front of the goal and headed it in attempt to score but Haracic was there again for another big save.

Tech took the shooting edge in the first half 14-1, while it was a true team effort from the Greyhounds in the first half as they recorded three team saves.

The hard work finally paid off for Michels in front of the net as she was able to get a hold of a Kelsey Loupee corner kick and head it into the back of the net in the 49th minute.

On a broken play that saw the ball get served into the box, Kelly Conheaney got a hold of the loose ball in the box and brought it out a few steps to get a better look at the net. Despite the readjustment, Haracic stopped the attempt.

Remaining persistent, Conheaney continued to attack through the second half and eventually put the Hokies up 2-0 in the 67th minute. After Jazmine Reeves was taken down just inches outside the 18-yard box, Tech was awarded a free kick that was lifted over the Loyola wall and soared over the keeper's hands into the back of the net.

Tech tacked on another goal at the 78:14 mark when Anne Lumpkin served in a long ball from the right sideline that Katie Cramp was able to get a head on as she rose above the crowd and redirected the ball into the top left side of the net.

Anna Romeiser got the start in goal for the Hokies, who played nearly every player that dressed, and played the full 90 minutes and stopping Loyola's only shot. Haracic also lasted the full 90 minutes and made 12 of the team's 15 saves.
