• The Virginia Tech women's soccer team will take on the No. 13 Boston College Eagles at noon on Sunday at Thompson Field as it looks for its first ACC victory of the season.

SCOUTING THE EAGLES

• The No. 13 Boston College Eagles have started the 2011 season 7-0-2 with a recent 2-1 conference win over Maryland Thursday night. The Eagles average 2.00 goals per game, while averaging 16.8 shots per game. BC has outscored its opponents 18-2, while outshooting its opponents, 151-64.

• Junior Kristen Mewis leads the Eagles with four goals and three assists on the season, while taking 43 shots. Five other players for BC have connected on two goals each with at least four points.

• Senior Jillian Mastroianni will be in goal for Boston College. The keeper has started all nine games so far, recording 30 saves and seven shutouts, while only allowing two goals this season. She leads the conference in four of the six stat categories for goalkeepers, including shutouts (7), shutouts per game (.88), goals against (2) and save percentage (.938).

SERIES INFO

• This will be the 10th all-time meeting between the two teams with the Eagles holding a 5-2-2 all-time record against the Hokies. The two teams first met in 2001 where BC defeated Tech, 2-0, in Chestnut Hill, Mass., and most recently collided last season as the Hokies won 1-0.

• Tech holds a 2-2-0 all-time record against the Eagles in Blacksburg.

Player Spotlight

Senior Brittany Popko has been a big asset to the Hokies this season as she has started all 10 games. She has recorded 11 shots, five on goal, this season. She earned a spot on the Wake Forest and Hokie Invitational All-Tournament teams, as she has been a huge part helping the defense limit its opponents to 5.8 shots per game, including holding Appalachian State to zero last weekend.

The Leesburg, Va., native has had a successful career at Tech, as she assisted in shutting out six of its 10 opponents this season and NC State and Clemson last season. She tallied her first-career goal against NC State in 2009. Popko looks to continue to bring a lot of depth to the Hokie defense this season.

LAST TIME OUT

Hokies fall to No. 6 Maryland, 2-1, in ACC opener Jazmine Reeves connected on the goal

COLLEGE PARK, Md. – The Virginia Tech women's soccer team fell to the No. 6 Maryland Terps, 2-1, in its ACC-opener at Ludwig Field Sunday evening. Sophomore Jazmine Reeves connected for her second goal of the season for the Hokies, as Kelsey Loupee recorded the assist.

The Terps attacked early in the first half, taking three shots in the first 10 minutes of the game. But the Hokies responded with a near goal off a the second corner kick of the game. After a corner kick and two shots, Loupee went back to take another corner. Reeves connected on the ball and shot it past the Maryland keeper, finishing it into the open net at the 28:44 mark. The two teams would go into the half with Tech up 1-0.

The Hokies had a chance to have a 2-0 advantage seven minutes into the second half as senior Katie Cramp took a header inside the box but gave it a little too much as the ball went over the goal.

The Terps responded three minutes later, as Olivia Wagner connected off a free kick from 24-yards out that went into the upper-left corner over Dayle Colpitts' head to tie the game at one at the 54:37 mark.

The two teams would trade corner kicks before Maryland would score the final goal of the game off a corner from Wagner as Cory Ryan headed it into the left side of the net past the Tech keeper at the 58:38 mark.

The Hokies tried to tie the game numerous times, taking six shots in the final 20 minutes of the game, including three corner kicks, but did not find the back of the net. Shannon Mayrose came so close as she took a header off an Anne Lumpkin corner that was deflected by the post.

Tech has not faced an opponent in the last three games to shoot in double-figures, as the Hokies outshot Maryland 11-7 and took six corner kicks, while limiting the Terps to just one.

In goal for the Hokies was Colpitts as she recorded two saves and allowed her first two goals of the season.

PARTY LIKE ITS 1994

• Before falling to Nebraska, 3-4, in double-overtime, the Hokies matched their best season start with six consectutive wins since 1994. The 1994 squad shutout five of the six opponents, while outscoring them 18-1. In the six victories this season, Tech shutout four of its six opponents, while outscoring them 19-3.

HOKIES HOST HILTON GARDEN INVITATIONAL

• The Hokies hosted the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational, inviting ACC-opponent Wake Forest, Nebraska and Loyola (Md.). Tech did not see action against Wake Forest and fell to the Nebraska Cornhuskers in a thrilling double-overtime game Saturday. Tech closed the invitational with a shutout against Loyola, including four Hokies being selected to the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational All-Tournament team. Ashley Manning, Kelly Conheeney, Brittany Popko and Anne Lumpkin all made the squad.

TECH DOMINATES WAKE FOREST TOURNAMENT

• Tech dominated the Wake Forest Tournament, recording wins over Campbell (3-2) and Connecticut (1-0). Four Hokies were named to the All-Tournament team, including Shannon Mayrose, Brittany Popko, Kelsey Loupee and Kelly Conheeney.

HOKIES RANKED NATIONALLY

• After recieving 48 votes the third week in the National Soccer Coachs Association of America poll, the Hokies entered week four at No. 25. In addition to the NSCAA Poll, Tech entered the Top-25 in the Soccer America rankings the previous week, sitting tied for 25 with Pepperdine. In week four Tech jumped up to No. 15, but fell to No. 20 in week five. In the Soccer Times Poll, Tech currently sits at No. 24.

2011 HOKIES OVERFLOW THE RECORD BOOKS

• Junior midfielder Kelly Conheeney has reached the top-10 in every category except two in Tech's all-time record book. She recently took over first place in game-winning goals with 10, after scoring the game-winner against Campbell. Conheeney is also tied for first in multiple goal games (5), tied for third in assists (17), fourth in points (57), tied for fifth in goals (20) and ninth in shots (134).

• Sophomore keeper Dayle Colpitts has also reached the top-10 in every goalie category except two in Tech's all-time record book. Colpitts sits first in goals against average with 1.00, tied for fifth in wins (12), sixth in minutes (2,158) and seventh in shutouts (6).

• Senior Brittany Michels just entered the top-10 in career games played as she sits tied for ninth with 75. She will have a chance to beat out former teammate Jennifer Harvey (86) for the top spot towards the end of the season.

• In addition to Colpitts, redshirt-sophomore Anna Romeiser entered the Tech's all-time record books at the goal position. She currently sits tied for tenth in career shutouts (2) and tied for eleventh in career wins with five.

GOALS, GOALS, GOALS

• The Hokies are dominating their opponents on offense this season. Tech holds a 30-9 scoring record against its opponents in 10 games. Kelly Conheeney leads the team with an impressive nine goals and two assists this season. Coming off her first multi-goal game, Shannon Mayrose follows Conheeney with six goals and three assists on the season. Six other Hokies have scored two goals and hold at least four points for the Hokies, including Jazmine Reeves (2g, 11pts), Kelsey Loupee (2g, 10pts), Anne Lumpkin (2g, 7pts), Katie Cramp (2g, 4pts), Julia Goldsworthy (2g, 4pts) and Brittany Michels (2g, 4pts).

• Reeves also leads the team and the ACC in assists with seven.

DEFENSE SHUTS IT DOWN

• The Hokie defense continues to shut down its opponents by allowing only nine goals so far. James Madison, Campbell, Nebraska and Maryland are the only teams to find the back of the net against the Hokies.

• Tech was able to limit the Appalachian State Mountaineers this past weekend to zero shots, which marks the fewest shots taken since last year against American on Aug. 23, 2010. James Madison and Nebraska were the only teams to be able to fire double-figure shots against the Hokies, while Elon, High Point and UNC Greensboro were limited to no more than four against Tech. Goalkeeper Anna Romeiser denied her first career penalty kick against Elon, while saving all three shots the Phoenix took.

CONHEENEY HONORED BY COLLEGESOCCER360.COM

• For the opening weekend of the Divison I women's college soccer season, junior Kelly Conheeney was named a CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer Honoree. Conheeney helped lead the Hokies to a 2-0 start to the 2011 season. In the season opener against UNCG, Conheeney took four shots and connected on two of them, including the game-winning goal for Tech. She has scored the game-winning goal in every season opener in her career.

HOKIES LEAD ACC

• Several Hokies sit in the top-10 in all stat categories in the ACC, including Jazmine Reeves leading the conference in assists. Kelly Conheeney is listed in seven categories and is no lower than fifth place in each. See column for all the Hokies in the ACC Top-10.

TOUGH COMPETITION

• Seven ACC women's soccer teams are included among the Top-25 NSCAA rankings, including four teams among the top 10. Duke sits at the No. 4 spot in the poll, followed by North Carolina at No. 5, Wake Forest at No. 7 and Florida State at No. 10. Maryland follows the Seminoles at No. 11, while Boston College keeps improving and currently sits at No. 13. After losing to BC, Virginia fell to No. 16.

TECH CLOSES HILTON GARDEN HOKIE INVITATIONAL WITH A 3-0 WIN OVER LOYOLA

BLACKSBURG, Va. – The Virginia Tech women's soccer team closed out the Hilton Garden Invitational with a 3-0 victory over the Loyola Greyhounds Sunday afternoon on Thompson Field. Brittany Michels, Katie Cramp and Kelly Conheeney each connected on one goal each for the Hokies.

Tech (7-1-0) set the tone for the game early in the first half as it dominated the Greyhounds (1-7-0) offensively and kept control of possession the entire half. Brittany Michels was very active on corner kicks as the Hokies tallied seven in the half, but she was unable to get a hold of anything.

Later in the half Katie Yensen received the ball up the field and fired a shot at the goal, but Loyola's keeper Didi Haracic came up with a big save. Tech nearly had another opportunity when Brittany Popko fired a header at the net but a Loyola defender was perfectly positioned at the post to deflect the ball away.

Towards the end of the half, Shannon Mayrose laid out as she dove at a ball in front of the goal and headed it in attempt to score but Haracic was there again for another big save.

Tech took the shooting edge in the first half 14-1, while it was a true team effort from the Greyhounds in the first half as they recorded three team saves.

The hard work finally paid off for Michels in front of the net as she was able to get a hold of a Kelsey Loupee corner kick and head it into the back of the net in the 49th minute

On a broken play that saw the ball get served into the box, Kelly Conheeney got a hold of the loose ball in the box and brought it out a few steps to get a better look at the net. Despite the readjustment, Haracic stopped the attempt.

Remaining persistent, Conheeney continued to attack through the second half and eventually put the Hokies up 2-0 in the 67th minute. After Jazmine Reeves was taken down just inches outside the 18-yard box, Tech was awarded a free kick that was lifted over the Loyola wall and soared over the keeper's hands into the back of the net.

Tech tacked on another goal at the 78:14 mark when Anne Lumpkin served in a long ball from the right sideline that Katie Cramp was able to get a head on as she rose above the crowd and redirected the ball into the top left side of the net.

Anna Romeiser got the start in goal for the Hokies, who played nearly every player that dressed, and played the full 90 minutes and stopping Loyola's only shot. Haracic also lasted the full 90 minutes and made 12 of the team's 15 saves.

BIG FIRST HALF LIFTS TECH PAST MOUNTAINEERS, 4-0

BLACKSGURG, Va. – An impressive first-half effort lifted the Virginia Tech women's soccer team past the Appalachian State Mountaineers, 4-0, on Thursday night at Thompson Field. Shannon Mayrose led the way for the Hokies with two goals, while seven different Tech players earned a point in the game.

Tech (8-1-0) controlled the game from the start, rarely letting the Mountaineers (3-4-0) touch the ball. Subsequently, Tech was the first on the board after Jazmine Reeves brought the ball into the right corner and crossed it to the middle of the field, connecting with a diving Kelly Conheeney who redirected the ball into the goal for the 1-0 lead, 24 minutes into the match.

Less than five minutes later, the Hokies struck again, this time it was Mayrose with the diving header in the box. Kelsey Mitchell served the ball from just outside the 18-yard box and Mayrose had space to position herself and get a head on the ball to advance Tech's lead to two goals.

The rapid scoring continued for the Hokies in the 31st minute as Mayrose again found the back of the net. Kelsey Loupee was the set-up man as she received a ball from the right side of the field but was unable to turn for a shot so she kicked it back outside the 18 to Mayrose, who buried the strong shot in the 31st minute.

Ten minutes before halftime Tech tacked on another goal when Brittany Michels rose above the crowd and headed in a corner kick from Anne Lumpkin.

The Hokies took a 4-0 advantage, as well as the 10-0 shooting edge into the halftime break.

Possession remained in Tech's favor throughout the second half as it continued to power shots at the Appalachian State goal.

Though the score would not change in the second half, Tech never allowed the Mountaineers to take a single shot in the game, a season-first, and took 14 shots of its own by match's end. The closest Appalachian State came to a shot was the one corner kick it took in the second half, while the Hokies tallied seven in the game.

Tech's keeper Dayle Colpitts returned to action against the Mountaineers and saw 70 minutes of time in goal, though little came her way. Colpitts was replaced by Anna Romeiser, who finished out the final 20 minutes of the game. Appalachian State's Amy Kolowsky tallied three stops against the Hokies and played the full 90 minutes.

HOKIES FALL TO NO. 6 MARYLAND, 2-1, IN ACC OPENER COLLEGE PARK, Md. – The Virginia Tech women's soccer team fell to the No. 6 Maryland Terps, 2-1, in its ACC-opener at Ludwig Field Sunday evening. Sophomore Jazmine Reeves connected on her second goal of the season for the Hokies, as Kelsey Loupee

recorded the assist. The Terps attacked early in the first half, taking three shots in the first 10 minutes of the game. But the Hokies responded with a near goal off a the second corner kick of the game. After a corner kick and two shots, Loupee went back to take another corner. Reeves connected on the ball and shot it past the Maryland keeper, finishing it into the open net at the 28:44 mark. The two teams would go into the half with Tech up 1-0.

The Hokies had a chance to have a 2-0 advantage seven minutes into the second half as senior Katie Cramp took a header inside the box but gave it a little too much as the ball went over the goal.

The Terps responded three minutes later, as Olivia Wagner connected off a free kick from 24-yards out that went into the upper-left corner over Dayle Colpitts' head to tie the game at one at the 54:37 mark.
