SCOUTING THE CAVALIERS

• The No. 11 Virginia Cavaliers have an overall record of 11-3-2, while being 5-2-1 in the ACC. The Cavaliers have defeated Florida State, 4-3 in overtime, then-No. 5 North Carolina 1-0 in double overtime and then-No. 6 Maryland, 4-1, while tying then-No. 4 Duke, 0-0 in double overtime.

• Virginia averages 2.56 goals per game and has outscored its opponents 41-14. The Cavaliers are known to attack the goal averaging 19.3 shots per game, while leading the conference in corner kicks with 126.

• Junior Caroline Miller leads Virginia and is second in the ACC with 12 goals and has recorded three assists on the season. Morgan Brian and Gloria Douglas follow Miller with five goals each, while Brian leads the conference in shots with 65. Four other Cavaliers have recorded at least two goals on the year.

• In goal, Chantel Jones has started all 16 games for the Cavaliers, recording 29 saves and eight shutouts, while allowing only 14 goals.

SERIES INFO

• This will be the 12th overall meeting against the Hokies and Cavaliers in women's soccer. Virginia holds a 9-2-1 all-time advantage over Tech, and has only given up one loss in Charlottesville to the Hokies. The series dates back to 1994 and met for two more consecutive years before taking an eight-year break. Tech has faced Virginia every year since it joined the ACC in 2004. The Hokies' two wins came in 2008, where Tech defeated Virginia, 1-0, in Blacksburg, and in 2009 where the Cavaliers fell 2-1 in Charlottesville.

• Virginia has been ranked in the top-20 every year the two teams have met.

TBA • The Cavaliers have won three out of the five games that have gone past regulation, while TBA the Hokies have lost all three double-overtime games this season.

TBA • Tech holds a 16-63-9 all-time record against ranked teams.

Player Spotlight

Sophomore Katie DeTuro has played in 13 games this season, recording three shots with one on goal. The Brick, N.J., native has played in 33 career games, including two goals, seven shots and four shots on goal. A year ago, she buried Tech's first goal of the game against North Carolina in the ACC Tournament quarterfinals and scored her first career goal, a game-winner, against LSU last season.

LAST TIME OUT

Reeves' second-half goal lifts the Hokies over NC State, 1-0 Dayle Colpitts records fifth shutout of the season

RALEIGH, N.C. – Sophomore Jazmine Reeves recorded the game-winning goal to lift the Virginia Tech women's soccer team over the NC State Wolfpack, 1-0, in ACC action Sunday afternoon at Dail Soccer Field. The Hokies improved to 11-4-1 overall and 3-3-1 in the conference, while NC State fell to 9-6-2 on the season and 0-4-2 in the ACC.

The Hokies came out strong in the first, as Kelly Conheeney took the first shot a minute in, but hit the cross bar. Dayle Colpitts made the first save of the game when NC State's Kristina Argiroff took a hard shot on goal at the 15:36 mark. The two teams traded shots back and forth but could not find the back of the net and would go into the break still 0-0.

Tech took the shot advantage in the first half, taking five to the Wolfpack's four. Colpitts finished the half with three saves, while Kim Kern stopped one in goal for NC State.

Argiroff took the first shot early in the second half for the Wolfpack in the 46th minute, but it went wide. The Hokies responded 10 minutes later with a shot by Kelsey Loupee that went high and a corner kick taken by Anne Lumpkin at the 56:05 mark.

Senior Kelsey Mitchell sent a cross ball into the box and Reeves jumped up and headed the ball over Kern's head to put Tech on the board and to secure the game at the 67:22 mark.

The Wolfpack tried to tie the score a minute later with their only shot on goal in the half but Colpitts was there to record her fourth save, while earning her fifth shutout of the season. Kern recorded the loss for NC State as she tallied one save for the day.

The Wolfpack outshot Tech 9-7, while the Hokies outcornered NC State 3-1.

CONHEENEY AND REEVES NOTCH WEEKLY HONORS

• Monday, Oct. 17, Kelly Conheeney was named Virginia Tech's Hardee's Star of the Week, while sophomore Jazmine Reeves was selected to the TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week for their efforts over the weekend.

• Conheeney notched all three assists in the 3-0 win against Clemson Thursday night. It allowed her to take sole possession of the Virginia Tech's career points category in the all-time record books as a junior with 67. Conheeney is the first female at Tech to have 20 goals and 20 assists (23g, 21a).

• Reeves led the team this past weekend with two goals, four points and five shots, including the game-winning goal against NC State.

HOKIES CALM THE HURRICANES FOR FIRST CONFERENCE WIN

• The Hokies struggled at the beginning of conference play, facing off with four NSCAA top-20 teams, including then-No. 4 Duke, then-No. 5 Wake Forest, then-No. 6 Maryland and then-No. 13 Boston College. Tech hosted Miami last Friday and recorded its first ACC win of the 2011 season. The Hokies dominated all game, downing the Hurricanes 2-1. Shannon Mayrose recorded the game-winning goal in the last minute to put Tech on top.

PARTY LIKE ITS 1994

• Before falling to Nebraska, 3-4, in double-overtime, the Hokies matched their best season start with six consectutive wins since 1994. The 1994 squad shutout five of the six opponents, while outscoring them 18-1. In the six victories this season, Tech shutout four of its six opponents, while outscoring them 19-3.

TECH DOMINATES WAKE FOREST TOURNAMENT

• Tech dominated the Wake Forest Tournament, recording wins over Campbell (3-2) and Connecticut (1-0). Four Hokies were named to the All-Tournament team, including Shannon Mayrose, Brittany Popko, Kelsey Loupee and Kelly Conheeney.

HOKIES HOST HILTON GARDEN INVITATIONAL

• The Hokies hosted the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational, inviting ACC-opponent Wake Forest, Nebraska and Loyola (Md.). Tech did not see action against Wake Forest and fell to the Nebraska Cornhuskers in a thrilling double-overtime game Saturday. Tech closed the invitational with a shutout against Loyola, including four Hokies being selected to the Hilton Garden Hokie Invitational All-Tournament team. Ashley Manning, Kelly Conheeney, Brittany Popko and Anne Lumpkin all made the squad.



HOKIES RANKED NATIONALLY

• After receiving 48 votes the third week in the National Soccer Coachs Association of America poll, the Hokies entered week four at No. 25. In addition to the NSCAA Poll, Tech entered the Top-25 in the Soccer America rankings the previous week, sitting tied for 25 with Pepperdine. In week four Tech jumped up to No. 15, but fell to No. 20 in week five. Tech currently sits at the No. 24 spot in the TopDrawerSoccer.com poll.

FROM CORNERS TO HEADERS

• The Hokies are known to attack the goal and as a result, Tech has out cornered its opponents 91-38 this season and sits third in the conference in corner kicks. The Hokies have tallied at least two in each of the 16 games so far. On Sept. 4 against Connecticut, Tech recorded 14 corners, while the Huskies only tallied one. The Hokies also reached double-figure corners against Loyala (Md.) tallying 10, while the Greyhounds only notched one.

• Tech has really perfected its corner kicks, as the Hokies record a header shot off of nearly each play. Brittany Michels has recorded two goals this season off of headers after a corner, against App State and Loyola.

• In addition to one of Michels' diving headers off a corner against Loyola, senior Katie Cramp connected off a Kelsey Loupee corner on a diving header.

• The Hokies have recorded six goals off the corner kicks this season.

 Although it wasn't off a corner, Shannon Mayrose recorded her second game-winner off a header shot in the last minute against the Miami Hurricanes, while Jazmine Reeves recorded header goals against Clemson and the game-winner against NC State.

GOAL AFTER GOAL

• The Hokies are dominating their opponents on offense this season. Tech holds a 37-13 scoring record against its opponents in 16 games and is second in the conference in goals. Kelly Conheeney leads the team with an impressive nine goals and six assists this season. Shannon Mayrose follows Conheeney with eight goals and three assists on the season. Jazmine Reeves charted her fifth goal against NC State last Sunday, while Anne Lumpkin tallied her third goal off a penalty kick against Boston College. Three other Hokies have scored two goals and hold at least four points, including Kelsey Loupee (2g, 10pts), Julia Goldsworthy (2g, 4pts) and Brittany Michels (2g, 4pts).

• Reeves also leads the team and is tied for first in the ACC in assists with seven.

DEFENSE SHUT NON-CONFERENCE DOWN

• The Hokie defense shut down its non-conference opponents this season by allowing only seven goals. Tech shut out six of the nine teams and scored atlead three goals in five of the six contests, including UNC Greensboro (4-0), High Point (3-0), Elon (5-0), Loyola (Md.) (3-0) and Appalachian State (4-0).

Tech was able to limit the Appalachian State Mountaineers to zero shots, which marks the fewest shots taken since last year against American on Aug. 23, 2010.
James Madison and Nebraska were the only two teams to be able to fire double-figure shots against the Hokies, while Elon, High Point and UNC Greensboro were limited to no more than four against Tech.

• Goalkeeper Anna Romeiser denied her first career penalty kick against Elon, while saving all three shots the Phoenix took.

SHOTS, SHOTS, SHOTS

• Tech has outshot its opponents 271-143 this season and sits third in the conference in shots, behind No. 11 Virginia (309) and No. 6 Duke (292). The Hokies average 16.9 shots per game and have tallied over 20 shots in six games, including a season-high 27 against Campbell.

• Wake Forest, NC State and Duke are the only two teams that have limited Tech to single-digit shots.

CONHEENEY HONORED BY COLLEGESOCCER360.COM

• For the opening weekend of the Divison I women's college soccer season, junior Kelly Conheeney was named a CollegeSoccer360.com Primetime Performer Honoree. Conheeney helped lead the Hokies to a 2-0 start to the 2011 season. In the season opener against UNCG, Conheeney took four shots and connected on two of them, including the game-winning goal for Tech. She has scored the game-winning goal in every season opener in her career.

2011 HOKIES OVERFLOW THE RECORD BOOKS

• Junior midfielder Kelly Conheeney has reached the top-5 in every category except two in Tech's all-time record book. She recently took over first place in career points with 67 as she assisted all three goals against Clemson. Conheeney is also first in game-winning goals with 11, after scoring the game-winner against Appalachian State. She is also tied for first in multiple goal games (5), tied for third in assists (17), second in points (63), fourth in goals (23) and tied for third in shots (156).

• Sophomore keeper Dayle Colpitts has reached the top-10 in every goalie category except one in Tech's all-time record book. Colpitts sits second in goals against average with 1.30, is third in wins (16), fifth in minutes (2,893), tied for third in shutouts (9) and seventh in saves (110).

• Senior Brittany Michels just took sole possession of third place in career games played with 83. She will have a chance to beat out former teammate Jennifer Harvey (86) for the top spot towards the end of the season. She also just entered the top-10 in career starts with 68.

• In addition to Colpitts, redshirt-sophomore Anna Romeiser entered the Tech's all-time record books at the goal position. She currently sits tied for tenth in career shutouts (2) and tied for eleventh in career wins with five.

HOKIES LEAD ACC

• Several Hokies sit in the top-10 in all stat categories in the ACC as of Oct. 17, including Jazmine Reeves who is tied for first the conference in assists. Kelly Conheeney is listed in seven categories, while Dayle Colpitts is listed in every goalie category and sits at 6th place or better. See column on the left for all the Hokies in the ACC Top-10.

TOUGH COMPETITION

• Seven ACC women's soccer teams are included among the top-25 NSCAA rankings, including three teams among the top-10. Wake Forest sits at the No. 3 spot in the poll, followed by Duke at No. 6 and North Carolina at No. 8. Virginia follows the Tarheels at No. 11. Maryland and Boston College are sitting at No. 15 and No. 17, respectively. Rounding out the conference in the polls is Florida State at No. 19.

NCAA HISTORY

• The Virginia Tech women's soccer program is coming off its third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and fourth all-time. In 2009, the Hokies advanced to the Sweet 16, which marked the first time in school history Tech advanced in the tournament.

• The Hokies return five starters and four players who have played in at least 15 games from last year's squad. Sophomores Jazmine Reeves and Dayle Colpitts both received ACC All-Freshmen accolades last season, while Kelly Conheeney was named to the 2010 VaSID All-State second team. Conheeney led the team in four categories, including shots (46), game-winning goals (3), assists (12) and points (22).



ALL AROUND THE WORLD

• The Hokies welcome 10 newcomers to the 2011-12 roster that consists of nine freshmen and a transfer from six different areas. Helen Butler and Victoria Parkinson have the longest travels from California and Canada, respectively. Kelsey Loupee is from Littleton, Colorado, while Jodie Zelenky is from Pennsylvania. Although Georgie Highton is from Connecticut, she was born in England, while Samantha Cormode, Katie Yensen, Danielle King, Ellie Zoepfl and transfer Kimberley Anderson all reside in northern Virginia.

WINSTON-SALEM, N.C. – In a game that lasted about four hours due to weather delays, the Hokies extended their unbeaten streak to five in a 3-2 victory over Campbell at the Wake Forest Tournament Friday night. Kelly Conheeney tallied her second multi-goal game this season, while charting her 10th game winner of her career. Argiroff took the first shot early in the second half for the Wolfpack in the 46th minute, but it went wide. The Hokies responded 10 minutes later with a shot by Kelsey Loupee that went high and a corner kick taken by Anne Lumpkin at the 56:05 mark.

Senior Kelsey Mitchell sent a cross ball into the box and Reeves jumped up and headed the ball over Kern's head to put Tech on the board and to secure the game at the 67:22 mark.

The Wolfpack tried to tie the score a minute later with their only shot on goal in the half but Colpitts was there to record her fourth save, while earning her fifth shutout of the season. Kern recorded the loss for NC State as she tallied one save for the day. The Wolfpack outshot Tech 9-7, while the Hokies outcornered NC State 3-1.
