• The No. 19 Hokies step back into the brutal ACC with a 8 p.m. matchup against the top-ranked Florida State Seminoles, last year's ACC Champion, Thursday night in Tallahassee, Fla.

THURSDAY'S MATCH

- Thursday marks the fifth team Virginia Tech will face that is ranked nationally
- The Seminoles are the last remaining undefeated team in the nation
- Florida State has only allowed three goals in its first 12 matches, including one in the last 11 games
- The Seminoles have outscored their opponents 29-3 and lead the nation in GAA (.250), shutout percentage (.833) and save percentage (.925)
- Junior goalkeeper Kelsey Wys ranks third in the country in GAA with a .299 throughout 11 games
- Tiffany McCarty leads the Seminoles with six goals, three assists, 31 shots and two game-winners

THE SERIES

- This marks the 12th meeting between the two teams and Florida State leads 10-0-1
- ullet The series dates back to 2002 where the Seminoles beat Virginia Tech 1-0 in at the Miami Tournament
- The Hokies' only point came in 2008 when Virginia Tech advanced to the second round of the ACC Tournament off a
- 4-2 advantage in penalty kicks
- The Seminoles have outscored the Hokies 19-3 in the series
- Florida State has been ranked in every meeting except one (2002)
- This is the third meeting Virginia Tech has been ranked in the top 25

- The Hokies and Seminoles kickoff at 8:05 p.m. on RSN
- Game will air live on the following channels: FS South, Sun Sports, Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic and NESN

IT CAN BE DONE

- Florida State is just the second top-ranked team the Hokies have faced all-time and are 1-1 in those games
- In 2009, Virginia Tech upset No. 1 and reining National Champions North Carolina, 1-0, in Blacksburg
- Four current Hokies contributed in the 1-0 upset
- Kelsey Mitchell and Kelly Conheeney started against the Tar Heels and Julia Goldsworthy and Amanda Gerhard both saw action in the win

LAST TIME OUT

- The Hokies cruised past Oklahoma, 4-1, Sunday evening at Thompson Field
- The win marked the first time in program history that Virginia Tech swept non-conference play
- Four Hokies found the back of the net against the Sooner, including Ellie Zoepfl for the first time in her career
- The four goals was the most goals scored this season
- The Sunday win marked the 25th win under head coach Chugger Adair

SUNDAY AT 5PM

- Last Sunday's game against Maryland marked the first time the Hokies have played a 5 p.m. game this season
- The last time Virginia Tech played a 5 p.m. match was Sunday, Sept. 18, 2011 at then-No. 6 Maryland
- The Hokies fell 2-1 at Ludwig Field after having the 1-0 lead at halftime
- Virginia Tech plays three 5 p.m. games this season

CHUGGIN' ALONG

- · With not even two seasons under his belt, head coach Chugger Adair notched his 25th win as Virginia Tech's head coach last Sunday against Oklahoma
- In Adair's first season the Hokies matched a program-best Sweet 16 run and set the school record with most shutouts in a season with 11
- This year, he's continued the success with sweeping the non-conference schedule for the first time in program history with the 4-1 win over Oklahoma and set school records with most consecutive shutouts (6), best season start (9-0-0) and most consecutive wins (9)

MEIER EARNS HARDEE'S STAR OF THE WEEK HONOR

- Freshman Ashley Meier was named Virginia Tech's Hardee's Star of the Week Monday, Oct. 8
- The freshman midfielder notched two goals this past week to bring her season total to six on the year which is second in team scoring
- She charted the first goal of the 4-1 win over Oklahoma this past Sunday to help the Hokies sweep non-conference play for the first time in program history.
- Throughout the weekend she tallied seven shots, including a team-high of five against then-No. 9 Duke last Thursday

MECHANICSBURG RIVALS

- Sophomore Jodie Zelenky and Duke's freshman Cassie Pecht met again for the first time in two years against Duke
- The two are from the same hometown, Mechanicsburg, Pa., and attended rival high schools
- Zelenky played for Mechanicsburg High School and Pecht attented Cumberland Valley High School and they competed against eachother for three years
- Zelenky has started the past four games at midfield and will go against Pecht, a forward that has started all 12 games for the Blue Devils
- The Hokies fell to Duke 3-2 in overtime, Pecht fired two shots and played 84 minutes, while Zelenky played all 97 in the midfield

SHUTTING OUT LEFT AND RIGHT

- The Hokies made history as they recorded their longest consecutive shutout streak in program history
- The 3-0 shutout over NC State on Sept. 16 was Virginia Tech's sixth-straight shutout which broke the Hokie record (5) which dates back to 1994
- Nebraska, North Carolina, Boston College and Duke are the only teams to score on the Hokies this season and Virginia Tech has outscored its opponents 25-10

MAYROSE EARNS HARDEE'S STAR OF THE WEEK HONOR

- Redshirt junior Shannon Mayrose was named Virginia Tech's Hardee's Star of the Week Monday, Sept. 17
- The forward scored the first two goals to help lift the Hokies past NC State, 3-0
- She also led both teams with five shots and three on frame as Virginia Tech improved to 9-0-0 on the season

LEADING THE NATION

- The Hokies led the nation in three team stats, shutout percentage, goals-against average and save percentage, through the games played on Sept. 16
- In first nine games, Virginia Tech had only allowed two goals and had a GAA of 0.217
- The Hokies had a shutout percentage of 0.889 with eight shutouts and a 0.931 save percentage
- Virginia Tech was tied with No. 1 Florida State in won-lost-tied percentage, as both teams are undefeated
- This week the Hokies are still in the top 10 in shutout percentage, as they sit tied for second with .750


