• Coming off a tough 5-0 loss to the No. 14 Virginia Cavaliers, the Hokies need to secure their spot in the ACC Tournament with a result at No. 7 Wake Forest Wednesday night.

WEDNESDAY'S MATCH

- Wednesday marks the final game during the Hokies' regular season
- The Demon Deacons enter Wednesday with an overall record of 12-3-3 and 5-2-1 in the conference
- Wake Forest is coming off a 2-1 win over the No. 10 North Carolina
- The Demon Deacons have outscored its opponents, 30-13
- Katie Stengel leads Wake Forest with seven goals, two assists, 31 shots and 15 on goal
- Aubrey Bledsoe has played all 18 games in goal for the Demon Deacons and has a 12-3-3 record and 44 saves
- Wake Forest hasn't lost a game in six-straight contests

THE SERIES

- This marks the 11th meeting between the two teams and Wake Forest leads 5-3-2
- The series dates back to 2000 where the Demon Deacons defeated the Hokies 5-1 in Winston-Salem, N.C.
- · Virginia Tech hasn't lost to Wake Forest in four-straight seasons with the last two meetings resulting in a tie
- Its last loss came in 2008 when the Hokies fell 2-1 in Blacksburg to a No. 19-ranked Wake Forest
- The Demon Deacons have been ranked in the top 25 in every meeting expect 2000

LAST TIME OUT

- Coming off a convincing 3-0 win over Clemson last Thursday, the Hokies fell to No. 14 Virginia, 5-0
- Virginia's Caroline Miller notched the first three goals for her second-career hat trick
- The Cavaliers outshot Virginia Tech 24-9 and took the 8-5 corner advantage
- Dayle Colpitts took the loss for the Hokies and fell to 7-5-1 on the season and picked up five saves

ACC TOURNAMENT ON THE LINE

- The Hokies are in need of a point Wednesday, as they are one point behind Miami in the ACC standings
- If Virginia Tech wins and Miami loses to Florida State Thursday, the Hokies are automatically in the tournament
- If Miami wins, the Hurricanes clinch the final spot
- Miami has to lose if the Hokies tie the Demon Deacons

FRESHMAN ON SPORTSCENTER TOP-10

- Freshman Ashley Meier's first goal not only put the Hokies up 1-0 against Clemson on Oct. 21, it made it on SportsCenter's Top-10 Plays
- The midfielder flicked the ball to herself about 15-yards out and connected to the upper right corner

LIVE ON TV

- On Thursday, Oct. 11, Virginia Tech was live on TV for the first time this season against top-ranked Florida State
- The Hokies and Seminoles kicked off at 8:05 p.m. on RSN
- Virginia Tech fell to the Seminoles 1-0 on Thursday night
- Game will aired live on the following channels: FS South, Sun Sports, Comcast SportsNet Mid-Atlantic and NESN

SUNDAY AT 5PM

- The game against Maryland marked the first time the Hokies have played a 5 p.m. game this season
- The last time Virginia Tech played a 5 p.m. match was Sunday, Sept. 18, 2011 at then-No. 6 Maryland
- The Hokies fell 2-1 at Ludwig Field after having the 1-0 lead at halftime

MITCHELL BECOMES TECH'S ALL-TIME LEADER

- In her final game at Thompson Field when the Hokies faced Virginia on Oct. 21, Kelsey Mitchell became Tech's all-time leader in career games started
- The senior has started every game in her career, good for a total of 86

CHUGGIN' ALONG

- With not even two seasons under his belt, head coach Chugger Adair notched his 25th win as Virginia Tech's head coach Sunday, Oct. 7 against Oklahoma
- In Adair's first season the Hokies matched a program-best Sweet 16 run and set the school record with most shutouts in a season with 11
- This year, he's continued the success with sweeping the non-conference schedule for the first time in program history with the 4-1 win over Oklahoma and set school records with most consecutive shutouts (6), best season start (9-0-0) and most consecutive wins (9)

MEIER EARNS HARDEE'S STAR OF THE WEEK HONOR

- Freshman Ashley Meier was named Virginia Tech's Hardee's Star of the Week Monday, Oct. 8
- The freshman midfielder notched two goals this past week to bring her season total to six on the year which is second in team scoring
- She charted the first goal of the 4-1 win over Oklahoma this past Sunday to help the Hokies sweep non-conference play for the first time in program history.
- Throughout the weekend she tallied seven shots, including a team-high of five against then-No. 9 Duke last Thursday

MECHANICSBURG RIVALS

- Sophomore Jodie Zelenky and Duke's freshman Cassie Pecht met again for the first time in two years against Duke
- The two are from the same hometown, Mechanicsburg, Pa., and attended rival high schools
- Zelenky played for Mechanicsburg High School and Pecht attented Cumberland Valley High School and they competed against eachother for three years
- Zelenky has started the past four games at midfield and will go against Pecht, a forward that has started all 12 games for the Blue Devils
- The Hokies fell to Duke 3-2 in overtime, Pecht fired two shots and played 84 minutes, while Zelenky played all 97 in the midfield

SHUTTING OUT LEFT AND RIGHT

- The Hokies made history as they recorded their longest consecutive shutout streak in program history
- The 3-0 shutout over NC State on Sept. 16 was Virginia Tech's sixth-straight shutout which broke the Hokie record (5) which dates back to 1994
- Virginia Tech has outscored its opponents 32-17 this season

MAYROSE EARNS HARDEE'S STAR OF THE WEEK HONOR

- Redshirt junior Shannon Mayrose was named Virginia Tech's Hardee's Star of the Week Monday, Sept. 17
- The forward scored the first two goals to help lift the Hokies past NC State, 3-0
- She also led both teams with five shots and three on frame as Virginia Tech improved to 9-0-0 on the season

- The Hokies led the nation in three team stats, shutout percentage, goals-against average and save percentage, through the games played on Sept. 16
- In first nine games, Virginia Tech had only allowed two goals and had a GAA of 0.217
- The Hokies had a shutout percentage of 0.889 with eight shutouts and a 0.931 save percentage
- Virginia Tech was tied with No. 1 Florida State in won-lost-tied percentage, as both teams are undefeated

SHOTS ON SHOTS ON SHOTS

- Not only does redshirt junior Shannon Mayrose lead Tech in shots, she sits third in the conference as well with 58
- She has taken well over 20 more shots than any other Hokie
- Mayrose also sits sixth in the ACC in shots per game with 3.22 and is tied for fourth in game-winning goals with four

COLPITTS NAMED TO TOPDRAWERSOCCER.COM TEAM OF THE WEEK

- Junior Dayle Colpitts was named to the TopDrawerSoccer.com Team of the Week Monday, Sept. 10
- The goalkeeper played every minute against Illinois and UMass and notched her third-straight shutout
- She charted six saves in the pair of wins for the Hokies

WAKE FOREST ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

- Three Hokies were selected to the 2012 Wake Forest Invitational All-Tournament team
- Shannon Mayrose was honored for her game winner against Illinois
- Freshman Ashley Meier found the back of the net against Massachusetts and fired four shots to earn the honor
- Defensive leader Kelsey Mitchell led a defense that only allowed 5.5 shots per game to get placed on the squad

- The 2-0 win over Massachusetts goes down in the Virginia Tech Women's Soccer Record Book

- The Hokies moved into October with a 10-2-0 overall record this season
- Virginia Tech is 62-88-14 all-time in the month of October
- The Hokies are 37-36-8 at home and 19-31-10 in the ACC in the month of October

MOVED ON UP

- The Hokies were ranked No. 8 in the NSCAA Continental Tire poll during Week 5
- That marked the highest ranking in program history
- The previous week was the first time in program history the Hokies have broke the top 10 with a No. 9 ranking


