MATCH NOTES

Last Time Out: On Sunday afternoon, Virginia Tech advanced past No. 9 Santa Clara in nail-biting fashion, as the Hokies drew the Broncos 1-1 in regular time before topping Santa Clara, 3-1, on penalty kicks. Senior goalkeeper Dayle Colpitts recorded eight saves in the run of play, before stopping three of the four PKs to help Tech move on.

The Hokies Thus Far: With the third-round win, the Hokies are now 18-4-3 on the year, having set a new program record for victories in a single season. Tech has also scored 51 goals this year, making it the highest-scoring Hokie offense in school history, breaking last season's record of 45 goals.

Freshman Murielle Tiernan's goal on Sunday afternoon gives her 11 this year, most on the team, just ahead of senior Jazmine Reeves, who has 10. Sophomore Ashley Meier sits just behind them with eight goals. Junior Kelsey Loupee has nine assists to pace the Hokies.

Senior Dayle Colpitts has continued her stellar career this year, recording 71 saves en route to a 0.72 goals-against-average.

Scouting the Blue Devils: Duke enters Friday's quarterfinal sporting a 9-8-6 record thus far, after getting past Colorado College on penalties, downing No. 2-seeded Florida and then advancing past Arkansas on PKs as well. Duke went 5-5-3 in ACC play before falling to Florida State, 2-0, in the first round of the ACC Tournament.

The Blue Devils have spread out their 31 goals this season, as Kelly Cobb and Kim DeCesare pace the eight goalscorers with seven and six goals, respectively. Laura Weinberg and Kaitlyn Kerr have each scored five of their own, while Mollie Pathman has tallied seven assists to lead the team.

Meghan Thomas has played all three matches in net for Duke, after a season that saw her tally 51 saves and maintain a 0.91 goals-against-average while splitting time with Ali Kershner.

Series History: Duke leads the all-time series between the teams, 9-1-1. The Hokies' only victory in the series was during the 2008 season, although each of the last four meetings between the teams was decided by a goal or less.

Earlier this year, the two sides met in Durham, N.C., where they battled to a 1-1 draw after 110 minutes. Ashley Meier tallied the Hokies' goal in the 67th minute, finishing off a great team goal with a single touch from 10 yards out.

NCAA Streak: With their selection this year, the Hokies have now appeared in six consecutive NCAA Tournaments. They have now reached the Sweet 16 three times (2009, 2011) and this year marks the first time Tech has reached the quarterfinals.

Double Double-Digits: This marks the first season in school history in which two Hokies have reached double-digits in goals, as freshman Murielle Tiernan has 11 goals, while senior Jazmine Reeves has scored 10.

Handling the Nation's Best: Last Friday evening's victory over No. 12 West Virginia marked the Hokies' sixth victory this season over a nationally-ranked side, setting a new program record for ranked victories in a single year.

Annual Big Wins: The Hokies' October 13 victory over No. 9 Notre Dame marked the seventh consecutive season in which Tech has defeated at least one team ranked in the top 10. In 2006, the last year that the Hokies went without a top-10 victory, Tech lost by just a single goal on the road against both No. 3 Florida State (1-2) and No. 2 UNC (0-1).

Hokies Contributing Early: With freshman Murielle Tiernan scoring 11 times in 2013, this marks the fourth time in the last five years that a Hokie freshman has scored five goals in her first collegiate season. Kelly Conheaney scored nine in 2009, Jazmine Reeves scored five in 2010 and Ashley Meier tallied eight last season.

ACC Success: Tech won nine ACC matches this season, the most conference wins the Hokies have ever earned in a single year. In 2009, Tech went 6-4 in the ACC to set the previous record and followed it up with a run to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

Marathon Woman: Over the course of the Hokies' first 15 matches, Jodie Zelenky did not exit a match, as the junior defender opened the year with 1,467 consecutive minutes until being subbed out in the 68th minute of the Hokies' October 20 victory over Pittsburgh.

Stonewall Defense: This year's defense will go down in history as one of Virginia Tech's strongest ever. The Hokies allowed just 13 goals in the regular season and have not allowed more than two goals since a 3-2 overtime loss to Duke last season. Tech allowed 20 goals total last season and 25 in 2011.

Extended Road Trip: Tech's stretch this season in which it played four straight opponents on the road (No. 21 Maryland, Boston College, NC State, Duke) was its longest stint away from Thompson Field since the 2001 season, when the Hokies faced five straight opponents away from home.

Powerful ACC: After placing five teams in the Sweet 16 in 2012, all eight of the ACC teams selected to the NCAA Tournament advanced to the Sweet 16 this season, with six advancing to the NCAA Quarterfinals.

Returning Offensive Firepower: Tech lost six letterwinners, including four starters, from last year's NCAA Tournament team, but will not miss much on the offensive side of the ball. Of the Hokies' 37 goals in 2012, only three were scored by players who are not on the roster this season. Tech also returns 24 of its 30 assists from last year.

Yensen's Gamewinners: Junior Katie Yensen has made a habit of scoring important goals for the Hokies over the course of her career. Though she has just 10 goals in her career in the midfield, seven of those ended up being the gamewinning goal for the Hokies, tied for the fourth-most in Virginia Tech history.

Playing For Your Country: The Hokies have a pair of players who have worn their home country's colors in international competition within the last year. Senior goalkeeper Dayle Colpitts suited up for Canada in the 2012 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Japan last fall, while sophomore Ashley Meier ompeted with the United States U-20 National Team in the 12 Nations Tournament in La Manga, Spain this past spring.

Shootout Success: Sunday's penalty kick shootout with Santa Clara marked the first time that the Hokies have gone to PKs since the 2008 ACC Tournament, when Tech won back-to-back shootouts over Florida State and Virginia to advance to the finals. Those are the only three instances of PKs in Virginia Tech women's soccer history.

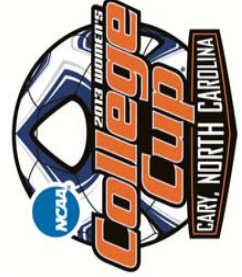
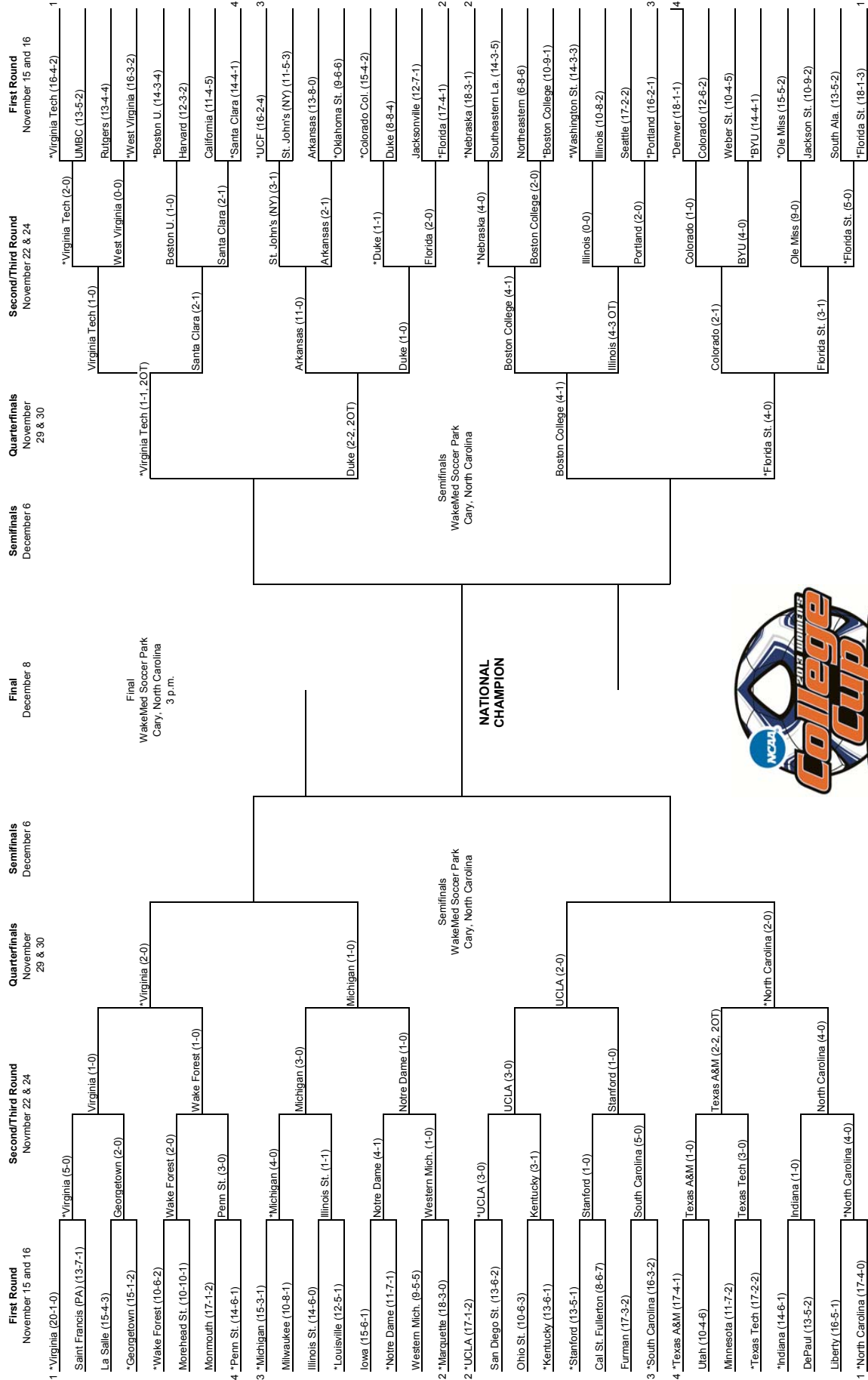
