MATCH NOTES

Last Time Out: Last Friday, Virginia Tech downed Duke in dominating fashion, as the Hokies rolled to a 3-0 victory in the NCAA Quarterfinals to advance to their first-ever College Cup. After junior Katie Yensen's goal just before halftime, junior Shannon Mayrose and senior Jazmine Reeves both scored second half goals to seal the victory.

The Hokies Thus Far: With the quarterfinal win, the Hokies are now 19-4-3 on the year, having set a new program record for victories in a single season. Tech has also scored 54 goals this year, making it the highest-scoring Hokie offense in school history, breaking last season's record of 45 goals.

Reeves' goal on Friday evening gives her 11 this year, tied for most on the team with freshman Murielle Tiernan. Sophomore Ashley Meier sits just behind them with eight goals. Junior Kelsey Loupee has nine assists to pace the Hokies.

Senior Dayle Colpitts has continued her stellar career this year, recording 76 saves en route to a school record goals-against-average of 0.69.

Scouting the Seminoles: Florida State enters this weekend's College Cup with a record of 22-1-3, after rolling through the first four rounds having matched the Hokies' total of one goal conceded. The Seminoles earned victories over South Alabama, Ole Miss, Colorado and Boston College on their road to the College Cup.

FSU has spread its 56 goals amongst 13 players this year, led by Dagny Brynjarsdottir with 14. Marta Bakowska-Mathews has tallied eight for herself, while Megan Campbell has racked up 12 assists to pace the Seminoles.

Kelsey Wys has played every minute in goal for Florida State this season, racking tallying 63 saves while posting a 0.48 goals-against-average, the ninth-lowest average in the country this year.

Series History: The Seminoles have controlled the all-time series against Tech, winning 13 of the 14 meetings between the sides and drawing the other. However, the last three contests have all been decided by a single goal.

The two sides have already faced each other twice in 2013. In the regular season, FSU got a goal with three minutes to play to grab a 2-1 win in a match that the Hokies had largely dominated, while the Seminoles earned a 1-0 victory in a hard-fought, physical ACC Championship in Cary, N.C. just a few weeks later.

Brynjarsdottir has scored all three of FSU goals against Virginia Tech this season and was the only Seminole to register a shot in the two sides' first meeting in Blacksburg.

NCAA Streak: With their selection this year, the Hokies have now appeared in six consecutive NCAA Tournaments. They have now reached the Sweet 16 three times (2009, 2011) and this year marks the first time Tech has reached the quarterfinals.

Double Double-Digits: This marks the first season in school history in which two Hokies have reached double-digits in goals, as freshman Murielle Tiernan and senior Jazmine Reeves have each tallied 11 goals.

Handling the Nation's Best: Virginia Tech's NCAA Second Round win over No. 12 West Virginia marked the Hokies' sixth victory this season over a nationally-ranked side, setting a new program record for ranked victories in a single year.

Annual Big Wins: The Hokies' October 13 victory over No. 9 Notre Dame marked the seventh consecutive season in which Tech has defeated at least one team ranked in the top 10. In 2006, the last year that the Hokies went without a top-10 victory, Tech lost by just a single goal on the road against both No. 3 Florida State (1-2) and No. 2 UNC (0-1).

Hokies Contributing Early: With freshman Murielle Tiernan scoring 11 times in 2013, this marks the fourth time in the last five years that a Hokie freshman has scored five goals in her first collegiate season. Kelly Conheaney scored nine in 2009, Jazmine Reeves scored five in 2010 and Ashley Meier tallied eight last season.

ACC Success: Tech won nine ACC matches this season, the most conference wins the Hokies have ever earned in a single year. In 2009, Tech went 6-4 in the ACC to set the previous record and followed it up with a run to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

Stonewall Defense: This year's defense will go down in history as one of Virginia Tech's strongest ever. The Hokies have allowed just 19 goals this season and haven't allowed more than two in a match since a 3-2 overtime loss to Duke in 2012. Tech allowed 20 goals total last season and 25 in 2011.

Marathon Woman: Over the course of the Hokies' first 15 matches, Jodie Zelenky did not exit a match, as the junior defender opened the year with 1,467 consecutive minutes until being subbed out in the 68th minute of the Hokies' October 20 victory over Pittsburgh.

National Championship Drought: Virginia Tech is one of only five major-conference schools without an NCAA Championship in any team sport. That list also includes Kansas State, Ole Miss, Mississippi State and Pittsburgh.

Extended Road Trip: Tech's stretch this season in which it played four straight opponents on the road (No. 21 Maryland, Boston College, NC State, Duke) was its longest stint away from Thompson Field since the 2001 season, when the Hokies faced five straight opponents away from home.

Powerful ACC: All eight of the ACC teams selected to the NCAA Tournament advanced to the Sweet 16 this season, with six advancing to the NCAA Quarterfinals and three reaching the College Cup.

Returning Offensive Firepower: Tech lost six letterwinners, including four starters, from last year's NCAA Tournament team, but did not miss much on the offensive side of the ball. Of the Hokies' 37 goals in 2012, only three were scored by players who are not on the roster this season. Tech also returns 24 of its 30 assists from last year.

Yensen's Gamewinners: Junior Katie Yensen has made a habit of scoring important goals for the Hokies over the course of her career. Though she has just 12 goals in her career in the midfield, eight ended up being the gamewinning goal, tied for the third-most in Virginia Tech history.

Playing For Your Country: The Hokies have a pair of players who have worn their home country's colors in international competition within the last year. Senior goalkeeper Dayle Colpitts suited up for Canada in the 2012 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Japan last fall, while sophomore Ashley Meier competed with the United States U-20 National Team in the 12 Nations Tournament in La Manga, Spain this past spring.

Shootout Success: The Hokies' third-round penalty kick shootout with Santa Clara marked the first time that the Hokies have gone to PKs since the 2008 ACC Tournament, when Tech won back-to-back shootouts over Florida State and Virginia to advance to the finals. Those are the only three instances of PKs in Virginia Tech women's soccer history.

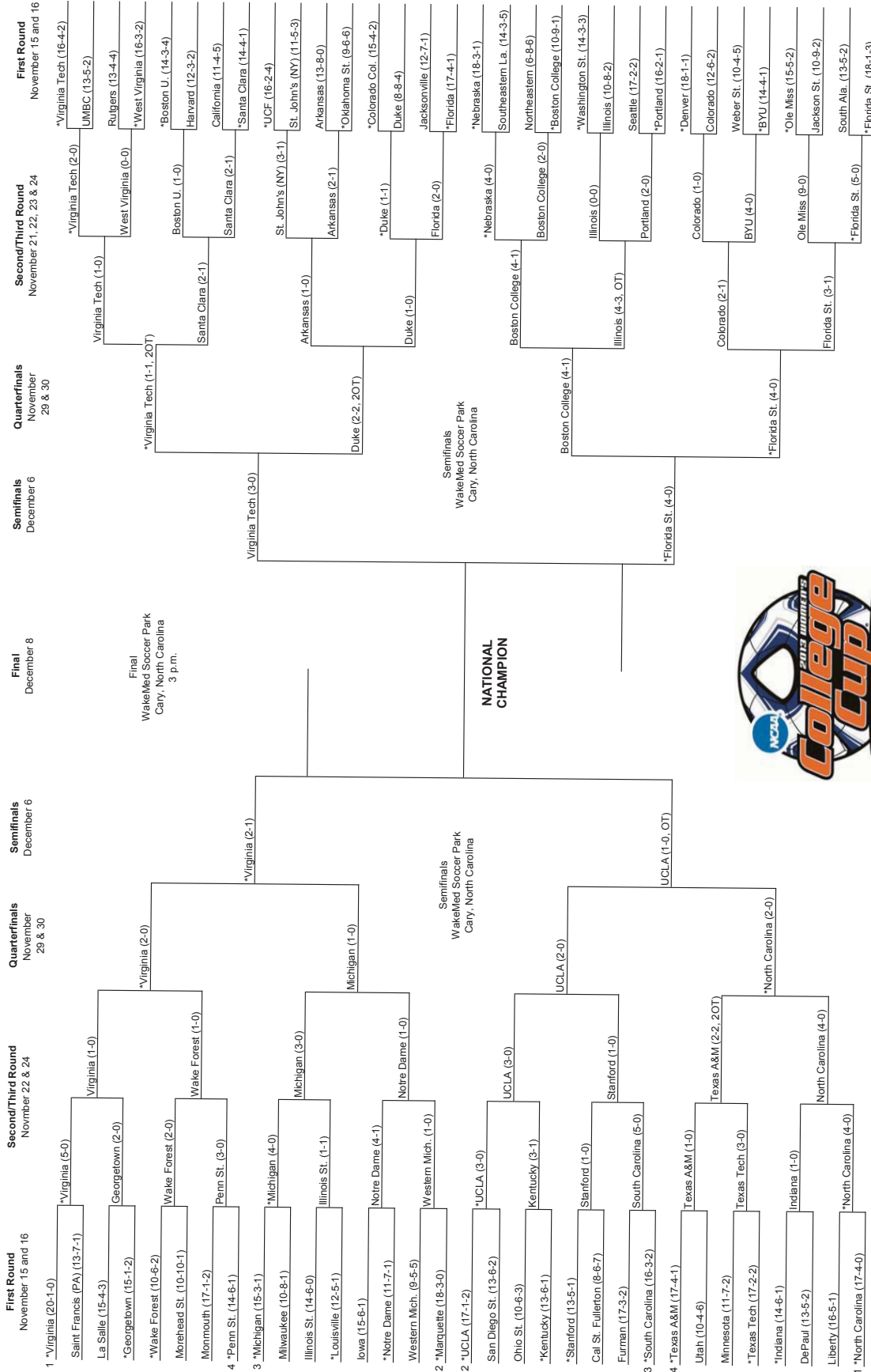
