Entering This Weekend's Matches

The Hokies enter the weekend 11-1-1 overall and 3-1 in conference action... Wake Forest is 4-7-2 on the season and 1-3 in ACC play ... Clemson was 9-1-1 overall and 3-1 in conference play, heading into Thursday's match against Virginia ... Tech is ranked ninth in the NSCAA poll and fifth in the TopDrawerSoccer.com poll ... Wake Forest is unranked and Clemson is ranked seventh in the NSCAA poll and ninth in the TDS.com poll.



The Hokies earned their third consecutive ACC victory with a 4-2 win at No. 22 Duke on a rainy Sunday afternoon in Durham ... Tech took a 1-0 lead into the half, following the first career goal by Anissa Dadkhah, on a cross from Madi Convers ... In the second half, Laila Gray, Murielle Tiernan and Caroline Kerns added goals to give Tech a 4-0 lead en route to the victory.



With the Hokies' 4-2 win at No. 22 Duke on Sunday, Virginia Tech is now 61-0 all-time when scoring four-ormore goals ... The four goals scored by the Hokies are the most against an ACC opponent since Oct. 23 of last season, when Tech won 5-0 at Syracuse ... It is the most goals Tech has scored against a nationally-ranked team since Sept. 5, 2014, when the Hokies defeated No. 13 Georgetown, 6-1, at Thompson Field.

Our Newest Hokie

Head coach **Chugger Adair** relied heavily on associate head coach **Drew Kopp** and assistant coach **Matt Gwilliam** prior to the win over Duke, for a very good reason ... On Friday, Adair and his wife, Shelbylynn, welcomed the birth of their their second child, son Austin Tate Adair ... Shelbylynn is an assistant coach on the Virginia Tech volleyball team.

Murielle is the Tops!

..Bill Dver

Virginia Tech junior forward, Murielle Tiernan, scored Tech's second goal of the Longwood match and in doing so, recorded her 30th career goal ... She now has 35 career goals ... That puts her alone in first place on the Virginia Tech all-time goals list ... In the loss to No. 3 UNC, Tiernan scored her 32nd goal and in doing so, set a new school record for career points ... She now has 83 career points and is tied for eighth in career assists, with 13.

Tech is 2-3-1 in road games in the series and is 2-1-1 against the Demon Deacons under **Chugger Adair** ... The Hokies are 4-5-2 in regular season ACC games against Wake ... Tech is 49-78-15 all-time against schools currently in the ACC and 43-60-12 in ACC games.

The Hokies vs. Clemson

The Hokies are 6-2-3 all-time against Clemson ... Tech has won the last six meetings, most recently a 2-0 win last year in Blacksburg ... Tech is 2-1-1 in road games in the series and is 4-0 against the Tigers under **Chugger Adair** ... The Hokies are 6-2-3 in regular season ACC games against Clemson ... Tech is 49-78-15 all-time against schools currently in the ACC and 43-60-12 in ACC games (Entering Thursday night's match at Wake Forest).

Murielle Tiernan is ninth nationally in both game-winning goals and goals per game ... She is 11th in total goals, 15th in points per game and 24th in total points ... All five marks lead the ACC ... Jordan Coburn is 20th in assists per game (third-best in the ACC) and 26th in total assists (second-best in the ACC).



Murielle's Big Week

Junior **Murielle Tiernan** earned many accolades for her play during the season's first weekend of action in the Hokies' victory in the Hoosier Classic ... Tiernan, who scored three of Tech's four goals on the weekend, was named the National Player of the Week by both espnW and TopDrawerSoccer.com ... She was also named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week.

Statistical Housekeeping

In checking back on the game final from the win at VCU, Virginia Tech's **Murielle Tiernan** should have been awarded an assist on the goal by Laila Gray in the 66th minute of play ... Tiernan now has two assists on the season.

On the List

Murielle Tiernan named to the 2015 Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Award watch list ... Tiernan is one of 28 student-athletes on the list and one of eight players from Atlantic Coast Conference schools ... Tiernan led the Hokies in goals, assists and scoring last season ... The MAC Hermann Award Trophy is the most prestigious individual award in NCAA soccer presented annually to one male and one female athlete.

Virginia Tech senior **Ashley Meier** spent a portion of her summer representing her country for US Soccer ... The U-23 Women's National Team came away with two wins and one draw in winning the 2015 Four Nations Tournament in Sarpsborg, Norway ... Meier has been a member of the national team pools since she was 12 years old and was a member of the U18 US National Team ... She was the 2011 NSCAA High School National Player of the Year and a two-time high school All-American ... Meier received the Ohio's "Ms. Soccer" and State of Ohio Player of the Year awards her senior year ... Off the pitch, Meier is a three-time ACC All-Academic Team selection and a two-time ACC Honor Roll selection ... She has been named to Dean's List in Spring 2014, Fall 2013, Spring 2013 and Fall 2012.

Senior Watch

Senior **Ashley Meier** has been named a preseason All-ACC selection in a vote by the league coaches ... Meier was third in goals and points ... In the same poll, the Hokies have been picked fifth in the ACC.

Upon Further Review

In the win over JMU, the Hokies' second goal was originally credited to **Ashley Meier** ... The coaches reviewed the game film and it was obvious that the goal should be credited to **Murielle Tiernan**, with an assist to Meier ... The stats have been adjusted.

On the Injury Front

The Hokies will be without outstanding freshman **Kelsey Irwin**, who suffered a torn ACL over the summer and will miss the 2015 season ... She is expected to be ready to practice during the spring and earn a medical redshirt ... Tech has also lost redshirt sophomore Jordyn Brock to a torn ACL, suffered in the win over UNC Greensboro ... She will miss the remainder of the season.

Senior Leadership

The Hokies won their first match against a ranked opponent, 2-1 over No. 12/10 West Virginia on Sunday, Aug. 23 in Bloomington, Indiana.

Major Losses

Head coach **Chugger Adair** had to replace some key players from last year's squad including third team Academic All-American Katie Yensen, third team All-ACC selection Shannon Mayrose and starting goalie Caroline Kelly ... In all, seven letterwinners graduated off of last season's 16-6 team.

Scoring in Bunches

Virginia Tech is continuing it's offensive success after last season's team scored 62 goals, the most in program history while only allowing 18 goals ... The high-powered offense and steady defense earned the Hokies 15 wins of at least a two-goal margin, including the first 10 games of the season ... In all, four of the team's top five scorers from last season return to the line-up this season ... Fourteen players scored goals last season; 10 of those players return for the Hokies ... So far this season, the Hokies are averaging 2.4 goals per match, slightly behind the pace of last season ... So far this season, Tech has scored at least two goals in 11 of the 13 matches and has yet to be shutout.

Get in the #HokieHuddle

The Hokies have a new way for fans and media to get even more information about all their favorite Virginia Tech athletic teams - The #HokieHuddle ... The #HokieHuddle, accessed from each sport's home page on hokiesports.com, offers a more detailed and inside look at all 22 Virginia Tech varsity sports ... Information likely on #HokieHuddle are community service features, Q & As with players and coaches and odds & ends about the programs ... On the women's soccer #HokieHuddle, national rankings and social media updates are among the topics available ... #HokieHuddle, check it out!

What is a Hokie?

The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Hokie" yell, which is still used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the word was solely the product of his imagination and was used only as an attention-getter for his yell ... It soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

Head Coach Chugger Adair



Charles "Chugger" Adair has wasted little time in making the Virginia Tech women's soccer program one of the best in the Atlantic Coast Conference and one of the best nationally.

In his four seasons at Virginia
Tech, he has posted a 65-25-6 overall
record, good for a sterling .708
winning percentage. During that
time he has also won 22 of 42 ACC
contests.

Promoted to head coach on Dec. 7, 2010, as the replacement for Kelly

Cagle, who resigned for family reasons, Adair has continued the upward trajectory of Tech women's soccer in the ACC, culminating in 2013 when he guided the Hokies to a record-setting season. Tech won a school record 19 games, advanced to the finals of the ACC Tournament and later advanced to the NCAA College Cup.

In the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament, making it seven straight NCAA appearances. During the regular season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62 and fewest goals allowed in a season, with just 18.

The 2013 season was an exciting one for Tech. The Hokies advanced to the NCAAs for the sixth straight time and seventh time in school history largely because of an exciting offense and stellar defense and goalkeeping.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since then.

Adair came to Tech after holding the associate head coaching position at UC Santa Barbara for two seasons. Prior to his arrival at UCSB, he worked a six-year stint as Youth Soccer Coach/ Assistant Director of Competitive Older Ages for the Del Mar Sharks.

He served as an assistant for the University of San Diego's men's soccer team from 1998-2000. He moved from there and spent a season as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at Pacific University in Portland, Ore.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn McBride, a volleyball assistant coach at Virginia Tech, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn. He also has two other daughters, Alexandra and Madeline, and a son, Jack. The Adairs are expecting another child this fall.
