The Hokies enter the weekend 12-2-1 overall and 4-2 in conference action... Miami is 5-8 on the season and 2-4 in ACC play ... Tech is ranked 12th in the NSCAA poll and 11th in the TopDrawerSoccer.com poll.

Last Time Out: No. 7 Clemson 3, No. 9 Virginia Tech 2

The Hokies dropped a close one at No. 7 Clemson, 3-2, on Sunday afternoon ... **Alani Johnson** scored on a header from **Kallie Peurifoy** and **Candace Cephers** scored unassisted for the Hokies, but Clemson scored in the final 11 minutes for the win.

The Hokies vs. Miami

The Hokies are 8-3-4 all-time against Miami ... Tech has won the last two meetings and has not lost in the last four meetings (3-0-1) ... The Hokies defeated Miami, 2-0, in Coral Gables last season ... Tech is 6-1 in home games in the series and is 3-0-1 against the Hurricanes under **Chugger Adair** ... The Hokies are 7-3-4 in regular season conference games against Miami ... Tech is 50-79-15 all-time against schools currently in the ACC and 44-61-12 in ACC games.

Chugging Right Along

Virginia Tech head coach, **Charles "Chugger" Adair**, is now in his fifth season in charge of the Hokies ... He has a 74-27-6 overall record (.720) and a 26-20-3 record in ACC competition (.561) ... A full bio is available on page 4 of this release.

Hokies in the National State

Murielle Tiernan is eighth nationally in both game-winning goals and goals per game ... She is seventh in total goals, 15th in points per game and 17th in total points ... All five marks lead the ACC ... She is 29th in shots on goal per game ... As a team, the Hokies are eighth nationally in total goals, 10th in won-loss percentage, 18th in scoring offense and 19th in total points.

Cornering the Market

So far this season, the Hokies have done a great job generating set plays via the corner kick ... Tech leads the ACC with 116 corner kicks so far this season.

Murielle is the Tops!

Virginia Tech junior forward, **Murielle Tiernan**, scored Tech's second goal of the Longwood match and in doing so, recorded her 30th career goal ... She now has 37 career goals ... That puts her alone in first place on the Virginia Tech all-time goals list ... In the loss to No. 3 UNC, Tiernan scored her 32nd goal and in doing so, set a new school record for career points ... She now has 87 career points and is tied for eighth in career assists, with 13.

Ashley's Not Far Behind

Virginia Tech senior midfielder, **Ashley Meier**, scored her 28th career goal in Tech's win over Davidson and now has 30 career goals ... That puts her alone in second place on the Virginia Tech all-time goals list, behind teammate **Murielle Tiernan** ... Meier enters Thursday's match in third place in career points, with 72 ... Meier has 178 career shots, fifth place on Virginia Tech's all-time list.

Some Interesting Numbers

With the Hokies' 4-2 win at No. 22 Duke on Oct. 4, Virginia Tech is now 61-0 all-time when scoring four-or-more goals ... The four goals scored by the Hokies are the most against an ACC opponent since Oct. 23 of last season, when Tech won 5-0 at Syracuse ... It is the most goals Tech has scored against a nationally-ranked team since Sept. 5, 2014, when the Hokies defeated No. 13 Georgetown, 6-1, at Thompson Field.

Murielle's Big Week

Junior **Murielle Tiernan** earned many accolades for her play during the season's first weekend of action in the Hokies' victory in the Hoosier Classic ... Tiernan, who scored three of Tech's four goals on the weekend, was named the National Player of the Week by both espnW and TopDrawerSoccer.com ... She was also named the ACC Offensive Player of the Week.

Statistical Housekeeping

In checking back on the game final from the win at VCU, Virginia Tech's **Murielle Tiernan** should have been awarded an assist on the goal by Laila Gray in the 66th minute of play ... Tiernan now has two assists on the season ... Alos, in the win over JMU, the Hokies' second goal was originally credited to **Ashley Meier** ... The coaches reviewed the game film and it was obvious that the goal should be credited to **Murielle Tiernan**, with an assist to Meier ... The stats have been adjusted.

On the List

Murielle Tiernan named to the 2015 Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Award watch list ... Tiernan is one of 28 student-athletes on the list and one of eight players from Atlantic Coast Conference schools ... Tiernan led the Hokies in goals, assists and scoring last season ... The MAC Hermann Award Trophy is the most prestigious individual award in NCAA soccer presented annually to one male and one female athlete.

Representing the U.S.A.

Virginia Tech senior **Ashley Meier** spent a portion of her summer representing her country for US Soccer ... The U-23 Women's National Team came away with two wins and one draw in winning the 2015 Four Nations Tournament in Sarpsborg, Norway ... Meier has been a member of the national team pools since she was 12 years old and was a member of the U18 US National Team ... She was the 2011 NSCAA High School National Player of the Year and a two-time high school All-American ... Meier received the Ohio's "Ms. Soccer" and State of Ohio Player of the Year awards her senior year ... Off the pitch, Meier is a three-time ACC All-Academic Team selection and a two-time ACC Honor Roll selection ... She has been named to Dean's List in Spring 2014, Fall 2013, Spring 2013 and Fall 2012.

Senior Leadership

This season's senior class for the Hokies consists of five players, **Ashley Meier, Jordan Coburn, Morgan Conklin, Courtney Stutts** and **Delia Maresco** ... This talented quintet entered the 2015 season with an overall record of 48-17-4, for a .725 winning percentage ... This group has also made the NCAA Tournament in all three of their previous seasons and 5-2-1 NCAA Tournament record.

Hoosier Honors

Juniors **Murielle Tiernan** and **Candace Cephers**, along with senior **Ashley Meier**, were named to the all-tournament team at the Hoosier Classic on Sunday afternoon.

Tough Slate

This season's schedule features a host of quality non-conference opponents along with the always-tough ACC slate ... Six opponents earned NCAA Tournament berths last season ... The Hokies won their first match against a ranked opponent, 2-1 over No. 12/10 West Virginia on Sunday, Aug. 23 in Bloomington, Indiana.

Major Losses

Head coach **Chugger Adair** had to replace some key players from last year's squad including third team Academic All-American Katie Yensen, third team All-ACC selection Shannon Mayrose and starting goalie Caroline Kelly ... In all, seven letterwinners graduated off of last season's 16-6 team.

Scoring in Bunches

Virginia Tech is continuing it's offensive success after last season's team scored 62 goals, the most in program history while only allowing 18 goals ... The high-powered offense and steady defense earned the Hokies 15 wins of at least a two-goal margin, including the first 10 games of the season ... In all, four of the team's top five scorers from last season return to the line-up this season ... Fourteen players scored goals last season; 10 of those players return for the Hokies ... So far this season, the Hokies are averaging 2.4 goals per match, slightly behind the pace of last season ... So far this season, Tech has scored at least two goals in 11 of the 13 matches and has yet to be shutout.

Head Coach Chugger Adair



Charles "Chugger" Adair has wasted little time in making the Virginia Tech women's soccer program one of the best in the Atlantic Coast Conference and one of the best nationally.

In his four seasons at Virginia Tech, he has posted a 65-25-6 overall record, good for a sterling .708 winning percentage. During that time he has also won 22 of 42 ACC contests.

Promoted to head coach on Dec. 7, 2010, as the replacement for Kelly

Cagle, who resigned for family reasons, Adair has continued the upward trajectory of Tech women's soccer in the ACC, culminating in 2013 when he guided the Hokies to a record-setting season. Tech won a school record 19 games, advanced to the finals of the ACC Tournament and later advanced to the NCAA College Cup.

In the 2014 season, Adair led the Hokies to a 16-6 record and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament, making it seven straight NCAA appearances. During the regular season, the Hokies set a school record for most goals in a season, with 62 and fewest goals allowed in a season, with just 18.

The 2013 season was an exciting one for Tech. The Hokies advanced to the NCAAs for the sixth straight time and seventh time in school history largely because of an exciting offense and stellar defense and goalkeeping.

Adair came to Tech in 2006 and served as the associate head coach under Cagle for five seasons before being promoted. In Adair's first season as an assistant to Cagle, the Hokies suffered a losing season, but have not suffered a losing season since then.

Adair came to Tech after holding the associate head coaching position at UC Santa Barbara for two seasons. Prior to his arrival at UCSB, he worked a six-year stint as Youth Soccer Coach/ Assistant Director of Competitive Older Ages for the Del Mar Sharks.

He served as an assistant for the University of San Diego's men's soccer team from 1998-2000. He moved from there and spent a season as an assistant coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at Pacific University in Portland, Ore.

Adair also possesses a great deal of playing experience, having played professionally for 10 years, including stints with the Los Angeles Galaxy of Major League Soccer and the U.S. National Futsal Team.

Adair played soccer at the University of San Diego after transferring from San Diego State in the early 1990s. He earned All-America honors, was a two-year captain and helped USD to the NCAA finals, where the Toreros lost to Virginia. He scored 27 goals and had 23 assists in his three years at USD. He got his bachelor's degree in business administration from USD in 1993 and he received his MBA from USD in 1996.

Adair is married to the former Shelbylynn McBride, a volleyball assistant coach at Virginia Tech, and they have a daughter, Callie Lynn. He also has two other daughters, Alexandra and Madeline, and a son, Jack. The Adairs are expecting another child this fall.
